

Chief Secretary directs Labour Department to start verification & registration of migrant labourers at Veer Savarkar International Airport & Harbours

Last warning to all principal employers to pay cess, this is not an option

Chief Secretary notes that Village Register System has fallen into disuse; for safety & security of the Islands, Islanders must verify all tenants & workers

Port Blair, April 25

Under the guidance of Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain, for the safety and security of the Islands, the Labour Department has started registering all the Migrant Workers arriving in the Islands. A Help Desk by the Department in this context has been set up at Veer Savarkar International Airport and Harbours in order to verify the workers arriving in the Islands. With the commencement of the process, more than 150 workers have been verified and registered in three days time. The entire process is being carried out by the Labour Department in collaboration with the DC Office and Police Department.

The A&N Islands are witnessing huge developmental projects and sufficient local labour force is not available in the Islands. Under such situation, the labour force has to come from rest of India for taking up the developmental works. With an aim to secure the Islands while getting labourers, it is important to register & verify each workers and tenants. The Islanders are requested to be cautious while engaging any unverified tenants or workers in their Residences or Establishment. This is very important for the future of the Islands, which is going to be the centre of growth in South East Asia.

In this regard, the first exercise of verification and registration has started on April 23, 2022. The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration noted that the Village Register System of 1999 has fallen into complete disuse. The aim is not to restrict outsider, but the aim is to regulate,



reorganise, re-orient them and at the same time labourers shall be getting various benefits under Labour Acts. Benefits of Registration & Skill Development will be honed through continuous training and will be extended welfare schemes of the Department. A lot of effort in this regard has been done by Shri Hari Kallikkat, Secretary (Labour) and Shri R.L. Rishi, Labour Commissioner with the help of Police Personnel and the Airport Authority of India. The ITF Ground will be presently used for this purpose until a new building has been set up for this purpose. On an average 50-100 migrant Labourers are arriving in the Islands every day.

The Principal Employers/Contractors whether in civil or defence must act responsibly and shall keep a vigil on every workers. It is seen that since 2004, people before elections come through contractors and post completion of work, these workers are dumped and the workers stay back in the lookout for other jobs. These workers have Aadhaar and other ID proofs from



various parts of Bengal and this being a serious issue, all Islanders shall co-operate, co-ordinate in verifying every workers and every tenants which is compulsory and not a choice.

Meanwhile, a meeting has been convened by the Labour Department with all Principal Employers/Construction agencies wherein it was directed that all Principal Employers including those in Central Sphere as well as Defence Establishments must remit Cess deducted on time to Labour Department, A&N Administration, failing which, Penalty Provision as laid down under Section 12 of Building & Other Construction Workers Welfare Cess Act, 1996 shall be invoked which provides for imprisonment which may extend upto 06 months or fine of Rs. 1000/- or with both.

The Principal Employer is also responsible for obtaining necessary Registration and Licenses under Inter State Migrant Workers Act, 1979 wherever applicable. The Section 6 of Inter State

Electricity Deptt. appeals general public to minimize use of power

Port Blair, April 25

It is to bring to the kind notice of general public that due to sudden rise in power demand, it has created a severe paucity of power demand in Port Blair and adjoining areas of South Andaman. A detailed demand side management has been prepared by the Electricity Department to ensure optimal utilization of available power. In pursuance of the same

this detailed directions are being issued. All consumers have share in the demand generated for power consumption. To minimize & optimize such demand, the following have been solicited:

- Switch off the Air Conditioners (AC) during peak hours from 5 PM to 11 PM.
- AC, if used in day hours shall be set at 26°C and use with ceiling fan for even distribution of cool air.

However, use of AC even during day hours should be minimal.

- Use LED lamps for lighting.
- Ensure optimal utilization of light in Office premises & unnecessary lighting may be switched off.
- Use of High Mast during peak hours should be avoided by PMB, DSS, PBMC & Pradhans.

Towards phasing out single use plastics by 2022 Deptt. of S&T promoting locally alternative products of single use plastics

Vendors/manufacturers of such alternatives urged to approach ANPCC

Port Blair, April 25

Considering the adverse impacts of littered single use plastic items on both terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems, Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi gave a clarion call to phase out single use plastics by 2022. The Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change has banned the manufacture, import, stocking, distribution, sale and use of identified single use

plastic (SUP), including polystyrene and expanded polystyrene, commodities vide notification G. S. R No.571 (E) dated 12th August, 2021 - Plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules-2021. The ban will be effective from 1st July, 2022.

Keeping in view of the harmful effects of single use plastic, it is very essential to use the alternatives that will replace plastic

CBSE Exam for Class XII & Class X 4793 students to appear in Class XII Exam this year while 5780 students to appear in Class X 52 Exam Centres setup across Isles

Port Blair, April 25

The Education Department has made all arrangements to monitor and ensure smooth conduct of the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) examinations for Class XII and X through offline mode in A&N Islands. The AISSCE (Class XII) will commence with Beauty & Wellness as first paper on April 26. However, the first major paper for Class 12 is Hindi which is scheduled to be held on May 2. The students of AISSE (Class X) will have English paper on April 27. The Class XII exam ends on June 15 with subject Psychology while Class X exam ends on May, 24, 2022 with subject Information Technology.

This year, the number

of regular candidates likely to appear in AISSCE (Class XII) is 4793, while in AISSE (Class X) 5780 students will take AISSE Board exam as regular candidates.

Altogether, 52 Examination Centres have been identified to facilitate students of AISSCE and AISSE appearing from this UT including the private candidates. Nationalized Bank/ Police Station have also been identified as custodian of examination confidential materials by CBSE for safe custody. Appointment of Centre Superintendent and Surprise Inspectors / Observers is being done by the Regional Officer, CBSE, Chennai to ensure free and fair conduct of these exams.

Vaccination drive in A&N Islands 11,353 beneficiaries in the age group of 12 to 14 yrs vaccinated so far

Port Blair, April 25

The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,72,391 doses of vaccines have been administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above so far. Similarly, 23,420 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18 yrs. and 11,353 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 12 to 14 yrs. The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at 18,398.

A total of 1820 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands today. 1473 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 68 beneficiaries were in the age group of 12-14 years, 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 15-18 years, 4 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 327.

Migrant Workers Act, 1979 stipulates that "No Principal employer of establishment to which this Act applies shall employ Inter-State Migrant Workmen in the establishment unless a certificate of registration in respect of such establishment issued under this Act is in force".

In case of non-compliance, the penalty provision under Sec-25 of Inter State Migrant Workers Act, 1979 which provides for imprisonment of 01 (one) year or fine of Rs. 1000/- or with both shall be invoked against Principal Employer.

It was directed that all Principal Employers/Contractors should obtain necessary registration and licenses under respective labour laws in order to ensure welfare and safety of migrant worker and also register their workers with Labour Deppt., A&N Administration. All Principal Employers have been asked to submit details of all ongoing works including details of workers engaged for the purpose before the Labour Commissioner, A&N Islands, a press release from Labour Department said.

High Mast becomes essential by DSS/PMB, load of high mast should be put on standby DG sets as far as possible.

► All Govt. buildings functioning from 0830 hrs to 1700 hrs or beyond and installed with standby DG sets shall meet their own requirement by running DG sets.

► Consume power judiciously by rationalizing the power requirements by using minimal lights & other electrical gadgets and switch off all non-required lights, fans and other electrical gadgets etc.

The Executive Engineer concerned will form teams to sensitize the consumers to personally monitor for effective compliance. Surprise checks would also be initiated by the respective Executive Engineers to ensure compliance. Cooperation from general public is highly solicited for judicious usage of power, an appeal issued by SE (i/c), Electricity Department said.

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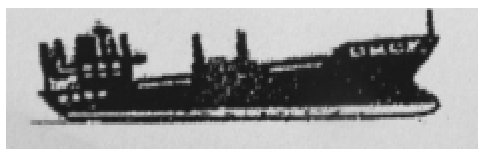
