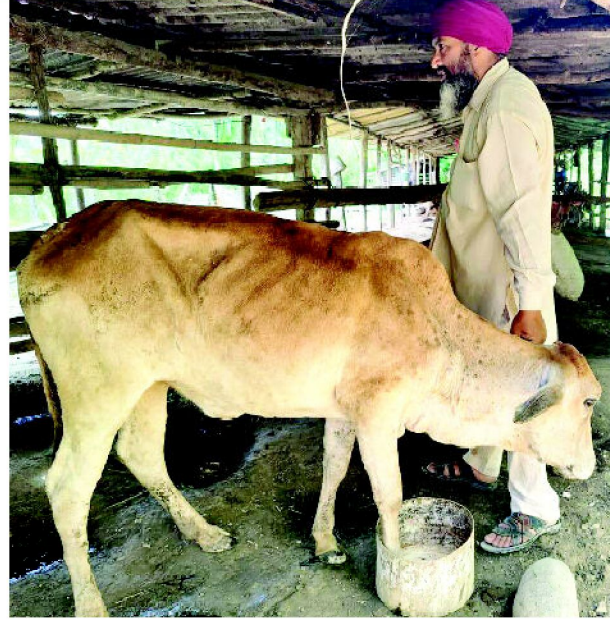

## SPREAD OF LUMPY SKIN DISEASE AT C/BAY No Veterinary team deputed to oversee the situation

Port Blair, Oct 16: While most of the States in the country affected by lumpy skin disease outbreak have taken precautionary measures by deputing expert teams to tackle the deadly animal diseases, the department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services has no plan to tackle the disease. It is estimated that over 97,000 cattle died due to the outbreak of this disease in the three months between July and 23 September, starting from outbreaks in Gujarat and Rajasthan. In the same manner, the lumpy disease was also reported in Campbell Bay. However, the SVO's and the Para Veterinary Staff successfully managed to control the spread of the disease and were able to save the lives of thousands of cattle in the islands. But surprisingly during and after the outbreak of this disease in Campbell Bay, the department of Animal Husbandry



failed to depute a team of Senior Veterinary Officers and Laboratory experts for the surveillance of spread and effectiveness of the treatment and vaccines given to the animals. Besides facing the challenges of controlling the spread of disease, it is also an opportunity for the Animal Husbandry department to

study the disease and find ways to prevent the outbreak of such diseases. But the white elephant, Animal Husbandry department has no vision or will to study, record such diseases and its impact on animals. It was more shocking that even the Director of See... Page No. 02

According to information collected by The Andaman Express, gambling is held everyday in various places in the city. Teams associated with organizing the gambling party have been arranging such parties

openly ahead of Diwali where only the closed gamblers are allowed and no outsider are invited. Only people with references are allowed to play the game. The gambling game starts in the night and goes on till morning the next day. One can understand people playing cards or gambling on Diwali as this is one day when gambling is not considered a vice and many people and families come together to win money. Playing cards is extremely popular on

Diwali night as it is believed that gambling on the festival of lights ensures goodwill to the players. But arranging daily gambling parties and putting at stake lakhs of rupees ahead of Diwali is something illegal and has to be prevented. Sources informed that these gambling parties are organized in agreement with the Police who look the other way deliberately. Undoubtedly, the Security Agency may be getting some benefit for allowing gambling.

## One convicted for sexual assault

Port Blair, Oct. 16: The Special Judge, Shri Raja Chatterjee on 13th October, 2022 convicted one accused persons namely Mithun Sikder, resident of Durgapur Village, Diglipur in a sexual assault case committed by him against a minor girl then aged 11 years. It may be recalled that on 1st November 2016, the victim girl had been to the tuition centre and the tuition teacher i.e. the accused herein was alone in the centre and no one else except the victim was present. The accused thereafter made the victim sit on his lap and started touching her

body inappropriately and also touched her private part with bad intention. The victim out of fear came out of the centre and called her father. Then the matter was brought to notice of PS Diglipur who registered a case against the accused person under Section 354 of Indian Penal Code (IPC) read with Section 9(m) & 10 of POCSO Act. The prosecution examined 09 witnesses and the Hon'ble Court after conducting trial found the accused person guilty of the offence and sentenced him to suffer 5 (five) See... Page No. 02

### Voice of reason

Bombay high court has sent a strong message on the sanctity of due process and procedural safeguards by acquitting ex-Delhi University professor GN Saibaba and five others given life terms on charges of membership of the banned CPI(Maoist) and "aiding" and "abetting" its activities. The wheelchair-bound Saibaba was jailed in 2014 and convicted in 2017. Section 45 of UAPA has two key safeguards to prevent wrongful implication of innocents by the police. Both, Bombay HC noted, were violated.

UAPA judges must await prosecution sanction before taking cognisance of chargesheets. This prosecution sanction, in turn, must be considered and granted by government only after an independent authority conducts a "review of the evidence gathered in the course of investigation and makes a recommendation". But the trial court framed charges against Saibaba before prosecution sanction arrived. The Director of Prosecution reviewing the chargesheet recommended prosecuting the accused without giving any reasoning. HC wondered how a few "laconic" sentences helped the prosecution sanctioning authority make informed decisions. The conviction was struck down, citing a constitution bench ruling that a trial proceeding without valid sanction would stand vitiated.

The judges exhorted the state to fight terrorism with "unwavering resolve" but said the rule of law must tower over loud refrains that "the end justifies the means, and that the procedural safeguards are subservient to the overwhelming need to ensure that the accused is prosecuted and punished". They signed off by warning that "empirical evidence suggests departures from the due process of law foster an ecosystem in which terrorism burgeons and provides fodder to vested interests whose singular agenda is to propagate false narratives." Food for thought for all of us.

Shortage of essential medicines is always an excuse for the SVO's and unavailability of Proper Laboratory and X-ray facility is another achievement of the director for which the poor animals sacrifice their lives.

# FINANCE MINISTER SITHARAMAN URGES WORLD BANK TO AVOID UNIDIMENSIONAL VIEW OF SUBSIDIES

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has urged the World Bank to avoid a "unidimensional" view of the subsidies provided by the Indian government and asserted that it is important to differentiate between "distortive subsidies"

and "targeted support" to the vulnerable households. Speaking at an intervention of the World Bank Development Committee's meeting on Friday, Sitharaman said that subsidies have made a definitive contribution in improving India's

performance on several key parameters of Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).

We urge the Bank to avoid a unidimensional view of subsidies. It is important to differentiate between distortive subsidies and targeted support to the vulnerable households, Sitharaman said.

As an illustration, she said that by providing free LPG connections under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojna over the last six years, the Indian Government has ensured that access to clean cooking methods has achieved near saturation for women in India. This has made a definitive contribution in improving India's performance on several key parameters of SDG, she said.

During her intervention, she told the Development Committee members that while the quest for energy and food security necessitates non exclusion of

fossil fuels from our energy mix, India has set up its first pure hydrogen producing plant as well as its first 2G bioethanol refinery this year.

Going forward, she suggested three clear opportunities for the World Bank Group.

First, promoting behaviour change to increase energy efficiency and to reduce food losses. Programmes like the Lifestyle for the Environment launched by India on the World Environment Day this June, in which World Bank President David Malpass delivered a wonderful keynote address, can mainstream responsible consumption behaviour, she said.

Second is helping all client countries in arranging concessional financing and technology transfer in areas like renewable and green energy. And third is supporting regional integration not only through IDA

but also through IBRD, the minister said.

On financing climate and development goals, the World Bank is uniquely placed to bring together all stakeholders for developing an investment strategy for climate and development finance, she observed. Yet, we must never lose focus on the internationally agreed basic principle of common but differentiated responsibilities. This necessitates avoidance of a one-size fit-all approach, she told the Development Committee. Mitigation of risks is essential for crowding in private capital. While welcoming the launching of SCALE, we encourage the Bank to increase the share of grants from the current five per cent level and to work below the country level to support projects with huge climate impact beyond the national borders. The aim of the workshop was to enhance the capacity of fishworkers' organizations, CSOs, and community-based organizations to engage with the SSF Guidelines to negotiate issues of concern in regard to policy, legislation, lives and livelihoods of the SSF communities. The workshop was attended by fisher representatives from all the coastal states and coastal union territories including Andaman & Nicobar Islands (ANI). Mr S. U Maheshwar Rao, Member of Governing Body, National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB) & Representative of National Platform for Small-Scale Fishworkers (NPSSF) and Ms Madhuri Mondal, Senior Programme Officer Dakshin Foundation and an islander working with fishing communities, attended the workshop from ANI. The 3-day workshop was divided into multiple sessions. On the first day, there were sessions on Customary rights of fishing communities and challenges faced

by the marine fishing communities in India by Trustees of ICSP Dr. John Kurien and Mr. V Vivekanandan. There were also talks on Marine Fisheries Management in India and Status of Marine Fish Stocks in India by scientists of Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI). On the second day, there was a talk on Public Expenditure in India on Coastal fishing communities by scientists from Central Institute of Fisheries Education (CIFE). There were also sessions on the World Trade Organization (WTO) Agreement on Fisheries Subsidies and its implications for India. On the third day, there were presentations on Coastal land rights by Senior Researchers from Centre for Policy Research and advocates from Madras and Bombay High Courts. Discussions were held on fisheries governance issues faced by marine fishers in each state and the governance reforms needed in the states and at union level. The representatives from ANI expressed the need to have a

mechanism for participatory fisheries management in the islands by formation of state and district level committees with fisher representatives, fisheries department officials, civil society organizations working with fishers and scientific institutions like FSI, CMFRI, Pondicherry University. Discussions were held on existing schemes for marine fishing communities in India and reforms needed on these. The representatives from ANI mentioned the need to provide pension to fishworkers above the age of 50 years and also to provide diesel subsidy for the fishers. They informed that there is also a need to build capacity of fishers in the islands periodically on various aspects of health, safety and use of technology. They discussed the need to improve the post harvest fish storage and handling by enhancing hygiene and quality of facilities in local fish markets. The need to recognize and prioritize the customary rights of local fishers were also highlighted. - Source : ICSP

In the inaugural session of the conclave, Drew Schuffetowski, Minister Counselor for Economic, Environment, Science, and Technology Affairs, U.S. Embassy, New Delhi said, "The greatest growth potential in our space relationship, and those of other Indo-Pacific partners, involves the private sector. India's space sector is undergoing a transformation with private companies taking on a more influential role in both design and production of launch vehicles, satellites, ground stations, and other elements at the heart of space exploration and applications." Minister Counselor Schuffetowski added, "Indian firms are now building their own satellite constellations for earth observation and designing small

launch vehicles to place them in low-Earth orbit. This is where space companies in the United States and across the Indo-Pacific can enhance this commercial sector momentum, through partnerships in trade, investment, and technological collaboration." More than 80 invited participants from several Indo-Pacific nations and beyond including the United States, India, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, South Korea, Germany, the United Kingdom, Malaysia, the Philippines, and Indonesia, are taking part in the conclave to discuss the core themes of space policy, scientific research and development, and space entrepreneurship. The conclave aims to establish the Association of Space Entrepreneurs in the Indo-Pacific (ASEIP), a networking and lobbying platform focused on innovation and entrepreneurship in the space sector. Stakeholders will recommend a future roadmap to promote international aerospace business and scientific space collaborations. Dr. Satya

The DC (SA) also directed the Revenue field staff and the officials of the line departments to follow up on all the matters that were placed before the camp. He assured the gathering that the District Administration is committed to the overall development of the Panchayat and urged the people to feel free to reach out to the District Administration for redressal of their grievances. ## CCI constantly honing its toolkit to tackle digital market challenges: Chairperson

The Competition Commission is constantly honing its toolkit to meet the challenges emanating from digital markets and plans to hire data scientists and algorithm experts for its upcoming digital markets and data unit, the regulator's chief Ashok Kumar Gupta said on Saturday.

In recent times, many cases related to technology markets have come up before the Competition Commission of India (CCI), including online marketplace platforms, app stores, payment gateways, online travel, food aggregators and social networking.

"Such cases pertain to issues such as self-preferencing, leveraging, data-collection practices, deep discounting, etc."

"As market regulators, we cannot overlook the challenges that market power and business practices of gatekeeper platforms pose to other market participants - those who are competing with them and, more so, those who deal with them (and rely upon them)," he said. Speaking at a conference

organised by the CCI and industry body ASSOCHAM, Gupta stressed that the regulator is constantly honing its antitrust and merger toolkit to meet these challenges and, in doing so, benchmarking itself with global best practices.

Among other efforts, the regulator is in the process of setting up a dedicated Digital Markets and Data Unit (DMDU).

"In addition to our staff from the law, economics, and finance streams, we plan to staff the unit with new professional profiles such as data scientists, algorithm experts, etc," the CCI chairperson said. Since it started

functioning 13 years ago, CCI has reviewed more than 1,200 anti-trust cases and 965 combination filings.

Some of the key sectors where the regulator has made interventions are cement, tyre, real estate, pharma, entertainment, coal, and digital markets. The CCI chief emphasised that businesses need to adopt compliance practices that inspire trust between the regulator and the industry. "To make a trust-based regime sustainable, it is imperative that businesses adopt proactive competition compliance as an important element of corporate governance strategy. This will also help them compete globally."

"The Indian Competition Act encourages this mutual meaningful relationship between competition and corporate governance," Gupta said, adding that with its ex-post enforcement regime, the regulator has been able to develop a substantive body of anti-trust jurisprudence. Further, he said while enforcing the law, CCI is "conscious that onerous procedures and processes do not create regulatory cholesterol."
