Urban residents peeved over increasing stray dog, pig menace

Port Blair, October 17: Even as the Port Blair Municipal Council is striving hard to sustain cleanliness and implement the Smart City project, the civic agency appears to falter in addressing some basic problems faced by residents. Menace of stray dogs and pigs are some of the problems which are increasing day-by-day in several parts of the city. According to reports, all the Municipal Wards have seen an alarming rise in the number of stray dogs putting the safety of the residents at risk. Stray dogs are often seen chasing pedestrians and bikers on streets mainly during night time. Though official figures could not be ascertained, sources say that at least a couple of dog bite cases are reported in health centres in the city every day, while many

sustain injuries by falling from bikes after being chased by the dogs. Street dogs roaming freely and chasing vehicles in the city is a common sight. This has created a panic situation among the two wheeler riders. In the same manner, stray pig have also emerged as a problem for the citizens. Incidents of two wheeler drivers meeting road accidents due to pigs occupy in roads have registered a growth in the recent months. "Mushrooming of food centres in the city is one major reason for the growing numbers of stray dogs. These fast food outlets attract dogs into the city limits as the animals feast on the waste dumped by the eateries along the roads. Though the civic body has put measures in place to contain the menace, packs of dogs can be found at any given place - be it residential areas,

marketplaces or offices," said an official of the Animal Husbandry Department, on conditions of anonymity. The sight of around a dozen stray dogs after you while returning home after work will give goosebumps to any normal human being. The area where I reside is one such example where people prefer to stay indoors in the early morning and evening hours. This area is so crowded with canines day and night that people don't even

allow their children to play in the open as they happen to be soft targets of these ferocious animals. Alarming rise in the population of these stray dogs has become a serious concern for residents in the city. Though some NGOs are working for the welfare of animals, some of these NGOs are more concerned about donation rather than working in the sector to contain the population of stray canines," said some residents.

MP requests Agriculture Minister to direct NAFED to procure Copra under Price Support Scheme

Port Blair, Oct 17: The Member of Parliament, Shri. Kuldeep Rai Sharma has requested the Union Minister, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare to direct National Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Federation of India Ltd. (NAFED) to procure Copra from Andaman and Nicobar Islands under Price Support Scheme. In a letter addressed to the Union Minister, Ministry of Agriculture

and Farmers' Welfare, the Member of Parliament mentioned that a large number of farmers in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, including the majority of brothers and sisters of Nicobar Tribal Community and farmers of Great Nicobar (Campbell Bay) depend on Copra farming for their livelihood. He added that due to delay in procurement of these Copra under Price Support Scheme of Government of India,

presently Copra farmers of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, especially Copra producers of entire Nicobar District are being exploited by middlemen, who are procuring Copra from them at very cheap price. As with time, Copra loses weight and it causes further loss to the Copra farmers, the Member of Parliament requested the Minister for an early action in this regard. - Source : Media Cell, MP

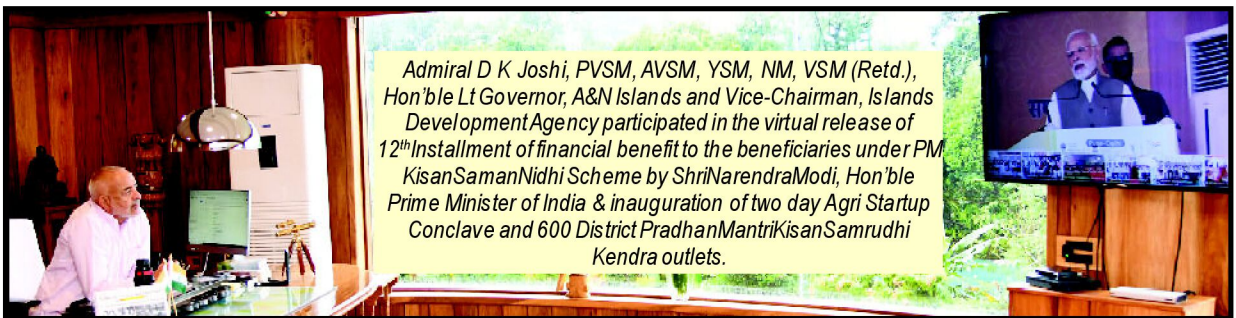

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First Post-Monsoon Cyclone in Bay of Bengal Likely This Week? IMD Says 'Too Soon to Say'

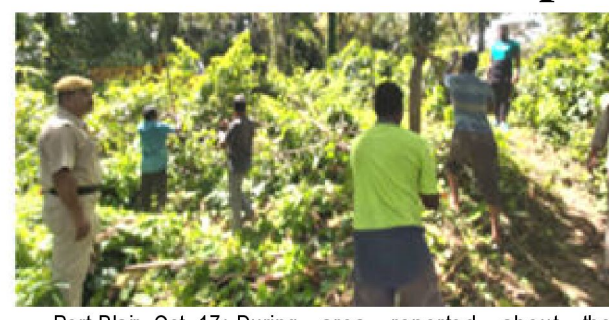

Voice of reason

Bombay high court has sent a strong message on the sanctity of due process and procedural safeguards by acquitting ex-Delhi University professor GN Saibaba and five others given life terms on charges of membership of the banned CPI(Maoist) and "aiding" and "abetting" its activities. The wheelchair-bound Saibaba was jailed in 2014 and convicted in 2017. Section 45 of UAPA has two key safeguards to prevent wrongful implication of innocents by the police. Both, Bombay HC noted, were violated.

UAPA judges must await prosecution sanction before taking cognisance of chargesheets. This prosecution sanction, in turn, must be considered and granted by government only after an independent authority conducts a "review of the evidence gathered in the course of investigation and makes a recommendation". But the trial court framed charges against Saibaba before prosecution sanction arrived. The Director of Prosecution reviewing the chargesheet recommended prosecuting the accused without giving any reasoning. HC wondered how a few "laconic" sentences helped the prosecution sanctioning authority make informed decisions. The conviction was struck down, citing a constitution bench ruling that a trial proceeding without valid sanction would stand vitiated.

The judges exhorted the state to fight terrorism with "unwavering resolve" but said the rule of law must tower over loud refrains that "the end justifies the means, and that the procedural safeguards are subservient to the overwhelming need to ensure that the accused is prosecuted and punished". They signed off by warning that "empirical evidence suggests departures from the due process of law foster an ecosystem in which terrorism burgeons and provides fodder to vested interests whose singular agenda is to propagate false narratives." Food for thought for all of us.

ARE INDIA-US RELATIONS TURNING SOUR OVER F-16 DEAL, RUSSIAN OIL PURCHASE?

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar during his ten-day visit to the US in late September said the ties between the two countries are "in good place". His counterpart, the secretary of state, Antony Blinken said the partnership is "simply one of the most consequential in the world". Despite these endorsements, there are suggestions that the spark is certainly a little less intense.

So, is the honeymoon between India and America over? Jaishankar's trip may have been a chance to stress the importance of the relationship, but the US's assistance to the F-16s to Pakistan is certainly a sore point with India. And India buying oil from Russia is a "sensitive" point for America.

"It is a sensitive point," asserted Tim Roemer, former US

member of Congress and former US ambassador to India, speaking at the ML Sondhi Institute for Asia Pacific Affairs and Kalinga International Foundation panel discussion in Delhi on "US Mid-term elections and their impact on India-US relations". He, however, added the "health of the relationship is in managing the differences."

This is not the first time that India and the US have not seen eye-to-eye on various issues. "I hope the question we ask is how do we work in the long term and help India's transition to a cleaner vibrant democratic economy," he said. Russia is an area where the two countries have not been on the same page. But with the Ukraine war—and

the US's engagement—this tussle is only likely to become more fraught. Especially because the public opinion in America is unsympathetic to India's stance on buying cheaper oil from Russia, even though Jaishankar claimed the oil prices were breaking India's back.

"All politics is now national," Roemer said. India, however, is equally sensitive about Pakistan. And the continued US assistance of 450 million dollars to Pakistan on the F16s has certainly led to much heartburn in India. While Blinken insisted that the assistance was to bolster "its capability to deal with terrorist threats emanating from Pakistan for the region", Jaishankar chose to call it out. In a private function with Indian diaspora, the external affairs minister said,

"You're not fooling anybody by saying these things," referring to the F-16 assistance package being given to Pakistan ostensibly for counter-terrorism reasons. What helps bolster India's argument was that President Joe Biden, at a recent function, referred to Pakistan as "one of the most dangerous nations in the world", citing the country's nuclear weapons arsenal, which is "without any cohesion". So, what message does it send to India? "I think it is in India's interest that the US keeps checking in to Pakistan," he said. The two countries agreeing to disagree on various points, however, was possibly an indication of the strength of the relationship, argued Roemer. "China is pushing India and America together," he said. - Source : Theweek

With 5,02,619 doses administered in the last 24 hours among all age groups. Omicron's new sub-

variant BA.5.1.7 is said to be highly infectious and have greater transmissibility after emerging from a region of Mongolia in China. According to recent reports, the first case of BF.7 has been found in India as detected by the Gujarat Biotechnology Research centre. On Sunday, India reported 2,401 fresh COVID-19 cases with which, the number of active cases increased to 26,625. The active cases comprise 0.06 percent of the total infections, according to Union health ministry data. (Source: Zee News)

India to be a hub for agri-products globally: Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday inaugurated the PM Kisan Samman Sammelan in Delhi. Ahead of Diwali celebrations, Modi at the event released the 12th instalment of financial benefit worth Rs 16,000 crore to over 11 crore eligible farmers under the flagship PM-KISAN scheme.

Under 'One nation one fertiliser', farmers will be provided with cheaper and good quality fertilizers, said PM. With modern technology, government is reducing gap between farm fields and markets, he added.

PM Modi said that new technologies will boost the agricultural sector. "There's a major transformation in the production technology and quality of fertilizers. This will boost the production of agri-products and address all crop-related problems. India will soon emerge as a hub for the efficient

production of agri-products globally," said Modi.

"We spend the most buying edible oil, fertiliser and crude oil from other countries. Whenever there's any crisis in foreign countries, it affects us too. Those countries from which we fulfill most of our needs are indulged in war," said Modi.

He also said that giving importance to natural farming has led to a multi-fold increase in production.

Over 13,500 farmers from across the country and around 1,500 Agri-startups are participating in the event. Researchers, policymakers and other stakeholders too are attending the event.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) scheme, the eligible farmers are provided with a financial benefit of Rs 6,000 per year in three equal instalments of Rs 2,000

each. The fund is directly transferred to the bank accounts of the beneficiaries.

The scheme was launched in February 2019 but is being implemented with effect from December 2018.

Union Agriculture Minister Narendra Singh Tomar and Chemicals & Fertilisers Minister Mansukh Mandaviya were present at the programme.

PM Modi also inaugurated the Agri Startup Conclave and Exhibition. An e-magazine on fertilizer 'Indian Edge' was also launched by the PM during the event.

PM-KISAN is a central sector scheme with 100 per cent funding from the central government. The state government and UT administration identify the farmer families that are eligible for support as per scheme guidelines.

India needs to play a big role to end Ukraine war

Port Blair, Oct. 17: INDIA's vote at the UN General Assembly on October 11 against Russia's demand for a secret ballot on a draft resolution to condemn its annexation of four regions of Ukraine is merely one indication of the challenges Russia's assault on Ukraine has created for Indian diplomacy. Earlier, justifying India's decision to abstain from condemning Russia's invasion of

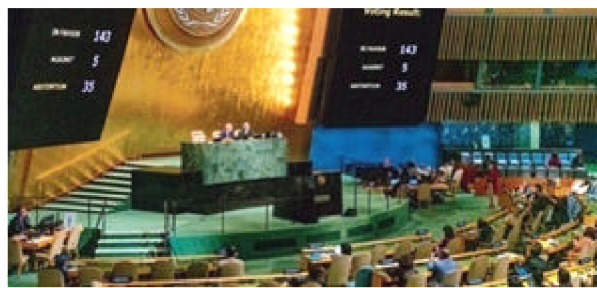
Ukraine at the Globsec 2022 forum in Slovakia in June, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar asserted that "Europe has to grow out of the mindset that Europe's problems are the world's problems, but the world's problems are not Europe's problems." This reflects scant concern for the resounding impact — extending far beyond Europe — of Russia's decision to conquer

a country whose independence it recognised after the Soviet Union collapsed in 1991. One result of that invasion has been a global food crisis, which has affected developing countries adversely. Another is that India's partners in the Quad fear that China, the superior economic partner in the Sino-Russian relationship, could follow Russia's example and embark on expansionist adventures in the Indo-Pacific. Additionally, Russian President Vladimir Putin's perception of himself as a 21st-century Peter the Great trying to win back Russian lands through war and his contempt for international law and the rules-based order (RBO) suggest that his ideal world lies somewhere between the 18th and 20th century. Evidently, he is

determined to remake the international order by conquest, which was outlawed by the UN Charter after the Second World War. As a member state of the Quad, which believes that the RBO can advance security and progress in the Indo-Pacific, India should, together with the US, Japan and Australia, find this contempt unacceptable. India says it is on the side that respects the UN Charter and its founding principles. However, it has condemned neither Russia's invasion nor the annexation of some Ukrainian territories through illegal referenda. Russia's recent threat to wage nuclear war also goes against India's commitment to nuclear disarmament and strengthening the non-proliferation order. But what is India's reaction to this

threat? "Where was Europe when China was expanding in Asia?" asked Jaishankar. Well, the EU was strengthening its trading ties with China. So was India. The difference is that no EU country's sovereignty is menaced by China, while India and most of China's Asian neighbours face its threats to their territorial integrity. True, the EU has no defence policy and lacks military clout in Asia or even in Europe. But whatever its deficiencies, the EU are not as narrow-minded as New Delhi alleges. Actually, the EU has invested heavily in Asia and in developing countries generally, to counter China's economic clout. In another plane, India — like its territorial contestant China — is entitled to buy Russian oil in the wake of Russia's aggression in

Ukraine, just as EU countries were purchasing far greater quantities of energy from Moscow since 2014, when it invaded Ukraine after 1991 and annexed Crimea. But India can learn something from the EU's experience — reliance on territorial spoilers for energy or trade, whether the spoiler is Russia in Europe or China against India, can be self-defeating in the long run. The legal, political and economic repercussions of Russia's war in Ukraine extend far beyond Europe — to the Indo-Pacific and Africa. Perceiving itself as a leader of the developing world, India should carve out a bigger international role for itself to end the conflict and reduce its unfortunate impact on developing societies. BATTERY TECH BREAKTHROUGH PAVES WAY FOR MASS ADOPTION OF AFFORDABLE ELECTRIC CAR

A breakthrough in electric vehicle battery design has enabled a 10-minute charge time for a typical EV battery. The record-breaking combination of a shorter charge time and more energy acquired for longer travel range was announced in the journal Nature on Oct. 12.

"The need for smaller, faster-charging batteries is greater than ever," said Chao-Yang Wang, the William E. Diefenderfer Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Penn State and lead author on the study. "There are simply not enough batteries and critical raw materials, especially those produced domestically, to meet anticipated demand."

In August, California's Air Resources Board passed an extensive plan to restrict and ultimately ban the sale of gasoline-powered cars within the state. By 2035, the largest auto market in the United States will

effectively retire the internal combustion engine.

If new car sales are going to shift to battery-powered electric vehicles (EVs), Wang explained, they'll need to overcome two major drawbacks: they are too slow to recharge and too large to be efficient and affordable. Instead of taking a few minutes at the gas pump, depending on the battery, some EVs can take all day to recharge.

"Our fast-charging technology works for most energy-dense batteries and will open a new possibility to downsize electric vehicle batteries from 150 to 50 kWh without causing drivers to feel range anxiety," said Wang, whose lab partnered with State College-based startup EC Power to develop the technology. "The smaller, faster-charging batteries will dramatically cut down battery cost and usage of critical raw materials such as

cobalt, graphite and lithium, enabling mass adoption of affordable electric cars."

The technology relies on internal thermal modulation, an active method of temperature control to demand the best performance possible from the battery, Wang explained. Batteries operate most efficiently when they are hot, but not too hot. Keeping batteries consistently at just the right temperature has been a major challenge for battery engineers. Historically, they have relied on external, bulky heating and cooling systems to regulate battery temperature, which respond slowly and waste a lot of energy, Wang said.

Wang and his team decided to instead regulate the temperature from inside the battery. The researchers developed a new battery structure that adds an ultrathin nickel foil as the fourth component besides anode, electrolyte and cathode. Acting as a stimulus, the nickel foil self-regulates the battery's temperature and reactivity which allows for 10-minute fast charging on just about any EV battery, Wang explained.

"True fast-charging batteries would have immediate impact," the researchers write. "Since there are not enough raw materials for every internal combustion engine car to be replaced by a 150 kWh-equipped EV, fast charging is imperative for EVs to go mainstream." The study's partner, EC Power, is working to manufacture and commercialize the fast-charging battery for an affordable and sustainable future of vehicle electrification, Wang said. - Source : Theweek



Air traffic set to regain pre-pandemic levels this fiscal

Air traffic in India is expected to resume pre-pandemic levels this fiscal (2022-23), aided by tariff hikes, to support higher debt servicing by operators. Private airport operators are also expected to see their traffic volume recover to the pre-pandemic levels this fiscal, spurring a recovery in revenue, supported by an increase in tariffs.

As per a recent report by CRISIL, revenue recovery is crucial to support rising debt servicing requirements as airports are at the end of their expansion phase.

The CRISIL report points out that between fiscal 2015 and 2020, air traffic had logged a healthy compound annual growth rate of 12 per cent, driven by the growing penetration of air travel beyond metro cities on tailwind from government schemes such as RCS and UDAN and the inherent benefit of time saving in passenger air travel for distances over 50 km, and focus on infrastructure development.

During the pandemic, air

traffic volume nose-dived in fiscal 2021. Fiscal 2022 saw only partial recovery (at 55 per cent of fiscal 2020 traffic), given the multiple waves of infection and restrictions on the movement of people.

The report points out that in fiscal 2023, with the pandemic impact seemingly behind, air traffic volume is expected to increase to the fiscal 2020 level of 340 million passengers. In the first five months (till August 2022), the volume was 88 per cent of the corresponding fiscal 2020 level, but is expected to pick up in the remaining months of the year because of improving business travel sentiment, pent-up demand on the international segment, and de-bottlenecking of capacity availability on aircraft and international slots.

"This fiscal, traffic volume is expected to recover to the pre-pandemic level, implying a robust growth of 75 per cent over the fiscal 2022 level. The pick-up is expected to be led by domestic traffic as slots and routes on the international front

are still opening up. In the first five months of this fiscal, domestic traffic stood at 92 per cent of the corresponding fiscal 2020 mark, while international traffic was at 75 per cent. This cements our confidence for healthy volume growth in the current fiscal and a return to near-double-digit growth next fiscal," remarked Manish Gupta, senior director, CRISIL Ratings.

The CRISIL report observes that aeronautical tariffs have increased by 30 per cent for the top four private airports, based on their released tariff orders, which in turn is likely to help aeronautical revenues reach 120 per cent in fiscal 2023. Non-aeronautical revenue, on its part, is recovering towards 90 per cent of the quantum in fiscal 2020 for this year. Consequently, the revenue of the private airports is expected to be 105 per cent and 130 per cent of fiscal 2020 revenue in fiscals 2023 and 2024, respectively.

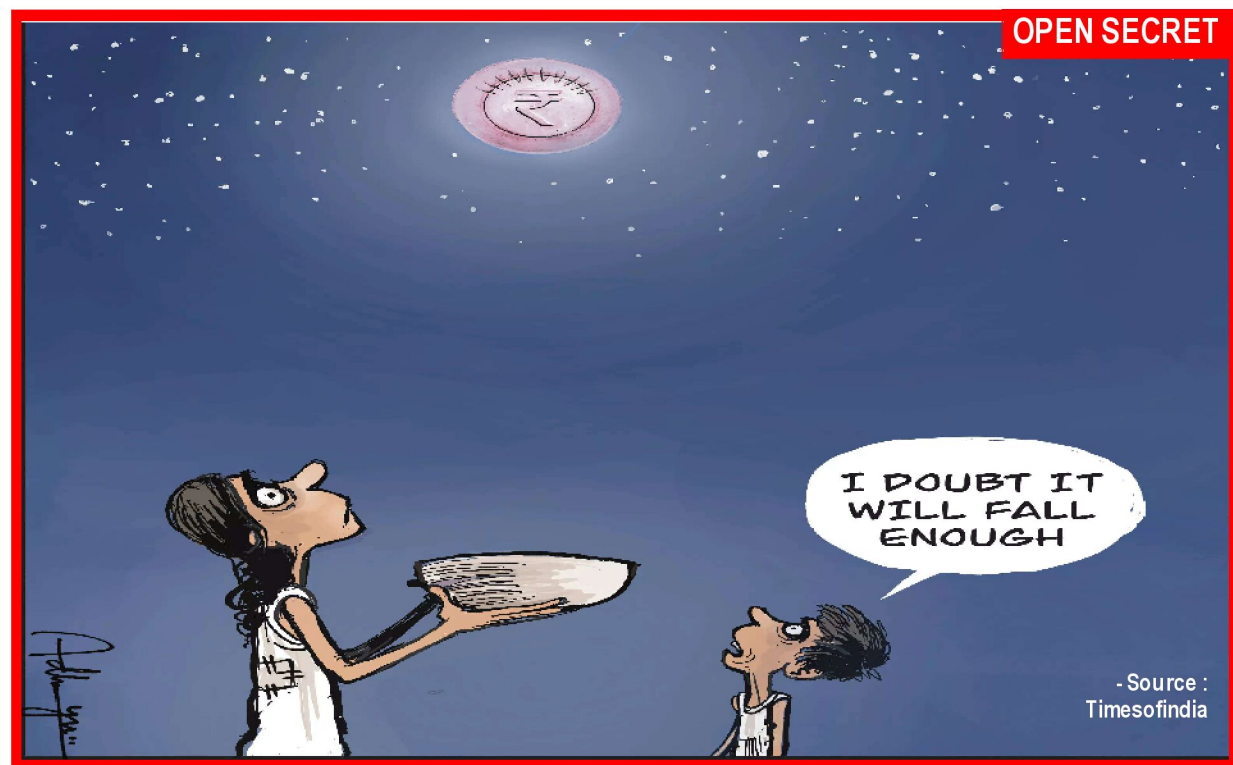
The report highlights that the improvement in revenue positions will help operators

withstand the debt-servicing requirements in fiscal 2023 and 2024 — at 25 per cent and 115 per cent higher, respectively, compared with fiscal 2020 as they had undertaken significant capacity expansion and the moratorium on this capex-related debt is expiring in these two fiscals.

Experts at CRISIL expect the debt-service cushions to be maintained close to long-term averages of around 1.4 times (similar to pre-pandemic levels) and not see any material impact on the credit quality of these operators. Additionally, the airports are going to benefit from a long remaining concession life (of over 35 years) compared with debt tenure (of around 10-18 years), which will enable them to refinance debt and manage debt obligations.

The report also says the air traffic recovery estimates and revenue projections will remain sensitive to macroeconomic uncertainties and geopolitical developments.

Indian teen D Gukesh beats World Champion Magnus Carlsen

Indian teenager Grandmaster D Gukesh upset Magnus Carlsen in the ninth round of the preliminary phase of the Aircross Rapid online chess tournament, becoming the youngest to beat the world champion.

The 16-year-old from Chennai beat the world No.1 with white pieces early on Monday to move up to third position behind Poland's Jan-Krzysztof Duda (25 points) and Shakhriyar Mamedyarov (Azerbaijan, 23 points) with 21 points after the 12th round.

Gukesh's 29-move dismantling of the world champion comes a day after his 19-year-old compatriot Arjun Erigaisi had posted a maiden win over the world champion.

"Gukesh just became the youngest player to ever beat Magnus after he became WC! Hats off to the 16-Year-Old Indian superstar," Meltwater Champions Chess Tour of which the Aircross Rapid event is a part, said on its Twitter feed.

Gukesh is 16 years 4 months 20 days while the previous record before his win was R Praggnanandhaa's 39-move victory over Carlsen in the Airings Masters in February.

Pragg was 16 years 6 months and 10 days old when he defeated the world No.1.

The Indian on his part, was quoted as saying after the momentous win: Beating Magnus is always special, but I was not very proud of that game."

Gukesh suffered a setback in round 10 when he lost to Duda but bounced back superbly to beat Mamedyarov and Eric Hansen in the next two rounds.

Erigaisi has as many points (21) as Gukesh and is in fourth as the race for the spot in the knockout phase gets closer.

The 19-year-old Erigaisi began the third day of the preliminaries with a loss to Mamedyarov before scoring over Hansen and talented German Vincent Keymer. However, a

defeat at the hands of fellow Indian GM Aditya Mital in the 12th round spoiled what would have been a good day.

Gukesh continued what has been a superb year so far for the young Indian players as he became the third one to put it across Carlsen after Praggnanandhaa and Erigaisi, who did so at last month's Julius Baer Generation Cup online event.

Even as Gukesh and Erigaisi underlined their talent and scored wins, the other Indians Vidyut Santhosh Gujrathi, Aditya Mital and P Harikrishna failed to impress.

Gujrathi lies in 10th spot and out of the qualification range for the knockout with 14 points. He lost two of his four games, to

Duda and Hansen. He drew against Mamedyarov before finishing the day with a victory over Keymer. Mital (12 points) is in 12th place. He upset Erigaisi in round 12 after having lost his three previous games to Anish Giri (the Netherlands), Richard Rapport and David Anton Guijarro in rounds 9, 10 and 11 respectively. Harikrishna is 15th after 12 rounds of play and is out of contention to reach the quarterfinals. To his credit, he did however, held Carlsen to a draw in the 10th round in a 76-move match. World champion Carlsen is in fifth spot after having a quiet day. After losing to Gukesh, he drew against Harikrishna and world rapid champion Nodirbek Abdusattorov and ended with a win over Daniel Naroditsky. Gujrathi had an impressive win over world rapid champion Abdusattorov but draws against Grandelius and Naroditsky and a defeat at the hands of Carlsen pegged him back.

The Aircross Rapid tournament is part of the Meltwater Champions tour and features 16 players including five from India. After the 15-round preliminaries, the top eight qualify for the knockouts.
