## Tylerabad road in a dismal condition; commuters fume over non-repair by APWD

Port Blair, Sept 14: Battered condition of the roads leading from Garachama junction to Tylerabad has become a nightmare for commuters. With the onset of the rainy season, the arterial stretch at Tylerabad has become unmovable, causing untold hardships to motorists.

People in the region are vexed over the stretch of road pockmarked with massive potholes and crater with the onset of the monsoon season. Two-wheeler riders get stained with muddy watersplashed on them by passing vehicles. Many accidents have been reported on the stretch in the past few days, while four-wheeler owners have also suffered damages negotiating the stretches, as per reports. "People who ride motorcycles are worst affected due to the dips that have emerged on the main road here. Bad roads are responsible for more strain on the spinal cord

with long-term health risks. It also affects the vehicle and motorists are forced to shell out money from the hard-earned income on getting them repaired. Some have also suffered injuries in mishaps that occurred in the past few days. Despite pleas, the authorities had taken no steps to ensure repair and renovation of the road network before the onset of the monsoon season and motorists will have to face the problems for

the next few months. Residents blame that the main reasons of this pathetic condition of this road is due to plying of heavy vehicles. Hundreds of heavily loaded trucks ply in this road causing damages to the road. Trucks are getting stuck on the deep muddy potholes on many stretches of this road. The muddy stretches had become a perpetual source of fret for commuters and local residents.

## MP urges CS to resume services of M.L. Peema between Long Island & Yerrata



Port Blair, Sept 14: Highlighting the problems being faced by residents of Long Island due to withdrawal of M.L. Peema vessel, from Long Island - Yerrata Jetty route, the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary of Andaman and Nicobar Administration to resume the service of the vessel.

In his letter, the Member of Parliament mentioned that the vessel M.L. Peema was the only 'safe' means of transportation between Long Island and Rangat but since 8th September 2021, the vessel has been withdrawn due to the non availability of Engine Oil. Such sudden withdrawal has put the residence of long island in big trouble.

The Member of Parliament added that people who need to visit Rangat area for various needs like treatments, banking works, daily purchases, official duties, schools etc are facing huge difficulties. He added that now in case of urgency, they have to travel by small Dinghy, which is not only expensive but also risky for people.

availability of bus services is causing lot of difficulties to commuters in this region. Hundreds of office goers who do not have their own vehicles depend on the bus services. The residents of this region have been demanding bus trip in this route.

Port Blair, Sept 14: The villagers of Durgapur and the Commercial vehicle owners today morning organized a Chakka jam at Durgapur gram Panchayat at Diglipur demanding to make the road motable from Aerial Bay to Lamia Bay. A large number of villagers along with EX PRI members gathered at

Durgapur chowk and pressed for a solution to the long-pending demand for immediate repair of the dilapidated main/rural roads. As per reports the Chakka jam was started at 8 pm and ended at 10:30 am. During this jam, the road was blocked by the villagers for all routes. It's pertinent to mention that the rural roads remained neglected for a decade

without any repair. Immediately the Assistant Commissioner, Diglipur, Mr Ankit Yadav, IAS, Revenue and NH officials reached the spot and NH officials assured that within 3 hours the road repair work in the area will start. ### Education vision

Crunching down-the-line backhands and smacking deep forehands cross-court saw Emma Raducanu keep it all crisp in her breakout Grand Slam title victory at the US Open. Even by women's tennis' non-jaded standards, where 20 different players have become Slam champs in the last 10 years, the all-teen final featuring 18-year-old Raducanu and Leylah Fernandez, 19, at Flushing Meadows, seemed to speak of dewey spring in the autumn tournament. Raducanu, with her backstory of immigrant upbringing in the United Kingdom, while being born in Canada to Romanian and Chinese parents, made it a persuasive watch. In an Olympic year, the history-making champion — British Virginian Wade last won a Slam in 1977 — is expected to edge out Tom Daley of August Tokyo Olympic vintage for the BBC Sports Personality of the Year honours.

Raducanu's story is different from so many other teenage prodigies. Call it the immigrant's enterprise or the genius of the young woman, Emma aces academics with straight-A's and could've taken her pick from among swimming, golf or table tennis. Tales continue to trickle out about her unwavering focus in training through the pandemic, on streets outside her home and at the neighbourhood tennis club.

Women's tennis doesn't recreate the Big Four aura of the men's game. With no one dominating, it tends to lean back and observe how many waves the likes of Angelique Kerber, Simona Halep, Garbine Muguruzca, and most recently Naomi Osaka and Ashleigh Barty, can ride. Time will tell if Raducanu can hold aloft a few, or many, trophies and string together consistent seasons. There's the additional challenge to live up to British expectations, which are never tempered, nor proportional, and Sweet Caroline is a fluttering hope away.

As per data available, a total of 3, 90, 407 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 12, 81, 003 (approx.). A total of 3, 122 people were vaccinated yesterday in A&N Islands. A total of 1, 58, 049 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till dated 13-09-2021. 2641 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 1668 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 244 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 138 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 237 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District out of which 14 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years.

## 11 STATES MEET TARGET FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURE IN FIRST QUARTER OF 2021-22

Eleven states have achieved the target set by the finance ministry for the capital expenditure in the first quarter of 2021-22. As an incentive, these 11 states have been granted permission by the government to borrow an additional amount of Rs 15,721 crore. With an aim to speed up capital expenditure by states, which in turn will boost economy, the Union finance ministry had incentivised their borrowing. To become eligible for incremental borrowing, states were required to achieve at least 15 per cent of the target set for 2021-22 by the end of first quarter of 2021-22, 45 per cent by the end of second quarter, 70 per cent by the end of third quarter and 100 per cent by March 31, 2022.

"The additional open market borrowing permission granted is equivalent to 0.25 per cent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP). Additional financial resources thus made available will help the states in pushing their capital expenditure further," the finance ministry said.

The states which have met the capital expenditure target are Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.

Andhra Pradesh will be eligible to borrow Rs 2,655 crore, Madhya Pradesh Rs 2,590 crore, Rajasthan Rs 2,593 crore, Kerala Rs 2,255 crore, Haryana Rs 2,015 crore, Bihar Rs 1,699 crore, Chhattisgarh Rs 895 crore, Uttarakhand, Rs 654 crore, Manipur Rs 90 crore, Meghalaya Rs 96 crore, and Nagaland Rs 89 crore. According to ministry, the capital expenditure has a high multiplier effect, enhances the future productive capacity of the economy, and results in a higher rate of economic growth. Accordingly, out of the net borrowing ceiling (NBC) of 4 per cent of GSDP for the states for 2021-22, 0.50 per cent of GSDP was earmarked for incremental capital expenditure to be incurred by the states during 2021-22. The target for incremental capital

expenditure for each state to qualify for this incremental borrowing was fixed by the

department of expenditure. The next review of capital expenditure of states will be undertaken by the

Department of Expenditure in December 2021. In this round, capital expenditure achieved by the states till 30th September, 2021 will be assessed. The third review will be done in the month of March, 2022 on the basis of capital expenditure incurred by the state during the first three quarters of the year 2021-22. The capital expenditure-linked borrowing ceiling of 0.50 per cent of GSDP will be allowed to those states who will achieve actual capital expenditure of at least 45 per cent of the target by September 30, 2021, or 70 per cent of the target by December 31, 2021. "There would be a final review of actual capital expenditure by the states in the month of June, 2022. Any shortfall/inefficiency in actual capital expenditure for the year 2021-22 by the state in comparison with the targeted capital expenditure for the year 2021-22, will be adjusted from the borrowing ceiling of the state for the year 2022-23," the ministry said.



### ICMR receives Centre's nod to undertake experimental delivery of vaccines in Andaman, NE states

New Delhi/UNIT: The Indian Council for Medical Research (ICMR) has received permission from the union government to conduct experimental delivery of vaccines using drones in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands and North-East states. The Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) announced on Monday.

"The permission has been granted to ICMR for conducting experimental Bay and Visual Line of Sight (BVLOS) vaccine delivery in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Manipur, and Nagaland up to a height of 3000 meters using drones," the ministry said.

"This exemption shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the said airspace clearance and shall be valid for a period of one

year from the date of approval of the said airspace clearance or until further orders, whichever is earlier," the ministry said.

The permission to the ICMR has been given for a joint research programme to be initiated by the apex medical research institute and Indian Institute of Kanpur (IIT-K) together to test the feasibility of delivering vaccines by drones in difficult terrains, sources in ICMR told UNIT.

However, the ICMR is still working on the nuances before starting the experimental programme. The senior government officials at the Union Health Ministry are of the opinion that the ICMR's project would help in accelerating the Covid-19 vaccination drive by delivering

vaccines to hilly and remote regions of the country.

Last week on Saturday, Union Minister for Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia had launched first of its kind 'Medicines from the Sky' project at Vikarabad in Telangana state under which drugs and vaccines will be delivered using drones.

On Aug 25, the MoCA had notified the liberalised Drone Rules, 2021, a much more liberalised regime for unmanned aircraft systems than what existed previously.

Under the new rules, a draft of which was released in July, several requirements and approvals have been abolished and this is expected to make drone operations simpler for civilian drone operators.

## Wholesale Price Index inflation rises to 11.39% in August: Centre

New Delhi, 14<sup>th</sup> Sep, 2021: The wholesale price-based inflation rose to 11.39 per cent in August in India, said the Ministry of Commerce and Industry on September 14. The Wholesale Price Index (WPI) inflation was 0.41 per cent in August 2020, the ministry said in a press release.

Snapping the two-month easing trend, WPI inflation rose in August and remained in double-digits for the fifth consecutive month. In July 2021, WPI inflation stood at 11.16 per cent.

The high rate of inflation in August 2021 is primarily due to the

rise in prices of non-food articles, mineral oils; crude petroleum and natural gas; manufactured products like basic metals; food products; textiles; chemicals and chemical products, etc. as compared to the corresponding month of the previous year, the release stated.

Inflation in food articles eased for the fourth straight month, recording (-) 1.29 per cent in August, from zero per cent in July; even as onion and pulses prices spiked. Inflation in onions was high at 62.78 per cent, while that in pulses was 9.41 per cent. In vegetables, it

was (-) 13.30 per cent in August. Inflation in crude petroleum and natural gas was 40.03 per cent in August.

In manufactured products, inflation stood at 11.39 per cent in August, against 11.20 per cent in July. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), which mainly takes into account retail inflation, in its monetary policy in August kept interest rates unchanged at record lows. It projected CPI or retail inflation at 5.7 per cent during 2021-22, up from its earlier projection of 5.1 per cent.





# SpaceX set to launch first all-civilian space mission into orbit



The first all-civilian crew is set to ride into Earth orbit from the historic Launch Complex 39A at NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida.

Elon Musk's SpaceX is set to launch four people into space Wednesday on a three-day mission called Inspiration4.

The SpaceX flight will be led by billionaire entrepreneur Jared Isaacman, the American founder and chief executive of e-commerce firm Shift4 Payments. Isaacman's main intention is to raise awareness and support for one of his favorite causes, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, a leading pediatric cancer center. He has pledged \$100 million personally to the institute.

The crew will bring items like artwork from patents on board the Crew Dragon spacecraft to auction off to benefit St. Jude.

29-year-old Hayley Arceneaux, St. Jude ambassador will be on board with Isaacman. Chris Sembroski, 41, and Dr. Sian Proctor, 51 will also be flying on Inspiration4 mission. Sembroski is an Iraq War veteran and engineer with Lockheed Martin. Proctor is a professor of geology and science communicator.

The spacecraft will circle the globe once every 90 minutes at more than 27,360 kph. The target altitude is 575 kilometers, beyond the orbits of the International Space Station or even the Hubble Space Telescope. After three days of orbiting the Earth, the spacecraft will splash down in the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Florida.

Organisers expect a 70 percent chance of favorable weather conditions for the launch atop a Falcon 9 rocket to orbit Earth aboard its Crew Dragon spacecraft. The crew have got commercial astronaut training that lasted months. The lessons include orbital mechanics, operating in microgravity, zero gravity, vehicle and spacecraft, space suit and spacecraft exercises and mission simulations. There were also trained managing stress, handling emergency situations.

The astro-tourist team will have no part to play in operating their spacecraft as the flight is fully autonomous. However, the mission is not a joyride. Once in orbit, the crew will perform medical experiments during their three-day trip.

"You're riding a rocket at 17,500 miles (28,000 kilometers) per hour around the Earth. In that kind of environment there's risks," Isaacman said in a Netflix documentary.

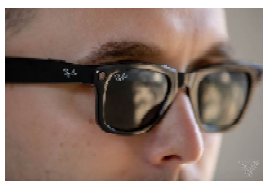

## After Ray-Ban, Xiaomi unveils microLED smart glasses



and Ray-Ban announced their collaboration for a new smart glass, the Ray-Ban Stories.

Xiaomi had earlier announced a significant rebranding for its premium product series, dropping the "Mi" branding in favour of "Xiaomi"—with a new logo to boot. "Ushering in the festive season, Xiaomi's premium product series "Mi" will be renamed to "Xiaomi" the company said.

With a teaser video promising to make smartphones "a thing of the past" if you imagine "every smartphone function integrated into what you wear", Xiaomi on Tuesday unveiled a smart glasses concept—just days after Ray-Ban and Facebook unveiled their own product in this space. Xiaomi says its Smart Glasses can display messages and notifications, make calls, navigate, capture photos, and translate text "right before your eyes". The video shows how the glasses can be used to take photos (a tap on the side), translate a menu from Mandarin to English, and projection image the size of a small billboard in front of the user's eye. There is even Heads-Up Display navigation with a mini-map style display. Xiaomi says its Smart Glasses will weigh just 51g, and has a display chip measuring just 2.4x2.01mm—roughly the size of a grain of rice. # ODISHA TO USE BEES TO PREVENT ELEPHANTS FROM ENTERING HUMAN HABITATIONS

In a bid to reduce man-elephant conflict, the Odisha government has decided to use honey bees to prevent the pachyderms from straying into human habitations, a senior forest official said on Tuesday.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (Wildlife) Sashi Paul said that the RE-HAB (Reducing Human-Elephant Attacks Using Bees) project will be launched in Athmallik Forest Division of Angul district in the first phase.

"Beehive boxes will be strategically placed on the periphery of forests and routes usually taken by elephants to enter human habitations. A wire will be tied to the boxes. When the pachyderms pass through the routes and stamp on the wire, the honey bees will attack and drive them back into the forests," he said.

The joint project of the Forest and Environment Department and the Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) was conceived keeping in view the high number of fatalities in man-elephant conflict.

While over 900 people have been killed in elephant attacks in the last one decade, 282 pachyderms

have died in only the last three years due to several factors including poaching, the official said.

Similar projects have succeeded in South Africa and other countries, and in states like Uttarakhand and Karnataka, he said.

A meeting was organised with residents of three villages lying on the periphery of Chandaka Sanctuary, Badampahar Forest Range and Similipal National Park.

The Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru has been assigned the job of putting radio collars on three elephants this week, he said.

Paul said that the Forest Department has also decided to commence 'Gaja Sathi Yojana' (Friend of Elephants) programme by involving volunteers of Van Suraksha Samiti to provide early inputs on the movement of the pachyderms.

Five members of each Van Suraksha Samiti will be engaged as Gaja Sathi and will be provided with firecrackers, lights and other equipment to track and drive elephant herds away from the human habitations. Each Samiti will be provided with an annual financial assistance of Rs 25,000, he said.

Paul said that human-elephant conflicts mostly happen during the harvest season from September-March and the project will be



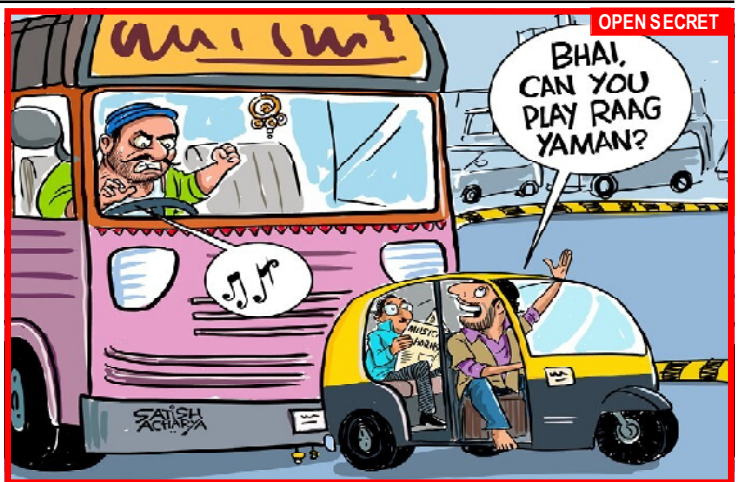
launched in this period.

"The government will closely monitor and study the impact of the project on the elephants," he said. The administration also plans to fit radio collars on specific marauding elephants that create nuisance in human habitations on the periphery of Chandaka Sanctuary, Badampahar Forest Range and Similipal National Park.

The Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru has been assigned the job of putting radio collars on three elephants this week, he said.

## Indian study finds big drop in COVID antibodies within 4 months of vaccination

Bhubaneswar, 14<sup>th</sup> Sep, 2021: A study of 614 fully vaccinated health workers in India found a 'significant' drop in their COVID-fighting antibodies within four months of the first shot.

The findings could help the Indian government decide whether to provide booster doses as some Western countries have done. Waning antibodies do not necessarily mean that immunised people lose their ability to counter the disease, as the body's memory cells may still kick in to offer substantial protection, said the director of a state-run institute that did the study.

"After six months, we should be able to tell you more clearly whether and when a booster would be needed," Sanghamitra Pati of the Regional Medical Research Centre, based in the eastern city of Bhubaneswar, told Reuters on Tuesday. "And we would urge similar studies in different areas for pan-India data."

British researchers said last month that protection offered by two doses of the Pfizer/BioNTech and the AstraZeneca vaccines begins to fade within six months. The Indian study, published in the Research Square pre-print platform but yet to be peer-reviewed, is one of the first such done in the country involving its main two vaccines - Covishield, a licensed version of the AstraZeneca shot and domestically developed Covaxin. Health officials say though they are studying the evolving science on booster doses, the priority is to fully immunise India's 944 million adults. More than 60% of them have received at least one dose and 19% the required two doses.
