In a letter addressed to the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, the Member of Parliament mentioned that during his recent visit to Car Nicobar Island, he interacted with the

> Based on the demands the Member of Parliament highlighted following issues:

Construction of Sea Protection Wall at Mus/ around the Island:

The Member of Parliament mentioned that the aftermath of earthquake/Tsunami struck these Islands, the soil erosion is taking place at fast pace around the Mus break Water as well as at Tee-Top and Sawai Coastal areas which need to be checked by erection of Sea Protection Wall in a phase manner at the earliest.

#### Air/Sea connectivity:

Car Nicobar being an Island, Sea and Air connectivity are the only modes of transport. Earlier the Indian Airline Flights were operated during the year 1985 but discontinued. Again in the Year 2016 Alliance Air flight once a

week had started but the same was stopped during the year 2017.

The Member of Parliament requested to re- start the Air connectivity, which will be helpful to the Tribal brothers and sisters, Government Servants serving in the District and most of all for evacuation of ailing patients. Likewise sea Connectivity to be rescheduled at least twice a week to augment the existing Pawan Hans sortie where seats are limited and unaffordable to the Tribal brothers and

## **Explosive Affair**

With investigators finding tell-tale signs of a terror plot having gone awry, post Sunday's predawn car blast near a temple in communally-fragile Coimbatore, the incident, unless tackled professionally with sensitivity, holds the potential of escalating existing tensions on the law and order and political fronts. Information that the car's driver and suspected mastermind, who was charred, Jameesha Mubin, was briefly under the National Investigation Agency (NIA) radar, would certainly call into question the capabilities of the intelligence apparatus in sensing and forestalling a terror plot. It is sheer providence that an LPG cylinder in the car exploded, as preliminary investigation suggests, before Mubin could strike terror. What cannot be overlooked is that the incident came against the backdrop of serial Molotov cocktail attacks last month, targeting properties of right-wing outfits and their office-bearers in the wake of the nationwide ban on the Popular Front of India. To the credit of the police force, the larger design was unravelled and the suspected plotters unmasked in less than 24 hours. That half a dozen suspects have been arrested bears testimony to their investigation skills. Despite the police's commendable post-blast action, realising the gravity and political ramifications of the issue at hand, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin did the right thing in recommending that the NIA take over the probe. Governor R.N. Ravi, a former IPS officer, has questioned the four-day delay in calling the NIA. However, that is a matter of perspective and individual assessment of the ground situation.

Politically, this has thrown up some challenges for Mr. Stalin. He has to delicately balance the duty of taking along the minorities and the administrative need to uncompromisingly deal with fundamentalists, who propagate violence as an answer to political problems. In this he would require the support of constituent parties of the DMK-led Secular Progressive Alliance, which should acknowledge the need for such balance. The DMK, as such, faces criticism of being soft on terror, due to the 1998 Coimbatore serial blasts, though Tamil Nadu has seen the fangs of terror during the AIADMK regime too (1993 RSS office blast). He also has to combat attempts trying to stoke communal passions and driving religious polarisation using this incident as a springboard. The BJP has seized upon the issue with a section of its leaders calling for a Coimbatore bandh on October 31 to put the heat on the government and consolidate itself politically. What is needed, though, is for the NIA and the government to deal with the plotters firmly while not providing scope for communalising and politicising terrorism.

## **Cardiologists Predict** Increase in Sudden **Cardiac Arrest Cases**

October 30: HYDERABAD: The leading cause of death in India is sudden cardiac arrest, or SCA, which can strike anyone at any age, including the young. Leading cardiologists pointed out that the mean age is much lower in India than elsewhere in the world for a SCA to occur, which necessitates immediate action. Cardiologists stated that the causes and signs of SCA are still not well understood or, at the very least, are not being addressed, and they predict an increase in SCA cases due to changes in lifestyle and other environmental factors. With October marked as Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Month, cardiologists emphasised the importance of educating people about the growing prevalence of SCA and how to prevent it. There has been a significant increase in cardiac arrest cases in India, particularly among younger age groups. Annually, more than seven lakh cases of sudden cardiac death are reported, according to estimates. As per the World Health Organization (WHO), 86 per cent of cardiovascular deaths could have been prevented or avoided through prevention and treatment. Dr. B. Hygriv Rao, senior cardiologist, says, "Aheart attack is one of the leading causes of Sudden Cardiac Arrest, and the number of heart attack patients in India continues to rise year after year, despite widespread awareness. The causes and signs of SCA are still not well understood. Given that the average age of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest in India is much lower than the rest of the world, immediate action is required."

Dr.Rao pointed out that the rapid shift to sedentary lifestyles, combined with poor air quality, is a major factor. While some efforts have been made to reduce this through dietary guidelines, they do not address the full range of issues that lead to cardiovascular diseases. "As a result, rather than prioritising, we must look at the indicators that lead to heart disease at a macro-level," he said.

Dr. V. S. Ramchandra, another cardiologist, said unhealthy lifestyle choices and increased stress are the main drivers of heart disease in India. While people are aware that increased consumption of processed foods can lead to weight gain in the short-term, they frequently fail to recognise the long-term consequences, which are not as easily reversed. "Additionally, working from home has resulted in a decrease in people's regular physical activity rather than a more balanced and focused life. People must take a break and go for a run, jog, or stroll. Children and young people must also make it a habit to exercise for at least 40 minutes every day because it is good for their hearts and overall health," hesaid. Furthermore, he stated that proper CPR training for the general public is required to aid in the prevention of sudden cardiac deaths. "Resuscitation is only possible when an onlooker or caregiver applies chest compressions to a patient whose heart has stopped during a cardiac arrest. This can help keep the oxygen supply going while you wait for medical help," he stated.

#### APWD (Road Sector/ Drinking water):

The Member of Parliament demanded for posting of a regular Executive Engineer and filling up of existing Vacant Post and repair and maintenance of existing internal (rural road) from Chuckchucha to Mus Village.

He also demanded repair/ maintenance of old existing rural road now called State Highway from Arong up to Kakana village reconstruction of RCC Bridge in place of the Collapsed Bailey bridge at Old Kimious village, as most of the plantation of Villagers exist there and due collapse of the bridge, their easy movement has been disrupted.

The MP also demanded improvement of water supply in all the villages by replacing old rusted pipe lines.

#### **Electricity Department:**

#### Fisheries Department:

The Member of Parliament pointed out that all the outboard engines issued by the Department to the fishermen runs on Kerosene oil, due to non-availability of kerosene oil, the fishermenare unable to venture into sea and this affects their livelihood.

#### Permanent Shelter:

The Member of Parliament demanded procurement of a Sewage Suction cleaner Truck to clean up the Septic tanks in situations practically. Shri all 4000 Permanent Shelters Pandey called upon the with Bathrooms as it is overflowing posing Health hazards.

#### BSNL (Network connectivity):

He pointed out that BSNL connectivity signal and internet data depend on power by Electricity supply Department, as they don't have power back up facility, due to which students and villagers from Chukchucha to Sawai (08 villages) are not able to use the internet data facilities. devolution of powers, application have been invited from licensed fishers and fisheries Co-Op. Societies under the area/Jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad, South Andaman for purchase of fish transport vehicle and tricycle under the UTPIan of the Zilla Parishad, South Andaman, Port Blair. The Pattern of assistance is as follows:-

For General Fisherman: 50% subsidy to max of Rs. vehicle **For** Tribes Exclusively: 75% subsidy subject to max of Rs. 3,00,000/ - per fish transport vehicle.

The fisherman should have the fishing and dinghy licence atleast for the last two consecutive years including current financial year and for tribes one year including the current Financial Year. The should not have availed assistance for similar asset in the past 8 years for fish transport vehicle. In case of Society, the society should be registered with the Registered of Co-operative Society, A&N Islands.

The Society should submit its audited statement of accounts for last 3 years along with its bye- laws. The aim and objective of the society should be related to 2,00,000/- per fish transport—the fisheries development activities.

The application should be submitted by the society through A & N Fisheries Co-Federation Operative alongwith a brief resume of the activity which they intend to take up by procuring the item together with a copy of resolution of the General Body/Managing Committee

Port Blair, Oct. 30: The Animal Science Division of ICAR-Central Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair cultivation conducted field day on demonstration "ICAR-CIARI Lead Fodder Development in Islands" on 28th October, 2022 at Animal Farm complex. programme was conducted project "Establishment of sustainable model village livestock farmers from Ranchi Basti and Indira Nagar of Wandoor area.

At the outset, Dr. E.B. Chakurkar, Director, ICAR-CIARI addressed the participants enlightened them with advanced knowledge on balanced feeding. He emphasized that surplus production of fodder may pave the islands way towards milk sufficiency in near future.


Dr. P.A. Bala, Senior Scientist and Course Director led the Island participants for hands on training experience in fodder in demonstration field at the farm. He explained the present scenario of feed and fodders of the islands and how milk productivity of the animals can be improved by balanced under the NABARD funded feeding of the animals with fodders as centre point. He briefed about the animal's on fodder production at class, physiology and South Andaman". The field production status, their day was attended by nutrient requirements, thumb rule in balancing the ration and how to prepare only fodder for medium milk yielding animals.


After the demonstration of the field activities, the farmers tried their hands on preparation of land, where they prepared the field with spade and then prepared the bunds for sowing the fodder cuttings. The standing Bajra-Napier Hybrid (CO-6) grass were cut by the farmers with three nodes and the roots were

dug for replanting in the prepared field. After plating the farmers were advised post planting management, where irrigation, weeding and manure dredging was explained.

The farmers were also enlightened with soil type, their management, fortification, types of fodders and best fodders in the island scenario. They were distributed with 60 pieces of Bajra-Napier Hybrid (CO-6) grass's stem cutting to each of them by Dr. D. Bhattacharya, HoD, Animal Science Division.

The participants showed keen interest in hands on training imparted to them and were very much enthusiastic to inculcate the ideas in their field to increase their animal's productivity and their own profit margin. In the feedback, the participants felt the knowledge very useful to them and requested to conduct such type of programme in near future.

South Africa lost its top three cheaply as Arshdeep struck with two blows early in the innings. Mohammed Shami picked the wicket of captain Temba Bavuma as South Africa managed 24 runs in the first six overs.

Suryakumar Yadav lifted India to 133 for nine with a 40-ball 68 against South Africa in the T20 World Cup here on Sunday.

Opting to bat, skipper Rohit Sharma was the first batter to get dismissed, following which India kept losing wickets at regular intervals.

Returning to the team at the expense of Tabraiz Shamsi, pacer Lungi Ngidi was the wrecker-inchief as he ran through the famed Indian top-order with four wickets during an incisive spell of fast bowling on a pacy track.

However, Suryakumar was at his aggressive best and revived



India's innings with his dazzling array of strokes.

# Holders Spain win FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup

Navi Mumbai, Oct. 30: Defending champions Spain won the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup with a 1-0 victory over first-time finalists Colombia whose campaign ended in a heartbreak after an own goal in the summit clash here on Sunday.

Spain emerged as the winners after an own goal by Colombian defender Ana María Guzmán Zapata in the 82nd minute of the final at the D. Y. Patil Sports Stadium.

FIFA president Gianni Infantino, alongside top officials from the Asian Football Federation (AFC) and All India Football Federation (AIFF), was in attendance at the venue as Spain eked out a solitary goal win and retained the title they also claimed in 2018.

Spain took the lead with Cristina's goal, when she scored off the rebound after the Colombian goalkeeper had stopped it the first time. However, the score remained 0-0 as the goal was disallowed by



a VAR review. It ruled that Cristina had touched the ball with her hand.

The two teams also met in the group phase, with Spain winning 1-0. This was European giants Spain's second title.

In the third-place classification match, Nigeria beat Germany 3-2 on penalties.

Two missed penalties by Germany's Paulina Platner and Loreen Bender and a save by goalkeeper Omilana Faith off Paulina Bartz's shot paved the way for Nigeria's first-ever medal in the tournament.

Hosts India failed to clear the group stage after losing all their three matches.


