Calls upon officers of CBI & CVC to rededicate themselves to abolish corruption from all walks of life

New Delhi, Oct. 20 (PIB)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi delivered a video message to the joint conference of CVC and CBI held today at Kevadia, Gujarat. The Prime Minister noted that the deliberations of the conference are taking place in Kevadia, a place marked by the presence of Sardar Patel, who gave the highest priority to making governance the basis of India's progress, public concerns and public welfare. "Today, when India is moving towards attaining its grand goals during the

Amrit Kaal. Today when we are committed to strengthening pro-people and proactive governance, your action-oriented diligence will give strength to the ideals of Sardar Saheb", the Prime Minister told the gathering. The Prime Minister called upon the officers of CBI and CVC to rededicate themselves to abolish corruption from all walks of national life. He said corruption takes away the rights of people and hinders the pursuit of justice for all, nation's progress and affects the collective power of the nation.

The Prime Minister emphasized that in the last 6-7 years, the Government has succeeded in instilling the confidence that it is possible to contain corruption. He said that there is trust that people can get the benefit of the government schemes without middlemen and bribes. Now people feel that corrupt, howsoever mighty, will not be spared, wherever they go. "Earlier, the way the governments and systems were run, they lacked both political and administrative will. Today there is the



political will to attack corruption and continuous improvement is also being carried out at the administrative level" he said. Talking about changed India, Shri Modi pointed out "Today, India of the 21st

part of the system. It wants its system transparent, process efficient and governance smooth."

Charting the government's journey from maximum control and maximum damage to minimum government and maximum governance, the Prime Minister explained how his government undertook the task of reduction of government interference in the lives of the common people in a mission mode by simplifying the government procedures. The Prime Minister

explained how the government stressed trust and technology to empower the citizens. He said that this Government does not mistrust the citizens and that is why, many layers of verification of documents have been removed and many facilities like birth certificate, life certificate and for pension are being delivered through technology without middlemen. Steps like the abolition of interviews in Group C and Group D recruitment, an online and faceless procedure

in services ranging from gas cylinder booking to tax filing are reducing occasions for corruption.

The Prime Minister shared his views on 'preventive vigilance'. He said that preventive vigilance can be achieved with alertness and can be strengthened through technology and experience. Along with technology and alertness- simplicity, clarity, transparency in the processes will go a long way for preventive vigilance. This will simplify our work and

Chief Secretary pays late night visit to GB Pant Hospital to take stock of its functioning

Inspects Labour Wards, New Medical Ward & upkeep of the Hospital

Issues on the spot directions for presence of more doctors on night duty, cleanliness of toilets and proper functioning of all electrical equipments

Port Blair, Oct. 20

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain along with Secretary (Health), Shri R N Sharma and Deputy Commissioner (SA), Shri Suneel Anchipaka visited GB Pant Hospital late in the night and particularly inspected both the Labour Wards of the Hospital, wherein it was noticed that women were sleeping on the ground and the Senior Resident on duty was not available. It was also noticed that one of the male resident intern was not on the spot, when the inspection took place.

Thereafter, the Chief Secretary inspected the New Medical Ward and it was found that only one Junior Resident was on duty and lot of attendants were sleeping on the floor. It was also observed that the fans in the corridor where a number of attendants were sleeping were not working. In this regard, the Chief Secretary directed that the Junior Engineer Incharge of Electrical be issued



showcause/suspended. The doctors present on the spot, Dr. Omkar Singh, Dr. AK Mandal and Dr. Rekha Verma were directed by the Chief Secretary to put up a proposal for creation of a hall for the comfort of the attendants. Since the



Islands have the highest number of Doctors per capita in the country, the Chief Secretary ordered that the New Medical Ward and all other Wards should have more doctors on night duty to take care of the patients. The Chief Secretary

warned that from next time, if any Doctors, Staff Nurses, Engineers are found missing from duty, they would be immediately placed under suspension and disciplinary action will be initiated against them. This is the second late night visit of the Chief Secretary, the first being in March, 2021 and the 6th visit to GB Pant Hospital.

Apart from this, it was also noticed that though the toilets of the Labour Wards were clean but that of the Surgical Ward were not clean. Taking note of this, the Chief Secretary directed the concerned to ensure proper upkeep of all the toilets in the Hospital.

The Chief Secretary also interacted with the patients as well as the attendants to know about their wellbeing and problems, if any. He assured them that the UT Administration is ever committed to provide the best of medical facilities and aid to the Islanders.

No positive case detected during test conducted on incoming flight & Inter Island passengers

Port Blair, Oct. 20

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar addressing a media briefing on COVID-19 held in the conference hall of IP&T today stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 491 passengers who arrived here yesterday,

no positive case has been detected. Today, 8 flights with 1325 passengers arrived, out of which 835 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on remaining 490 passengers and the reports are awaited.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

Red ginger (Alpinia purpurata) - best intercrop in plantation

Red ginger (Alpinia purpurata) belonging to the family Zingiberaceae is a popular cut flower and widely utilized in landscape horticulture because of its long attractive red flower bracts and lush green leaves. Partial shade condition is ideally suitable for red ginger and hence is best to be grown as intercrop in plantation-based cropping system. The optimum temperature for growth and development of red ginger is 21-35°C and hence humid tropics like Bay Islands are highly suitable. In partial shaded condition with light intensity of 13900 to 15700 lux resulted in round the year flower production with more number of flowers per plant. This shows that red ginger can be a potential intercrop in plantation-based cropping systems. Red ginger can be commercially propagated by division of clumps and off shoots. In coconut plantation with of spacing of 7.5 x 7.5 m, red ginger can be planted at spacing of 75 x 75 cm between two rows of coconut and by this method 5 rows of red ginger can be accommodated in between two rows of coconut. About 7100 red ginger plants can be accommodated per acre of coconut plantation. The rhizomes are planted at a depth of 7-10 cm and life irrigation to be given for rhizome sprouting. Flowers are harvested with long stalk of 50-80 cm length. The shelf life of harvested inflorescence is 2-3 weeks.

Benefit: The humid tropical climatic condition of the Island is highly suitable for cultivation of red ginger as intercrop in plantation based cropping system.

PMGKP: Insurance Scheme for Health Workers fighting COVID-19 extended for a further period of 180 days

So far 1351 claims settled under the scheme

'Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Package (PMGKP): Insurance Scheme for Health Care Workers Fighting COVID-19' was launched on 30.03.2020 to provide comprehensive personal accident cover of Rs. 50 Lakh to 22.12 lakh health care providers including community health workers and private health workers who may have been in direct contact and care of COVID-19 patients and may be at risk of being impacted by this.

Further, on account of the unprecedented situation, private hospital staff/retired/volunteer/local urban bodies/contract/daily wage/ ad-hoc/outsourced staff requisitioned by states/central hospitals/autonomous hospitals of central/states/UTs, AIIMS & Institute of National Importance (INI)/hospitals of Central Ministries specifically drafted for care of COVID-19 patients are also covered under the PMGKP. The current period of the policy is

ending on 20.10.2021. Since the Covid-19 pandemic has still not abated and deaths of health workers deployed for COVID related duties are still being reported from different States/UTs, accordingly, the insurance policy has been extended w.e.f. 21.10.2021 for a further period of 180 days so as to continue to provide the safety net to the dependents of health workers who are deputed to take care of COVID-19 patients. So far, 1351 claims have been paid under the scheme.

Global economy needs Clean, Affordable, Reliable and Sustainable energy to speed up post-pandemic recovery: Minister

New Delhi, Oct. 20 (PIB)

Minister of Petroleum & Natural Gas and Housing & Urban Affairs, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri today said that India believes that access to energy must be affordable and reliable. In his welcome remarks at Fifth India Energy Forum by CERAWEEK at New Delhi, he said that the global economy needs Clean, Affordable, Reliable, Sustainable

energy to speed up the post-pandemic recovery. We need to accept that the world needs a reliable supply of oil and gas until we can build new energy infrastructure.

The Minister said that to say that the world faces unprecedented challenges would be an understatement. In an era of energy transition, the energy markets are characterised by key imbalances, he added.

Shri Puri said that the current levels of oil and gas prices are too high. India is 85% dependent on imported oil while the import dependence is about 55% for gas. He said that 20% of the country's import bill is from these items. The import bill of these items has almost gone up by almost three times in last quarter compared to last year's corresponding quarter.

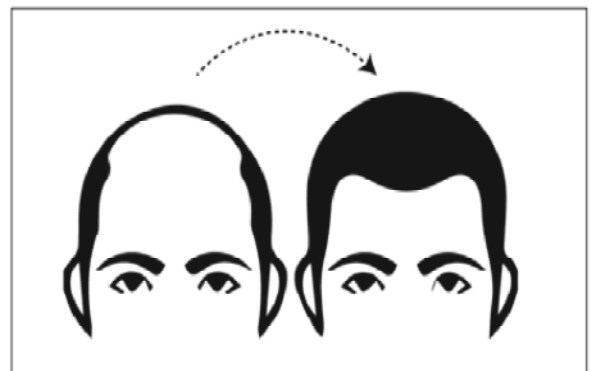
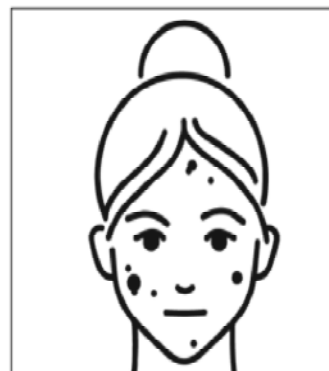


