### 4,79,802 doses of vaccine administered to beneficiaries

Port Blair, Oct. 23

Vaccination drive to vaccinate maximum number of eligible beneficiaries of 18 above age group in the entire Island Territory is continuing and the percentage of population vaccinated so far in Isles stands at 73.21%. With 2833 eligible beneficiaries vaccinated today, 4,79,802 doses of vaccines have been administered to

beneficiaries in A&N Islands so far.

The Health Department is striving hard to cover maximum number of eligible beneficiaries by vaccinating them through its designated vaccination centres spread over the Islands to keep the corona virus at bay. As per data available, the cumulative

vaccinated with first dose so far is 292851 (102.40 percent) while cumulative beneficiaries vaccinated with second dose so far is 186951 (63.84 percent). 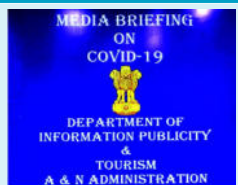
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## Media briefed on COVID-19

### Two positive cases detected during test conducted on incoming flight & inter-island bound passengers: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Oct. 23

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar addressing a media briefing on COVID-19 held in the conference hall of IP&T today stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 430 passengers who arrived here yesterday, one positive case has been detected. Today, 8 flights with 1299 passengers arrived, out of which, 854 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on remaining 445 passengers and the reports are awaited. RAT was conducted on 186 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and one positive case has been detected. Similarly, RAT test was



conducted on 120 passengers and all were found negative. At helipad, test was conducted on 2 passengers and all were negative. Apart from this, RT-PCR test was conducted on 14 ship crew members and the reports are awaited.

### 1227 unorganized workers in A&N Islands registered at e-SHRAM portal so far

### Unorganized Workers urged to register on e-SHRAM portal by visiting nearest CSCs or self-register

Port Blair, Oct. 23

The Ministry of Labour & Employment, New Delhi has launched a registration module/ portal i.e. e-SHRAM for creation of a comprehensive National Database of Unorganised Workers (NDUW) for all types of Unorganised Workers such as Construction Workers, Migrant Workers, Domestic Workers, Agricultural Labourers, MGNREGA Workers, Gig Workers, Self-employed Workers, Street Vendors, Small Shopkeeper, ASHA Workers, Anganwadi Workers, Fishermen, Unorganised Plantation Workers, Milkmen and similar other sub-group of Unorganised Workers. In A&N Islands, so far, 1227 unorganized workers have registered at e-Shram Portal which is the country's first National Database on Unorganized Workers, out of this, 627 of them have self-

## Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub Maranda (Calathea crotalifera): a new introduction to cut flower trade

Calathea crotalifera is one of the important ornamental plants belonging to family Marantaceae and is a herbaceous perennial highly adapted to tropical humid agro-climatic condition. This rhizomatic plant species can produce a very attractive inflorescence and have been used in landscaping especially for screening and indoor plants. The exotic appearance of C. crotalifera inflorescence commonly known as Rattle snake is more popular in cut flower industry. The inflorescence has attractive bracts (modified leaf) that can be found in four different colours as red, white, green or yellow with a few conspicuous flowers will peek out from the bract as they matured. The plant height ranges from 2.5 to 3.0 m with plant spread ranging from 140 to 160 cm. The commercial propagation of this species is through rhizomes and division of clumps. This species prefer moist humid climate and partially shady situations for their growth and flowering. Hence, the crop is suited to grow as intercrop in plantation based cropping system. The species performs well in a spacing of 1.5-2.0 m between plants and 2 m between rows. The average number of flowers recorded per plant per year is 75.7. The duration of flowering is about 210 days which shows year round production of cut flowers. The vase life of the inflorescence can vary considerably from 10 to 15 days. The shelf life of the flowers in the plant is 21.3 days. The crop can be grown commercially with minimum inputs and less managerial care.

## Over 101 crore 30 lakh COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in country so far; Recovery rate stands at 98.16 per cent

New Delhi, Oct. 23

More than 101 crore 30 lakh COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in the country so far under the N a t i o n w i d e Vaccination Drive. Health Ministry said, over 68 lakh 48 thousand doses were administered yesterday. India reported more than 16 thousand new cases during the last 24 hours. India's Active caseload stands at one lakh 73 thousand 728 and it is the lowest in 233 days.

Active cases account for less than one per cent of total cases and it is currently at 0.51 per cent, the lowest since March last year.

The Ministry said, the recovery rate is currently at 98.16 per cent, highest since March last year. Over 17 thousand people recovered in the last 24 hours and total recoveries touched three crore 35 lakh 32 thousand 126. The weekly positivity rate currently stands at 1.24 per cent which is less

than two per cent for the last 29 days. Daily positivity rate is at 1.20 per cent which is less than two per cent for last 19 days.

The death toll due to the pandemic has reached four lakh 53 thousand 708. In the last 24 hours, 666 deaths were reported. Over 59 crore 84 lakh COVID tests have been conducted across the country so far. More than 13 lakh 64 thousand tests were conducted yesterday. (Source: india.gov.in)

India have won all their matches against Pakistan in the World Cup - both in the ODI and T20 formats. Overall India and Pakistan have played each other seven times in the ODI World Cup and five times in the T20 World Cup. India have emerged victorious on all the occasions. On the eve of the all important match, Indian Skipper Virat



Kohli said in a press conference that the focus of Indian team is to play well in the World Cup.

Meanwhile, in the opening match of Super-12 stage of the tournament today, Australia defeated South Africa by five wickets in Abu Dhabi. Earlier, South Africa

were restricted to 118 for 9 in the stipulated 20 overs. Australia chased down the target of 119 runs in 19.4 overs.

In the second match, defending champion West Indies were all out for 55 runs in (14.2) overs against England in Dubai. England won the match by 6 wickets.

## India's First Banni Buffalo IVF Calf Born

### Government encourages IVF of buffaloes to improve cattle wealth in the country

New Delhi, Oct. 23 (PIB)

With the birth of first IVF calf of a Buffalo breed namely Banni in the country, India's OPU - IVF work has reached to next level. This first IVF Banni calf is born out of 6 Banni IVF pregnancies established at the doorsteps of a farmer, Vinay . L. Wala of Sushila Agro farms, located at Dhanej in Somnath district of Gujarat.Prime Minister , Shri Narendra Modi had talked about the Banni buffalo breed during his visit to Kutch region of Gujarat on December 15, 2020. The very next day, i.e. December 16, 2020, Ovum Pick-Up (OPU) and aspiration processes for the in vitro fertilization (IVF) of Banni Buffaloes were planned.The scientists aspirated 3 Banni Buffaloes of Sushila agro farms of Vinay.



L. Wala of Dhanej in Somnath district of Gujarat. They subjected 29 oocytes (egg cells) to IVC from these three Banni buffaloes. Total 20 oocytes from one of them were subjected to IVC.

In fact, 20 oocytes from one donor resulted in 11 embryos. Embryo transfer (ET) was done with 9 embryos, which resulted in 3 IVF pregnancies. Total 5

Oocytes from second donor resulted in 5 embryos (100 %). Of five embryos, four were selected for the ET which resulted in 2 pregnancies. From the 4 oocytes of the third donor, 2 embryos were developed and the embryo transfer resulted in one pregnancy.

Overall, 18 embryos were developed from 29 oocytes (62 % BL rate). The ET of 15 embryos resulted in 6 Banni pregnancies (40 % Pregnancy rate). Of these 6 pregnancies, the very first IVF Banni Calf is born today. This is the first Banni Buffalo IVF calf in the country.

Both the government and the scientist fraternity see a great potential in the field of IVF of buffaloes and are striving hard to improve cattle wealth in the country.

## India's commitment to environment friendly green energy further gets strengthen through the notification of 'Rules for Timely recovery of costs due to Change in Law'

### Rules for Promotion of generation from renewable sources of energy by addressing Must Run and other matters

New Delhi, Oct. 23 (PIB)

Ministry of Power notifies rule for the sustainability of the electricity sector and promotion of clean energy to meet the India's commitment towards Climate Change.The investors and other stakeholders in the power sector had been concerned about the timely recovery of the cost due to change in law, curtailment of renewable power and other related matters. The following Rules notified by the Ministry of Power under Electricity Act, 2003 are in the interest of the electricity consumers and the stakeholders:

i) Electricity (Timely recovery of costs due to Change in Law) Rules, 2021.  
ii) Electricity (Promotion of generation from renewable sources of energy by addressing Must Run and other matters) Rules, 2021.

Timely recovery of the costs due to change in law is very important as the investment in the power sector largely depends upon the timely payments. At present the pass through under change of law takes time. This impacts the viability of the sector and the

developers get financially stressed. The Rules would help in creating investment friendly environment in the country.

The energy transition is happening across the globe. India has also made commitments to bring about energy transition. India has also announced international commitment to set up 175 GW of RE capacity by 2022 and 450 GW by 2030. These Rules will help in achieving the targets of RE generation. This will ensure that the consumers get green and clean power and secure a healthy environment for the future generation.A formula has been provided to calculate adjustment in the monthly tariff due to the impact of Change in Law.

The Rules also provide that a must-run power plant shall not be subjected to curtailment or regulation of generation or supply of electricity on account of merit order dispatch or any other commercial consideration. The electricity generated from a must-run power plant may be curtailed or regulated only in the event of any technical constraint in the electricity grid or for reasons of security

of the electricity grid. For curtailment or regulation of power, the provisions of the Indian Electricity Grid Code shall be followed. In the event of a curtailment of supply from a must-run power plant, compensation shall be payable by the procurer to the must-run power plant at the rates specified in the agreement for purchase or supply of electricity. The RE generator is also allowed to sell power in the power exchange and recover the cost suitably. This helps in realisation of revenue by the generator and also the power is available in the electricity grid for use of consumers.

The Rules also provides for the Intermediary procurer to procure electricity for distribution licensees. In this regard, the Rules inter-alia states that "the intermediary procurer, an agency nominated by the Central Government or State Government, may procure electricity through a transparent process of bidding in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Central Government under section 63 of the Act for sale to one or more distribution licensees."

## Real estate sector in country expected to reach market size of 1 trillion dollars by 2030: NITI Aayog CEO

New Delhi, Oct. 23

NITI Aayog CEO, Shri Amitabh Kant today said that India's real estate sector is expected to reach a market size of 1 trillion dollars and contribute 18-20 percent of the country's GDP by 2030. Addressing the 13th Edition of Confederation of Indian Industry - CII Realty and Infrastructure Conclave 2021 in Mumbai, Shri Kant said housing sales are recovering, buoyant by the decade low mortgage rates. He added that

the Smart City Project, which aims to build 100 smart cities, is a prime opportunity for real estate companies. Shri Kant said the realty sector and its stakeholders also play a critical role in supporting the 'housing for all' initiative taken by the government.

Accepting that the past 18 months have been challenging, Shri Kant said the Atmanirbhar Bharat Package 3.0 that provides tax relief for real estate developers and home buyers

and the setting up of Alternative investment Fund, Affordable Housing Fund and National Housing Bank with an initial corpus of 35,000 crore rupees is likely to revive the sector in coming months. He added that the Real Estate Investment Trust Platform, as approved by Securities and Exchange Board of India, will create opportunities worth 1.25 trillion rupees in coming years. 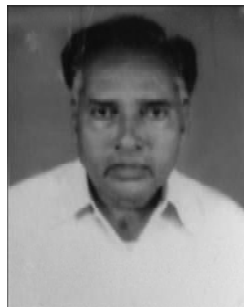

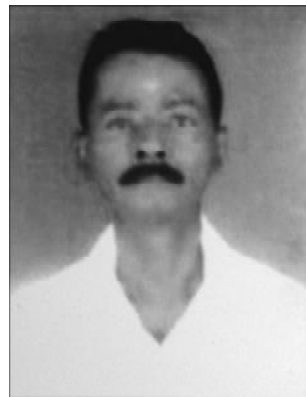
