In a meeting of the PCC held on 07th May 2022, Shri Rangalal Halder, President and Shri G.Bhasker, Campaign Committee Chairman announced the decision to hold the candle march. Accordingly, the proposed march will begin at the

Member Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Chief Secretary of Andaman Nicobar Administration to start Dental Implant facilities at G B Pant Hospital, Port Blair.

In a letter addressed to the Chief Secretary the Member of Parliament pointed out that although facilities for Dental care and Dental extraction are available at G B Pant Hospital Port Blair, there is no facility for Dental Implant for patients.



He added that G B Pant Hospital is preferred by a large number of patients, including patients from low income groups as well as patients from Inter-Island but due to absence of Dental Implant facilities patients facing huge inconvenience.

SAFETY TIPS ON CYCLONE PREPAREDNESS

(For Cyclone, Heavy Rain, Water Logging, Flash Flood etc.)



- 1.Listen to radio or TV weather reports for warning & advice and be alert.
- 2.Identify safe shelters in your area. These should be cyclone resistant and also find the closest and safe route to reach them.
- 3.All your family members should know the safe routes to nearest shelter/raised puccabuildings.
- 4. Keep your emergency kit and basic food supply, medicines, torch and batteries etc. ready in waterproof bags. Drink preferably boiled water. Keep your food items covered.
- 5.Doors, windows, roof and walls should be strengthened/ checked before the cyclone season through retrofitting and repairing. Store adequate foodgrains and water in safe places.
- 6.If your area is flood-prone, consider suitable flood resistant building materials.
- 7.Do not let children and pregnant woman remain empty stomach.
- 8. Put furniture, clothing and valuable items etc. on a higher platform so that they can be shifted safely/easily.
- 9.Do not use electrical appliances, which are in flood water.
- 10.Do not go into water of unknown depth and current.
- 11.Do not allow children to play in, or near flood water.
- 12.Do not venture into the sea if so advised. Stay Indoors under the strongest part of the house/if not moved to the cyclone shelter.
 - 13.Remain indoors until informed that weather has improved.
- 14.In case of cyclone alert, do not go out, till officially advised that it is safe. If evacuated, wait till advised to go back. Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush/panic.
- 15.Be careful of broken/uncovered power lines, damaged roads and houses, fallen trees etc.
- 16.Be careful of snakes, as snake bites are common during floods.

- * Use the recommended route to return to your home. Do not rush.

DOs & DONTS OF LIGHTNING SAFETY

- * Check weather forecast before outdoor activities.
- * Keep ready an Emergency survival kit with important medication, dry foods etc.
- * Postpone outdoor activities and stay inside for at least 30 minutes after you last hear thunder or see lightning.
- * Avoid metal structures and get off elevated areas such as hills, mountains ridges or peaks.
- * If you are caught in an open area, act quickly to remove yourself from danger.
- * Got out of and away from ponds, lakes, and other water bodies.
- * If you are in open place, sit down by closing your ears properly with joint feet. * Rubber soled shoes and car tyres do not offer protection from lightning.
- * Keep away from all utility lines and objects that conduct electricity (telephone, power, metal fences, overhead wires, etc. tree and hilltops.
- * Unplug any all electrical/electronic equipment/appliances such as TV, computer, fans etc. and turn off Air Conditioner well before the storm arrives.
- * Use battery operated radio for news updates.
- * Find a house, building or a car with a solid roof.
- * Stay away from broken power lines and report them immediately.
- * Help people who may require special assistance such as infants, children, women and elderly.
- * Provide immediate medical treatment if someone near you have been struck

- * Do not go outside during adverse weather especially for working in agriculture field, grazing cattle, fishing and plying boats.
- * Do not take shelter under electric or telephone poles or trees.
- * Do not use metallic items and stay away from bikes.
- Never use mobile phones during lightning
- * Do not use umbrellas with iron rods.
- * If you are in forest area, take shelter under small and dwarf trees.
- * Do not lie on concert/marble floors and do not lean against concert walls.
- * Avoid contact with electrical equipment
- * Avoid shower, take a bath, wash dishes or use any other water source.
- * Do not swim or be close to water
- * Do not go under or near tall trees.
- * Don't lie on the ground.

Early self-awareness of autism might lead to better life quality: Study



Individuals who learn they are autistic at a younger age can have a heightened quality of life and sense of well-being in adulthood. That's the finding of a new study, published in the journal Autism, which also found that those who learned of their autism as adults reported more positive emotions (especially relief) about autism when first learning they were autistic.

Findings suggest that telling a child that they are autistic at a younger age empowers them by providing access to support and a foundation for self-understanding that helps them thrive later in life.

For the first time, researchers directly investigated whether learning if one is autistic at a younger age is associated with better adult outcomes. Many people autistic particularly females, ethnic/racial minorities and people with limited resources diagnosed years after the characteristics are first noticed. In many cases, autistic people do not receive their diagnosis until adulthood.

The study was carried out by a team of autistic and non-autistic students and academic researchers.

Seventy-eight autistic university students were surveyed, sharing how they found out they were autistic and how they felt about their diagnosis. Respondents also revealed how they felt about their lives and being autistic now.

One of the co-authors, Dr Steven Kapp, Lecturer in Psychology at the University of Portsmouth, was diagnosed with and informed of his autism aged 13. He said: "Students who learned they were autistic when they were younger felt happier about their lives than people who were diagnosed at an older age. Our study shows that it is probably best to tell people they are autistic as soon as possible in a balanced, personal, and developmentally appropriate way. Learning one is autistic can be empowering because it helps people understand themselves and also helps them connect with other people like them."

However, being given a diagnosis as an adult can often also be empowering.

empowering. Dr Kapp said: "Learning about autism at older age associated with more positive emotions about a diagnosis - especially relief. This finding makes although sense, emotional reactions are often very complex and unique to each person there has been a lot of research emerging showing that relief is a common response to an autism diagnosis in

adulthood." The study suggests that parents should not wait for children to become adults to tell them they are autistic. No participants recommended doing so, although most highlighted factors to consider when informing a child of their autism, including developmental level, support needs, curiosity, and personality.

Findings also suggest that parents should tell their children they are autistic in ways that help them understand and feel good about who they are.

One participant said: "I would tell my child that autism is a different way of thinking, that it can be challenging and beautiful and powerful and exhausting and impactful, that autistic people deserve to be themselves, to be proud of their identity, and have supports that help them meet their needs."

Bella Kofner, co-lead author (24), who was diagnosed with autism at the age of 3 and informed of her autism at the age of 10, said: "This is the first study, to our knowledge, demonstrate that learning at a young age that one is autistic may have positive impacts on emotional health among autistic university students. Hopefully, this finding may begin to address concerns parents have about when to talk to their child about autism. `When` the conversation begins is particularly important. Our findings suggest that learning at a younger age that one is autistic can help autistic people develop selfunderstanding access support, providing the foundations for wellbeing in adulthood."

SpaceX gives rocket ride to ISS to 3 paying space enthusiasts; Check cost of each seat



Canaveral: SpaceX launched three rich businessmen and their astronaut escort to the International Space Station on Friday for more than a week's stay, as NASA joins Russia in hosting guests at the world's most expensive tourist destination. It's SpaceX's first private charter flight to the orbiting lab after two years of carrying astronauts there for NASA.

Arriving at the space station Saturday will be an American, Canadian and Israeli who run investment, real estate and other companies. They're paying \$55 million apiece for the rocket ride and accommodations, all meals included.

Russia has been hosting tourists at the space station and before that the Mir station for decades. Just last fall, a Russian movie crew flew up, followed by a Japanese fashion tycoon and his assistant. NASA is finally getting into the

act, after years of opposing space station

visitors.

Their tickets include access to all but the Russian portion of the space station they'll need permission from the three cosmonauts on board. Three Americans and a German also live up there.

Former NASA astronaut Michael Lopez-Alegria, the chaperone, plans to avoid talking about politics and the war in Ukraine while he's at the space station. "I honestly think that it won't be awkward. I mean maybe a tiny bit," he said. He expects the "spirit of collaboration will shine through."

The private Axiom Space company arranged the visit with NASA for its three paying customers: Larry Connor of Dayton, Ohio, who runs the Connor Group; Mark Pathy, founder and CEO of Montreal's Mavrik Corp.; and Israel's Eytan Stibbe, a former fighter

pilot and founding partner of Vital Capital.

Before the launch, their enthusiasm was obvious: Stibbe did a little dance when he arrived at the rocket at Kennedy Space Center.

SpaceX and NASA have been upfront with them about the risks of spaceflight, said Lopez-Alegria, who spent seven months at the space station 15 years ago.


"There's no fuzz, I think, on what the dangers are or what the bad days could look like," Lopez-Alegria told The Associated Press before the flight.

Each visitor has a full slate of experiments to conduct during their nine to 10 days there, one reason they don't like to be called space tourists.

"They're not up there to paste their nose on the window," said Axiom's cofounder and president, Michael Suffredini, a former NASA space station program manager.

The three businessmen are the latest to take advantage of the opening of space to those with deep pockets. Jeff Bezos' rocket company Blue Origin is taking customers on 10-minute rides to the edge of space, while Virgin Galactic expects to start flying customers on its (Contd/-page.6...)



the overall quality of health care provided at this hospital, it is alleged.

Rootcause of the problem begins with the inadequate manpower, especially paramedics, nurses etc. When it comes to Nursing Staff, there is severe shortage of them. Ironically, retired Nursing Officers are found to have been reemployed on lumpsum remuneration much to the awe of patients since the patients have to again endure the sulking of such senior nurses who have comparatively less dedication for their work, patients complain.

became Situation worse especially after the COVID as the infrastructures that turned decrepit during the two years of lockdown has not been restored to its original condition. As regards the diagnostic systems such as X-rays, etc, patients, regardless of their state of health and emergency are made to wait for an unwarranted period to give a date. On an average, a patient is made to wait for about 30-45 days in a cycle to get access to X-ray or any other diagnostic facility. The GB Pant hospital, despite being part of a premier Medical College still reels from such pathetic condition is an open secret.

There are instances where OPD patients being referred by doctors for admission are made to run from pillar to post by Nursing Officers on the pretext of lack of beds. It is common to see ailing patients waiting outside the wards seated in wheel chairs or trolleys, but the ward in-charges and Nursing Officers are least concerned about the suffering of such patients and yelled at them and drive

had its worst bearing on them away on the pretext of lack of beds. Such instances are more common to see on a daily basis at this great State Hospital which is touted as the nerve centre of ANIIMS, social workers allege.

When it comes to posting of inadequate strength of Nursing Staff, there are grievances that, each Nursing Officer is forced to look after about 40 to 50 patients every shift and such arduous duty makes the Nursing Officers worn out, which obviously leads to their losing temper sometimes, it is opined.

Dysfunctional airconditioners also pose inconvenience to the patients against the heat-wave severe prevailed during the last two months. Since the windows are not allowed to open in wards, patients have to endure lack of ventilation and sultriness which reportedly added to their misery of illness. If anyone complains about this issue, nurses at the ward would yell at them and ask them to get admitted at some private hospitals for better facilities, it is alleged. Needless to say about the cleanliness of lavatories inside the wards as they perennially stink and adds to the problems of patients. Patients who are already suffering from low immune are prone to infection due to unclean toilets, but defying this fact, the lavatories in the GB Pant Hospitals are always lay filthy and unclean thanks to lack of proper cleaning and sanitation by the staff.

General public urge that, the Administration may immediately appoint adequate nurses to provide better services in wards. While the reemployment of retired Nurses on lumpsum remuneration of 40 to 50

thousands as given now is a wasteful expenditure considering their productivity, social activists demand that, those unemployed nurses who were employed on COVID duty may be employed as their services are selfless throughout the pandemic period. Instead spending double the money on pension and remuneration on retired nurses, appointing young candidates to nursing staff vacancies would be like getting two mangoes with one stone as it alleviates the unemployment problem while reducing the burden to exchequer, it is suggested.

General public also demand that, deficiencies in the medical imaging systems such Ultrasound, X-Ray, CT etc may be addressed and adequate machines are installed to cater to the patients so that patients are not required to wait for unwarranted time before getting access to such facilities.

There is a general perception that, there is lack of keenness on part authorities revamping the health infrastructure in these Islands. Apart from local public, the Gandhi Park used to be on the itinerary of mainland tourists as well. People were eager to take up boating as it was one of the most sought after facility available here. But, post COVID, pedal boats and self-propelled boats have lost their life and lying in a dilapidated condition, an employee says. According to him, it was because of the continuous idleness of boats during pandemic that led to their current condition. There have been no steps from higher authorities to repair the boats, he further added.

The PBMC which runs this park may barely generate revenue from this park as all the revenue generating sources such as kids train, merry go round etc are lying dysfunctional and no more in use. On the other hand, if this park is out to leased an experienced private firm from mainland who have experience in running amusement parks, they would definitely turn this park into a heaven with facilities at par with mainland, it is suggested. While attracting large gathering of people and tourists, transformation of this park into amusement park would generate copious revenue to the Municipal Council which is reeling under huge shortage of funds.

The Secretary, PBMC may take steps to propose Gandhi Park for outsourcing on a PPP mode to transform it into an amusement park so that it becomes a tourism hotspot besides generating revenue to the Municipal Council. On the other hand, it will generate employment unemployed youth through private players while ensuring that the park is maintained to global standards.
