Ministry of Tourism organises two day 'Chintan Shivir' for promoting "Tourism in Mission Mode"

Tourism Minister outlines vision of the Govt. to leverage tourism as a vehicle for socio-economic development, job creation and achieving sustainable development goals

New Delhi, March 29 (PIB)

In order to deliberate, ideate and devise strategies for promoting "Tourism in Mission Mode", the Ministry of Tourism organized a two-day Chintan Shivir on March 28 and March 29 at New Delhi where all the States, Industry Associations and Industry leaders took part. The agenda for discussions on the first day was set by Minister of Tourism, Culture and DoNER, Shri G. Kishan Reddy. He outlined the vision of the Government to leverage tourism as a vehicle for socio-economic development, job creation and achieving sustainable development goals for the country. He stated that this is the most opportune moment to unveil a shared vision for



future of India's tourism, guiding its course for next 25 years to make India as the most sought-after travel destination in the world when India celebrates 100 years of Independence in 2047. He pointed out the three key pillars of developing tourism in mission mode - active participation of the States, Convergence of Government

Programs and Public Private Partnerships. He stated that one major step would be to develop National Strategies and Models for providing guidance to the States in developing their tourism potential. The Ministry has recently formulated National strategies for development of various tourism sectors such as Rural Tourism,

Adventure Tourism, MICE Tourism, Ecotourism, Medical Tourism, Sustainable Tourism.

Shri Arvind Singh, Secretary, Ministry of Tourism, Government of India stated that the 02 day Chintan Shivir will provide a platform to all stakeholders to conduct fruitful interactions and share

good practices followed across the country and a stage to share unique ideas involving technological solutions in travel sector, sustainability in tourism and responsible travel with the aim to take the benefits of tourism to the grass root level.

Terrorism in all forms & its financing amongst most serious threats to global peace, says India at NSA meeting of SCO countries

New Delhi, March 29

National Security Advisor, Shri Ajit Doval today said that terrorism in all its forms and its financing are the most serious threats to international peace and security. He said, any act of terrorism, regardless of its motivation, is unjustifiable. Shri Doval said this while chairing the meeting of the National Security Advisers (NSAs) of member countries of the Shanghai

Cooperation Organisation (SCO) hosted by India in New Delhi.

Shri Doval said that India is committed to fulfilling its obligations under the International North-South Transport Corridor (INSTC) and the inclusion of Chabahar Port within the framework of INSTC. He said, India became a member of SCO in June 2017, but its relations with SCO countries go back

several centuries. Shri Doval said that SCO can play important roles to address the issue of mutual concerns.

The meeting was attended in person by several high-level delegates from the Central Asian Countries. The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation comprises China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Pakistan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. (Source: india.gov.in)

The Housing & Estate Department, Andaman and Nicobar Administration had developed Automated Allotment of Government Accommodation Application (AAGA Portal) through IT Department i.e. SOVTECH and the same was launched on 25/03/2021. It provides end to end solution with no manual intervention for allotment and an attempt has been made to make a paperless solution. It had built in feature of online verification by DDOs,

Medical Department (for medical cases) and H&E Department for further verification.

Now, the Housing & Estate Department, Andaman and Nicobar Administration, Secretariat has invited online applications for allotment of Government Accommodation under General Pool from Government employees of various Departments under Andaman & Nicobar Administration for the period from 01/04/2023 to 30/04/2023 for the Session 2023-2024.

12,991 families registered under the scheme in Isles so far; entitled for cashless treatment at empanelled hospitals at mainland

Port Blair, March 29

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, GoI has launched the world's largest health assurance program named Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in 2018. The scheme has successfully completed 4 years of its implementation on 23rd September, 2022. Ayushman Bharat-PMJAY aims to provide a cashless treatment worth Rs 5 lakh per family per year against secondary and tertiary hospitalization care. Presently, 12,991 families (40,636 members) have registered under the



AB-PMJAY scheme in this UT and are entitled for cashless treatment at 28,000 empanelled public and private hospitals across the country. To create awareness among the general public and to identify the unregistered eligible AB - PMJAY beneficiary, various IEC activities are conducted in this UT. AB-PMJAY card generation drives were organized by the State

Health Agency (SHA), Port Blair at Gram Panchayat, Tushnabad and Calicut. A total of 194 people attended the camps, out of which, 35 new unregistered eligible beneficiaries were identified and cards were created for them. During the camp, the resource person from the State Health Agency, addressed the queries of the public pertaining to Ayushman Bharat -



PMJAY scheme and also explained the eligibility criteria to the public and the PRI

regular Government Servants of the Administration will be made on the basis of seniority as determined from the date of their entry into Government service under the A&N Administration. Ad-hoc/Contract employees are not eligible for allotment of Government Residential Accommodation under General Pool and as such their applications will not be entertained.

divided into 6 Sessions deliberating on Incredible India@100 - Shared vision of Central Government, States and Industry, Policy Benchmarking and Ease of Doing Business, Investible Projects and Public Private Partnerships, "Global Best Practices and Capacity Building for Tourism Investments" by UNWTO, Developing MICE Tourism and Wedding Tourism and Innovation and Digitalization and Startups in Tourism Sector. Some of the key speakers were representatives from the industry stakeholders viz. FAITH, India Convention Promotion Bureau (ICPB) as well as from international organizations like World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) and the State Governments. UNWTO discussed the development of a Tourism Investment Strategy (TIS) through the UNWTO framework on Organizational, Attractiveness and Promotion Strategy which will provide a structured approach to developing a comprehensive investment strategy that takes into account factors such as the local business environment, the potential for growth in the tourism industry, and the availability of financing options. State of Rajasthan made a comprehensive presentation on granting of industry status to the tourism and hospitality sector along with benefits accrued to the industry from the same. State Government of Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh showcased the investible projects in order to attract investment in tourism and hospitality sector. Union Territory of Lakshadweep Islands also shared successful case studies of public private partnership. In cognizance of the importance of the MICE sector as well as the Wedding Destination sector, a separate Session was kept on the two niche segments for deliberating on various policies, initiatives and strategies for development of MICE tourism and Wedding tourism in the Country. MICE Tourism brings higher revenue and year-round business for the destination overcoming seasonality. At the same time, MICE needs its own ecosystem before a destination can succeed as MICE destination. Wedding destinations are also fast emerging segment in India.

As an initiative of India's G 20 Presidency, the Ministry of Tourism is organizing the 1st Global Tourism Investors' Summit on May 17-19, 2023. Chintan Shivir will also provide opportunity to deliberate on the strategies and preparations for successful organization of 1st Global Tourism Investors' Summit.

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to Geological and Hydro-meteorological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts of the world and vulnerable to earthquake and tsunami disasters. Tsunamis are powerful and dangerous natural disasters that can cause devastating damage and loss of life. Dr. Nitin Shakya, Director (Disaster Management), A&N Administration has urged the general public of A&N Islands to adhere to the Do's & Don'ts of Tsunami.

DO's:

- Pay attention to tsunami warnings: If you live in a coastal area or are visiting one, make sure to be

aware of any tsunami warnings issued by the authorities.

- Move to higher ground: If a tsunami warning is issued, move to higher ground immediately. Do not wait for official instructions or for the wave to arrive.
- Follow evacuation orders: If authorities issue an evacuation order, follow it immediately. Do not delay or hesitate.
- Stay tuned to local news: Stay tuned to local news and radio stations for updates on the situation.
- Be prepared: Have an emergency kit ready, including food, water, medications, and important documents.

DON'Ts:

- Don't stay in low-lying areas: If you are in a low-lying area and a tsunami warning is issued, do

not stay there. Move to higher ground immediately.

- Don't go to the coast to watch the wave: Tsunamis are not a spectator sport. Stay away from the coast and do not go there to watch the wave.
- Don't use the beach as a shelter: Do not use the beach or shoreline as a shelter during a tsunami. The wave can be much higher than the normal tide level and can quickly flood the area.
- Don't use elevators: If you are in a building during a tsunami, do not use the elevators. Use the stairs instead.
- Don't return to the area until it is safe: After a tsunami, do not return to the area until authorities declare it safe to do so. (Source: Directorate of Disaster Management)

Promoting quality cinnamon production in Isles Frontline demo on Cinnamon conducted under CSS-MIDH

Cultivation of true cinnamon has great potential in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Due to wider adaptability of the crop, it can be cultivated under open as well as an intercrop in the existing coconut and arecanut plantations. In order to promote scientific cinnamon cultivation and its postharvest handling, several efforts are being taken by ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair under the Central Sector Scheme- Mission on Integrated Development of Horticulture (CSS-MIDH) Project on Spices.

With the financial support from the Directorate of Spices and Arecanut Development, Kozhikode, Kerala, frontline demonstrations have been taken up at the farmers' fields in different parts of the



Islands. For selection of the beneficiaries, proposals were invited from the island stakeholders.

Quality planting material of true cinnamon has been provided for commercial scale cultivation to the farmers from South Andaman Island (Ograbraj, Bird Line, Prothrapur, Caddlegunj, Bambooflat, Wimberlygunj, Garacharma), Baratang Island, North and Middle Andaman Islands (Kalipur and Rangat) and Little Andaman Island (Harminder Bay). Further, considering the medicinal value of the spice, planting materials were also provided to various stakeholders who

participated in different training and awareness programmes conducted during the year. An awareness programme on quality cinnamon production in the Andaman Islands was conducted on March 24, 2023 during which Dr. Ajit Arun Waman, Scientist-SS, ICAR-CIARI and Principal Investigator of the project guided various stakeholders on cinnamon cultivation in Wimberlygunj, Bambooflat and Ograbraj villages in South Andaman. In the long run, these activities would help in boosting the quantum of cinnamon production from the Islands, a press release from CIARI said.

Country registers 2151 new cases of COVID-19

New Delhi, March 29

The country has registered two thousand one hundred and fifty one new cases of COVID-19 in the last 24 hours. The Union Health Ministry stated that twelve hundred and twenty-two people have recovered during the same period. The recovery rate is currently 98.78 per cent. AND, WHEREAS, the Committee after due examination, finalized a quarry plan of White Moorum Quarry at Rabindranagar village under Little Andaman Tehsil.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the power conferred under Rule 5 read with Rule 16 of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012, the Officer authorized by Lt.Governor to be competent to approve quarry plan i.e., the Deputy Commissioner (South Andaman), hereby approves the quarry plan containing the location, site plan, progressive and final closure plan, reclamation and restoration plan including specific guidelines for source-wise pollution control measures to be followed for quarry operations in South Andaman District as under:

QUARRY PLAN**A. BACKGROUND**

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands Minor Mineral Rules, 2012 was notified on 20th September, 2012. In pursuance of Rule 6, contiguous areas for quarrying, having due regard to the restrictions mentioned in Rule 4, general topography and environmental aspects, was identified at Rabindranagar village in Little Andaman Tehsil.

An area of 0.3190 hectares was identified at Rabindranagar village under Little Andaman Tehsil for conduct of quarrying without use of explosives.

The Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A & N Islands, in pursuance of Rule 15 and Section 5(b) of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands Minor Minerals Rule, 2012 read with Administration's Order No.312 dated 30/01/2015 and in supersession of Administration's Notification No.4-2/19-R/Quarry/PF-I dated 09/10/2012 notified the following committee vide notification dated 03/08/2015 for South Andaman District for preparing quarry plan for the area(s) identified for quarrying under Rule 6 of the said rules:-

1	The Assistant Commissioner (HQ)	Chairman
2	Representatives of Health Department as nominated by Director, Health Service	Member
3	Representatives of APWD as nominated by Chief Engineer, APWD, Port Blair	Member
4	Representatives of Forest Department as nominated by PCCF	Member
5	The Assistant Commissioner (Settlement)	Convener

The above Committee has been assigned the task of preparing quarry plan(s) for South Andaman District, which shall include for each identified area outer boundary, potential for extraction or crushing, progressive and final closure plan of quarry, plans for reclamation and restoration of land, measures for pollution control, responsibility of the quarry lease holder and any other matter that the committee may decide. The plan shall also include the cost of preparation of such plan or plans to be apportioned amongst the lease holders of quarries established on such area in such a manner as the committee may decide.

The Deputy Conservator of Forest (Planning & Monitoring) was nominated as member of the Committee by PCCF, Deputy Director (Health) was nominated by Director of Health Services as member of the Committee and Junior Engineer, (Civil), APWD was nominated as member of the Committee by Chief Engineer, APWD.

The Committee held its meeting on 10.01.2022 at 3.30 PM, the Chairman informed about the urgency in preparing the quarry plan for the areas identified at Rabindranagar village for quarrying of white moorum and presented a draft quarry plan of the area before the committee for its perusal.

The Committee after perusal of the draft quarry plan and after deliberations and after making such modifications as deemed fit has prepared and finalized the quarry plan.

B. LOCATION

(i) An area of 0.3190 hectares was identified at Rabindranagar village for conduct of quarrying without use of explosives.

● An area measuring 0.3190 hectares has been identified in the land bearing Sy.No.345/7 situated at Rabindranagar village recorded in favour of Govt. Revenue Department. The coordinate of the site is 10°43'01.373 N, 92°34'02.501 E.

● The subject land is free from all encumbrances and the area includes the sites.

● The selected area satisfies the restrictions mentioned in Rule 4 and is more than 500 meters from any Educational Institution, Health Institution or a residential area and is also more than 500 meters away from HTL.

C. SITE PLAN

i. The selected quarrying area at Rabindranagar village is a compact area.

ii. The selected area has limited spatial extent, recognizable through topographic expressions, small hillocks, mounds, ridges over shorter intervals having narrow depressions etc.

iii. The extraction from this area would be of minor minerals only i.e. white moorum. Inspection report of Tehsildar, Little Andaman & Executive Engineer, MID APWD, Little Andaman has revealed that there are sufficient deposits of these minor minerals at the site.

iv. Quarrying in this area is not exactly mining but is more like digging and leveling. This would ultimately result in getting flat land bounded by hillocks having a gradient of 45 degree angle.

v. The selected quarry area was inspected by the Tehsildar, Little Andaman & Executive Engineer, MID APWD, Little Andaman and levels taken at different locations. Based on the levels taken, plots of size 0.3190 hectares have been carved.

D. POTENTIAL FOR EXTRACTION OF MINOR MINERAL AND YEARLY EXTRACTION

● Since the block have been carved out of small hillocks, at the end of quarrying the area will develop into a flat land, which can be used for other purposes.

● As stated earlier the committee is satisfied that the quarry sites are having existence of minor mineral. However, committee feels that it is for the prospective bidder to do the estimate prior to bidding and satisfy themselves with regard to quantity of minor minerals.

● In order to stagger the quarry operations over a period of time, the Committee decided to allow extraction of upto 20,000 cbm Minor Minerals from the site per annum.

E. PROGRESSIVE AND FINAL CLOSURE PLAN

● Considering the small size of quarry site to be leased out Committee feels that progressive closure plan would not be feasible however avenue for plantation is to be undertaken as an interim measure for protection of the environment.

● The Committee has decided to recommend guidelines for final closure of quarry. The following points are to be considered as a part of final closure of the quarry.

(a) Location of the Quarry.

(b) Topography of the Quarry

(c) Reason for Closure or Reserves of Minor Minerals available for future in the quarry, if any

(d) The reclamation and rehabilitation of the mined quarries indicating the method of reclamation/restoration of land and quarries pits.

(e) Water quality and hydrology of the area indicating water bodies, surface run-off, vulnerability to erosion, sedimentation/ siltation, diversion of water course, contamination, quantity and quality change of water in water bodies. The corrective and protective measures are to be considered.

(f) Air quality indicating air quality status & corrective measure to prevent pollution.

(g) Waste Management indicating status, type, quality and quantity of over burden, earth/ top soil removed and prevention measure & disposal methods of the overburden in case not utilized for stabilization & for filling the pits. The protective measures to be taken for prevention of siltation, erosion and dust generation from these waste materials should also be addressed.

(h) Infrastructure- Emphasis on maintaining the existing roads, etc and creation of toe/ retaining walls, check dams etc.

(i) Disposal or removal of Quarrying Machineries & construction like hutment/shed if any.

(j) The Administration may include any activity as a part of closure of closure plan at any point of time.

(k) Statutory obligations like payment of wages/ Compensation for retrenchment of manpower/labours under ID Act, and handling any other kind of repercussions shall be the sole responsibility of quarry lease holder.

(l) Disaster Management & Risk Assessment-indicating the probable high risks like landslides, seismic activities, inundation of low areas in abandoned quarry and action plan to mitigate these risks.

(m) Monitoring and Evaluation of the activities of the closure plan.

● The above activities shall be undertaken jointly by the successful bidder under supervision of the Department of Revenue, Forest, Andaman Public Works Department and the Pollution Control Committee of the UT.

F. RESPONSIBILITIES OF SUCCESSFUL BIDDER FOR RECLAMATION AND RESTORATION OF LAND

The following activities for reclamation and restoration of the land have to be jointly undertaken by the successful bidder under supervision of concerned Departments such as Revenue, Forest, Andaman Public Works Department and the Pollution Control Committee of the Union Territory.

(a) Plantation activities to be taken up in strips (along the approach road) & Blocks (in the abandoned/closed quarries).

(b) Coastal/Littoral species of trees/plants will be selected for Strip Plantation along road and Hardy and fast growing tree species will be selected for block plantation.

(c) The Strip Plantation along the road will be taken up in 2-3 rows depending upon the availability of land along the road.

(d) The Strip Plantation on the sea ward side of the road will be raised in staggered/quincial pattern with spacing of 3mts x 3mts. (row to row & plant to plant respectively).

(e) Casualty/ mortality filling of the plantations will be carried out for minimum of three years starting from year of planting.

(f) Maintenance of the plantation will be done continuously for minimum of five years or more till the establishment of the plantations and activities like mulching, weeding, climber cutting and cleaning including the repair and maintenance of tree guards/fences will be taken up in each year.

(g) Cost estimation for each segment of Strip or Block plantation will be done by Forest

department based on the Schedule of rates/ standard norms of the department considering the site conditions/ locality factors specially the soil and biotic factors of the area.

G. MEASURES FOR POLLUTION CONTROL

● During quarrying operations, the water should be sprayed at least once in a day over the roads at the quarry sites and nearby areas by the lease holders.

● Kachha road, used for transportation of moorum, from the quarry site shall be invariably sprayed by water during these operations. In order to minimize dust pollution, measures such as adoption of hoods at transfer points, vulcanizing of conveyor belt joints, under belt cleaning devices, and installation of dust suppressions and/or dust extraction system for conveyance shall be adopted.

● The kachha road leading to the quarry shall have avenue plantation to arrest the dust pollution.

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES FOR SOURCEWISE POLLUTION CONTROL MEASURES TO BE FOLLOWED FOR MOORUM QUARRY BY THE LEASE HOLDER**AIR POLLUTION****DRILLING :**

1) Drilling machine shall be fitted with dust suppression, collection and disposal arrangement.

2) Deep wetting of drilling zones shall be done by water sprinkling before starting drilling.

3) During the drilling operations the efforts shall be made to reduce dust generation by taking appropriate measures.

Heavy Earth Moving Machinery (HEMM):

1) The operator/ transporter shall carry out regular maintenance of the machinery and vehicles.

2) The speed limit shall be adhered to.

3) Operator's cabin of the HEMMs should preferably be air conditioned at least air tight.

4) The smoke emission should conform to the standards notified in Motor Vehicle Act.

5) The trucks carrying the mined products shall be covered with tarpaulin so that there are no fugitive emissions during transportation.

6) The transportation should not be through the busy roads in the city/towns/villages if by pass roads are available.

HAUL ROADS :

1) All the haul and service roads shall be metalled and well maintained.

2) Unmetalled haul roads shall be free of ruts and pot holes.

3) All haul roads and surface roads shall be regularly sprayed with water.

4) Plantation alongside haul roads (avenue plantation) shall be carried out done.

OVERBURDEN :

1) Plantation over and around over burden dumps shall be carried out to ensure stability of slopes, prevention of dust by wind action and soil erosion during the run off.

2) Wetting of surface of Overburden dump shall be regularly practiced.

NOISE POLLUTION**DRILLING:**

The workers shall be provided appropriate personal protective equipment viz. ear muffs/ ear plug or noise proof cabins.

Heavy Earth moving Machinery (HEMM):

1) The engine exhausts of HEMM to be fitted with mufflers and cabins shall be noise proof.

2) HEMM shall be properly maintained.

3) Operators shall be provided with ear muffs / ear plugs.

4) Imposition of speed restriction of HEMM near residential area shall be enforced.

5) The haulage path of the HEMM shall be re-routed so that it is away from the residential area.

WATER POLLUTION SURFACE:

The project components should comply with all the standards given in the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.

H. RESPONSIBILITY OF QUARRY LEASE HOLDER

Besides the responsibilities of the quarry lease holder as stated in the A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012, a quarry lease holder shall also be responsible for complying with the various aspects as suggested in the various headings of the instant quarry plan.

I. DEIAA & DEAC FOR ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE

● Periodical Health check-up of the workers and their family members engaged in the quarry, a dust prone unit and to keep vigilance on development of Silicosis or other respiratory illness.

● All quarry lease holder must keep necessary provision of "First Aid" at the work site.

● Make provision of fund for aid to the workers and their family in case of any accidental injury/death take place.

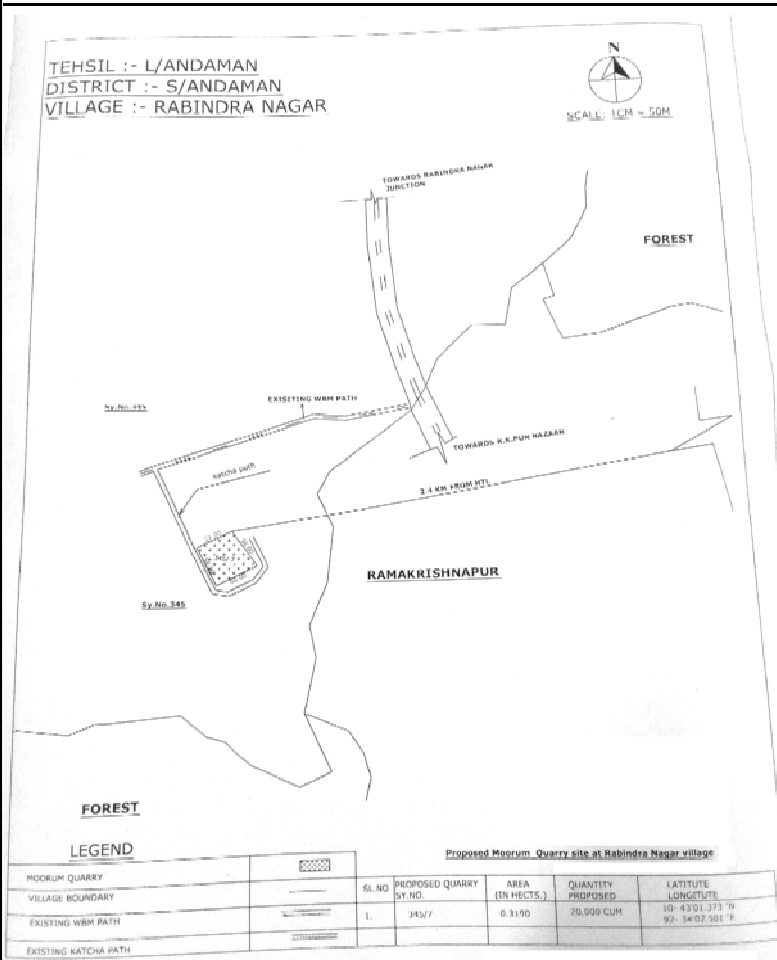
J. PERIOD OF OPERATION OF QUARRY PLAN

● The instant quarry plan shall come into force immediately after notification by the Competent Authority.

● The plan shall remain in force till one year from the date of notification unless otherwise modified/recast on the basis of review conducted by the Committee after one year or on account of orders of a Competent Court/Administrator and in such event, the modified quarry plan shall have the same force and applicability for all concerned including the quarry lease holders.

● The instant quarry plan is within the ambit of provisions of Andaman and Nicobar Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012.


