Port Blair, Aug 24: In view of COVID-19 pandemic situation and delay in submission of local OBC / Origin Certificate by the parents, the last date of receipt of online application for allotment of various professional/technical/non-technical courses at mainland has been extended from 21.08.2021 to 31.08.2021.

## Inordinate delays in issuing NOC for online building plan approval draws flak for ANC

Port Blair, Aug 24: The Port Blair Municipal Council has taken up the issue of inordinate delays by the Andaman Nicobar Command in issuing NOC for online approval of building plans. In a letter to the Commander-in-Chief, ANC, the Executive Engineer, PBMC has stated that the Council has submitted 35 building plans online which comes under the vicinity of Port Blair for want of accord of NOC. However, four months has since passed, the ANC has not given the approval, as a result of which applicants are facing hardships. He mentioned that due to delays in approval by the ANC,



applicants are approaching the Council and raising objections that Council is delaying the sanction of online building plan approval. Residents living in close proximity to the Port Blair airport and waiting to construct houses are facing a lot of hardship in getting their new building plan approved due to lack of cooperation and coordination by the ANC. As per norms, residents living in the vicinity of the airport and willing to construct buildings have to obtain building plan approval from the PBMC and the ANC. Building plans submitted to PBMC are further submitted by the civic body to the ANC for approval and only after the approval of the ANC, residents can start

### Two ferry vessels for Shaheed Dweep for 100 students appearing for exams

Port Blair, Aug 24: The Member of Parliament, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma with Shri Rangal Halder President PCC today met the Deputy Commissioner of South Andaman, Mr. Suneel Anchipaka and highlighted the problems being

faced by people of Shaheed Dweep, Swaraj Dweep, Rangat and Long Islands, in absence of a connecting ferry (Line Boat) for these islands. He pointed out that before lockdowns a ferry used to connect all these islands and hence previously people from these islands were able

to travel from one island to the other, very fast and with minimum expenditure. The MP pointed out that in absence of the said ferry service people of remote islands have to come to Port Blair first, then to Port Blair for tickets and then travel to other islands, which cost

more than Rs.2000 to Rs. 2500 per head. The Member of Parliament demanded to restart the Ferry Services connecting Shaheed Dweep, Swaraj Dweep, Rangat and Long Island at the earliest. Mr. Sharma also

## One new +ve case found, 11 active cases in South Andaman

Port Blair, Aug 24: One new positive case of COVID-19 has been detected on Tuesday. One of the passengers, who arrived here in flights on Monday, had tested positive for the infection on re-testing. Altogether, 639 passengers arrived here in four flights on Tuesday. RT-PCR tests were conducted on them and the results

will be available tomorrow. None of the 351 passengers bound for the North and Middle Andaman district tested positive for the infection at Farragunj today, said the Deputy Director of Information, Publicity and Tourism, Mr. RS Meena. At the daily press briefing, Mr. Meena informed that currently there are eleven active cases of COVID-19 in these islands

and patients are undergoing the treatment COVID Care facilities in South Andaman. A total of 169 were tested at Mohanpura, 181 at Phoenix Bay and 06 passengers at the helicopter terminal and all tested negative for infection. 900 doses of COVID-19 vaccine were administered at JNRM today of

### Return of Taliban has implications for India

The dramatic events in Kabul over the weekend have shocked India, which seemed quite unprepared like much of the world for a precipitous collapse of the government headed by Ashraf Ghani. Through the last few weeks, Delhi had stiffened its opposition to the Taliban and doubled down its support for Kabul. This was reinforced by the broader Indian elite and popular sentiment in favour of Kabul. The genuine warmth for the Afghan people and a deep commitment for their welfare might have prevented India from recognising the weaknesses of the government in Kabul. Delhi had also perhaps overestimated the domestic political support in Washington for a strong posture against the Taliban and the Biden Administration's ability to manage the end-game of its plan to withdraw all troops from Afghanistan. While a post-mortem of the developments in Afghanistan must take place at an appropriate time, Delhi's current focus must be on addressing the immediate challenges confronting it in Afghanistan. As a non-permanent member of the UN Security Council, Delhi will have a voice in shaping the international debate on the situation in Afghanistan. India also chairs the Taliban Sanctions Committee of the UNSC and will have an important role in framing the international response to the Taliban's demands for the lifting of all sanctions against its leaders. India also must step up its diplomatic outreach to all the major powers and key regional actors to develop political and policy coordination in responding to the dynamic situation in Afghanistan. Meanwhile, delivering international humanitarian assistance to the large number of Afghan people displaced by fighting in the last few weeks must be taken up as a high priority at the UN. The final challenge is domestic. As Islamabad's triumphalism at the successful re-installation of the Taliban begins to rise and Pakistan-based jihadi groups turn their attention to Kashmir, tensions are bound to rise on India's western borders. Delhi must maintain vigilance against a resurgence of cross-border terrorism that could quickly destabilise Kashmir and escalate the conflict between India and Pakistan.

the building construction work. In order to ensure speedy approval, the PBMC has initiated a process of securing online approval of building plans. The online system of securing building plans has eased the procedure as the new system has ushered in more transparency. Once the documents are uploaded and after verification, the building plan approval is issued by the Council. Applicants submit the building plans to PBMC which are forwarded to the ANC for online approval. But after the introduction of the online system, files pertaining

to approval of building plans have been piled up in the Command office and residents have had to face difficulties as they cannot take up the construction work without approval. While approval is given fast and quickly by the PBMC, citizens blame the ANC for the delay in granting approval. Since March 2020, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the approval work has totally halted, but after the unlock, the ANC should speed up the process so that those waiting for the approval can start the building construction work.

# COUNTRY'S FIRST MRNA VACCINE SAFE, DCGI GIVES NOD FOR PHASE 2/3 CLINICAL

India's first Covid-19 mRNA vaccine was found to be safe and given the go-ahead from the Director General of India to move into the phase 2/3 clinical trials. Genovva Biopharmaceuticals Ltd., (an Emcure group of companies) is a Pune-based biotechnology company that has been working on the nation's first mRNA-based Covid-19 vaccine.

The firm submitted the interim clinical data of the Phase II study to the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSCO), the Government of India's National Regulatory Authority (NRA).

"We had enrolled 82 participants across three trial sites (two in Pune and one in Kolhapur) in the Phase I trial that has been completed. Safety data was good enough and approval has been given for phase 2/3 trial which is expected to begin in the next two weeks," Dr Sanjay Singh, CEO of Genovva Biopharmaceuticals Ltd told The Indian Express. The vaccine Subject Expert Committee (SEC) reviewed the interim Phase I data and

found that HGC019 was safe, tolerable and immunogenic in the participants of the study. Genovva submitted the proposed Phase II and Phase III study — A Prospective, Multicentre, Randomized, Active-controlled, Observer-blind, Phase II study seamlessly followed by a Phase III study to evaluate the Safety, Tolerability, and Immunogenicity of the candidate HGC019 (COVID-19 vaccine) in healthy subjects — which was approved by the office of the DCGI, CDSCO. Vaccine price to be outcome of sale; have output capacity of 30 mn doses per month. The study will be conducted in India at approximately 10-15 sites in Phase II and 22-27 sites in Phase III. Genovva plans to use the DBT-ICMR clinical trial network sites for this study. "We hope to enrol 4,400 participants," Dr Singh said. The vaccine development programme was partly funded by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Govt of India under ICMR CEPI back in June 2020. Later on, the DBT further supported the programme under the Mission Covid



Swaksha — The Indian Covid-19 Vaccine Development Mission, implemented by BIRAC. "We are aiming to roll out the vaccine as early as possible, maybe by year-end and initially it will be for adults," Dr Singh said. Genovva is investing in scaling up its manufacturing capacity to cater to the nation's vaccine requirement, he added. In a statement, Dr Renu Swarup, Secretary, DBT and Chairperson, BIRAC said, "It is a matter of great pride that nation's first mRNA-based vaccine is found to be safe and the Drugs Controller General of India has approved Phase 2/3 trial. We are confident that this will be an important vaccine for both India and the world. This is an important milestone in our indigenous Vaccine Development Mission and positions India on the Global Map for Novel Vaccine Development."

# Former India footballer Olympian Chandrasekharan dies aged 86

Chandrasekharan, who played as a defender, was a member of the Indian team in the 1960 Rome Olympics, the last time the country participated in football at the Games.

Former India footballer O Chandrasekharan, popularly known as Olympian Chandrasekharan in his home state Kerala, died at the age of 86 in Kochi on Tuesday. He had been suffering from dementia for a decade or so. Chandrasekharan, who played as a defender, was a member of the Indian team in the 1960 Rome Olympics, the last time the country participated in football at the Games. India famously held France 1-1 in a

and his defensive partners. His death comes just days after SS Hakim, another one from that Olympics team, passed away. Chandrasekharan was also part of Indian teams that won gold in the 1962 Asian Cup, silver in the 1964 AFC Asian Cup, silver in the Merdeka Tournament (1959 and 1964). He played alongside some of the greatest names in Indian football like PK Banerjee, Chuni Goswami, Tulsidas Balaraman, Simon

Sunderraj, Peter Thangaraj, Jarral Singh, and Mariappa Kempaiah. Born in Irinjalkuda in Thrissur district, Chandrasekharan honed his football skills at Maharaja's College in Enakulam and went on to play for Calcutta in Mumbai from 1966. After his retirement from international football in 1966, he played for the State Bank of India. He was also the captain of the Maharashtra team that won the Santosh Trophy national championship in 1963.

## At 46, skating nomad-turned-Olympian Oberholzer inspiring youth, impressing mum

Dallas Oberholzer, 46, competed in the teenager-dominated sport in Tokyo but the South African is a pioneer who overcame his Apartheid upbringing to find new converts among the coloured population

With a battered skateboard under his arm and nothing in his pockets, Dallas Oberholzer awoke into Isithumba — the Zulu village between Durban and Pietermaritzburg — in 2001. There, he wooed the kids with tricks and flips and in return, South Africa's skateboarding nomad was gifted a piece of land by the village elders. By 2009, the piece of land, overlooking the Umgeni river in the Valley of a Thousand Hills, had grown into a homestead comprising tin-roofed huts and a skate park. That year, the youth camp attracted Tony Hawk, the name synonymous with the sport. The American visited the village and was so enamoured by the skills of the Zulu kids that he shipped personalised boards out for them. A year later, with the country gripped by Fifa World Cup fever, Oberholzer was reveling in the festivities, skating down the street to the shops when he was arrested. "I had been arrested for skating before. This time, I was jailed and asked to pay the bail to get out," Oberholzer tells The Indian Express. "Ten years later, my country asked me to represent it at the Olympic Games. That's how ridiculous skateboarding could be."



Oberholzer, 46, competed at skateboarding's Olympic debut in Tokyo. He was the oldest member of Team South Africa and the second-

oldest participant in the youngest sport. Fellow 46-year-old Rune "The Danish Destroyer" Glitberg pipped him by eight months. Oberholzer says the veterans made it a perfect show case for skateboarding. "I don't think ever again there will be a 40-year-old skateboarder at the Olympics. You'd be lucky if a 30-year-old makes it. So, it was just lovely that the introduction to skateboarding was such a mixed bag of people," he says. "It wasn't predictable." Oberholzer's men's park event was won by an 18-year-old from Australia. The combined ages of the podium in the women's street and park events were 42 and 44 respectively. Just like the spin of the universe, the skateboarding universe spins fast. Things are moving faster and getting more technical. These young athletes from the start, they see things that are really good," he says. "Whereas

when I started, we aimed for things that are very average now. Their progression, their trajectory is just through the roof compared to my steady progression." It had taken him to 50 countries but with little to show for it. He moved to Durban to train at Tony Hawk-designed skate park. The search for ambition and direction brought him to Isithumba in 2001, which remains his on-and-off shelter. "I am the only white person in a 30km radius. Everybody thinks I'm crazy," he says. "Everybody wanted to know why I wanted to live there. My parents talked about the negatives of living here but got over it later. Some comments would be backhanded, stuff like 'god that you are helping the blacks' but for me, this was a place to have fun, to build a safe space for skaters." A white South African schooled separately during the Apartheid era,

In Tokyo, Oberholzer noticed how the other skate teams had physios, coaches, and support crew. How Australian Keegan Palmer, who won the gold medal, is from the country with the highest percentage of skateparks, and why Japan's rise was due to the infrastructure.
