SIE to Conduct **Examination for National** Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme

Port Blair, Nov. 8: The State Institute of Education, Port Blairwill be conducting the NMMSS Examination in A&N Islands on 17th December, 2022 under the guidance of Ministry of Education (MoE). The selection test/ examination will be conducted to select students presently studying in Class VIII for award of Scholarship under the centrally sponsored scheme 'National Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme' (NMMSS) for the academic session 2022-

Students who have secured minimum 55% marks or equivalent Grade in class VII examinations (relaxable by 5% for SC/ST candidates), presently studying in Class VIII (Eighth) in Government, Govt.-Aided and Local Body Schools of State/ UT and whose parental income does not exceed Rs.3.5 Lakh per annum from all sources are eligible to appear in NMMSS Examination.

The students of Kendriya Vidyalayas, Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas and Residential Schools run by State Government and Private Unaided Schools are not eligible for scholarship under the

Success is not an activity but a process ...

Economics and Exclusion

On the face of it, a new kind of reservation in education and jobs solely based on income or economic criteria was destined to face several constitutional hurdles. However, given that the special provision in favour of 'Economically Weaker Sections' (EWS) among those who are not eligible for community-based guotas meant for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes, was introduced through an amendment to the Constitution, only a demonstration that the new quota violated the basic structure of the Constitution would have succeeded in dislodging it. By a majority of three to two, the Supreme Court of India has ruled that the amendment does not violate the basic structure. In the process, the Court has recorded a major paradigm shift in its conception of what constitutes valid affirmative action. For the first time, it has upheld a kind of reservation that specifically excludes those from the three existing categories of beneficiaries and is extended solely on the basis of economic criteria. When in Indra Sawhney (1992), a nine-judge Bench upheld OBC reservation, but favoured exclusion of advanced sections of the beneficiary communities from its purview, it introduced a form of economic criteria for the first time. However, the criteria were used to exclude individuals, while the groups continued to be eligible for reservation. At the same time, the Court struck down a provision for 10% reservation for economically backward sections introduced by the Congress regime, on the ground that the Constitution does not provide for reservation solely based on economic criteria.

The logic behind this scheme of affirmative action was that reservation is a tool of reparation for groups excluded from mainstream avenues of advancement due to caste discrimination, while it should not become a benefit or reward for individual members of the same groups who may have made reasonable progress. This logic was wholly inverted in 2019 when the BJP-led regime amended the Constitution to provide reservation solely on economic criteria to sections other than those enjoying reservation under the categories of SCs, STs and OBCs. The resort to economic or income criterion as the sole marker for identifying a beneficiary is obviously unsustainable from the point of view of equality of opportunity. All five judges agree that the introduction of an economic criterion does not violate the Constitution, However, Justice S. Ravindra Bhat, with Chief Justice of India U.U. Lalit, concurring, has correctly found that the exclusion of groups that already enjoyreservation from accessing this new form of affirmative action violates the equality norm, which is a basic feature of the Constitution.unsustainable, as it is a vertical compartment that is carved out of the open competition segment. Once the idea of using economic criterion alone is accepted in principle, as has been done even by the dissenting opinion, it can only be argued that the benefit should have been modulated to maximise thebeneficiaries. The objective of economic emancipation could have been better achieved if the income-based reservation had been thrown open to all sections of society. The fear that some sections may corner a large share of the reservation cake had earlier been partially addressed by the 'creamy layer' norm for backward classes, but it also meant that the welloff among them will have to compete in open competition. By introducing an income criterion and barring OBCs, besides SC/ST communities, from the EWS silo, there is a clear violation of equality in their eligibility to avail of a part of the open competition opportunities.

Bharat Biotech Expects Regulator's Nod for **Intranasal COVID-19** Vaccine This Month

Health, Science /Tech

November 8: Bharat Biotech, which is working on an intranasal COVID-19 vaccine candidate is hopeful of getting regulatory licenses this month, if all goes well, Chairman and Managing Director of company, Krishna Ella said.



He also has said BBIL (Bharat Biotech International Limited), which has a vaccine manufacturing plant in Ankleshwar in Gujarat is one of the two plants in the world capable of producing vaccine for monkeypox disease. The other one is in Bavarian Nordic, Germany.

"We will be applying for licenses and (they) should come. If everything goes well, we know by next month (August). You (people) would rather get the coronavirus nasal vaccine and if any variant comes it is easy to plug in quickly and move fast. So we are optimistic that both injectable and nasal strategy will work protecting people's lives in the future, any variant comes also we can handle," he said in a recently held

Clinical trials of nasal vaccine complete

Mr. Ella said the firm completed clinical trials of the nasal vaccine with about 4,000 volunteers and there is no instance of side effector adverse reaction reported

The Drug Controller General of India gave its nod to conduct clinical trials for BBIL's intranasal vaccine as booster dose.

Separately, the DCGI also granted permission to the firm to conduct phase-3 clinical trial to compare the immunogenecity and safety of BBV-154 (intranasal) with Covaxin. This trial has been permitted to be conducted at nine sites. Nasal vaccine vs Injectable vaccineJustifying the reason for a nasal vaccine for coronavirus, he said any injectable vaccine only protects the lower level (of the body). That's why people who were vaccinated with injectable vaccines may still get RT-PCR positive, whereas the nasal jab gives protection to the whole body. Replying to a query, he predicted that the country may face higher hospitalisations with the emerging coronavirus variant BA.5 as the new form may "evade the vaccine". "It is totally different from delta variant. It is totally different from omicron also. They call "deltaomicron", a combination of both. I think if that attacks then it is going to be an issue. But we keep watching. We are working on that also. Risk mitigation we are trying to do. We are well prepared now... I think hospitalisation will increase if there are BA.5 attacks," Mr. Ella said.

> In addition to the qualifying date of 01.01.2023, an eligible Citizen, who is going to attain theage of eighteen years on any of the subsequent qualifying dates in the year 2023, that is to say, the 1st April, 2023, the 1st July, 2023, or the 1st October, 2023, may also file his or her claim for inclusion of his or her name in the Electoral Roll, in Form-6, in advance, and the same shall be considered and decided in the respective quarter of the year with reference to the respective qualifying date.

ocial turbulence is now a chronic condition in India as in many other parts of the World. On one hand the Government of India has been trying hard to sell its idea of a "New India" to the whole world and on other hand, there are disturbing events like strikes, communal riots, bharat bandh and what not. Take, for instance the city of Mumbai which is considered to be the financial, commercial and entertainment capital of India, where there was a strike called by private cab drivers, the reason for which was the drop in incentives by cab aggregators. Next in the series was great commotion by the employees of essential services which held people of Mumbai to ransom. What was common in the above events was "Public Anger" as well as their cries for justice. One can easily understand how much inconvenience and harassment these strikes and bandhs must have caused to millions of ordinary people. There is tension everywhere and the nation suffers a huge economic loss. It should be borne in mind that, due to various strikes alone, in Mumbai, there has been, according to government sources, a loss of around Rs.1000 crores and according to a leading economic weekly of Mumbai , Rs.2000 crores. Moreover, the workers do not reap a real, long-term benefit even if they get a pay-hike because as a result of it the prices begin rising again. In view of all this, one would like to know whether there is no peaceful method of resolving such disputes which cause great social upheavals and huge economic losses. It should in this context, not be hard to appreciate that an emerging economy like India, cannot afford to waste its energies on avoidable conflicts. It should also be remembered that all techniques of mob mobilisation by persons who have no soul-force, ultimately unleash forces which are bound to produce violence. Hence, the most effective non-violent method which does not create turbulence in the society, therefore, is the method of creating soul-force by Yoga power and to base our private industry on the principle of trusteeship. No society has yet tried these methods and one may, therefore, feel awry to adopt this new socio-economic measure, but the very rationale behind the whole idea of trusteeship and yoga will convince anyone that it is the only method that can bring about a silent revolution in the desired direction, satisfying all sections of the society and ending all strikes and turbulence for every one for ever.



'We Haven't Played Well, England Need to win T20 World Cup to Achieve Greatness'- Moeen Ali

November 8: England must win more silverware to be considered a truly great limited-overs team, all-rounder Moeen Ali said, as the 2010 Twenty20 World Cup champions prepare to face India on Thursday in the semi-finals of the latest edition.

England, who also won the 50overs version three years ago, have failed to hit top gear in Australia and reached the lastfour with a scrappy win over Sri Lanka

"There's a lot of talk about us being a great white-ball side and the England team has been really good, but we've only won one tournament," Moeen told British media.

"It's important we start winning more as a team and as a country.

"Then we can call ourselves a top side."



While England have not been firing on all cylinders at the World Cup, Mooen backed them to peak at the right time.

"We wanted to get to the semis. In the past we've played well and got through," he said.

"This time I don't think we've played well but we've got through and the best is yet to come with this side. I don't think we've been near where we want to be but now's a great opportunity to put that right.

"You always talk about peaking at the right time and if you scrape through it means you can get better. If we play our bestcricket in the next two games I believe we win the World Cup."

Pakistan vs New Zealand Tip-off XI: Haris to Open, Babar to Bat at Three, Nawaz to Bowl in the Powerplay

November 8: Since their first match loss against India in the World Cup, Pakistan's cricket ecosystem has been crying wolf. About the form of Babar Azam and Mohammad Rizwan, about Shaheen Afridi's fitness, about Babar Azam's captaincy, about this and that.

Indian Express argues for Mohammad Haristo open, Babar Azam to bat at No 3 and and Mohammad Nzwaz to start the proceedings for Pakistan with the ball for their semi-final match against New Zealand in Adelaide.

Mohammad Haris, the blazing strokeplayer responsible for his Pakistan's World T20 turnaround. He has travelled to Australia as a reserve.

It's this fearlessness that has catalysed Pakistan's turnaround in the T20 World Cup. His 11-ball 28 against South Africa and 18-ball 31 versus Bangladesh have been the sort of momentumfuelling knocks that Pakistanhad been frantically searching for.

Suddenly, from being a reserve player, Haris has become an indispensable batsman for his team. So much so that many pundits want him to open the innings. "We need firepower at the top with batters who are showing clear intent like Haris," Shahid Afridi tweeted. Waqar Younis is convinced that nobody in the Pakistan team understands T20 cricketas much as Haris does. With Babar Azam and Mohammad Azam struggling at the top Pakistan might play a punt by sending Haris to make the most of the powerplay.

Babar Azam to bat at No 3

Pakistan teammentor Matthew Hayden has backed his under-fire skipper Babar Azam to produce "something special" in the knockout stages of the T20 World Cup. The fourth-highest runscorer in T20Is since the last World Cup, Babar has failed to fire in the ongoing showpiece, with a 33-ball 25 against Bangladesh being his best in the last five matches.

With pressure mounting on him, we might see Babar playing at 3 to strengthen the middle order. Babar has managed only 39 runs in five innings and is due for a big one in the tournament. His scores prior to the start of the tournament, however, includes an unbeaten 79

against the very attack he takes on in the semifinal in New Zealand's conditions. His form at the World Cup is likely nothing more than a blip, and a match-winning innings in his side's most important games of the year should be on its way.

Nawaz to bowl in powerplays

Finn Allen and Devon Conway tormented the Australian bowling attack in their first match. Allen particularly was very aggressive against the speedster. But in other matches duo looked vulnerable against the spinand Pakistan might gamble with Nawaz's left-arm spin in the powerplay to get the Kiwi openers cheaply.

It is highly unlikely that there will be any changes in the playing XIs from both sides.


