Ordinary citizens vexed over addl. fee demand for e-stamps, long wait at authorized banks

Demand check on cyber café operators, rollback to authorized vendor system

Port Blair, Dec 22: While a range of government services are now available online, additional fee charged by private cyber cafes for e-stamp papers is taking a toll on common citizens. While the local administration has prescribed a set of rules for procuring e-stamps for various purposes, people particularly those belonging to the poor sections are compelled to pay extra for purchase of e-stamps even those of low denomination at cyber cafes. To add to their woes is long wait to obtain the e-stamps from the authorized banks.

As per sources, some cyber cafes in the city charge around Rs 50/- for an e-stamp of Rs 10 denomination. "Unjustified demand of fee to provide various online services is drawing criticism from the public for the cyber cafes operating the city. There is widespread discontentment among citizens for charge of huge money for even low denomination stamps papers by the cyber cafes operators. Either the administration should consider rolling back the earlier practice of issue of stamps papers from the authorized vendors or work out a mechanism to impose a cap on fee charged by cyber cafes," said a resident of Denapuri.

"Various government services have been made online with the aim of improve delivery of services to citizens without the citizens facing difficulties by visiting various offices. But the unjustified demand for additional money for e-stamps is taking a toll on the common man. It takes hardly some minutes to book an e-stamp online. But charging Rs 50 for 10 rupee e-stamp is totally unwarranted. Not every person can afford a computer, internet connection at home and are compelled to avail the services from the cyber cafes. To obtain e-stamps from the authorized banks, one has to wait for more than 25 days. While the local administration has prescribed a certain service charge to the levied on providing such online service for Common Service Centres (CSC), there is no cap imposed on cyber cafes as a result of which ordinary citizens are forced to pay through their nose for availing such e-stamps at cyber cafes. The administration should take a role of the prevailing situation and devise a mechanism to ensure such cyber cafes do not charge exorbitant fees from ordinary citizens," said another. The A&N Administration in collaboration with Stock Holding Corporation of India Limited had launched the online payment for stamp duty and printing of e-Stamp Certificate on 17th Dec. 2020. The system allows them to buy e-stamps upto a maximum of Rs.1000/- per their convenience from their place. The basic requirements for online e-stamping is any handheld device with internet connection and printer. Citizen may visit the website www.shcisstamp.com and login as guest or proceed to register. After registration with basic details, an URL will be sent to the registered mail id for activation which has to be activated by the user. This user credentials can be used across all online products of e-Stamping (non-judicial) and e-Court fee (judicial). The same user credentials are valid for all States/UT wherever online facility is available. In case of guest login, OTP will be sent to the mobile number for further verification.

After the registration, Client would enter all the details of the transaction such as the Name and address of the parties, consideration and Stamp duty amount etc. On submission of these details a Transaction Reference No. will be generated. Against this reference no., the user has to make online payment through Net Banking or VISA Debit Card via Payment Gateway Services. On successful completion of the payment, clients required to print the e-Stamp Certificate in A4 size plain paper. This citizen centric initiative has simplified the procedure and streamlined the entire process. Earlier this year, the district administration stated that some unscrupulous persons operating computer centres in the town are taking advantage of and demanding general public to pay an amount twice the price of the stamp paper. The general public who do not have direct access to computer system to purchase e-stamps online are being duped by such computer centres. The District Administration warned warns all such persons to avoid such malpractice and requested the general public to come forward and submit complaint against such persons, so that strict and penal action can be initiated against them.

Jathedar Shot Dead

Jathedar Santokh Singh, 52, president of the Delhi Gurudwara Prabhanda Committee was shot dead by a DGP member Sohan Singh Sandhu from the Singh Sabha Gurudwara in Delhi's Vishnu Garden. Immediately after Sohan Singh was shot dead by the Jathedar's bodyguard. Though police and eyewitness accounts were nebulous regarding the incident which took place a few seconds, preliminary investigations reveal that the Jathedar who was travelling in a white Ambassador car was shot thrice by Sandhu, a few yards from the gurudwara. He had come to attend a function at the gurudwara. Santokh Singh and Sohan Singh Sandhu were declared dead upon arrival at the hospital. Prime Minister Indira Gandhi has expressed shock at the Jathedar's murder.

Assam Talks To Resume

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OMICRON: CENTRE URGES STATES TO 'ACTIVATE' WAR ROOMS, EMERGENCY OPERATION CENTRES

Asserting that the Omicron variant is at least three times more transmissible than Delta, the Centre Tuesday asked states and union territories to "activate" war rooms, keep analyzing even small trends and surges and keep taking strict

besides increasing testing and surveillance. The letter highlights measures that need to be taken in view of initial signs of surge in cases of COVID-19 as well as increased detection of the variant of

zones etc. This evidence should be the basis for effective decision making at the district level itself. "Such a strategy ensures that infection is contained at the local level itself before it spreads to other parts of the state," Bhushan said in the letter.

Based on current scientific evidence, the VOC (variant of concern) Omicron is at least 3 times more transmissible than the Delta VOC. Besides, the Delta VOC is still present in different parts of the country.

Response Package (ECRP-II) funds released by central government and other available resources etc.

The existing National Clinical Management Protocol remains unchanged for Omicron, the letter said.

"Ensure stringent enforcement of home isolation as per extant guidelines. This would include among others: customized kit for persons undergoing home isolation, their regular monitoring through call centres as well as home visits etc. This will be a very critical activity in the days to come specially to ensure that persons under home isolation do not spread the virus to others in view of its higher transmissibility," the letter underlined.

The states and union territories have been asked to ensure 100 per cent coverage of first and second dose eligible beneficiaries in an accelerated manner. Special focus to be given to those districts where the first second dose coverage is less than the national average, the letter stated, adding the door-to-door vaccination campaign need to be strengthened.

They have also been asked to ensure advance engagement and information so that there is no misinformation or panic, transparent communication on hospital and testing infrastructure availability, regular press briefings etc.

"Participation of community backed by strict enforcement is necessary for ensuring Covid appropriate behaviour," the letter said.

Himalayan glaciers losing ice far quicker than others: Study

Port Blair, 22nd Dec, 2021: 14,798 Himalayan glaciers have lost around 40% of their ice compared to the Little Ice Age. "Our findings clearly show that ice is now being lost from Himalayan glaciers at a rate that is at least 10 times higher than the average rate over past centuries," co-author Jonathan Carrivick of Leeds University said in a statement. "This acceleration in the rate of loss has only emerged within the last few decades, and coincides with human-induced climate change." The Hindu Kush Himalayas experienced a

temperature rise of as much as 1.3 degree Celsius between 1951 to 2014, a comprehensive study on climate change over India by the earth sciences ministry had said in June 2020. Several areas of Hindi Kush Himalayas have experienced a declining trend in snowfall and retreat of glaciers in recent decades, it said. The mountainous region will experience warming in the range of 2.6-6 degrees by the end of this century, the official Indian study predicted, which will cause severe hydrological and agricultural impacts in the country.

Rat informed the House that as on December 14 this year, 10,635 applications for Indian citizenship were pending with the government. Out of these, 7,306 claims were from Pakistan, 1,152 from Afghanistan and 161 from Bangladesh. A total of 428 applications from stateless people were also pending with the government.

3,117 from minority communities of Afghanistan, Pak, Bangladesh granted citizenship since 2018: Govt

New Delhi, 22nd Dec, 2021: While rules for the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) are yet to be framed, government data show that a significant majority of those granted Indian citizenship since 2018

were minorities from Pakistan, Afghanistan and Bangladesh. According to data provided by the government in Parliament, 8,244 people from Hindu, Sikh, Jain and Christian faiths from the three neighbouring countries had applied for Indian citizenship during the period. Out of these, citizenship was granted to 3,117 people in December this year.

Moreover, between 2018 and 2020, the total number of foreigners from across the world who were granted Indian citizenship was 2,254. The overall data for 2021 was not available. "Number of citizenship applications received from Hindu, Sikh, Jain and Christian minorities groups from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan during the year 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 is 8,244. Number of Indian citizenship granted to people belonging to Hindu, Sikh, Jain and Christian minorities groups from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan during the year 2018,

2019, 2020 and 2021 is 3,117," MoS for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai told the Rajya Sabha on Wednesday in a written reply to a question. India does not have a refugee policy. The CAA was enacted by the Parliament on December 12, 2019, but its rules have not been framed as yet. The legislation, which seeks to grant citizenship to illegal immigrants belonging to Hindu, Sikh, Parsi, Christian and Buddhist communities from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan, was passed by the Parliament amid vehement criticism

from the Opposition that said the law had a "communal agenda" as it conspicuously left out Muslims. "All foreign nationals including refugees seeking are governed by the provisions contained in The Foreigners Act, 1946, The Registration of Foreigners Act, 1939, The Passport (Entry into India) Act, 1920 and The Citizenship Act, 1955," Rai said in his reply.

In reply to another question regarding the total number of foreigners granted Indian citizenship, Rai informed the House that between

2016 and 2020, as many as 4,177 people were granted Indian citizenship. Out of these, 628 claims were approved in 2018, 987 in 2019 and 639 in 2020.

MONTHLY RENTALS IN CO-LIVING PROPERTIES DOWN 10-25 PC POST COVID: REPORT

The average monthly rentals in co-living properties, including student housing, declined by 10-25 per cent across major after the outbreak of the Covid pandemic, according to property consultant Colliers India.

In its whitepaper Future of Co-living in India, Colliers India mentioned that the number of beds fell to 1.3-1.4 lakh in 2020 from 2 lakh in the previous year while the occupancy level dropped to 40-60 per cent.

There has been a dip of 10-25 per cent in rentals post-Covid, it pointed out.

population to their respective hometowns in the wake of the Covid-19 outbreak brought the evolving co-living sector to an immediate halt, the statement said.

On the outlook for the next year Colliers said the segment would witness a recovery, driven by reopening of offices, record vaccination and reopening of colleges in a phased manner. The number of beds could surge to 4.5 lakh by 2024.

"With the situation improving rapidly, the sector has recovered substantially and

add on to the demand for the co-living in coming quarters," JLL India CEO Ramesh Nair said.

During the period of 2015-2019, Colliers India MD (advisory services) Subhankar Mitra said, the student housing and co-living witnessed exponential growth resulting in sharp increase in the number of operators and investments.

"However, the pandemic marred the growth story of co-living temporarily, resulting in some players exiting the business thereby creating opportunities for acquisition and expansion for the others," he added.

The segment is now ready to enter a new phase of growth driven by factors such as pain point assessment and product recalibration, Mitra said.

Organised co-living is concentrated largely in metro and tier I cities of India with expansion being witnessed across tier II cities as well, the report said.

The key players in this space are -- Colive, Stanza, Zolo, Housar and Nestaway. There are around 500 co-living operators. The rental yield in this segment is high at 7-9 per cent.

"Co-living in India is still in its nascent stage and the operators are constantly updating their metrics," the report said.

The pandemic has further pushed the operators back to the drawing boards to reinvent their strategy to provide an attractive and safe housing solution, it added.

New players keep entering this segment because of higher yield compared to a traditionally rented house. The product offering is constantly evolving as new entrants are experimenting with specifications, amenities and services.



During the 2021 calendar year, the supply has again bounced back to over 2.10 lakh beds, and the occupancy level improved to 70 per cent.

"The concept of 'shared economy' got severely tested during the peak of the pandemic. Factors such as uncertain economic conditions resulting in loss of jobs, work from home and the shift of migrant

is looking more optimistic. The primary contributor to the recovery is the growing rate of vaccination.

"The unemployment rate is down to 7 per cent in November 2021, a gradual dip from 11.84 per cent in May 2021. Also, amidst the pandemic, hiring by IT companies has gathered pace followed by robust performance of the sector which will only

Genome sequencing of samples of all Covid cases starts in Delhi to check for Omicron

Genome sequencing of samples of all COVID-19-infected people in Delhi began Wednesday to ascertain if the new Omicron variant has spread in the community, city Health Minister Satyendar Jain said.

The national capital is processing around 100-125 cases a day, while it has the capacity of genome sequencing of 400-500 samples daily.

"The Delhi government runs the Lok Nayak Hospital and the Institute of Liver and Biliary Sciences can sequence 100 samples each day. Two at Centre-run labs in Delhi can sequence 200-300 samples a day. So, 400-500 samples can be analysed in a day, Jain said.

"Around 100 to 125 new cases are emerging every day... Samples of all COVID-19 patients will be sequenced from Wednesday. Through this, we will be able to ascertain the number of cases from the society. Till now, the maximum number of (Omicron) cases have come from foreign countries (sic)," the health minister said.

Jain had said Tuesday that three Omicron patients in Delhi had no travel history.



The total number of Omicron cases in the national capital mounted to 54, according to data shared by the Union Health Ministry on Tuesday.

Following a meeting of the Delhi Disaster Management Authority on Monday,

Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal had announced that samples of all Covid-positive patients would be sent for genome sequencing.

Minister Jain said the government will take steps to prevent crowding during Christmas and New Year's Eve celebrations.



ICC Test Rankings: Virat Kohli slips to No. 7

DUBAI: Indian captain Virat Kohli slipped a notch to be placed seventh in the latest ICC rankings for Test batters even as Australia's Marnus Labuschagne, riding on his prolific Ashes form, displaced England skipper Joe Root to become the new world number one.

India's Rohit Sharma remained static at fifth position.

Among bowlers, Ravichandran Ashwin is still in second place behind Australia skipper Pat Cummins.

Kohli, who played the second Test against New Zealand, was earlier placed sixth and now with 756 points is in seventh position. Labuschagne has climbed to the top of the ICC ranking's for Test batters for the very first time after sensational performances in the two matches of the Ashes so far.

With career-best 912 rating points, he went past Root (897), who



has dropped to the second spot.

Ranked fourth before the series, Labuschagne rose two spots to No.2 after scoring 74 in Australia's win in the Brisbane Test. In the second Test at Adelaide, he scored a hundred and fifty (103 and 51) as Australia routed England by 275

runs to go 2-0 up in the Ashes.

His teammate Mitchell Starc broke into the top 10 for Test bowlers after returning figures of 6/80 in the second Test which included four for in the first innings that helped reduce England to 236. He moves up to the 9th spot.

In the Player Rankings for T20Is, Pakistan captain Babar Azam reclaimed the top spot in the list of batters after a just one week of losing it.

With scores of 0 and 7 in the first two T20Is against the West Indies, Bazar dropped two spots to No.3 in last week's rankings update.

He came roaring back and is now tied at the top of the rankings with David Malan after a brilliant 79 in the final T20 that helped Pakistan complete a clean sweep over West Indies.

His fellow opener Mohammad Rizwan, who has had a tremendous 2021, capped the year by climbing to No.3 in T20I batters' rankings with career-best ratings of 798.

India's new white ball vice-captain KL Rahul is best placed Indian at fifth position in the table. There are no Indian bowlers in top 10 T20 list.

IPL mega auction likely to be held in Bengaluru on Feb 7 and 8

NEW DELHI: The BCCI is planning to hold the two-day mega Indian Premier League auction on February 7 and 8 in Bengaluru, a senior BCCI official said on Wednesday.

It could well be the last mega auction that BCCI might conduct as most of the original IPL franchises want to be discontinued. "Unless the COVID-19 situation worsens, we will have the IPL mega auction in India. The two-day event will be held on February 7 and 8 and like other years, we plan to hold it in Bengaluru. Preparations are underway," a senior BCCI official told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

There were reports that the auction will be held in the UAE but as of now, BCCI has no such plans. However with the emergence of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 and cases on the rise, the situation will remain fluid but if

there are restrictions with regards to overseas travel (unless allowed to decide to use charter planes), conducting it in India will be less of a logistical nightmare.

This year's IPL will be a 10-team affair with Sanjiv Goenka owned Lucknow franchise along with venture capital firm CVC owned Ahmedabad making their debut in the cash rich league.

CVC is however waiting for its letter of intent from the BCCI but is expected to get all clear in the next few weeks.

Both teams have time till Christmas to announce their three draft picks but BCCI might extend the dates for both as CVC is yet to get clearance.

Most of the franchise owners feel that mega auctions have passed their sell-by date and a

team's composition and balance gets severely compromised when there are auctions after every three years.

Delhi Capitals co-owner Parth Jindal had in fact said this on record how it is tough to release players after having put in effort to build a team.

"It is very sad to lose Shreyas Iyer, Shikhar Dhawan, Kagiso Rabada and Ashwin. The auction process itself is something like this. Going forward, IPL should look at this because it's not that you build a team, give chances to young players, groom them and get them opportunities from franchises, play for the country and then you lose them after three years," Jindal had said after players' retention was announced November 30.
