MP pleads for re-engagement of security guards in the Health Dept.

Requirement of Hospitals & financial crises of discontinued personnel highlighted

Port Blair, 7th Oct, 2022: The Member of Parliament Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has urged the UT Administration to re-engage discontinued Security Guard personnel at GB Pant Hospital and other Health Centers till finalization of New Tender. In a letter to the Chief Secretary, Andaman and Nicobar Administration, the parliamentarian had said that the Directorate of Health Services has engaged 100 security guards and deployed them at various health centers including GB Pant Hospital and other hospitals across A&N Islands on contract basis through outsourcing. Out of these, 68 were deployed at GB Pant Hospital and 32 were posted at other PHCs/CHCs for safety and security of Staff, Patients and the infrastructure of the Department. Shri. Kuldeep has said that due to expiry of their term of engagement and in view of non-finalization of next tender process before expiry of validity of last tender which is pending for finalization by the competent authority, the services of these 100 Security Guard personnel have been discontinued w.e.f. 1st July 2022, due to which there are no security personnel in the premises of health centers. Due to non-availability of security persons since 1st July 2022, Staff of various hospitals are facing hardship in discharging their duties at operation theatres, laboratory, OPD and other isolated places. Disturbances are also observed for in and out patients at health centers. Besides these, Assets of the Health Department at various hospitals are at risk. Adding further, Shri. Sharma said that due to discontinuation of their service, these 100 Security Guard personnel have also become jobless and their livelihood has been affected since 1st July 2022. They have no other source of income for their livelihood other than the job now they were performing for many years. Citing See... Page No. 02

Crackdown on bootleggers and drug peddlers

Port Blair, Oct 7: In fight against bootlegging, illicit liquor and drug abuse, Andaman and Nicobar Police has adopted multi-pronged strategy coupled with zero tolerance against this menace. On supply front, Police is cracking the whips against bootleggers and drug peddlers. On demand side, mass public awareness campaign has been launched to spread awareness about ill-effects of alcohol/drug abuse. Cracking down on bootlegging, as many as 118 cases under 32 Regulation III of 1876 were registered in the month of September, 2022 as compared to 61 cases in July and 85 cases in August, 2022. 892 bottles of liquor, 327 Kgs of Handia and 127.5 ltrs of illicit liquor were recovered from the possession of bootleggers. Apart from this, search and combing operations were carried out in jungle in which as much as 5,570 ltrs of Lehan (fermented wash to prepare illicit liquor) was destroyed. Similarly, in fight against drug abuse, 13 cases under NDPS Act were registered in September, 2022, in which 16 accused were arrested. From their possession, 11.7 Kgs of Ganja and 3.18 kg of Methamphetamine were recovered. During August 2022, more than 50 Awareness programmes on See... Page No. 02

Centre constitutes a 9-member task force for monitoring Cheetah introduction project

The Centre has constituted a Task Force for monitoring Cheetah introduction in Kuno National Park in Madhya Pradesh and other suitable designated areas. The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) would facilitate the working of Cheetah Task Force and render all necessary help. The nine member task force will include Principal Secretaries, Forests and Tourism of Madhya Pradesh, and the Inspector General of NTCA, New Delhi. Dr. Amit Mallick, Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change in a statement said that the Task Force will be in-force for a period of two years. This task force may appoint a subcommittee to regularly visit the Cheetah introduction area as and when decided by them. The Task Force has been constituted to review, progress and monitor the health status of Cheetah, upkeep of the quarantine and soft release enclosure, protection status of the entire area and adherence See... National Lok Adalat to be held across country on November 12

National Lok Adalat will be held across the country on 12th November this year to dispose off pending cases through settlement. Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Ministry said, there are about six lakh eight thousand consumer cases pending in the country. It said, considering the benefits of the Lok Adalat system and mutual settlement between parties a large number of consumer cases are expected to be disposed off. It has the phone numbers and emails of three lakh parties whose cases are pending before the commissions. Operation Chakra: 26 cyber criminals held in 115 CBI raids

As many as 26 alleged cyber criminals have been arrested so far under 'Operation Chakra' of the CBI to dismantle cyber crime gangs operating in the country. The operation has been launched in coordination with State police, Interpol and agencies of other countries, officials said on Thursday. The CBI said 16 people were arrested by Karnataka Police, seven by Delhi Police, two by Punjab Police and one by Andaman and Nicobar Police. The central probe agency, in coordination with state police, conducted searches under the operation at 115 locations across the country on inputs provided by Interpol, FBI, Royal Canadian Mounted Police and Australian Federal Police, the officials said. The CBI registered 11 cases against cyber criminals involved in financial fraud using the internet. Oil slick ahead?

Two independent developments this week again highlight the challenges facing the global economy in the near future. Oil prices are likely to remain elevated as the supply cartel Opec plus, which includes Saudi Arabia and Russia, decided to trim production in a bid to keep the price high. The grouping, which produces a little more than 50% of the world's crude, plans to reduce output by 2 million barrels/day beginning November by using August's production as a benchmark. It's about 2% of production. Therefore, the planned cut will most likely set a floor to any price decline. Separately, WTO forecast growth in merchandise trade volume will slow in 2023. It's now projected to grow at 1%, lower than 3.4% forecast a few months ago. Trade volume growth is being dragged down by the economic slowdown in three major economic engines, the US, Europe and China. WTO thinks the ongoing monetary tightening in the US will soon bite hard, while the energy shock in the form of a 350% year-on-year increase in gas prices in Europe will lead to reduced consumer spending. China's zero-Covid strategy has taken a toll on its growth. The energy shock is partly on account of self-defeating economic sanctions imposed by the US and Europe on Russia following its invasion of Ukraine. While Europe took the biggest hit because of its dependence on Russian gas, the rest of the world felt the impact through both an oil price surge and upward pressure on prices of key food items. Supply pressure on key commodities can keep domestic inflation elevated while a global slowdown will act as a drag on growth here. The monthly average price of the Indian basket of crude peaked at \$116/barrel in June and later declined to \$91/barrel in September. Pump prices of petrol and diesel, however, remain unchanged since May 22, ring-fencing the domestic economy from global oil price movements. What may emerge as the main challenge again is a relative slowdown – a purchasing managers' survey for services in September showed the lowest reading in six months. Monetary and fiscal policies need to be flexible to adapt to a highly uncertain scenario.

JUDGE DELAYS TWITTER TRIAL, GIVES MUSK TIME UNTIL OCT. 28 TO CLOSE THE DEAL

A Delaware court has delayed a looming trial between Twitter and Elon Musk, giving the Tesla billionaire more time to close his \$44 billion deal to buy the company after months spent fighting to get out of it.

Chancellor Kathaleen St Jude

McCormick, head of the Delaware Chancery Court, said Thursday that Musk and Twitter now have until Oct 28 to close the deal. A trial originally set for Oct. 17 will happen in November if they don't, she said.

Musk had asked to halt the upcoming Delaware court trial,

where the Tesla CEO was expected to fare poorly against Twitter's lawsuit to force him to complete his April merger agreement. Musk's attorneys revived the takeover offer on Monday but said the trial should be adjourned to leave more time for Musk to secure the financing.

Twitter had asked McCormick earlier Thursday to proceed with the trial, saying the billionaire refuses to accept the "contractual obligations" of his April agreement to buy the social media company and take it private.

Twitter disputed Musk's claim that the San Francisco-based company is refusing to accept his renewed bid. Musk told Twitter earlier this week he's ready to buy the company once again after trying to back out of the deal over the summer, accusing it of refusing to give him information about "spam bot" accounts on the service.

Twitter described Musk's move to delay the trial as "an invitation to further mischief and delay" after his arguments for terminating the agreement haven't had merit.

But after the judge's ruling, Twitter reiterated in a statement that it was ready to close the deal on the share price agreed upon in April: "We look forward to closing the transaction at \$54.20 by October 28th," referring to the price Musk originally offered for each Twitter share.

Brooklyn Law School professor

Andrew Jennings said Twitter wants to be certain that the deal will get done and not allow "wiggle room for Musk to walk away again."

Musk attorneys argued that Twitter was disagreeing with the trial delay "based on the theoretical possibility" of Musk not coming up with the financing, which they called "baseless speculation."

They said Musk's financial backers "have indicated that they are prepared to honor their commitments" and are working to close the deal by Oct. 28. Musk attorney Alex Spiro said in a statement Thursday that "Twitter offered Mr. Musk billions off the transaction price" but Musk "refused because Twitter attempted to put certain self-serving conditions on the deal." He didn't elaborate on what those conditions were. Twitter hasn't described the talks beyond what its attorneys have said in court.

Twitter's shares fell \$1.91, or 3.7%, to close at \$49.39 on Thursday. It was the stock's second day of declines following a surge of more than 22% on Tuesday after Musk made his renewed offer to buy the company. - Source : Theweek

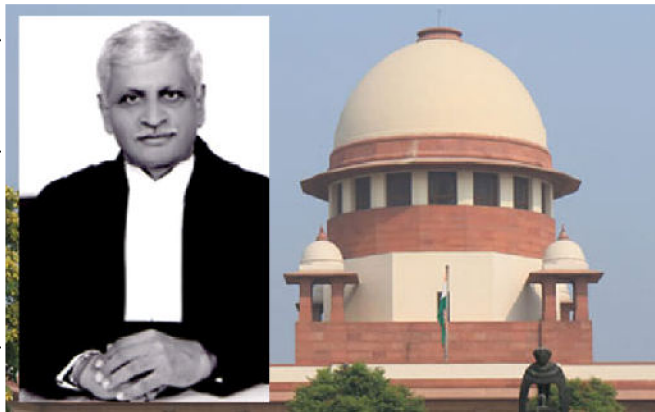
Govt asks CJI Lalit to recommend successor

Setting in motion the process of appointing the next head of the Indian judiciary, the government on Friday wrote to Chief Justice of India Uday Umesh Lalit to recommend his successor.

Justice Lalit will retire as the CJI on November 8 after a brief tenure of 74 days.

"As per the MoP on appointment of Chief Justice of India and Supreme Court Judges, today the Hon'ble Minister of Law and Justice sent a letter to the Hon'ble Chief Justice of India for sending his recommendations for appointment of his successor," the Ministry of Law and Justice said in a tweet.

This is perhaps the first



time that the ministry has tweeted about it.

According to the Memorandum of Procedure (MoP), the CJI names the senior-most judge as his or her successor. The MoP is a document which guides the appointment and transfer of Supreme Court and high court judges.

Justice D. Y. Chandrachud is the senior-

most judge after the CJI. Going by the established practice and convention, Justice Chandrachud would be the 50th CJI and take oath on November 9. He would have a tenure of two years and demit office on November 10, 2024. While Supreme Court judges retire after attaining the age of 65, high court judges retire at 62 years. - Source : Theweek

84-year-old NYU professor sacked after students signed a petition against him

A New York University (NYU) professor has been fired after group of 82 students complained that his class was too hard and they scored poorly in his course.

Maitland Jones, 84, who teaches organic chemistry to 350 students of the class, received a message from the dean of science just before the start of the fall semester terminating his contract, the New York Times reported.

Marc A. Walters, director of undergraduate studies in the chemistry department, in an email to Dr. Jones, said the plan would "extend a gentle but firm hand to the students and those who pay the tuition bills," an apparent reference to parents. The

University officials also tried to placate the students by offering them a review of their 'poor' grades.

"We urge you to realize that a class with such a high percentage of withdrawals and low grades has failed to make students' learning and wellbeing a priority and reflects poorly on the chemistry department as well as the institution as a whole," the petition signed by students read.

However, the university's action provoked equal and opposite reactions from both the chemistry faculty, who protested the decisions. "The deans are obviously going for some bottom line, and they want happy students who are saying great things about the university so more people apply

and the U.S. News rankings keep going higher," said Paramjit Arora, a chemistry professor who has worked closely with Dr. Jones.

Maitland Jones, who taught organic chemistry for decades, at Princeton from 1973 until 2007 and then at New York University on a series of yearly contracts, and is also an author of a reputed textbook. He has also received awards for his teaching.

Dr. Jones who was planning to retire soon told New York Times that he did not want his job back. "I just want to make sure this doesn't happen to anyone else." - Source : Theweek



Stringent quality control measures required to ensure Indian pharma's future success

Subpar and spurious medicines have always been a thorn in the flesh for the Indian pharma sector.

Indian pharma companies have been scrutinised by the US Trade Representative (USTR), which found that approximately 20 per cent of all drugs on sale in India are counterfeit. This is the kind of finding that can adversely affect India's budding pharma sector and reputation, even as it ranks third in the world in terms of the volume of drugs produced. India meets over 20 per cent of

the global demand for generic drugs, which is no surprise considering the country has over 10,500 manufacturing units and 3,000 firms.

Despite the export achievements in the sector, India may fall behind in the race due to the sheer lack of quality products if the country fails to invest in quality control measures. In the wake of the recent allegations against Maiden Pharmaceuticals, which is under scrutiny after the WHO issued an alert saying the firm's cough syrups could

potentially be linked to the death of children in the Gambia, the industry will have to take certain measures to regain its status in the world pharma rankings. These steps include encouraging innovation through increased spending in R&D, making marketing companies accountable for product quality, and implementing stringent quality controls.

Here is a look at a few steps that could be implemented to improve the quality of drugs produced in the country.



API quality check

As of now, quality checks are only done for final batches of medicines. In the future, the government should decide on parameters for active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) that are added to formulations as well. This is because a few companies are marketing APIs without studying their quality.

Using inferior quality materials inevitably results in poor quality medicines. Since it is tough to understand the quality of APIs used in the final formulations, there should be stringent mandates for lab testing parameters for key APIs. Besides, random quality checks of APIs manufactured and sold in the country should be normalised.

Introduction of barcode The Drugs Technical Advisory Board (DTAB) has recommended that QR codes or barcodes be introduced for the top 300 brands of drug products available in the market. This is a great initiative and must be made a standard practice for all drugs produced in India. Such codes aid in tracking drugs throughout the pharma supply chain and ensure that they are authentic.

Barcode data must necessarily include a unique

product identification code, the batch number, size, API and brand name, name and address of the manufacturer, date of manufacturing and expiry, serial shipping container code, manufacturing and import licence number.

Maintain quality control In the post-Covid world, the focus is on the best quality standards, and drugs made in India must also align with these changing standards. The health ministry has made regulatory changes to make marketing companies responsible for quality as well. Earlier, only pharma manufacturers were liable for drug quality. Under the changed norms, no companies will now be able to blame contract manufacturers for poor quality products as marketing firms will also be liable for ensuring drug quality.

Setting up QC task force Although strict quality checks are in the process of being mandated by the government, many factors leave much to be desired in the sector. There is an urgent need to establish a task force whose chief purpose will be to maintain the quality of manufactured drugs, under the aegis of Drugs Controller General

of India (DCGI). The task force should conduct occasional raids on pharma manufacturing units to ensure production rules are not compromised and collect samples from manufacturing units.

Pharmaceutical Technology Upgrade Assistance Scheme (PTUAS) The government has proposed support for SMEs under the PTUAS scheme, either through interest subsidies of up to 5 per cent per year (6 per cent in the case of units owned and managed by SC/STs) or a 10 per cent credit linked capital subsidy. In both cases, the loan is limited to a maximum of Rs 10 crore. A budget of Rs 300 crore has been set aside for the five-year scheme.

The PTUAS scheme, which has been proposed to assist SMEs, can also be used by pharmaceutical companies for upgrading manufacturing units and automating them. This will aid in maintaining finished drug quality standards. These measures are just the beginning of an entirely new quality journey for the industry. When used properly, they will support the country in its fight against subpar and counterfeit drugs, helping India become the global pharma leader. - Source : Theweek

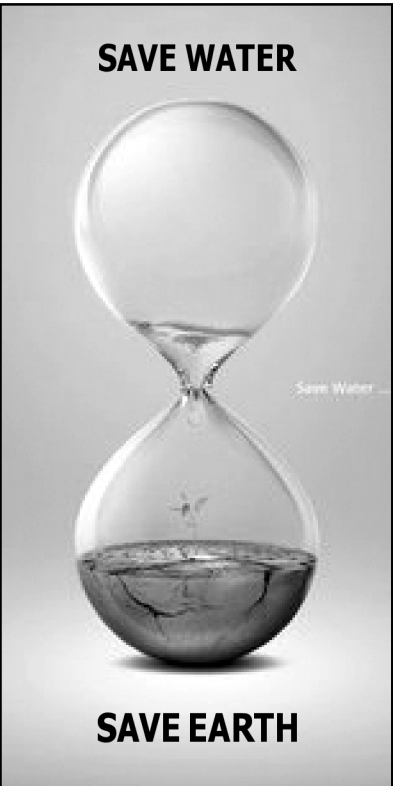

VANDE BHARAT TRAIN DESIGNED CONSIDERING CATTLE COLLISION, SAYS RAILWAY MINISTER



Collision with cattle on the tracks is unavoidable and this has been kept in mind while designing the semi-high speed Vande Bharat train, Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said here on Friday.

A day before, four buffaloes were killed after being hit by the Gandhinagar Capital-Mumbai Central Vande Bharat Express near Valva in Ahmedabad. The train's cone nose was damaged and it was replaced later. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had flagged off the train on the route on September 30.

"The train has been designed in such a way and it is so strong that if there is an accident, nothing will happen to the train. Its nose on the front is totally replaceable. As soon as the train reached Mumbai (after the incident on Thursday), it was completely cleaned up and its nose replaced," Vaishnaw said.

The minister was interacting with the

students of an engineering college at Vallabh Vidyanagar. The train has been designed "very thoughtfully," he said. "In India, the tracks are laid on the ground. Wherever you go, cattle will cross them, one cannot stop them. Unless we elevate the tracks in another 5-6 years, they (cattle) will come in front of the trains," the minister said. "The trains will run at a speed of 120-130-160 kmph and a collision is inevitable. It is a matter of common sense and design.

Therefore, design it in such a way that you can mend it whenever there is such an incident," the Union minister said. "The train has been designed keeping this in mind," he said.

"The next version of the Vande Bharat train will run at a speed of 200 kmph," Vaishnaw said. The latest updated version which runs on the Gandhinagar-Mumbai route has a top speed of 160 kmph.

During the interaction with college

students, the minister also talked about Modi's experience of the train as he travelled from Gandhinagar to Kalapur railway station in Ahmedabad on the first day. The air spring of the train absorbs the shock nearly completely and noise is practically non-existent inside, Vaishnaw said. "Modi travelled for nearly 40km. Along the route, he was talking to technicians and welders and stood eight or nine times for photos on their request. He did not have to take support even once due to non-existing vibration (when he was standing). Even the noise level is 65 decibels against 80-90 decibels of planes," he said. These are the features of a "world-class train," the minister added. "The first two Vande Bharat trains (launched first in 2019) have covered 18 lakh kilometres which is equal to nearly 45 times the Earth's periphery without any major problem," he said. - Source : The week

Indian-origin family's murder: Accused had a long dispute with victims which 'got nasty'

The man suspected of kidnapping and murdering the Indian-origin family in California had a long-standing dispute with the family that "got pretty nasty," Merced County Sheriff Vern Warnke has said.

The accused, Jesus Manuel Salgado, used to drive for the victims' company, Sheriff Warnke was quoted by ANI. According to the slain family's relatives, Salgado had sent angry text messages to the family about an year ago. "I believe that he had someone else with him and at least helping him do some of the things. As far as the homicide itself, we are going to let the evidence take us where it needs to take us," Warnke added.

Jasdeep Singh, wife Jasleen Kaur and their 8-month-old child Aroohi Dheri and Amandeep

Singh were kidnapped from a business at the intersection at Merced County in California on Monday.

The family was taken at gunpoint and the abduction was caught on camera. The footage, released by the Sheriff's office, shows two of the family members - 36-year-old Jasdeep Singh and 39-year-old Amandeep Singh - coming out of the business with their hands zip-tied together. Some time later, Salgado is seen leading Jasleen Kaur and her 8-month-old baby Aroohi Dheri out of the building into a truck.

Their bodies were spotted in an orchard on Wednesday by a farm worker who immediately contacted the police. All the bodies were found close together. Sheriff Warnke said Jesus Manuel Salgado was booked into the

Merced County Jail. "He was arrested for four counts of murder and four counts of kidnapping. Our detectives, alongside investigators from assisting agencies, will continue to follow up on any leads of additional people who may have been involved in this horrific incident," said Merced County Sheriff's Office. The sheriff has also called it one of the worst crimes he has

seen over his 43 years in law enforcement and pleaded for Salgado's accomplice to turn himself in. "There's some things you'll take to the grave. This to me was pure evil," he said in an interview Thursday. The accused Salgado was taken into custody Tuesday afternoon and remains in the hospital in critical condition following a suicide bid.

Interestingly, Ganguly will represent the Cricket Association of Bengal, instead of CAB president Avishek Dalmiya, which rules out the possibility of the former BCCI chiefs son to take up atop post in the Board.
