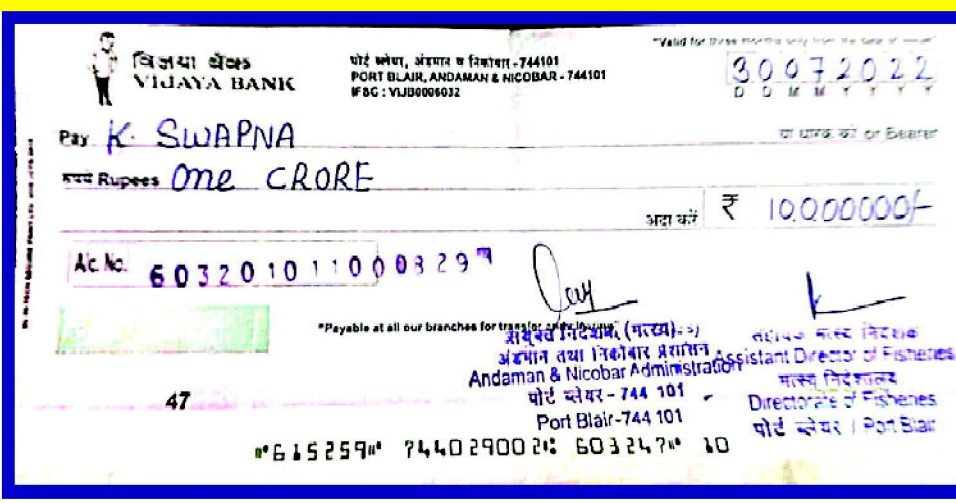

Swapna has the signature of Joint Director (Fisheries) and Assistant Director of Fisheries. The purpose of the issuance of cheque to the beneficiary under which scheme is to be identified and detailed investigation is required to be conducted for issuing of such a huge amount to a single individual. The subject matter is already with the knowledge of the Fisheries Department from last month back, but still no action against the officers indulging in issuance of cheque has been taken by the department. Pendency of online applications at its peak in revenue Department

Port Blair, Oct 11: Online system for settlement of revenue related cases was conceived with the objective to reduce hardship of applicants in running behind revenue officials and curb the menace of corruption. With passage of time, it seems that the system lost its objectives as applicants are forced to approach concerned revenue official in person, his/her case remains unattended by the revenue staff for several reasons. So indirectly applicants are forced to contact revenue staff for attending their application. The situation is alarming as the approach may lead to corruption and issue of fabricated reports or documents. There is provision in the online portal for checking the number of pending cases with each and every dealing revenue staff. Higher officials shall check the status online and take remedial measures for clearance of pending cases. Immediate measures are essential to stop the ongoing wrong practice. Reportedly, there is a recommendation of dealing Patwari for demarcation of land. This is because several applications for issue of No dues & Non-encumbrances are being reverted for want of Demarcation. If meeting with patwari/RV Surveyor is essential for getting the land record related document or copies, then what for is the online system? To avoid the hardship being faced by applicants, a monitoring mechanism on clearance of cases and pending cases need to be activated. Issue of citizen charter and strict compliance of schedule may be another and effective solution to the issue.

Too few rules

That the five-member Supreme Court collegium issued a clarification, following reported differences over appointment of judges to four SC vacancies, is commendable. More so because key aspects of the collegium system of appointing judges are not open to any scrutiny. Take for instance, SC's statement revealing that the "procedure of circulating the judgments of the prospective candidates and making an objective assessment of their relative merit was introduced for the first time" in the September 26 collegium meeting. This is a very important public disclosure and also startling – surely such objective criteria should be regular inputs in judges selection.

But this was mentioned almost in passing in the clarification. What other yardsticks have been formalised beyond the Second and Third Judges Cases (1993 and 1998) and Justice Department's Memorandum of Procedure for appointment of judges (1999) stipulations? It must be asked why such an elementary selection procedure like vetting a candidate's prior verdicts was not used for three decades. That there are disagreements among collegium members over what constitutes proper procedures is a good thing – the problem is that too little of the process is codified. Since the Third Judges Case and 1999 MoP that shaped the present collegium, the system seems unable to cope whenever a controversy over judicial appointment or transfer breaks out. Following SC's constitution bench striking down the National Judicial Appointments Commission and reinstating the collegium in 2015, SC had tasked Govt to finalise a new MoP, which would lay emphasis on transparency and improve the selection of judges by the collegium. Unfortunately, that process was stalled. But nothing stops the SC collegium from fine tuning, publicising and institutionalising its internal criteria to find judges.

Some may point out that at least a process of vetting judgments written by the candidates is now being followed. Some earlier CJs reportedly interviewed candidates too. Emphasis on quality rather than largely quantitative parameters like seniority or number of judgments bolsters collegium's credibility. But the question remains: Will an uncoded process survive the next CJ or a CJ further down the line? There are thorny questions. For example, how would an eminent lawyer interested in SC judgeship be evaluated? He or she won't have judgments to show. So, when a big-name lawyer is made an SC judge, what criteria are at work? The collegium must lay down some parameters.

UKRAINE: INDIA VOTES AGAINST RUSSIA'S DEMAND FOR SECRET BALLOT AT UNGA

India has voted to reject Russia's demand for a secret ballot in the UN General Assembly (UNGA) on a draft resolution to condemn Moscow's annexation of four regions of Ukraine, on Monday.

New Delhi took a position in favour of a public vote against Russia's call for the 193-member body to hold a secret ballot on the draft, reported PTI. While 107 UN member states voted in favour of public vote, only 13 voted for a secret ballot. Thirty four nations, including Russia and China, abstained.

However, India has not revealed how it would vote on the resolution that will be moved on Tuesday or Wednesday. New Delhi abstained while Russia vetoed a draft UN Security Council resolution tabled by the US and Albania to condemn Moscow's illegal referenda and declared the annexation of four Ukrainian territories as invalid last week.

Monday's draft resolution was moved by Albania to condemn Russia's illegal so-called referendums and attempted illegal annexation of the

Donetsk, Kherson, Luhansk, and Zaporizhzhia regions.

Russia later appealed against the ruling of the president of the general assembly in favour of a public vote, following which a recorded vote on Russia's appeal was held. India was among the 100 nations who voted against the challenge made by Moscow.

Russia then sought reconsideration of the decision to adopt the motion submitted by Albania for a recorded vote. The General Assembly decided not to reconsider the motion

after 104 nations, including India, voted against such a reconsideration, while 16 voted in favour and 34 abstained.

Russia's Permanent Representative Vassily Nebenzia said the UN membership had become witnesses to an outrageous fraud in which the president of the general assembly, unfortunately, played a key role.

"We were not given the floor to make a point of order (the indicator light at our seat is still on), our statement was distorted, and now UN member states are being robbed of their right to express their opinion freely.

This is an unprecedented manipulation undermining the authority of the general assembly and the United Nations as a whole. Of course, in such circumstances we opted to not take part in the vote, he said.

The action in the UNGA came hours after Russia carried out strikes against multiple Ukrainian cities, including Kyiv, where at least 10 people were killed and around 60 others wounded across Ukraine.

Meanwhile, External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said the escalation of hostilities was in no one's interest and noted that India stood ready to support all such efforts aimed at de-escalation of the situation.

"India is deeply concerned at the escalation of the conflict in Ukraine, including the targeting of infrastructure

and deaths of civilians," he said, urging the immediate cessation of hostilities.

Air defence system for Ukraine US President Joe Biden has promised to provide Ukraine with an advanced air defence system, a day after Russia rained missiles and rockets on Kyiv to retaliate against the attack on the Crimea bridge.

Biden also lashed out at Russia for the "utter brutality" of Vladimir Putin's "illegal war." "The United States strongly condemns Russia's missile strikes today across Ukraine," Biden said in a statement. "These attacks killed and injured civilians and destroyed targets with no military purpose. They once again demonstrate the utter brutality of Mr. Putin's illegal war on the Ukrainian people," the statement added.

Biden, who spoke to Ukrainian president Volodymyr Zelensky on Monday, also pledged to continue supporting Ukraine, including providing advanced air defence systems. However, no detail was given in this regard, though CNN reported that it could be National Advanced Surface-to-Air Missile Systems.

The Biden administration also refused to respond to whether or not the type of weapons supplied to Kyiv will change with the latest missile attacks. It, however, said that the US will continue to help provide short- and long-range air defence systems, as it has in the past.

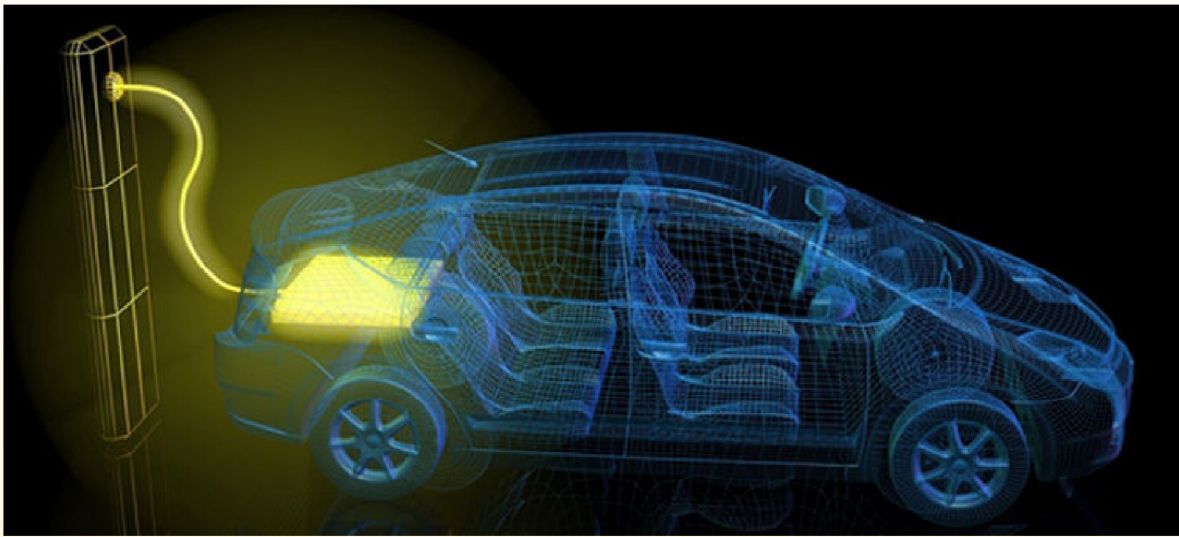

NEW SPACE TECH CAN CHARGE ELECTRIC CARS IN JUST FIVE MINUTES: NASA



A new NASA-funded technology for future space missions may charge an electric car in just five minutes on Earth, paving the way for increased adoption of such vehicles, the US space agency said.

Researchers at Purdue University, US developed the Flow Boiling and Condensation Experiment (FBCE) to enable two-phase fluid flow and heat transfer experiments to be conducted in the long-duration microgravity environment on the International Space Station (ISS).

The new "subcooled flow boiling" technique results in greatly improved heat transfer effectiveness compared to other approaches and could be used to control the temperatures of future systems in space.

This technology can also have applications on Earth: it could make owning an electric car more appealing, the researchers said.

Currently, charging times vary widely,

from 20 minutes at a station alongside a roadway to hours using an at-home charging station.

Lengthy charging times and charger location are both cited as major concerns of people who are considering electric vehicle ownership.

Reducing the charging time for electric vehicles to five minutes -- an industry goal -- will require charging systems to provide current at 1,400 amperes.

Currently, advanced chargers only deliver currents up to 520 amperes, and most chargers available to consumers support currents of less than 150 amperes.

However, charging systems providing 1,400 amperes will generate significantly more heat than current systems, and will require improved methods to control temperature.

Recently, the team applied the technique learned from the NASA FBCE experiments to the electric vehicle charging

process.

Using this new technology, dielectric -- non-electrically conducting -- liquid coolant is pumped through the charging cable, where it captures the heat generated by the current-carrying conductor.

Subcooled flow boiling allows the team to deliver 4.6 times the current of the fastest available electric vehicle chargers on the market today by removing up to 24.22 kilowatts of heat, the researchers said.

The charging cable can provide 2,400 amperes, which is far beyond the 1,400 amperes required to reduce time required to charge an electric car to five minutes, they said.

"Application of this new technology resulted in unprecedented reduction of the time required to charge a vehicle and may remove one of the key barriers to worldwide adoption of electric vehicles," the researchers added. - Source : The week

IMF cuts India's economic growth forecast to 6.8 per cent in 2022

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) on Tuesday cut its projection of India's economic growth in 2022 to 6.8 per cent, as it joins other global agencies that have trimmed forecasts.

The IMF had in July projected a gross domestic product (GDP) growth of 7.4 per cent for India in the fiscal year that started in April 2022. Even that forecast was lower than 8.2 per cent projected in January this year.

India had grown at 8.7 per cent in 2021-22 fiscal (April 2021 to March 2022). In its annual World Economic Outlook report released on Tuesday, the IMF said outlook for India is growth of 6.8 per cent in 2022 a 0.6 percentage point downgrade since the July forecast, reflecting a weaker-than-expected output in the second quarter and more subdued external demand.

Global growth is forecast to slow from 6.0 per cent in 2021 to 3.2 per cent in 2022 and 2.7 per cent in 2023. This is the weakest growth profile since 2001, except for the global financial crisis and the acute phase of the COVID-19 pandemic. The economic growth projections reflect significant slowdowns for the largest economies: a US GDP contraction in the first half of 2022, a euro area contraction in the second half of 2022, and prolonged COVID-19 outbreaks and lockdowns in China with a growing property sector crisis, the IMF said. "The global economy continues to face steep challenges, shaped by the lingering effects of three powerful forces: the Russian invasion of Ukraine, a cost-of-living crisis caused by persistent and broadening inflation pressures, and the slowdown in China," said

Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas, Economic Counsellor and the Director of Research of the IMF, in his forward to the WEO released during the annual meeting of the IMF and the World Bank.

More than a third of the global economy will contract in 2023, while the three largest economies -- the United States, the European Union, and China -- will continue to stall. "In short, the worst is yet to come, and for many people 2023 will feel like a recession," he wrote. Growth rate projections for China is 3.2 per cent, down from 8.1 per cent growth rate in 2021. In China, the frequent lockdowns under its zero-COVID policy have taken a toll on the economy, especially in the second quarter of 2022. Furthermore, the property sector, representing about one-fifth of economic activity in China, is

rapidly weakening.

"Given the size of China's economy and its importance for global supply chains, this will weigh heavily on global trade and activity," Gourinchas said.

In the United States, the tightening of monetary and financial conditions will slow growth to 1 per cent next year. In China, the IMF has lowered next year's growth forecast to 4.4 per cent due to a weakening property sector and continued lockdowns, he wrote in a blog post.

"Russia's invasion of Ukraine continues to powerfully destabilize the global economy. Beyond the escalating and senseless destruction of lives and livelihoods, it has led to a severe energy crisis in Europe that is sharply increasing costs of living and hampering economic activity," he said.
