Chief Secretary launches end to end integration of 5 DBT Schemes of Department of Education & Higher Education with Service Plus platform of MeitY

Port Blair, Sept. 14

The Chief Secretary, A & N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain today launched end to end integration of 5 Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) Schemes of Department of Education and Higher Education with Service Plus platform of MeitY, GoI in the presence of Secretary (Education), Director (Education) and senior officers of A&N Administration. The integrated schemes are Reimbursement of cash in lieu of school uniform; Reimbursement of cash in lieu of stationery kit to the school students; Scholarship to the



school students in the form of reimbursement of mess bill; Scholarship to the college students and (Degree & Diploma) in the form of reimbursement of mess bill (JNRM, ANCOL, MGGC, TGCE and DBRAIT) and Scholarship to the students pursuing higher education in mainland in the form of mess bill

reimbursement. Service Plus is an open source based configurable, unified framework for service delivery and grievance redressal. The web-based application facilitates rapid rollout of any service, any time, at any level and by any Government entity. The integration of above 5 schemes with Service Plus will simplify and

improve the delivery of services to the beneficiaries. An estimated amount of more than Rs 5 crore is likely to be disbursed under these schemes directly into the bank accounts of the beneficiaries. The eServices portal involves integrated and seamless delivery of citizen services through automation of workflow, back

end digitization, integration, and process redesigning and end-to-end computerization for providing services in a most efficient manner to the students. Applicants can avail the services online through the link <https://eservices.andaman.gov.in>, a press release from Directorate of Education said.

3,93,934 doses of vaccines administered to beneficiaries so far

The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly at the designated vaccination centers and 3,93,934 doses of vaccines have been administered to beneficiaries so far in A&N Islands. The percentage of population vaccinated in A&N Islands stands at 69.38. As per data available, the cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with first dose so far is 2,77,514 (98.55%) while the cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with second dose so far is 1,16,420 (41.95%).

Meanwhile, a total of

3527 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 2472 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 1326 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44

Ayushman Bharat - Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY), the world's largest health assurance programme will be completing three years of its implementation on Sept. 23. Ayushman Bharat Pakhwada will be observed across the country from Sept. 15 to 30, to mark the occasion and create awareness among the eligible beneficiaries about the benefits of the scheme and to generate PMJAY

card for the left out eligible beneficiaries. The scheme provides cashless treatment worth Rs. 5 Lakhs per family per year to eligible beneficiaries for secondary and tertiary care hospitalizations at more than 23,000 empanelled public and private hospitals across the country.

AB-PMJAY aims to cover 50 Crore beneficiaries from 10.4 Crore families belonging to the poor and vulnerable sections



of the country. PMJAY cards have been issued to 16 Crore beneficiaries in the country as on date. More than 2 Crore hospital admissions have been recorded under the scheme since its implementation.

The Health

Department has conducted camps and door to door surveys to identify and issue PMJAY cards to the AB-PMJAY beneficiaries of these Islands. PMJAY cards have been issued to 36,974 beneficiaries belonging to 11,164 eligible families in the UT. 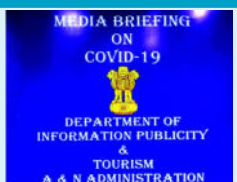

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Media briefed on COVID-19 Seven flight passengers tested positive during RT-PCR test: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Sept.14

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar briefing media persons on COVID-19 in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening said that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 1078 passengers who arrived here yesterday, 7 positive cases have been detected. Today, 6 flights with 959 passengers arrived and the RT-PCR reports are awaited. He further disclosed that RAT was conducted on 244 passengers bound for



North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and all were found negative. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, 209 passengers were tested and no positive case has been detected. Apart from this, 166 passengers travelling to different destinations were tested at Phoenix

Bay Jetty and all were found negative. At helipad, 5 passengers were tested and all were found negative. One patient at GB Pant Hospital was tested positive today.

The Director said that today 1003 beneficiaries were administered vaccines, out of which, 893 were in the age group of 18-44.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

CARI Surya - A promising coconut Variety

The variety was developed through selection from exotic accession IND 112 introduced by ICAR-CPCRI from French Polynesia as Hari Papua Orange Dwarf and conserved at World Coconut Germplasm Centre at Sipighat farm, ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair. It is a dualpurpose variety suitable for tender nut as well as for ornamental purpose. The palms of this variety take about 3-4 years for first flowering. It is recommended by Group Meeting of All India Coordinated Research Projects on Palms during 2013 for cultivation in coconut growing tracts of Andaman and Nicobar Islands ecosystems. The palms are dwarf with slender stem, shorter drooping leaves, stem has no bole at the base. The palms are cross pollinated unlike other dwarf varieties. The fruits are Orange (red-yellow), small-size and oval shape, average fruit weight of over 410 g with copra content of over 70 g having oil content of about 62.5%. The palms take about 40 months for first flowering after planting. The tender nut water content is 154ml. Unlike, most other dwarf varieties, this variety performs well under rainfed conditions also. It recorded an average of 107 nuts per palm per year under rainfed conditions with copra yield of about 7.49 kg per palm per year. The potential yield was estimated to be over 161 nuts per palm per year with copra yield of over 11.27 kg per palm per year.

Benefit: Owing to the compact canopy it could be planted at closer spacing of 6 x 6 m also. The variety has not recorded any major pests under field conditions. The variety has attractive cluster bearing bunches and hence preferred for planting in house compounds and for ornamental painting also.

Port Blair, dated the 25th August, 2021.
No. 77/2021/F.No.1-6/SC/ANI/Rule/2021/1097.- In exercise of power conferred under Section 102 of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019, and in pursuance of Notification No.S.O.3997(E) dated 03.11.2020 issued by GOI, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, the Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands hereby makes the following rules namely :-

1. Short Title and Commencement :

(i) These Rules may be called the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Consumer Protection Rules, 2021.

(ii) They shall come into force on the date of publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Definitions :

(1) In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-

(a) "Act" means the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 (35 of 2019);

(b) "District Commission" means the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission for all the three Districts of Andaman and Nicobar Islands stationed at Port Blair;

(c) "District Council" means District Consumer Protection Council established under Section 8(1) of the Act;

(d) "Mediation Cell" means a Consumer Mediation Cell established under Sub-section (1) of Section 75 of the Act;

(e) "Member" means a Member of the District Commission or the State Commission, as the case may be;

(f) "Panel" means a panel of mediators prepared by the Commission under Sub-section (1) of Section 75 of the Act;

(g) "Parties" means parties to a dispute;

(h) "President" means the President of the District Commission or the State Commission, as the case may be;

(i) "Public Utility Entities" means the Establishments and Units as mentioned in rule 3 of these Rules;

(j) "State Commission" means the State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Andaman and Nicobar Islands at Port Blair;

(k) "State Council" means State Consumer Protection Council established under Section 6 (1) of the Act;

(l) "State Government" means and includes The Lieutenant Governor (Administrator), Andaman and Nicobar Islands;

(m) "Section" means a Section of the Act;

(n) "Settlement" means a Settlement arrived at in the course of mediation or settlement arrived at in between the parties;

(o) "Registrar" means the Registrar of the State Commission;

(p) "Regulation" means the Regulation made under the Act;

(q) "Rules" means the rules made under the Act;

(2) The words and expressions used herein and not defined and defined in the Act shall have the same meaning respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. **Public Utility Entity** : Establishments including any advertising agency, commission agent, manufacturing, trading or any other commercial agency which carries on any business, trade or profession or any work in connection with or incidental or ancillary to any commercial activity, trade or profession or such other class or classes of persons including -
i. transport service for the carriage of passengers or goods by air, road or water; or
ii. postal, telegraph or telephone service; or
iii. supply of power, light or water to the public by any establishment; or
iv. system of public conservancy or sanitation; or
v. service in hospital or dispensary; or
vi. insurance service; or
vii. education or educational institution; or
viii. housing and real estate service; and
ix. any other service which the Central Government or the State Government, as the case may be, may, in the public interest, by notification declare to be a public utility entity for the purpose of this rule.

4. **Unfair Trade Practice** : The conduct of any contest, lottery, game of chance or skill, for the purpose of promoting, directly or indirectly, the sale, use or supply of any product or any business interest, except such contest, lottery, game of chance or skill as may be prescribed, in contravention of Section 2(47)(iii)(b) of the Act.

5. **Establishment of State Consumer Protection Council** : The Andaman and Nicobar Administration shall establish a State Consumer Protection Council to be known as State Council consisting of the following Members:-

(i) The Secretary-in-charge of Consumer Affairs in the Andaman and Nicobar Administration who shall be the Chairperson;

(ii) The Registrar, State Commission, A & N Islands : Member

(iii) The Director, Social Welfare Department, A & N Administration : Member

(iv) The Chairperson, A & N State Social Welfare Advisory Board, A & N Administration: Member

(v) The Director of Fisheries, A & N Administration : Member

(vi) The Director of Agriculture, A & N Administration : Member

(vii) The Director of Health Services, A & N Administration : Member

(viii) The Director, Doordarshan, Port Blair : Member

(ix) The Secretary, PBMC, Port Blair: Member

(x) The President, Andaman Chamber of Commerce & Industry, Port Blair : Member

(xi) The Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad, Mayabunder : Member

(xii) The Chairman, Tribal Council, Car Nicobar : Member

(xiii) The Chairman, Tribal Council, Nancowrie : Member

(xiv) The President, Fair Price Shop Association, Port Blair : Member

(xv) The President, Vegetable Vendors Association, Port Blair: Member

(xvi) The President Fruit Vendors Association, Port Blair : Member

(xvii) The President, Grain Dealers & Grocers Association, Port Blair : Member

(xviii) (i) The Chairman, Consumer and Civil Rights Protection Council, A & N Islands : Member

(xix) The Director, Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs A & N Administration : Convening Member

(xx) Such number of other official or non-official members, not exceeding ten, as may be nominated by the Central Government.

6. **Time and place of meeting of State Council and the procedure for the transaction of its business:**

(1) The State Council shall meet as and when necessary but not less than two meetings shall be held every year;

(2) The State Council shall meet at such time and place as the Chairperson may think fit;

(3) The meeting shall be convened by the Convening Member in consultation with and with the approval of the Chairman;

(4) The venue of the meeting shall be such as the Chairman may think fit;

(5) The object of the State Council shall be to render advice on promotion and protection of consumer rights under the Act within the State;

(6) The resolution adopted in the meeting shall, as far as practicable, be unanimous. But in the event of any difference of opinion, the majority decision of the Members shall be final. In the event of any tie in the difference of opinion, the Chairman shall have the power to cast an additional vote;

(7) The terms of the members of the State or District Council shall be four years from the date of nomination of such members.

Provided that the State/District Council shall continue to function for a further period of three months or till it is reconstituted, whichever is earlier.
7. Establishment of District Consumer Protection Council : The Andaman and Nicobar Administration shall establish District Consumer Protection Councils to be known as District Councils consisting of the following Members for each of the three districts of Andaman and Nicobar Islands:-

South Andaman District :

(i) The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman District : Chairperson

(ii) The Director of Health Services, A & N Administration: Member

(iii) (i) The Superintending Engineer, Electricity Department, A & N Administration: Member

(iv) (ii) The Secretary, PBMC, Port Blair : Member

(v) The Executive Engineer, PHED, APWD, Port Blair : Member

(vi) The Chairperson, A & N State Social Welfare Advisory Board : Member

(vii)The Deputy Registrar, Co-operative Society : Member

(viii) The Assistant Director (Enforcement), Directorate of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs: Member

(ix) The General Secretary, Andaman Chamber of Commerce & Industry: Member

(x) The General Manager, ANIIDCO, Port Blair : Member

(xi) The Chairman, Consumer and Civil Rights Protection Council, A&N Islands: Member

(xii) The Assistant Director (Enf.), Dte. of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, A&N Administration.: Convening Member

North and Middle Andaman District :

(i)The Deputy Commissioner, North & Middle Andaman District : Chairman

(ii)The Assistant Commissioner (HQ), Mayabunder: Member

(iii) The Assistant Commissioner, Rangat : Member

(iv)The Assistant Commissioner, Diglipur : Member

(iv) The Assistant Commissioner, Campbell Bay : Member

(v) The First Captain, Tribal Council, Car Nicobar : Member

(vi) The Chief of Tribal Council, Nancowrie : Member

(vii) The Managing Director, EHL, Car Nicobar : Member

(viii) The Medical Superintendent, District Hospital, Car Nicobar: Member

(ix) The Assistant Director, STS Department, Car Nicobar : Member

(x) The Assistant Director, Civil Supplies Department, Car Nicobar: Convening Member

8. Time and place of meeting of District Council and the procedure for the transaction of its business under Sub-section (4) of Section 8:

(1) The District Council shall meet as and when necessary but not less than two meetings shall be held every year;

(2) The District Council shall meet at such time and place as the Chairperson may think fit;

(3) The meeting shall be convened by the Convening Member in consultation with and with the approval of the Chairman;

(4) The venue of the meeting shall be such as the Chairman may think fit;

(5) The object of the District Council shall be to render advice on promotion and protection of consumer rights under the Act within the District;

(6) The resolution adopted in the meeting shall, as far as practicable, be unanimous. But in the event of any difference of opinion, the majority decision of the Members shall be final. In the event of any tie in the difference of opinion, the Chairman shall have the power to cast an additional vote.

9. Composition of District Commission : The District Commission shall consist of -

a. a President ; and

b. two Members.

10. **Territorial jurisdiction of District Commission** : The District Commission shall exercise territorial jurisdiction over all three Districts viz. South Andaman District, North & Middle Andaman District and Nicobar District of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

11. **Venue of sittings of District Commission** : The District Commission has all along been holding sittings in the High Court Complex, Circuit Bench at Port Blair in the absence of any accommodation exclusively for the District Commission. The District Commission shall also hold Circuit Courts in the District Head Quarters of North & Middle Andaman District and Nicobar District as and when the State Commission may direct in consideration of good number of institution of cases arising out of the territorial jurisdiction of the respective district.

12. Salaries and allowances payable to President and Members of District Commission :

(1) The President of the District Commission shall receive the salary and other allowances as are admissible to a District Judge in the super time scale of pay.

(2) A Member of the District Commission shall receive a pay equal to the pay at the minimum of the scale of pay of a Deputy Secretary of the Andaman & Nicobar Administration and other allowances as admissible to such officer.

(3) There shall be an annual upward revision of the pay of a Member at the rate of 3%.

(4) Pending creation or sanction of regular posts, the President of District Commission shall receive a consolidated salary of Rs. 2,00,000/- and a Member of District Commission shall receive a consolidated salary of Rs. 40,000/- or the amount mentioned in sub-rules (1) and (3) of this rule, whichever is lower, as a stopgap arrangement. In the event of creation of regular sanctioned post of the President and Members of the State Commission in accordance with new Rules, the President and Members so recruited under new Rule shall get their respective salary in terms of sub-rule 1 & 2 subject to deduction as contemplated under sub-rule 5. The aforesaid amount of consolidated salary of the President of District Commission shall only be released in case of appointment of full time President on the basis of proper advertisement to be issued by the Administration :

"Provided that the Registrar of the High Court, Calcutta, Circuit Bench at Port Blair shall be functioning as President District Commission till creation of sanction/ appointment of regular post. In the event the President of the District Commission shall be getting @ Rs. 4000/- per day of sitting".

(5) The pay of a person appointed as President or Member, who is in receipt of any pension, shall be reduced by the gross amount of pension drawn by him.

(6) During the temporary absence of the President, District Commission from station either on leave or inability to attend office, the President, State Commission, A & N Islands may authorize the senior most Member of the District Commission to remain in-charge of the office of the President till the latter resumes duties.

13. **Composition of the State Commission** : The State Commission shall consist of -

a. The President; and

b. four Members

14. **Venue of sittings of State Commission** : (1) The State Commission shall ordinarily function at the State Capital. The State Commission shall also perform its functions by holding Circuit Courts in the District Head Quarters of North & Middle Andaman District and Nicobar District in consideration of good number of institution of cases and/or appeals arising out of the territorial jurisdiction of the respective district.

The State Commission shall have supervisory power over the District Commissions and may issue necessary directions for proper functioning and management of District Commissions.

(2) The President of the State Commission may have a Camp Office in his/her native place;

(3) The President of the State Commission shall also be entitled to a mobile phone having android facility and he/she will be entitled to a monthly allowance of one thousand for recharging.

(4) The President of the State Commission may at his/her discretion engage a Secretarial Assistant-cum-Stenographer and Telephone Attender on contractual basis for his Camp Office and their monthly remuneration shall not to exceed the minimum wages fixed by the Andaman and Nicobar Administration under the Minimum Wages Act from time to time. Their payment shall be made from the consolidated fund of India.

(5) In the event of any pandemic or Natural Calamity or in case of any like exigency of circumstance preventing him from visiting his State Headquarters, the President, State Commission may perform his functions through video conferencing and the State Commission shall create necessary links and share the link to all stakeholders for proper functioning of the Commission.

15. **Hearing Hours of State Commission and District Commission** : Subject to the provisions of any rules made in this behalf, the normal working hours of the State Commission and District Commission shall be on all working days of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration.

16. **Procedure of Appointment** : The Presidents and Members of the State Commission and District Commission shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, Andaman and Nicobar Islands on the recommendation of the Selection Committee as per rule 6 of the Consumer Protection (Qualification for appointment, method of recruitment, procedure of appointment, term of office, resignation and removal of the President and Members of the State Commission and District Commission) Rules, 2020.

17. Salaries and Allowances Payable to President and Members of State Commission :

(1) The President of the State Commission shall receive the salary and other allowances as are admissible to a sitting Judge of the High Court at Calcutta.

(2) A Member of the State Commission shall receive a pay equivalent to the pay at minimum of the scale of pay of an Additional Secretary of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration and other allowances as are admissible to such officers.

(3) There shall be an annual upward revision of the pay of the President and Member at the rate of 3%.

(4) Pending creation or sanction of regular posts, the President of State Commission shall receive a consolidated salary of Rs. 3,00,000/- per month and a Member of State Commission shall receive a consolidated salary of Rs. 50,000/- per month or the amount mentioned in sub-rules (1) and (2) of this rule, whichever is lower, as a stopgap arrangement.

(5) The pay of a person appointed as President or Member, who is in receipt of any Government Pension, shall be reduced by the gross amount of pension drawn by him.

18. **Medical Fitness** : No person shall be appointed as President or Member unless he/she is declared medically fit by any Medical Officer working under the Government of India/State Government or any Registered Medical Practitioner of Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

19. **House Rent Allowance** : The Presidents of the State Commission and the District Commission shall be entitled to rent free accommodation according to their status and dignity of a sitting Judge of a High Court or District Judge in the super time scale, as the case may be. In the event no rent free accommodation according their status as aforesaid is not provided, the President of District Commission and/or the President, State Commission shall be entitled to House Rent Allowance according to their respective entitlement as per the rate applicable at Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Members, if appointed on regular basis, shall be entitled to House Rent Allowance at the same rate as are admissible to Group 'A' Officer of Andaman and Nicobar Administration of a corresponding status, subject to the fulfillment of the extant provisions of the Rules in this behalf.

20. Transport Allowance :

(1) The Presidents of the State Commission and District Commission are entitled to independent transport facility according to the status and dignity of a sitting Judge of a High Court and District Judge in the super time scale, respectively.

(2) The Members of the State Commission and District Commission, if appointed on regular basis, shall be entitled to transport allowance at the same rate as are admissible to a Group 'A' Officer of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, subject to the extant provisions of the Rules in this behalf.

21. Leave, LTC and Medical Treatment and Hospital facilities :

(1) The Presidents of the State Commission and District Commission shall be entitled to Leave, LTC, Medical treatment and hospital facilities as admissible to a sitting Judge of the High Court and District Judge in the super time scale, respectively, for themselves and their dependent family members.

(2) The Members of the State Commission and District Commission shall be entitled to leave at the same rate as are admissible to a Group 'A' Officer of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration, subject to the extant provisions of the CCS (Leave) Rules, 1972, as amended from time to time.

(3) The President of the State Commission, be his appointment on regular pay structure or on consolidated pay, shall be entitled to free air travel between his home town and Port Blair for himself and his dependent family members twice in a year.

(4) The President of the District Commission, be his appointment on regular pay structure or on consolidated pay, shall be entitled to free air travel between his home town and Port Blair for himself and his dependent family members once in two years. The President of District Commission shall also be entitled to annual free sea passage between Port Blair and nearest sea-port in the mainland for himself and his dependent family members.

(5) The Members of the State Commission and District Commission, if they are recruited from the mainland, shall be entitled to LTC to visit home town once in two years and Annual Free Sea Passage between the station of posting and the port nearest to their hometown :

Provided, however, the President, District Commission and the Members of State Commission and District Commission are not entitled to avail both LTC and AFSP separately in one calendar year.

(6) The Members of the State Commission and District Commission shall be entitled to Medical treatment and hospital facilities as admissible to a Group 'A' Officer of the Andaman and Nicobar Administration subject to the provisions of the CCS (Medical Attendance) Rules, 1944 as amended from time to time.

22. **Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance** : The President of the State Commission and District Commission, while on official tour, shall be entitled to Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance as admissible to a sitting

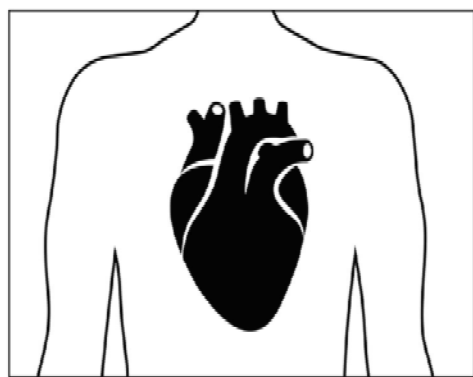

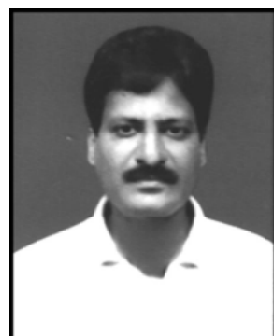
