# STATES LEAD THE WAY IN COMMUN MANAGEMENT OF ACUTE MALNUTRI

India is a heterogeneous and irse country, due to which states diverse country, due to which states require a granular approach while combating developmental chalenges. Mailurition is one such problem that, historically, has impacted the country at large. Despite several nutrition programmes, mainutrition, stunting and wasting remain readellocks to development for various state requeriments.

Each state has tried to deal with it in its unique manuer and has had varied experiences. While the problem

varietexperiencies. While the proba-persists, some have been more successfulthan others allowing states to learn from each other. One such state is Rajasthan which, as per Niti Ayog's national health index, has emerged as one of the top two states that have made the most progress on healthcare indicators

between 2015-16 and 2017-18. Rajasthan has seen a drop in death rates of newborns and children under rates of newborns and children under five years of age, a reduction share of low-birthweight babies and a rise in immunisation rates. Areading of all these indicators points to an overall impovement in child health. Similarly, Rajasthan has also been making headway indealing with malnutrition by implementing community management of malnutrilon (CMAM). Traditionally, in delia children with sevene acute in the years and the control of the

malnutrition (MAM). Traditionally, in India, children with severe acute malnutrition (SAM) have been treated in a facility (hospital-based) setting. SAM childrenae treated and stabilized through the facility-based protocal following a dinical regime that includes medical and therapeutic treatment. However, the facility-based management has certain limitations

since many people are usually reluctant to bring malnourished children to the facilities (also known as Malnutrition Treatment Center of MTCs). This reluctance increased

as Mainuthion Treatment Center or MTCs). This reluctance increased during CVID-19 due to lockdowns and fear of contracting the virus. Children with SAM have nine times more risk of dying than well-nourished children and the Rajasthan government rightly made SAM a priority for targeted intervention. Community management of malnutrition has essentially decentralized the management of SAM, making it easier to reach and treat children in their communities. It involves early det ection of children with SAM, outpatient treatment in communities (astrategy similar to the Drectly Observed Therapy that is used for Tuberculosis), timely referral to

inpatient care for those who develop or have complications, and subsequent follow-ups in the community.

ow-ups in the community.
Rajasthan's tryst with community nagement of malnutrition started in 2015 when it first implemented this as apart of the National Nutrition Mission (AKA POSHAN) in 10 districts. The success was tremendous, with around 88 per cent of SAM chidren recovering injust about 8-12 weeks of treatment. Encouraged by the pilot program's success, Rajasthan scaled up its success, Rajasthan scaled up its community management programme under POSHAN-II across 20 districts of Rajasthan involving 10,000 SAM children. This has been hailed as one of the largest CMAM projects in the country. The children were provided energy-dense nutrition supplement (EDNS) for two morths resulting in a recoveryrate of 75 per cent and around 55 per cent actained nutrition levels. 95 per cent retained nutrition levels even after the stoppage of these

even arter the stoppage or these supplements. This suggests that SAM children without medical complications can be treated successfully using supplements in the community and do not require inpatient treatment at Malnutrition Treatment Centres. There is also common consensus amo stakeholders that these centres a stakeholders that these centres are notenough to bearthe burden of SAM cases. Treatment of SAM children without medical complications through CMAM programs enables tackling the mainutition problem at a larger scale than what is possible through only patient treatment of SAM children, witchis concentrated in certain areas. Treatment centres are not a very scalable solution as they require infrastructural investment. With CMAMs, Asha workers and

Anganwadis can beengaged.

had some significant experience with
CMAM. All states that have adopted CMAM have benefited in terms of their nutrition outcomes. Concurrently, there nutrion outcomes. Concurrently, tiese seems to be some acknowledgment towards CMAM from the Central government, considering that sensitization for community management has been included in Poshan-MAAH (the government's flagship programme for improving nutritional outcomes for children.

### 30 companies may float IPOs in Oct-Nov to mop up Rs 45,000 crore

Hectic fundraising through initial public ings (IPOs) is expected in October-November, with at least 30 companies looking to collectively raise over Rs 45,000 crore through initial share-sales, merchant ces said.

Of the total fundraising, a large chunk would be garnered by technology-driven

The successful IPO of food delivery company Zomato, which was overwhelmingly subscribed by over 38 times, encouraged new-age tech companies to come out with their primary companies to come out with heir primary share sales. Historically, companies like Zomato have raised funds from private equity players, and the IPO has opened up a new source of funding for new-age tech companies, Jy di Roy, deputy vice-president formulty, exhatorical formulty. president (equity strategist) of Angel One.

The firms that are expected to raise funds through their IPOs during October tunds through their IPUs during October-Nov ember include Policy bazaar (Rs 6,017 croe), Emcure Pharmaceutcals (Rs 4,500 crore) Ny kaa (Rs 4,000 crore), CMS Info Sy stems (Rs 2,000 crore) and MobiKwik Sy stems (Rs 1,300 crore), the

# Over 90% Indian business leaders feel pandemic pressed need to improve crisis mgmt capability: Study

NEW DELHI: Over 90 per cent of the Indian business leaders opined that the Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the need to improve crisis management capabilities, says a survey by consultancy firm Pw C India.

About 59 per cent of the Indian business admitted having adversely impacted by the coronavirus pandemic, said the PwC's Global Crisis Survey 2021- India Insights.

The survey also revealed that over 80 per cent of India's business leaders have already invested in technology in the aftermath of the

In India it added business leaders were substantially more confident than global leaders about their ability to evaluate the lessons of the pandemic and put them into action. 
