Vaccination drive continuing smoothly in ANI

Port Blair, Sept 20: The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 4,11,782 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2,81,603 (approx.). A total of 1,62,753 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till dated 19-09-2021. A total of 1459 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 469 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 85 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 902 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District out of which 17 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44. 88 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District out of which 1 beneficiary was in the age group of 18-44.

CCS Ltd. Plans major revival to gain lost hold on market

Management decides upgradation of branches with self-service facility



Port Blair, 20th Sep, 2021: To reinstate the lost stature of profit-making organisation, the management committee of the Consumer Cooperative Society Ltd. took several decisions in the Managing Committee meeting held today at 11.30 AM in the CCS Head Office, Aberdeen Bazaar. The meeting was held in the presence of the Member of Parliament, Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma and was attended by Managing Committee Members and employees of the society.

With the objective to renaissance with expansion of its business in a big way by applying radical changes in the business methods several major decisions were taken for revival of its business in islands.

In the meeting held today, Shri Abdul Siddique, Secretary - CCS Ltd. informed that the first phase of revival plan existing 4 branches of the society viz. branches at Aberdeen Bazar, Bathubas, Bambooflat & Wimberly Gunj will be upgraded to self-service units with all modern facilities and fed with almost all household items on offer prices. He further informed the house that the society will restart its wholesale sections at Aberdeen Bazar and will also open separate modern counters in all these branches for seafoods such as fish, prawns and other items.

Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma stated that the present Board of Directors of the Society is committed for the development of the society and he also advised the



employees to extend full cooperation to the Managing Committee and put full efforts for execution of various developmental plans on war footing. The meeting was attended by Shri K. Ganesan, CCS Monitoring Committee Member, Shri Abdul Rasheed, ARCS and other dignitaries.

Records of CCS Ltd. reveals that after the country's war with China, Andaman and Nicobar Islands witnessed major hike in cost of essential commodities in islands. To overcome crises, in 1962 a membership drive was initiated with a fee of Rs. 10/- to constitute Consumer Cooperative Society Ltd. Since then, CCS Ltd. witnessed many fold expansion and had a major share of the market in islands. The level of success was such that in the year 1984, CCS Ltd was declared the best consumer cooperative society in the country and was awarded by the Govt. of India. The downfall of CCS started in 2004 after the Tsunami impacted the islands when GOI withdrew the LPG subsidy offered to CCS. From 2014-15, CCS Ltd suffered heavy losses and is still running in loss. Despite possessing assets over Rs. 35 Cr., successive CCS management were not able to bring the CCS Ltd into a profit-making cooperative.

The present Managing Committee took decisions of major revival to restore the lost status of CCS Ltd. Smt. P. Pushpanjali Raju, Chairman, CCS Limited directed the welcome address and Shri P. Vemanna, Vice Chairman conveyed vote of thanks to all the participants of the meeting.

China-Pakistan alliance

In a lecture last week, the Chief of Defence Staff, General Bipin Rawat, touched upon the idea of 'clash of civilisations', propounded at the end of the Cold War three decades ago by American political scientist, Samuel Huntington. Clash of civilisations was certainly not the main focus of Rawat's speech. It was about India's defence reforms that have acquired a new urgency under the NDA government. The reference to the idea was in his opening remarks about the geopolitical imperatives of India's defence reform. Given the massive political and religious baggage associated with the idea, it inevitably drew attention at home and abroad. Rawat was not making the claim himself but pointing to Huntington's thesis on the inevitable confluence of Confucian and Islamic interests.

What is said in Delhi does not stay in Delhi these days. It travels quickly and is easily distorted. The media headlines on Rawat's speech in India, unsurprisingly, drew attention in Beijing and it reportedly came up in the Chinese foreign minister Wang Yi's conversation with India's External Affairs Minister Subrahmanya Jaishankar when they met on the margins of a regional summit in Dushanbe, Tajikistan. Jaishankar affirmed that "India does not subscribe to any clash of civilisations theory". Although the controversy seems rooted in a misperception of what Rawat had said, it is a reminder to officials in high positions not to waste into grand theories about how the world works. It is one thing to discuss these ideas in universities and think tanks and entirely another for policy makers to throw them around casually. Huntington argued that after the collapse of communism, the main international contradiction will be between different religious identities rather than nation-states. Although religious identity has indeed gained ground across different geographies, it has by no means become the main locus of international conflict. On the contrary, religion has become a divisive force. In West Asia, the resurgence of Islamist ideology has only sharpened conflict among, and within, various Muslim societies. In the last few years, we have seen more Islamic countries make up with Israel, rather than embark on a final confrontation with the Jewish state in Israel.

India's military planners are right to focus on the two-front military problem that it confronts with China and Pakistan. But what brings China and Pakistan together is not some grand convergence between Confucianism and Islam, but a shared secular interest in keeping India down. China's influence in West Asia is certainly growing as Rawat noted but that is true of every region in the world — from Europe to the South Pacific, and from Africa to the Arctic. That is a consequence of China's economic and military weight, and not the power of its civilisation.

CONNECTED CARS HIT THE MAINSTREAM INDIAN CAR MARKET

It wasn't too long ago when a new car model launch meant rolling off specs on power and performance off one's tongue as if there's no tomorrow. Engine technology and capability, horsepower and speed, fuel efficiency, braking and other safety features, and of course the colours

the car comes in were the focal point. That era may just have come to an end, with the advent of the age of connected cars.

While real-time internet connectivity have been seen in fits and starts in car models launched in India in recent years and have all been

in the luxury segment, a car that opened for booking this week aims to upend all that.

MG Motor India, the Gurugram-based, Chinese-owned originally-British brand's latest offering, the Astor, brings next-generation connected features into the mass market segment for the very first time in India. The standout feature of the new car is not power or performance, but its connected features that include an Artificial Intelligence-backed assistant on the dashboard (see pic), as well as self-driving features to the tune of 'autonomous level 2' (self-driving capabilities are graded from 1 to 5, with 5 being the top-most complete driver-less cars). Astor's 'autonomous level 2' means the driver assistance feature can control steering and speed, adjusting pace by intelligently deciphering road signs, lane markings as well as pedestrians or other vehicles that come in the way.

"Technology and innovation are leading the connected car space in the automobile industry," explains Rajeev Chaba, president and managing director of MG Motor India. "The current trend focuses increasingly on software-driven devices."

The real significance of this model is the fact that it is not a premium offering — similar self-driving features have so far only been seen in luxury models from the likes of

Volvo and Mercedes-Benz. "We're positioning this new model in the same category as Creta," said an MG Motor India official. Hyundai Motor's Creta is the market leader in the overall SUV category in the country, with prices starting at 10 lakh rupees.

In fact, engineering and performance giving way to technology and autonomous features will be the big move the auto industry will have to transform through, even before electric mobility takes centre stage. The trend has already started moving towards the mass market segment in varied levels recently, with the likes of Hyundai which offers the 'Auto Link' technology, or Tata Motors introducing the 'Intelligent real time assist' or iRA in the BS6 compliant variant of its Nexon electric car. Tata thus became the first homegrown brand to offer connected features.

A recent study by the consultancy firm Deloitte noted that majority of Indian users expected more digitally connected features in their cars in the coming days, and were even ready to spend more for the same. "Traditionally, cars used to largely dictate their production based on vehicle features, but with this change, personalisation and focus on the consumer is expected to lead the game of product manufacturing," the study noted.

While MG's voice-assistant can talk back and find weather, news

updates as well as dig up info on Wikipedia for you a la Siri on your phone, there are lot more concrete services that a tech-enabled car that can communicate real time can do. This could range from checking air filter/belt filter change to tyre pressure which can now be reported via smart phones so that action can be taken at the right time, according to Deloitte.

The global semi-conductor shortage has come as a spanner in the works for auto industry's hopes of a resurgence based on the 'connected' strategy. Delivery lag is running into months for most leading manufacturers, with software taking centre stage where once pistons and hydraulics ruled the roost. However, the leading auto manufacturers are hopeful they will be able to surmount this logistical glitch somehow, keeping in mind the festive season rush which just weeks away.

And if you still own one of the conventional models with none of the new-fangled connected features, auto-tech startup Cardekho says it can help. UpLink, which the company launched recently, is a plug-and-play device that can do real-time tracking of the, trip history, rash driving analysis and all sort of usage stats — thus turning your old contraption into a 'smart car' of sorts. It may still not be able to do smart navigation yet, but those days may not be far away.

Remote learning: Arunachal to Andamans, 22 DU colleges helping mentor institutes

New Delhi, Sept 20: Visits by

teachers, online training, skill development training and student exchange programmes, this is how 22 Delhi University colleges and departments are taking forward the process of mentoring 29 colleges across the country as part of the Vidy Vistar scheme launched by DU earlier this year. Most DU colleges have picked up institutions located in rural and tribal areas, many belonging to the Northeast. For instance, Hansraj College has adopted three colleges, one each in Arunachal Pradesh, Ladakh and Chamba in Himachal Pradesh.

Explaining the reason behind choosing these colleges, Rama Sharma, principal of Hansraj College, said, "We chose a college in the Northeast because we have alumni like Kiren Rijju. We were already running a scheme called Vidy Vistar where we had adopted many colleges. Once the university

launched this scheme, we changed that to Gyan Setu."

The online teachers' training programme has already been started. "We recently held an event where our students interacted with those of other colleges. Once the Covid-19 situation gets better, we have plans of holding exchange programmes for students of these colleges so that they get to see and access our facilities," said Sharma. Ramanujan College has two colleges under it — Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Imphal, and Kalimpong College, University of North Bengal. Visits by teachers have already taken place. "Two of our teachers visited both the colleges to understand how we could help them. Online teachers' training is also being conducted. As part of the plan, teachers' exchange programme, student training programme and some extension activities will be

conducted," said SP Aggarwal, principal of Ramanujan College. As part of the training programme, students would be provided skills courses such as data analytics, data mining, among others. Ramanujan College wants to work with its partners to develop the nearby areas. It would also be sharing library resources and other academic facilities with them. Rama Sharma of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, which is partnering with a government college in Barwani, Madhya Pradesh, said, "The teachers and researchers of both colleges will be engaging in joint research activities and will be co-investigators in the programmes submitted to funding agencies. We will initiate and assist innovation activities and boost start-ups. The idea is to cultivate the feeling of brotherhood among youths of the two institutes through sports and extra-curricular activities."

For instance, Hansraj College has adopted three colleges, one each in Arunachal Pradesh, Ladakh and Chamba in Himachal Pradesh.

Explaining the reason behind choosing these colleges, Rama Sharma, principal of Hansraj College, said, "We chose a college in the Northeast because we have alumni like Kiren Rijju. We were already running a scheme called Vidy Vistar where we had adopted many colleges. Once the university launched this scheme, we changed that to Gyan Setu."

The online teachers' training

programme has already been started. "We recently held an event where our students interacted with those of other colleges. Once the Covid-19 situation gets better, we have plans of holding exchange programmes for students of these colleges so that they get to see and access our facilities," said Sharma. Ramanujan College has two colleges under it — Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Imphal, and Kalimpong College, University of North Bengal. Visits by teachers have already taken place. "Two of our teachers visited both the colleges to understand how we could help them. Online teachers' training is also being conducted. As part of the plan,

teachers' exchange programme, student training programme and some extension activities will be conducted," said SP Aggarwal, principal of Ramanujan College. As part of the training programme, students would be provided skills courses such as data analytics, data mining, among others. Ramanujan College wants to work with its partners to develop the nearby areas. It would also be sharing library resources and other academic facilities with them. Rama Sharma of Aditi Mahavidyalaya, which is partnering with a government college in Barwani, Madhya Pradesh, said, "The teachers and researchers of both colleges will be engaging in joint research activities and will be co-investigators in the programmes submitted to funding agencies. We will initiate and assist innovation activities and boost start-ups. The idea is to cultivate the feeling of brotherhood among youths of the two institutes through sports and extra-curricular activities."

Foreign Minister of Saudi Arabia Prince Faisal bin Farhan al Saud to call on PM Modi today

Foreign Minister of Saudi Arabia, Prince Faisal bin Farhan al Saud will call on Prime Minister Narendra Modi today. The meeting will take place at the Prime Minister's residence in New Delhi.

Yesterday, External Affairs Minister, Dr. S. Jaishankar met the visiting Foreign Minister of Saudi Arabia. This was the first ministerial visit from Saudi Arabia to India since the outbreak of the COVID pandemic. Both Ministers discussed all issues related to their bilateral relationship and regional and international issues of mutual interest. The two Ministers reviewed the implementation of the Strategic Partnership Council Agreement signed between the two sides during the visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to Saudi Arabia in October 2019. They expressed satisfaction at the meetings held under the Agreement and progress achieved. Both sides discussed further steps to strengthen their partnership in trade, investment, energy, defence, security, culture, consular issues, healthcare and human resources.

Both Ministers also exchanged views on the developments in Afghanistan and other regional issues. They discussed bilateral cooperation in multilateral forums such as UN, G-20 and GCC. Dr Jaishankar congratulated Saudi Arabia on its successful Presidency of G-20 last year despite the COVID-19 pandemic. He appreciated Saudi Arabia for the support provided to the Indian community during the COVID pandemic and urged Saudi Arabia to further relax restrictions on travel from India.

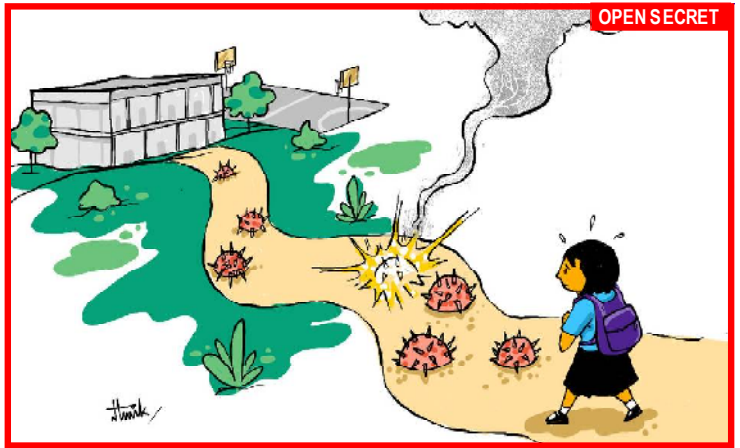
