Citizens hail LG's direction for a time bound filling up vacant posts in Govt depts

Port Blair, Oct 14: The direction of the Lt Governor, Admiral D K Joshi (Retd.) to government departments for a time bound action plan to fill-up all vacant posts on a mission mode is really a step welcomed by the citizens. This move has come as a breather for the lakhs of qualified unemployed youth who are running from pillar to posts searching jobs. The Lt Governor after reviewing the status of vacancies in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, alongwith Senior Officials of Andaman and Nicobar Administration, Andaman and Nicobar Police and Department of Environment and Forests on Thursday directed various departments to fill-up all vacant posts lying in various department of the UT administration for the past several years. Despite clear directions by the central

government to fill-up all vacant posts, departments under the administration were moving at a snail pace to fill-up vacancies. Though online applications for filling up certain posts have already been made and the process is underway, many departments in the UT administration have still not started the process to fill-up vacant posts in their department. The direction by the Lt Governor has come at the right time. Growing unemployment in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands has emerged as one of the biggest challenges for the UT administration. According to sources, over 10,000 posts are lying vacant in different departments of the administration as lakhs of unemployed youths in the islands are struggling to get a government job. At a time when growing unemployment has become a big challenge for the administration,



choosing the more convenient method, departments of the administration prefer to re-engage retired government officials on contract basis. Some departments even go the extra mile to re-engage retired officials, ignoring the fact that these retired officials are already getting all the benefits as senior citizens, including monthly pensions.

ANTA objects Administering medicines/health assessments by teachers

Port Blair, Oct 14: The Andaman Nicobar Teachers Association (ANTA) has objected to the practice of Administering medicines/health assessments by teachers in schools. In a letter to the Secretary (Education), the President, ANTA has said that teachers cannot be held responsible for the genuineness of the medicine or its method of administration to the children because they are not expert or

trained for the purpose. Citing recent incidence of Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School, Port Blair, wherein About 24 students from classes 6 to 9 were hospitalized after purportedly consuming albendazole tablets for treating worm infestation among children, the ANTA President has said that this medication is being supplied by the Department of health to each school to be administered by the teachers. The teachers cannot

be held responsible for the genuineness of the medicine or its method of administration to the children. Besides on several occasions, the responsibility of health assessment of school children and other such activities are shifted on to the shoulders of the teachers who are already overburdened in record maintenance in addition to their own academic activities. Think big & publish

The Biden administration published its new National Security Strategy (NSS) for the US that clearly defines China as the main systemic challenge, identifies Russia as an immediate threat and again highlights a coming global struggle between democracies and autocracies. While all of these are things that Washington had already been signalling for some time now, the document does help reiterate the US position in a complex geopolitical environment.

Every new American administration is required to publish an NSS by law. Other consequential countries also put out their version of the document. China has its defence white papers, the UK has brought out an Integrated Review 2021, and France has its Strategic Update. Even Pakistan brought out one earlier this year. But India doesn't publish anything similar. There was only a 2004 Indian army doctrine. A comprehensive NSS that addresses both internal and external security challenges, economic and technological priorities, and regional and global opportunities, will add credibility to the Indian policy establishment.

The world has changed dramatically in the last three decades, and security can no longer be viewed solely through the prism of conventional military power. Security of vital supply chains, cyber and energy security, space and maritime domains, and economic growth are all crucial components of an NSS. The crisis engendered by the Ukraine war illustrates this vividly. Weaponisation of global trade has meant critical components such as semiconductors can be held to ransom by strategic rivals. India has done well to start seriously looking at creating a domestic semiconductor ecosystem. A similar endeavour is underway to revive domestic pharmaceutical APIs. But both these moves were in response to ties with China souring post-Galwan. If India is to live up to its international ambitions, it can't have such an ad hoc approach to strategic issues. Some may argue that not having a pre-stated grand strategy gives India context-specific strategic elbowroom. But every power that publishes such a grand vision also cuts corners when needed. Not having a published NSS is bad advertisement for India's power.

SMOKING, DIABETES, OBESITY BIGGER RISK FACTORS FOR COVID DEATH THAN HEART AILMENT: STUDY

Risk factors for cardiovascular disease such as obesity, smoking and diabetes, rather than preexisting heart disease, are the main contributors to death and poor outcomes among critically ill COVID-19 patients, according to a study.

Patients with cardiovascular disease were found to have close to a 30 per cent higher mortality rate than critically ill COVID patients without the preexisting condition. However, when adjusted for risk factors -- including age, sex, race, smoking and others -- that relationship was no longer statistically significant.

"The fact that the association between cardiovascular disease and death was so heavily diminished when accounting for comorbidities suggests that cardiovascular risk factors rather than preexisting heart disease are the main contributors to in-hospital death in patients with severe COVID-19," said senior author Salim Hayek.

The team, led by researchers at the University of Michigan in the US, analysed outcomes for more

than 5,100 patients admitted to intensive care units at 68 centers across the US with severe COVID between March and June of 2020.

Of those patients, 1,174 had either preexisting coronary artery disease, congestive heart failure or atrial fibrillation.

A total of 34.6 per cent of

patients died within 28 days and nearly 18 per cent suffered a cardiovascular event, such as cardiac arrest or myocarditis.

Researchers say the association between such events and death did not differ between patients with and without preexisting heart disease.



The study, published in the journal Circulation: Cardiovascular Quality and Outcomes, found that the presence of myocardial injury was associated with cardiovascular events and death, regardless of whether a patient had preexisting heart disease.

Myocardial injury was common among patients in the ICU, occurring in nearly half of patients who had heightened levels of troponin, a protein released when the heart muscle is damaged.

Patients with the highest troponin measurements were nearly three times more likely to die than those without myocardial injury, the researchers said in a statement. "While patients with severe COVID commonly had signs of cardiac injury, our findings reinforce COVID-19 as a pulmonary disease with multi-organ injury related to systemic inflammation," Hayek said.

"The evidence of heart damage that we frequently see in patients with severe COVID-19 is more likely a reflection of the severity of the illness and the stress it imparts on

all organs, rather than the development of new complications or the exacerbation of preexisting heart disease," he said.

The findings should not minimise the fact that patients with cardiovascular disease are still at risk for death due to COVID-19, as they have a high burden of risk factors for the disease, such as diabetes, hypertension and smoking, says co-first author Alexi Vasbinder.

We are currently working on studies to further define groups of patients with COVID-19 at highest risk for severe outcomes, such as those with advanced heart failure or coronary artery disease, Vasbinder said.

Cardiovascular disease is a common condition among patients who suffer severe COVID illness, given its prevalence among older adults and associated chronic inflammation.

In the study, age, obesity and diabetes were much stronger predictors of death due to COVID, the researchers added.

Port Blair, Oct 14: Andaman & Nicobar Islands Institute of Medical Sciences (ANIIMS), Port Blair has been approved 114 MBBS seats by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), Govt. of India and Andaman & Nicobar Administration for the academic year 2022-23. NEET-2022 qualified students will be admitted through All India quota counselling and state quota counselling. Out of total approved 114 seats, 17 seats of All India quota will be filled by online counselling by Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), and rest of the 97 seats will be admitted under state quota (10 EWS

plus 87 Category seats). The Applications have been invited from NEET eligible candidates for admission to ANIIMS. The applicants can apply through Common Admission Online Portal (www.collegeadmission.andaman.gov.in). Only NEET-2022 qualified students from Andaman and Nicobar Islands can apply for above mentioned 97 seats of state quota. Remaining 17 seats of All India quota will be filled through online counselling by Medical Counselling Committee (MCC).

During interaction with the fishers, the Secretary (Fisheries) motivated and urged the fishermen to avail the benefits of PMMSY under which subsidy is extended to various components including Ice Plants, Cold Storages, Deep Sea Fishing

Vessels, Insulated and Refrigerated Trucks etc. During the meeting, the fishermen put forth their demands pertaining to extension of Jetty from 50 to 80 meters, extension of Fish Landing Centre, Pokadera, installation of HDPE Jetty near the fishing village, Mayabunder, supply of Essential Fishery Requisites by the Department, supply of fencing material to protect the freshwater fishes from flood and other climatic disaster, compensation against loss of fishing crop due to flood etc. The Karen fishermen of Karmatang village have shown interest towards installation of Ice Plants. The Secretary (Fisheries) advised them to install 2 MT Ice Plant by availing subsidy under PMMSY. The Secretary (Fisheries) assured the fisher community to look into their issues and directed the Assistant

WHY EC ANNOUNCED DATE FOR ONLY HIMACHAL PRADESH ASSEMBLY POLLS?

Setting speculations to rest, the Election Commission, on Friday, announced the schedule for assembly elections in Himachal Pradesh, leaving the announcement of the polling dates for Gujarat for later. The decoupling of the declaration of elections in the two states follows the convention set in previous state polls in 2017.

There had been speculations on whether the EC will announce the election schedule for both states, as had been the case before 2017, or follow the delinking of the announcement of elections in the two states as had been done five years ago.

Chief Election Commission Rajiv Kumar announced the schedule for assembly elections only for Himachal Pradesh. While polling will take place in a single phase in the hill state on November 12, the results will be declared on December 8. The large gap between the voting and the declaration of results suggests that the outcome of elections in Himachal Pradesh and Gujarat is set to be announced on the same day. Answering questions on why the election schedule for Gujarat was not

announced, Kumar said the EC considered various factors, including weather and the convention set by the poll body in 2017.

The CEC pointed out that there was a gap of 40 days in the qualifying date for announcement of elections between the



two states. While the term of the Himachal Pradesh assembly ends on January 8, that of the Gujarat Vidhan Sabha ends on February 18.

He said the weather is a very important factor in the case of Himachal Pradesh, especially in the upper reaches where it snows. "After examining everything

and having weighed everything, we decided to go with the convention followed last time," he said.

Kumar further said the model code of conduct period has been reduced in these elections from the earlier 70 days to 57 days. He said the MCC period in 2012, when the announcement of elections in the two states was done on the same day, was 81 days.

Reacting to the EC announcing the election dates only for Himachal Pradesh, the Congress alleged it was done to allow Prime Minister Narendra Modi to hold more programmes in Gujarat.

"Obviously, this has been done to give more time to the PM to make some mega promises & carry out more inaugurations. Not at all surprising," tweeted Jairam Ramesh, AICC general secretary in charge of communications in the Congress.

The poll body had, in 2017, announced the Himachal Pradesh polls on October 12. Elections were held in the state on November 9, while counting took place on December 18. That was the first time the polls in the two states were decoupled. The election dates for Gujarat were announced on October 25, after a gap of 13 days. - Source : Theweek

World dangerously close to recession, warns World Bank president

World Bank President David Malpass, on Thursday, warned that the global economy is "dangerously close" to a recession and called for targeted support for the poor.

"The growth rate, we have lowered our 2023 growth forecast from three per cent to 1.9 per cent for global growth. That is dangerously close to a world recession, and that is, a world recession could happen under certain circumstances," Malpass told reporters on the sidelines of the annual meeting of the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund.

All of the problems that people have taken note of, the inflation problem, the interest rate rises, and the cutoff of capital flows to the developing world hits the poor hard, he said, adding that's a huge challenge for the bank.

"We are focused on helping people get ahead in developing countries, and right now there have been reversals. The countries, of course, are all different. So, we will have a

discussion today of certain countries. So, it is not monolithic



at all," Malpass said.

Some countries, he said, have already been raising their interest rates and may be reaching a point where they don't have to keep raising. Some countries have done one kind of subsidy versus another kind of subsidy.

"And so, fiscal policies are different throughout. And also, very importantly, some countries are commodity producers and some are commodity buyers.

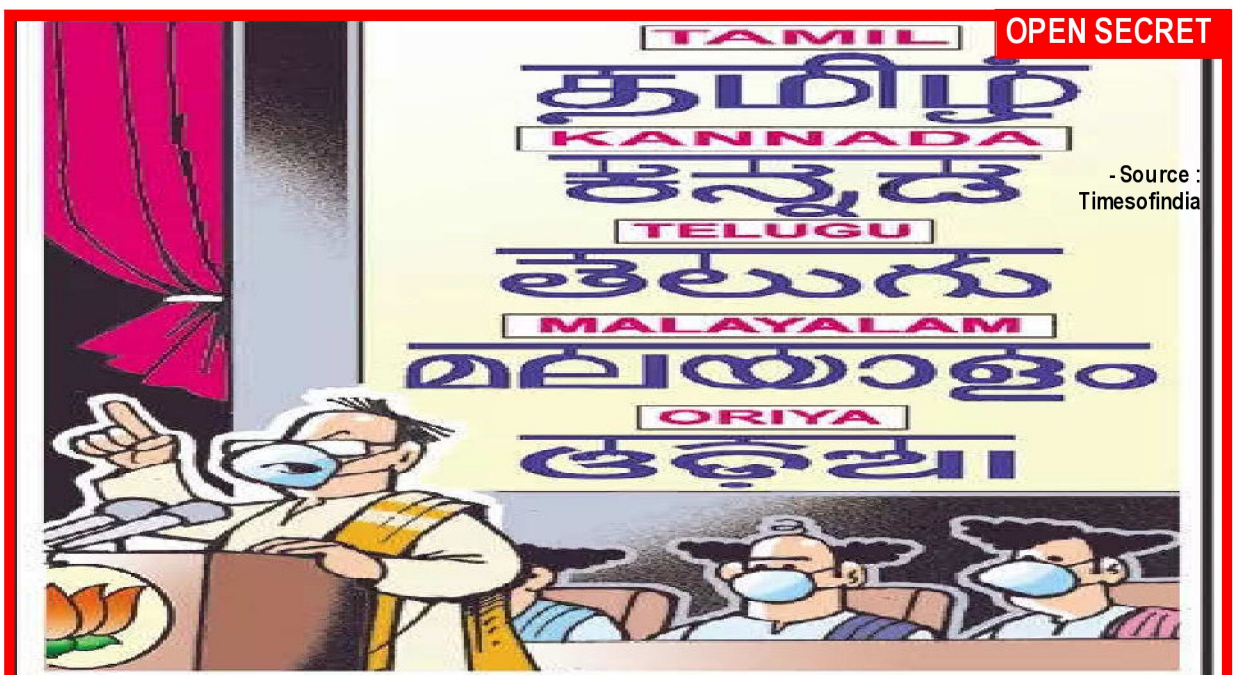
And so, we have, in general, advocated for countries that when—as they address the crisis that they try to have targeted responses. That means support for the poor; that means interventions that are targeted; and also, there is an exit strategy, they are temporary," Malpass said.

According to Malpass, the buildup of debt for developing countries is mainly because of high interest rates; the amount of debt itself is up; and their currencies tend to be weakening. "The depreciation of the currency adds to the burden of the debt. We have a fifth wave of debt crisis facing the developing world," he said.

Noting that there has been a lot of discussion on Ukraine, he said the World Bank is the

primary conduit for the transfer of funds to the administrative side of the Ukrainian government. "We had good conversations yesterday on that. We've set up yet another trust fund so that we can absorb money from various parts of the world, donor community." "Very important what is going on in education. As you know, learning poverty is up. The World Bank has kept extensive data on the reversals going on in education. And so, we had an important event to discuss the principles of getting out of that crisis," he said.

"On climate, we have had extensive interaction. As you may know, the World Bank is the biggest funder of climate action. We are proposing at this meeting a new trust fund called SCALE that would allow the world—the global community to put funding into global public goods. So, that's the connection that needs to be set up within the global system to actually have impact on greenhouse gas emission reduction," Malpass said. - Source : Theweek

"The All-India Senior Selection Committee has named Mohammed Shami as Jasprit Bumrah's replacement in India's



ICC Men's T20 World Cup squad. Shami has reached Australia and will link up with the squad in Brisbane ahead of the warm-up matches," BCCI secretary Jay Shah was quoted in a press release.

That Shami would replace Bumrah in the main squad was reported by PTI last month.

Mohammed Siraj and Shardul Thakur have been named as backups and will travel to Australia shortly. The burnament will be held from October 16 to November 13.

Bumrah has been ruled out of competitive cricket for an indefinite period due to stress related injury on his back.

Shami had last played in T20 internationals during the last edition of the ICC T20 World Cup in the UAE.

He was supposed to play in the six T20Is at home against Australia and South Africa but tested positive for COVID-19 and had to remain in isolation.
