### IMF loan

Economic Affairs Secretary R N Malhotra is optimistic that India's application for a \$ 5.7 billion loan from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) will go through. He bases this optimism on two factors: The negotiations have been completed to the satisfaction of India as well as the IMF management. Secondly, the US officials have told India that the Reagan administration has not prejudged the loan request. Malhotra, who returned to New Delhi from Washington after attending the joint annual meetings of the World Bank and the IMF, also denied that India was asked to scale down the quantum of loan it was seeking.

#### Punjab strategy

The Union government is understood to have provided guidelines to the Punjab government on the action to be taken against the protagonists of Khalistan. The guidelines have been issued after a series of meetings. At the administrative level, Cabinet Secretary Krishnaswami Rao Sahab, and the Home Secretary, T N Chaturvedi, have been holding discussions with the intelligence and other agencies concerned. At the political level, Rajiv Gandhi, Home Minister Zail Singh and Commerce Minister Pranab Mukherjee have been holding discussions with various people to formulate a strategy to check extremist activities. The problem in Punjab is intensifying, according to reports, because along with extremist sections of the Akalis, the Naxalites have also become active in the state.

#### Namibia independence

Commonwealth leaders on Monday resolved that Namibia should be granted full independence before the end of 1982. This time-frame was decided following a four-hour discussion held in Melbourne on Southern Africa with the arrival of the Nigerian President, A S Shagari, to the city.

## SC DIRECTS FULL-FLEDGED PROBE INTO COLLUSION OF TIHAR JAIL OFFICIALS WITH EX-UNITECH PROMOTERS

The Supreme Court Wednesday directed a full-fledged probe into the collusion of Tihar Jail officials with Unitech's imprisoned ex-promoters Sanjay and Ajay Chandra, based on Delhi Police Commissioner Rakesh Asthana's report filed in a sealed cover.

A bench of Justices D.Y. Chandrachud and M.R. Shah directed registration of criminal cases against

Tihar Jail officials and other unknown persons under relevant provisions of Prevention of Corruption Act and Indian Penal Code against those involved in collusion on the basis of the report.

It also directed suspension of Tihar Jail officials, pending proceedings against whom cases will be lodged as per the report, following ED's disclosure that the Chandra brothers were conducting business

from prison.

The top court further directed the Home Ministry to comply with Asthana's suggestions in the report on enhancing prison management and allowed a copy to be shared with the ministry for necessary compliance of directions.

Besides, the court also took on record reports filed in sealed cover by Enforcement Directorate (ED),

Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO) and Delhi Police, and listed the matter for further hearing on October 21.

On August 26, the apex court had directed that the Chandra brothers be shifted from Tihar Jail in the national capital to Mumbai's Arthur Road Jail and Talaja prison in Maharashtra after the ED had said that they were conducting business from the premises in connivance with the staff.

The top court, which then perused two status reports of the ED, had said Tihar Jail Superintendent and other staff are absolutely shameless for conniving with the Chandra brothers to flout the court orders and undermine its jurisdiction. Pursuant to the direction of the top court, the Chandra brothers were shifted to jails in Mumbai.

The two ED reports have raised some serious and disturbing issues for consideration and will be dealt with accordingly, the top court had said.

It had directed the Delhi Police Commissioner to personally hold inquiry forthwith about the conduct of the Tihar Jail staff with regard to the Chandras and submit the report to the court within four weeks.

The ED had made a startling revelation that it had unearthed a secret

underground office here which was being operated by erstwhile Unitech founder Ramesh Chandra and visited by his sons Sanjay and Ajay when on parole or bail.

The ED, which has been investigating money laundering charges against the Chandras and realty firm Unitech Ltd, said in its report that both Sanjay and Ajay have rendered the entire judicial custody meaningless as they have been freely communicating, instructing their officials and disposing of properties from inside the jail in connivance with the prison staff there.

Besides ED and SFIO, Economic Offence Wing of Delhi Police is also conducting investigation into the affairs of the Unitech Group and business transactions of erstwhile promoters of the real estate company.

Both Sanjay and Ajay who are in jail since August 2017 are accused of allegedly siphoning home buyers' money. The top court in its October 2017 order had asked them to deposit Rs 750 crore with the apex court registry by December 31, 2017.

The brothers have claimed that they complied with the court's conditions and they have deposited an amount in excess of Rs 750 crore and, therefore, they are granted bail.

## Reprimanding a student would not tantamount to abetment to suicide: Supreme Court

It is a solemn duty of a teacher to in still discipline in the students- court observed

New Delhi, 6<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2021: Reprimanding a student for his indiscipline would not be tantamount to provoking a student to commit suicide unless there are repeated specific allegations of harassment, the Supreme Court said on Tuesday.

The apex court said that an old saying — spare the rod and spoil the child — may have lost its relevance in present days and Corporal punishment to a child is not recognised by law but that does not mean that a teacher or school authorities have to shut their eyes to any indiscipline act of a student. The top court said it is a solemn duty of a teacher to instill discipline in the students and reprimanding a student for not being attentive or not being up to the mark in studies or for bunking classes or not attending the school is not uncommon. The observations were made by the apex court while quashing an FIR against a school teacher accused under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code for abetment of the suicide of a class 9 student. The disciplinary measures adopted by a teacher or other authorities of a school, reprimand a student for his indiscipline, in our considered opinion, would not tantamount to provoking a student to commit suicide unless there are repeated specific allegations of harassment and insult deliberately without any justifiable cause or reason, a bench of Justices S A Nazeer and Krishna Murari said. The bench set aside an order of Rajasthan High Court

which refused to quash an FIR against a Physical Training (PT) teacher who was accused of abetment of the suicide of the



student. The apex court said a simple act of reprimand of a student for his behaviour or indiscipline by a teacher, who is under moral obligations to inculcate the good qualities of a human being in a student would definitely not amount to instigation or intentionally aid to the commission of suicide by a student. It is not only a moral duty of a teacher but one of the legally assigned duties under Section 24 (e) of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 to hold regular meetings with the parents and guardians and apprise them about the regularly in attendance, ability to learn, progress made in learning and any other act or relevant information about the child, the bench said. The apex court said that for alleged abetment of suicide under Section 306 IPC there must be an allegation of either direct or indirect act of incitement to the commission of the offence of suicide. It said mere allegations of harassment of the deceased by

another person would not be sufficient in itself, unless, there are allegations of such actions on the part of the accused which compelled the commission of suicide.

Further, if the person committing suicide is very sensitive and the allegations attributed to the accused is otherwise not ordinarily expected to induce a similarly situated person to take the extreme step of committing suicide,

it would be unsafe to hold the accused guilty of abetment of suicide, the bench said. The apex court said that what is required is an examination of every case on its own facts and circumstances and keeping in consideration the surrounding circumstances as well, which may have bearing on the alleged action of the accused and the psyche of the deceased. The top court was hearing an appeal filed by Geo Varghese against an order passed by the Rajasthan High Court dismissing the petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking to quash the FIR against Police Station Sodala, Jaipur City (South) against him under section 306 IPC. The accused, a Physical Training Teacher in St Xavier's School, Newla, Jaipur, and also a member of the Disciplinary Committee for maintaining overall discipline by the students of the School, was booked for an offence under Section 306 (abetment of suicide) Indian Penal Code. The

appellant was appointed as a Physical Training Teacher in St. Xavier's School, Newla in the year 2016. He was also a member of the Disciplinary Committee for maintaining overall discipline by the students of the School. One student of Class 9th of the institution, unfortunately, committed suicide in the morning on April 26, 2018. The mother of the deceased student lodged the FIR in question on May 2, 2018, before the concerned Police Station under Section 306 IPC after about 7 days of the suicide, alleging that her son committed suicide due to mental harassment meted out by the appellant. The apex court noted that in the First Information Report and as also the statement of the complainant recorded by the police, no reasons or cause for the accused teacher to harass and insult the victim are spelled out. The appellant having found the deceased boy regularly bunking classes, first reprimanded him but on account of repeated acts, brought this fact to the knowledge of the Principal, who called the parents on the telephone to come to the school. No further overt acts have been attributed to the appellant either in the First Information Report or in the statement of the complainant, or anything in this regard has been stated in the alleged suicide note, the bench said.

Even the suicide note does not attribute any act instigation on the part of the appellant to connect him with the offence for which he is being charged, it said.

## SC hails govt's decision to conduct NEET-SS exam by old pattern, says 'it has been very fair'

New Delhi, 6<sup>th</sup> Oct, 2021: After being pushed by the Supreme Court, the Centre on Wednesday told the top court that NEET-Super Speciality exam scheduled in November this year will be held as per the old question pattern.

Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhat, representing the Centre, submitted before a bench headed by Justice DY Chandrachud that in the larger interest of students, the government has decided that the revised NEET-SS exam syllabus will be introduced from 2022.

He added that the new question pattern will be applicable from next year. The bench replied that the 'govt has been very fair'. Bhat said the exam scheduled this year will be held as per the old pattern. Advocate Prashant Bhushan, representing a petitioner, submitted that his should not in any way imply that the court is accepting the revised pattern exam for the next year. The bench recorded that the Centre states that decision has been taken in consultation with the National Medical Commission (NMC) and National Board of Examinations (NBE) and taking note of students' interest who would have commenced preparation for NEET-SS, before the change of pattern was notified. The bench said the Centre has stated that the modified pattern will be in effect from academic year 2022-23. "Since the

grieve addressed under Article 32, and in these circumstances petitions under Article 32 are disposed of", said the bench. On Tuesday, the Supreme Court pulling up the Centre on the changes in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test-Super Speciality (NEET-SS) 2021 pattern, said the impression and message which will go out is that the medical education and medical regulation in the country has become a business and it appears the entire haste is for filling the vacant seats. On the aspect of syllabus change, the bench told the NBE counsel, "What was the hurry. You have an examination pattern which had been going on from 2018 to 2020." The top court said, "The impression we get is that medical education has become a business and medical regulation has also become a business." The bench also comprising Justices Vikram Nath and BV Nagarathna said this would become a tragedy for the medical education in the country. Defending the pattern change, the Centre had proposed deferring the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) Super Speciality exam for 2021 by a period of two months. The top court was hearing a plea by Prateek Rastogi and 40 postgraduate qualified doctors, who challenged the abrupt last-minute changes, contending that they were made to favour the general medicine candidates.

## 1,168 oxygen plants developed by DRDO to be dedicated on Thursday

When the second wave of COVID-19 caused distress across the country, primarily due to the shortage of medical oxygen, the Centre turned to the country's premier defence scientists. The DRDO was tasked to set up 1,200 oxygen plants on war footing. The defence research organisation pooled in all its resources, at times pulling out scientists involved in missile development, to focus on completing the task at hand.

On October 7 (Thursday), 1,168 oxygen plants, developed by DRDO, will be dedicated across the country. While 43 of these will be dedicated by PM Modi, the remaining will be done by public representatives and local administration.

The PM will visit poll-bound Uttarakhand on Thursday where he will inaugurate an

oxygen plant at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) in Rishikesh. Uttarakhand will go to polls next year.

Apart from the oxygen plant at AIIMS Rishikesh, PM Modi, who completes 20 years of service as a constitutional postver since he took oath as Gujarat chief minister in the year 2001, will virtually dedicate 42 other plants across the country. Except for Mizoram and Andaman and Nicobar Islands, medical oxygen plants are ready for all states and Union Territories.

The shortage of oxygen during the second wave of the pandemic had led to several deaths. In a first of its kind task, DRDO used onboard oxygen generation technology for light combat aircraft (LCA) Tejas for the medical oxygen plants (MOP). All



these plants can generate 1,000 litres of oxygen per minute.

The DRDO transferred its MOP technology to Bengaluru-based Tata Advanced Systems Limited and Coimbatore-based Trident Pneumatics along with other private industries to set up plants across the nation.

"The prime minister's office expressed confidence in DRDO's capability and the organisation has

delivered it on time," said a key official, who added that every laboratory of DRDO was directed to provide all possible support for setting up medical oxygen plants.

Till now, a total of 1,224 medical oxygen plants have been funded under PM CARES across the country, out of which more than 1,100 plants have been commissioned, providing an output of over 1,750 MT oxygen per

day. During the first wave of COVID-19 in 2020, DRDO had come out with multiple interventions, including sanitizers, masks and PPE kits. It fast-tracked the design and development of N95, N99 mask and many other technologies for disinfection and protection from COVID-19. These technologies were transferred to many industries for free for all COVID related technologies.



# NEW FINDINGS SUGGEST THAT COVID-19 EPIDEMIC IS MAN-MADE



The hypothesis is that COVID-19 leaked accidentally from a Chinese lab in Wuhan was widely dismissed then as an unfounded conspiracy against China. The leak theory, which says that the virus was man-made in a lab, has again come to light as the researchers

could not find the viral host that kicked off the pandemic.

After SARS-1 and MERS outbreaks in 2003 and 2012 respectively, studies proved that the virus was found in animals. Hence affected people were hit by Coronavirus that

mutated in the host animal. Within months of the SARS-1 and MERS outbreaks, scientists found that animals had hosted the viruses before they could jump to humans. A few months after both outbreaks, scientists found that more than 80 percent of the animals around local markets were infected with the coronavirus. This proved that both SARS-1 and MERS outbreaks are infections that are transmitted from animals to humans.

After the SARS-CoV-2 outbreak, the World Health Organization (WHO) investigation team analysed more than 9,000 hospital samples collected from late 2019—the period before the epidemic started—and found no evidence of pre-pandemic infections.

The study of people having Covid-like symptoms in China's Hubei and Shaanxi provinces proved there were no instances of community infection. WHO team after testing more than 80,000 animals from 209 species in 2020, found no trace of SARS-CoV-2. So from where did the novel coronavirus suddenly come?

The testing conducted among wild, domesticated, and market animals hinted at the possibility of lab-leak theory. A coronavirus adapts for the animals before it can spill over to humans and it takes time to optimize itself so that it can infect humans. But the process takes little time in a laboratory-made pathogen using humanised mice.

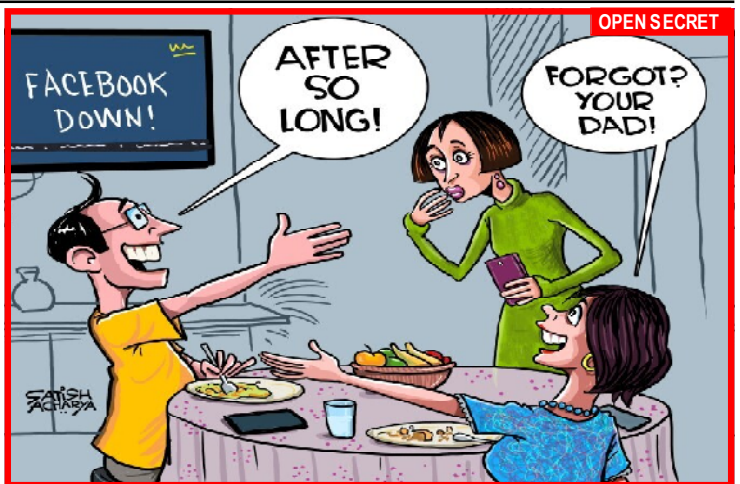

## India short of one pacer for T20 World Cup, says MSK Prasad

MUMBAI: India is a pacer short heading into the T20 World Cup this month, feels former chairman of selectors MSK Prasad, who is also a bit concerned about all-rounder Hardik Pandya not bowling in the ongoing IPL.

The T20 World Cup gets underway from October 17 in the UAE and Oman with India among favourites to clinch the title. "It is a decent squad but I feel that they are one fast bowler short actually... because we are playing the majority of the matches in Dubai and Abu Dhabi, so maybe one more fast bowler could have been handy," Prasad told PTI in an interview.

"Had we played more matches in Sharjah, this was okay, but one fast bowler could have been there) and more important with Hardik not bowling, I think it is a little cause of concern," explained the 46-year-old.

The Virat Kohli-led India will begin their T20 World Cup campaign when they take on arch-rivals Pakistan at the Dubai International

Stadium on October 24. While the pitches in Sharjah have aided the spinners, the tracks in Dubai and Abu Dhabi have been helping the fast bowlers as is being seen in the IPL.

Baroda all-rounder Pandya, a key member of the team, has not been bowling for five-time IPL champions Mumbai Indians in the current UAE leg of the cash-rich league. The franchise has said repeatedly that it does not want to push him too hard keeping in mind his importance to the Indian team.

Asked about his take on the situation, Prasad said, "See, Hardik has been picked as an all-rounder, notes a batsman, he is seen as an all-rounder, who will add that what you call balance to the side."

"We don't exactly know, but in an ideal scenario, Hardik has been picked as an all-rounder, I would love to see him bowling."

"I don't know what exactly is the thought process because selectors must be knowing it, or the Board must be knowing it, but

Hardik, if he doesn't bowl then there will be little, I mean, the balance of the side will get a little affected," said Prasad, who played 6 Tests and 17 ODIs.

The former India stumper also backed Kohli's decision to step down as the T20 skipper after the World Cup.

"...he has taken strain of captaincy across all formats, which is clearly visible right now on his individual performances. So, I think (it) must be a right decision to take," said Prasad when asked how this decision of Virat would help the batsman in him. "We want a man who can get 70 centuries in a decade's span, we would want to see the same Virat. If the T20 captaincy is affecting the batting, then it is the right decision to take," added the veteran of 96 first-class matches. Key spinner Yuzvendra Chahal could not make the World T20 squad and Prasad said the Chetan Sharma-led selection panel probably made that decision on his recent indifferent form. "Instead of



talking about why he (Chahal) has not been included, instead of expressing our opinion, I would definitely say why he's been excluded," he said. "Probably the selectors would have gone with his form in mind, unfortunately he was not among the wickets in the last few months."

"They would have seen that form and now that he has regained that it's a tricky situation right now, but Chahal has been our premier T20 bowler, he is the highest wicket-taker for India in the T20 format," added Prasad.
