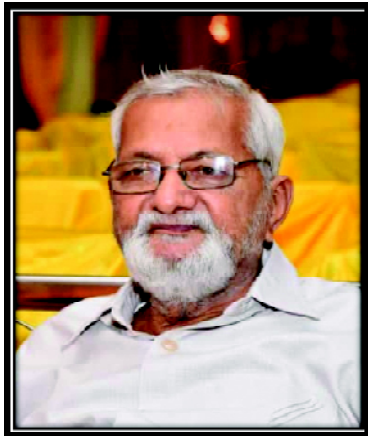

Bad bank

On Thursday, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced that the government had approved extending a guarantee of Rs 30,600 crore to the National Asset Reconstruction Company Ltd (NARCL) — colloquially referred to as the bad bank — to help clear stressed loans worth Rs 2 lakh crore from the balance sheets of banks. As the buyer of these bad loans, NARCL, through its operational entity, India Debt Resolution Company, will be tasked with the resolution of these assets. This may perhaps lead to better outcomes as consolidating loans from multiple banks into a single entity may lead to a more effective, and timely resolution process.

Under this framework, Rs 90,000 crore of loans, which banks have fully provided for, will be transferred in the first phase. NARCL will purchase these loans in an 15:85 format — 15 per cent of the value will be paid in cash, while security receipts will be issued for the balance amount. The upfront cash payment will aid cash flows of banks. But the process of price discovery — the price at which NARCL buys these loans from the banks — might prove to be challenging even though the transaction involves the public sector as both buyer and seller. Banks though will have the freedom to sell the security receipts. From the perspective of investors, to the extent that the receipts are guaranteed by the government, their downside is protected. But to what extent a secondary market for such securities evolves is debatable. On its part, the government is pushing for a time-bound resolution of the assets by giving a five-year period for the invocation of the guarantee. But considering that these loans have been written down by banks, it is difficult to gauge what this will yield. The absence of buyers as reflected in the IBC process, the extent to which financial creditors have had to take haircuts on their admitted claims, all raise questions over the market appetite on both sides of the transaction. To be effective, the resolution process will need to be managed in a timely manner by capable personnel as delays will only lead to value destruction. Resolution is after all preferable to liquidation. From the government's perspective, the security receipts guaranteed by it are a contingent liability. If the proceeds from resolution of these bad loans exceed the guaranteed amount, then there will be no outflow from its side.

The creation of a bad bank could help clean up bank balance sheets — though in the absence of a successful resolution it may end up being a repository for bad loans. But it does not in any way address the underlying cause of the bad loan problem in India — the credit culture that exists at public sector banks. Only by reforming the banking system in India, especially the public sector banks, can the financial system be made more efficient.

FIFTH SERO-SURVEY FINDS ANTIBODIES IN 86% OF MUMBAIKARS

In India's second-most populous city, Mumbai, up to nine in every ten people has antibodies against COVID-19, according to the results of the latest sero-survey by the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai.

The fifth sero-survey conducted in the BMC's jurisdiction has found antibodies in 90.26 per cent of people

who were fully or partially vaccinated, and in 79.86 per cent of unvaccinated citizens. The overall sero-prevalence in the city of Greater Mumbai is 86.64 per cent.

Prevalence of antibodies in people from slum as well as non-slum areas much higher compared to previous sero-surveys.

The study was cross-sectional in nature and included participants above 18 years of age, from all 24 wards of the city of Greater Mumbai, the MCGM said in a release.

"Overall Sero-prevalence in the city of Greater Mumbai is 86.64 per cent. The study estimates around 87.02 per cent prevalence in slums

and 86.22 per cent prevalence in non-slums in the 24 wards. Sero-prevalence among males is 85.07 per cent and sero-prevalence among females is 88.29 per cent which is higher as compared to males. Almost 65 per cent of the study subjects received COVID-19 vaccine and 35 per cent did not receive any vaccine."

"Sero-prevalence amongst partially and fully vaccinated participants is 90.26 per cent. Sero-prevalence amongst those who have not taken COVID-19 vaccine is 79.86 per cent. Out of total samples, 20 per cent were health care workers. Sero-prevalence in health care workers is 87.14 per cent. The age-wise sero-prevalence varies from 80 per cent to 91 per cent among the study subjects."

The report notes that overall sero-positivity to the extent of 86 per cent is based on qualitative test results and does not indicate protective levels of IgG antibodies. "It is therefore recommended to continue to strictly follow COVID appropriate behaviour" including using masks correctly, washing hands frequently and maintaining social distancing."

An earlier sero-survey had found that over 50 per cent of Greater Mumbai's pediatric population (those below and up to the age of 18) had antibodies against COVID-19.

Maharashtra as a whole was reporting 3,783 cases of COVID-19 on Wednesday. Mumbai reported a test-positive rate of just 1.71 per cent with 514 new COVID-19 cases.

for counselling, candidates selected for admission during counselling session shall be given admission on the same day. Candidates have been advised to attend counselling as per the serial number/session wise/subject wise/all categories final merit list. Those who fail to attend the counselling session on specified date and time will not be considered for admission to the respective course and the next eligible candidate from the merit list will be considered for admission. However, if any candidate from outer island is

unable to attend counselling due to sudden breakdown of transportation and if their name is in the merit list, they have been asked to intimate their position over telephone, in any one of the given numbers (landline 03192-240482, mobile/whatsapp no. 9679504372, 9933243263) so that their claims for admission can be protected during counselling. Such information should reach these phone numbers well before counselling till 21.09.2021 (04:00 pm). If no information is received, next eligible candidate will be considered for admission.

All colleges in Kerala to reopen from October 4

All higher education institutions, including professional colleges, in Kerala, will be reopened on October 4. The state government issued an order in this regard on Friday.

Classes for final year post-graduate courses (third and fourth semesters) have been permitted to function with cent per cent attendance. Meanwhile, the classes for final year courses for degree students (fifth and sixth semesters) can be held in batches on alternate days with 50 per cent attendance or daily provided there is sufficient room.

Educational institutions have been told to seek the assistance of local bodies, health workers and volunteers to disinfect the campuses before classes resume. The heads of institutions are made responsible for the adherence of COVID-19 protocol at campuses. Students must maintain social distancing and avoid crowding, the order states.

Online mode to continue

However, the classes for all other semesters other than those mentioned above will continue in the online mode. The colleges have been urged to devise suitable timetables to manage online and offline classes. The government has called for the formation of Jagratha Committees to monitor the safe conduct of classes.

Class timings

The educational institutions have been advised to host sessions between 8.30 am and 1.30 pm. The other timings recommended for the college councils by the education department are 9 am to 3 pm, 9.30 am to 3.30 pm and 10 am to 4 pm. Institutions have been advised to devise a timetable by mixing online and offline classes, the entire duration of which should be 25 hours a week.

Work from home to continue Teaching and non-teaching staff must mark their attendance at the colleges. However, to balance the ongoing online

classes, work from home mode shall continue and the college councils have been assigned the responsibility of scheduling the shifts on a rotation basis. The members of the staff permitted to continue in the work from home mode are mothers with babies under one year, pregnant women, and critically ill.

Even students who fall under the categories mentioned above have been exempted from having regular attendance.

Hostels to open Students' hostels have been allowed to function by adhering to the COVID-19 protocols. The heads of institutions have been told to ensure that the protocol is strictly implemented at hostels.

Not for practical classes The state government has said for science subjects, practical classes could be prioritised.

Meanwhile, engineering colleges have been told to follow the present system of having six hours of classes daily

India adds 35,662 COVID-19 cases; active cases rise to 3,40,639

India saw a single day rise of 35,662 new COVID-19 infections, while the active cases increased to 3,40,639, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Saturday.

The active cases now comprise 1.02 per cent of the total infections and the national COVID-19 recovery rate has been recorded at 97.65 per cent, it said.

Also, 14,48,833 tests were conducted on Friday, taking the total cumulative tests conducted so far to 55,07,80,273, it said.

The daily positivity rate has been recorded at 2.46 per cent. It has been less than three per cent for the last 19 days, according to the data. The weekly positivity rate has been recorded at 0.02 per cent. It has been below three per cent for the last 85 days, the ministry said. The number of people who have recuperated from the disease is 3,26,32,222, while the case fatality rate has been recorded at 1.33 per cent, it said.

The cumulative doses administered in the country so far

under the vaccination drive has exceeded 79.42 crore, according to the ministry. India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7 last year, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark on December 19 last year. India recorded two crore cases on May 4 and three crore cases on June 23.

BSF resumes public viewing of Attari-Wagah retreat ceremony



The BSF has resumed the public viewing of the daily flag lowering retreat ceremony along the India-Pakistan border front in Punjab, over a year and half after it was suspended due to the Covid outbreak, the force said on Friday.

A Border Security Force (BSF) spokesperson said it was allowed again from the Indian side on Wednesday with a limited number of audience seated in the spectators gallery.

The over an hour-long event takes place at Attari, about 26 km from Amritsar city, opposite Wagah of Pakistan.

The public viewing was suspended by India on March 7 to contain the coronavirus spread.

India and Pakistan have been traditionally hosting the evening flag-lowering ceremonies at the Attari-Wagah border for many years now and the event is attended by a huge number of people from both countries as well as foreign nationals.

The BSF conducts the synchronised ceremony in coordination with their counterparts Pak Rangers and it involves lowering of the flags of the two countries along with foot stomping manoeuvres of the troops with patriotic songs playing in the background.

NO NEED FOR COVID BOOSTER DOSES IN INDIA AT THIS STAGE, SAY EXPERTS

Will a booster shot provide the turbocharge for Covid immunity that India is looking for? Maybe in an ideal situation where most people are fully vaccinated but not less than a quarter of the adult population has received both doses, say experts.

As the global debate on booster shots gathers momentum, several scientists here said the priority must be to ensure that more people are inoculated with at least their first jab.

Immunologist Satyajit Rath said that less than 15 per cent of Indian adults have been vaccinated with two doses, and this clearly means that all Indians who are more vulnerable to infection have not yet necessarily gotten two doses.

"I therefore think that it is ethically premature to begin planning a third dose to a fortunate category of people at this stage, Rath, from New Delhi's National Institute of Immunology (NII)," told PTI.

It is also pragmatically premature to do so, since we have no really clear idea of who is 'more vulnerable to infection'. We do know that some co-morbid categories are more vulnerable to serious illness, but two doses of the current vaccines currently protect quite well against that, he explained.

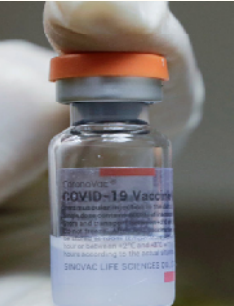
Immunologist Vineeta Bal agreed, saying India should not think of providing booster doses at this stage when about 40 per cent of the eligible population is yet to receive the first dose.

"In her view, vulnerable people, those with co-morbidities, may be considered for additional shots on a case by case basis. But it has to be remembered that additional shots do not cover specific variants, which are supposed to be more dangerous," Bal, guest faculty at Pune's Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, told

PTI. Hence the utility of an additional shot will be limited, in terms of expanding immunity, she argued.

Though India has not yet rolled out the third dose, there are reports some healthcare workers and politicians in Mumbai have taken a booster shot.

Indian Council of Medical



Research (ICMR) Director General Balram Bhargava said earlier this week that a booster dose is not the central theme at the moment and getting two doses remains the major priority.

On Friday, India administered a record over 2.5 crore COVID-19 vaccine doses, taking the cumulative number of doses administered in the country to 79.33 crore, according to data on the co-WIN portal. With this, an estimated 63 per cent of India's adult population has received its first dose and 21 per cent are fully vaccinated, official sources said.

According to Rath, all current Covid vaccines in use worldwide

remain very effective for protection against serious illness or death from the infection, without any booster doses.

While antibody levels are indeed going down after a few months, this is neither surprising nor does it necessarily indicate any substantial loss of this kind of protection. How much longer it will be before any such loss begins to be seen is an empirical question for which we will have to wait for data, the scientist added.

Identifying population groups with an increased risk of infections within a fully vaccinated population is necessary to minimise the death rate, said researcher Naga Suresh Veerapu.

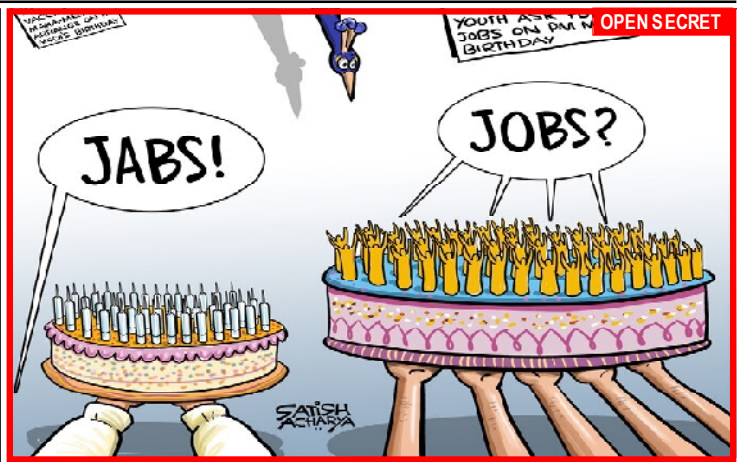
The reasons for booster doses may differ by population groups at risk, type of vaccine, waning immunity, variants of concern, and clinical and epidemiological settings, said the associate professor, Department of Life Sciences, School of Natural Sciences (SNS), Shiv Nadar University, Delhi-NCR.

There is an argument for booster shots if countries have the luxury to administer them.

The need has been emphasised due to concerns over waning immunity provided by vaccines and also the rise of the Covid variants, especially the Delta strain.

A recent study by ICMR-regional medical research centre (RMRC), Bhubaneswar, found that the level of antibodies produced among Covaxin recipients starts to decline after two months, while the same for those who have been vaccinated with Covishield starts after three months.

Similar results have been found for many other vaccines internationally. Pfizer and Moderna earlier this week said protection from their vaccines can wane over time.
