MP for releasing salary of ANCOL's Assistant Professors

Forty Years Ago

Prime Minister Indira Gandhi strongly defended the decision to recognise the Heng Samrin government in Kampuchea. Addressing a press conference in Jakarta, she said that her party had decided to recognise the Heng Samrin government even before the general elections of January 1980. Sharply reacting to a correspondent's question on what India had gained from it, she said, "We do not take these decisions on the basis of deriving any benefit." "The general applied by India was that any government that was operating de facto should be recognised". Asked whether Kampuchean question figured in her discussions with President Suharto, and if there were differences with him, Mrs Gandhi said with a smile, "We both agreed that the situation should be resolved. There are bound to be differences between nations and leaders."

Antulay Petition

Justice S C Pratap of the Bombay High Court admitted the writ petition against A R Antulay and the state of Maharashtra by P B Sawant, Minral Gore and Kamal Desai challenging the allocation and distribution of cement. Justice Pratap said that the petition succeeded in making a prima facie case. The court also directed that a show cause notice be issued to Umesh Balachandra Tipnis, secretary food and civil supplies, Maharashtra government, who had filed an affidavit against the admission of the petition. It asked why a case against contempt of court should not be made against him.

US-USSR Talks

US Secretary of State, Alexander Haig and the foreign minister of the Soviet Union, Andrei Gromyko, agreed that the two countries should begin negotiations on November 30 in Geneva to reduce medium range nuclear forces in Europe.

Vaccination drive continuing smoothly in ANI

Port Blair, Sept. 26 The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in ANI Islands. As per data available, a total of 4,36,070 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in ANI Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 4,81,603 (approx.). A total of 1,69,629 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till dated 25-09-2021. A total of 2126 people were vaccinated yesterday in ANI Islands, 1616 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 278 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 334 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which, 30 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In Nicobar District, 176 beneficiaries were vaccinated out of which, 4 were in the age group of 18-44 years.



STATES LEAD THE WAY IN COMMUNITY MANAGEMENT OF ACUTE MALNUTRITION

India is a heterogeneous and diverse country, due to which states require a granular approach while combating developmental challenges. Malnutrition is one such problem that, historically, has impacted the country at large. Despite several nutrition programmes, malnutrition, stunting and wasting remain roadblocks to development for various state governments.

Each state has tried to deal with it in its unique manner and has had varied experiences. While the problem persists, some have been more successful than others allowing states to learn from each other.

One such state is Rajasthan which, as per NITI Aayog's national health index, has emerged as one of the top two states that have made the most progress on healthcare indicators

between 2015-16 and 2017-18. Rajasthan has seen a drop in death rates of newborns and children under five years of age, a reduction share of low-birthweight babies and a rise in immunisation rates. A reading of all these indicators points to an overall improvement in child health.

Similarly, Rajasthan has also been making headway in dealing with malnutrition by implementing community management of malnutrition (CMAM). Traditionally, in India, children with severe acute malnutrition (SAM) have been treated in a facility (hospital-based) setting. SAM children are treated and stabilised through the facility-based protocol following a clinical regime that includes medical and therapeutic treatment. However, the facility-based management has certain limitations

since many people are usually reluctant to bring malnourished children to the facilities (also known as Malnutrition Treatment Center or MTCs). This reluctance increased during COVID-19 due to lockdowns and fear of contracting the virus.

Children with SAM have nine times more risk of dying than well-nourished children, and the Rajasthan government rightly made SAM a priority for targeted intervention. Community management of malnutrition has essentially decentralized the management of SAM, making it easier to reach and treat children in their communities. It involves early detection of children with SAM, outpatient treatment in communities (a strategy similar to the Directly Observed Therapy that is used for Tuberculosis), timely referral to

inpatient care for those who develop or have complications, and subsequent follow-ups in the community.

Rajasthan's trust with community management of malnutrition started in 2015 when it first implemented this as a part of the National Nutrition Mission (AKA POSHAN) in 10 districts. The success was tremendous, with around 88 per cent of SAM children recovering in just about 8-12 weeks of treatment. Encouraged by the pilot program's success, Rajasthan scaled up its community management programme under POSHAN-II across 20 districts of Rajasthan involving 10,000 SAM children. This has been hailed as one of the largest CMAM projects in the country. The children were provided energy-dense nutrition supplement (EDNS) for two months resulting in a recovery rate of 75 per cent and around 95 per cent retained nutrition levels even after the stoppage of these supplements.

This suggests that SAM children without medical complications can be treated successfully using supplements in the community and do not require inpatient treatment at Malnutrition Treatment Centres. There is also common consensus among stakeholders that these centres are not enough to bear the burden of SAM cases. Treatment of SAM children without medical complications through CMAM programs enables tackling the malnutrition problem at a larger scale than what is possible through only patient treatment of SAM children, which is concentrated in certain areas. Treatment centres are not a very scalable solution as they require infrastructural investment. With CMAMs, Asha workers and

Anganwadis can be engaged.

As per Rajasthan, even states like Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat have had some significant experience with CMAM. All states that have adopted CMAM have benefited in terms of their nutrition outcomes. Concurrently, there seems to be some acknowledgment towards CMAM from the Central government, considering that sensitization for community management has been included in POSHAN-MAAH (the government's flagship programme for improving nutritional outcomes for children, pregnant women and lactating mothers) activities for this year.

However, the Central Government has still not made CMAM a part of the POSHAN guidelines. Without the Central Government's mandate, CMAM cannot be implemented at the national level. Governments ought to recognize that malnutrition has serious repercussions on human capital, poverty alleviation, and equity promotion. It also keeps people from reaching their potential and reduces the nation's economic growth. Malnourished children underperform in school, limiting their future job opportunities.

On the one hand, we regularly find state governments holding investment summits to attract capital, while on the other hand, investment in health continues to be sub-optimal. Therefore, for states to truly emerge as attractive investment destinations, efforts towards improving the ease of doing business need to be complemented with improvements in health indicators like malnutrition. As sustained reduction in malnutrition will contribute significantly to poverty reduction and increased government budgetary savings.

28,326 new COVID infections recorded in India, taking total tally of cases to 3,36,52,745

India saw a single-day rise of 28,326 new coronavirus infections, taking the country's total tally of cases to 3,36,52,745, according to Union health ministry data. The death toll has climbed to 4,46,918 with 260 daily fatalities, according to the data updated at 8 am.

The active cases have increased to 3,03,476, comprising 0.90 per cent of the total infections, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate was recorded at 97.77 per cent, the ministry said. An increase of 2,034 cases has been recorded in the active COVID-19 caseload in a span of 24 hours.

The daily positivity rate was recorded at 1.90 per cent. It has been less than 3 per cent for last 27 days.

Weekly positivity rate was recorded at 1.98 per cent. This has been below 3 per cent for the last 93 days, according to the Health Ministry. The number of people who have recuperated from

the disease surged to 3,29,02,351, while the case fatality rate was recorded at 1.33 per cent.

The cumulative doses administered in the country so far under the nationwide COVID-19 vaccination drive has exceeded 85.60 crore.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20 lakh mark on August 7, 2020, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one crore mark on December 19.

India crossed the grim milestone of two crore on May 4 and three crore on June 23. PTI PLB AAR 09261003

30 companies may float IPOs in Oct-Nov to mop up Rs 45,000 crore

Hectic fundraising through initial public offerings (IPOs) is expected in October-November, with at least 30 companies looking to collectively raise over Rs 45,000 crore through initial share sales, merchant banking sources said.

Of the total fundraising, a large chunk would be garnered by technology-driven companies.

The successful IPO of food delivery company Zomato, which was overhyped, subscribed by over 38 times, encouraged new-age tech companies to come out with their primary share sales. Historically, companies like Zomato have raised funds from private equity players, and the IPO has opened up a new source of funding for new-age tech companies. Jyoti Roy, deputy vice-president (equity strategist) of Angel One, said.

The firms that are expected to raise funds through their IPOs during October-November include Policy Bazaar (Rs 6,017 crore), Emure Pharmaceuticals (Rs 4,500 crore) Nykaa (Rs 4,000 crore), CMS Info Systems (Rs 2,000 crore) and Mobikwik Systems (Rs 1,900 crore), the

merchant banking sources said.

In addition, Northern Arc Capital (Rs 1,800 crore), Ixigo (Rs 1,600 crore), Sapphire Foods (Rs 1,500 crore), Fincare Small Finance Bank (Rs 1,330 crore), Sterile Power (Rs 1,250 crore) RateGain Travel Technologies (Rs 1,200 crore) and Supriya Lifescience (Rs 1,200 crore) may float their IPOs during the period under review, they added.

Angel One's Roy attributed the impressive IPO pipeline in the coming month to several factors, including a stronger-than-expected recovery in the economy after the second wave of COVID, continued FPIs and domestic flows in the markets and an increase in retail participation in the stock market in the past year.

Going forward, the IPO boom is expected to extend in the coming year as the prevailing market situation remains constant or doesn't change much, Kaushendra Singh Sengar, founder and CEO at INVEST19, said.

Making a similar statement, Nikhil Kamath, co-founder of True Beacon and Zerodha, said if the bull run continues for the next 1-2 years, the IPO rush will continue. Moreover, the technology sector is expected to remain a major market driver.

So far, in 2021, as many as 40 companies have floated their IPOs to raise Rs 64,217 crore. Further, Aditya Birla Sun Life AMC will launch its Rs 2,778-crore initial share sale on September 29.

Apart from these, PowerGrid InvIT, the infrastructure investment trust (InvIT) sponsored by Power Grid Corporation of India, mopped up Rs 7,735 crore through its IPO, and Brookfield India Real Estate Trust raised Rs 3,800 crore via its initial share sale. This was way higher than Rs 26,611 crore raised by 15 companies through initial share sales in the whole of

2020.

Such impressive fundraising through IPOs was last seen in 2017 when firms mopped Rs 67,147 crore through 36 initial share sales.

According to Kamath, IPOs rely heavily on market cycles, and the IPO exuberance that has been witnessed in the last 18 months is a function of the current bull cycle. Companies look to take advantage of investor sentiment.

"The market is touching new highs and the strong response that we see in the primary market is nudging companies who were sitting on the fences to come and take advantage of the buoyant market," Vikas Singhania, CEO of TradeSmart, said. He further said that companies are raising money for growth capital or organic growth opportunities in the future. Many of the IPOs are an offer for sale (OFS), where private equity players or the promoter wants to cash out part of their holding.

"Nowadays, the entire process of IPO garners a bit of attention for such companies that act as an indirect promotion," Kamath said. Initial share sales are receiving tremendous applications from investors, and IPOs have been subscribing multiple times. This has pushed companies to raise funds through IPO.

The initial share sales of almost a dozen companies including Paras Defense and Space Technologies, MTAR Technologies, Easy Trip Planners, Devyani International, Rolex Rings, Tatva Chintan Pharma Chem and Nazara Technologies subscribed over 100 times.

Interestingly, the ongoing calendar year saw most of the IPOs opening with a premium over the issue price, suggesting a strong investor appetite.

Laxmi Organic Industries, MTAR Technologies, Easy Trip Planners, GR InfraProjects, Clean Science and Technology, MacroTech Developers and Amri Organics, which got listed this year, are trading above their issue price, giving smart returns in the range of 110 to 320 per cent, since listing, to investors.

INVEST19's Sengar said that with the current favourable interest rate scenario along with high liquidity, financial institutions offer IPO funding products at lower rates. The lower cost of funding will continue to support the IPO boom. Further, PSU disinvestment will be a blockbuster to support the ongoing IPO boom. Listing of LIC is expected to happen in 2021-2022, which will be one of the largest IPOs in the history of the Indian market. This will aid the current ongoing buoyancy in the IPO market for 2022, he added. Earlier this month, SEBI chairman Ajay Tyagi said that growth-oriented technology companies have raised Rs 15,000 crore through initial share sales in the last 18 months and IPOs worth around Rs 30,000 crore by such firms are in the pipeline.

"Growing number of unicorns in the start-up ecosystem is a testimony of the new-age tech companies coming of age in our economy. These companies often follow a unique business model focusing more on rapid growth than immediate profitability," he had said.

Over 90% Indian business leaders feel pandemic pressed need to improve crisis mgmt capability: Study



NEW DELHI: Over 90 per cent of the Indian business leaders opined that the Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the need to improve crisis management capabilities, says a survey by consultancy firm PwC India.

About 59 per cent of the Indian business admitted having adversely impacted by the coronavirus pandemic, said the PwC's Global Crisis Survey 2021- India Insights.

The survey also revealed that over 80 per cent of India's business leaders have already invested in technology in the aftermath of the pandemic.

In India, it added, business leaders were substantially more confident than global leaders about their ability to evaluate the lessons of the pandemic and put them into action. 92 per cent of India organisations said they were 'confident' vs just 75 per cent of global leaders, the survey said. The responses of India's business leaders were largely in line with the overall results of PwC's Global Crisis Survey 2021, showing only minor areas of significant divergence in views and insights. About the survey, PwC said more than 2,800 business leaders around the world shared company data and personal insights into the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and the future of enterprise resilience. "With 99 respondents representing Indian organisations, our report offers an analysis of how our business community is responding and how leaders are applying the lessons of this era to prepare for the next disruption," it said.

As per the survey, the top 5 priorities cited by business leaders going forward are, include accelerate transformations in organisational areas

identified during the crisis (99 per cent); adapt strategy to respond nimbly to major interruptions and implement changes (96 per cent); and implement a reaction/review process to assess response to future incidents and crisis (89 per cent). The other two are: Actively work on increasing resilience in the near future (86 per cent) and make changes to corporate strategy in response to the pandemic (51 per cent). Puneet Garkhel, Partner and Leader, Forensics Services, PwC India, said that operations and supply chain, finance and liquidity, and workforce are the three areas in which Indian businesses experienced "significant" or "critical"

impact owing to the pandemic. According to the survey, another key focus for business leaders across all sectors was employee wellbeing - 90 per cent agreed (68 per cent strongly) that their response to the crisis took into account the physical and emotional needs of their employees.

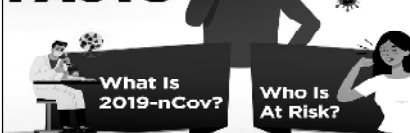

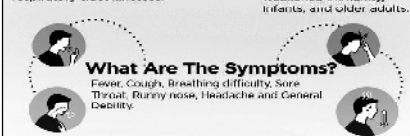

YAMAHA EXAMINING FACTORS LIKE PRICING, CHARGING INFRASTRUCTURE BEFORE EV ROLLOUT

Japanese two-wheeler major Yamaha is closely looking at development of enabling factors like charging infrastructure and battery production before entering the electric vehicle segment in the country, according to a top company official.

We are contemplating on factors like pricing, performance and infrastructure before we roll out any products for the Indian market," Yamaha Motor India Chairman Motohumi Shitara told PTI.

He noted that the Fascio 125 Fi Hybrid and the

RayZR 125 Fi Hybrid are the company's first step towards entering the EV space in the Indian market.

"The hybrid technology with electric power assist in our 125cc scooter range is just one of many technological advancements achieved in the field of electric mobility by Yamaha, which we have introduced in the Indian market. With time, we intend to introduce similar technological advancements, eventually entering the EV space," Shitara noted.

On the company's growth plans in the premium segment, he stated that Yamaha is committed to having a strong presence in the premium 125cc scooter, 150cc and 250cc motorcycle space, with a strategically planned product portfolio that consists of two-wheelers for all riding possibilities—new riders, experienced riders and riders seeking the finest technologies or advanced controls.

Currently, Yamaha enjoys around 20 per cent market share in the premium (149cc-155cc) motorcycle segment.

"We strongly believe that there is a huge opportunity for us in this segment as the customers are stepping up from the lower-displacement bikes to higher models for more excitement. The perception of customers is continuously changing; over the

years, we have noticed that customers are now demanding for high-performance two-wheelers, representing their spirit of riding," Shitara said.

Going forward, the company will stand by its commitment to introduce global excitement of racing and motorcycling culture in India with an aim to strengthen its position in the premium segment, focusing more on reaching out to a wider audience in metro cities and surrounding districts, where the demand for personal mobility will surge more than ever, he added.

He added that the 150cc segment holds enormous value for both step-up customers and new riders and Yamaha has always been a strong contender in this category, with a strong 20 per cent share in the 149cc-155cc motorcycle segment.

We intend to acquire a larger percent age with the newly launched YZF-R15 V4 and the AEROX 155, along with our existing range of premium offerings in the 125cc scooter, and the 150cc and 250cc motorcycling space," Shitara said.

Elaborating further, he noted that over the years, motorcycling has become a lifestyle statement for most millennials, with the industry witnessing a shift in paradigm in terms of performance and features as customers today are a lot more aware about the global product range and expect the same in India as well.

"Along with growing expectations, purchasing power has also surged and customers are willing to invest in two-wheelers with advanced features and technology," Shitara said.

He added that going forward, the company would also be introducing connected mobility solutions in its models along with some innovative technology to enhance the safety quotient of its products, to stay more relevant in the market.

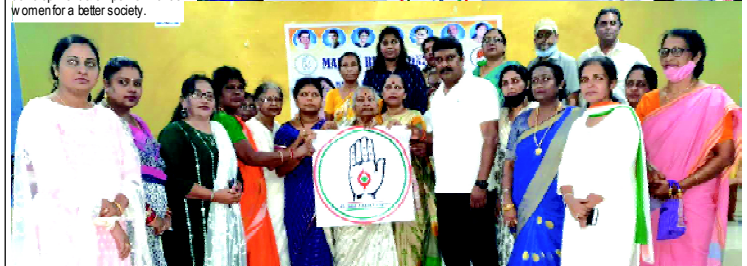
