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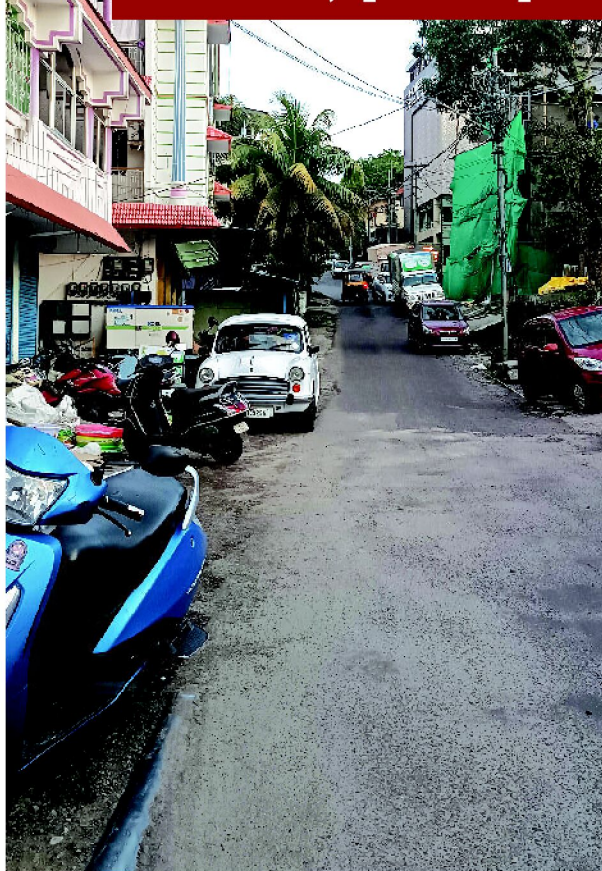

Both side parking chokes Biggiline road, puts peoples' lives at risk

Port Blair, Sept 27: Haphazard parking of vehicles on both sides of Biggiline road is creating a lot of hardship to the motorists and pedestrians. Motorists parked their vehicles on both sides of this sloppy road obstructing other movement of vehicles. Chaotic parking by motorists on this narrow road further chokes the traffic movement during school and evening hours. 'I have seen traffic chaos at Port Blair and was under the impression that the bylines will be safe. However, due to haphazard parking of vehicles on both sides of the roads in this bylane is causing a lot of hardship to the motorists. The problem is so acute that on any day, it will lead to major accident', said a resident. This road like other road has a lot of commercial shops on both side of the roads and shopper stupidly park their vehicles on roadside on both sides and go for the shopping which is leading to choking of roads at any time of the day, said

another resident. 'Haphazard parking has become the order of the day in the city. Besides major roads, almost all bylines in the city roads have become so congested due to people parking their vehicles on both sides of the roads. Motorists, including two wheeler drivers having no fear of the Traffic Police and little respect for the traffic flow, park their vehicles on roads causing nuisance to the smooth flow of traffic as well as pedestrians', said Sanjay, a shopkeeper. Roads are actually meant for traffic flow and not for parking of vehicles. Since motorists care too hoots for the traffic cops, they park their vehicles in a haphazard manner. What is needed is serious drives to educate the motorists not to park the vehicles in haphazard manner', said another resident. However, this is a stopgap solution and the permanent solution is creating adequate parking spaces, through multi-level parking facilities to decongest the roads.

World Rabies Day is observed in these Islands on 28 September this year. It will mark the 16th World Rabies Day. This year's theme 'Rabies: One Health, Zero Deaths' highlights the deep connection between the environment and the living beings- both people and animals. The COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated that an integrated approach to health and collaboration across sectors can minimize the loss of lives.

Rabies is a zoonotic disease and is almost invariably fatal. The infectious agent is a virus which affects the central nervous system, and the disease is dreadful due to the horrifying nature of symptoms suffered by the patient before death. Humans mostly contract the disease from rabid dogs. Globally an estimated 59,000 human rabies death occur annually in over 150 countries, with 95% of cases occurring in Africa and Asia. India accounts for 59.9% of rabies deaths in Asia and 35% of deaths globally. The spread of the disease can be prevented only through vaccinating dogs and other susceptible pets and zoo

animals. Prophylaxis in humans is the only available immunization.

Rabies control programmes offer a great example for One Health implementation, and the structures and trust that underpin these are crucial for other zoonotic diseases as well, including those that are pandemic-prone.

Andaman and Nicobar Islands are one of the only regions in India which are still free from this disease. We can continue to maintain this exemplary performance in future through strict disease surveillance and the contribution of all the stakeholders. I exhort all of you to be vigilant and create pet awareness among the masses, including the pet owners. I extend my best wishes towards the endeavour.

Example of leadership

Cricketer Ajinkya Rahane, who was leading West Zone during the Duleep Trophy final against South Zone, set a fine benchmark for upholding the spirit of cricket and of sports in general. He also gave a leadership lesson in the process. Rahane sent his teammate Yashasvi Jaiswal off the field for seven overs for incessant sledging – a virtually unheard-of captain's call. Complaining about opposition players' sledging is common. Disciplining a performing player from your own ranks takes guts and a well-honed moral compass. The qualities on display were evident when Rahane led the national team, too. It was under his calm captaincy that India scripted one of the greatest comebacks in a Test series, against Australia in 2020-21.

In recent years cricketers have been pushing the limits of verbal crosstalk. With the advent of high-octane T20 cricket and TV and online streaming becoming an integral part of the commercial side of the game, on-field aggression by players can appear and indeed is entertaining. But there is a fine line between playing hard and being nasty. That line is easily determined by common sense. That common sense is more useful than Law 42 of the laws of cricket that deals with offensive conduct.

Some banter between players adds tadka, as Indians would say, to the game. Sunil Gavaskar once recalled how Pakistan's Javed Miandad kept badgering an Indian bowler for the latter's hotel room number – Miandad said he wanted his next six to land there. In the 1999 World Cup, Aussie skipper Steve Waugh is famously believed to have told South African Herschelle Gibbs, "you just dropped the cup mate," when the latter prematurely celebrated a catch and put it down. All this, and much more, is part of cricket's lore. But knowing the limits is even more important. Jaiswal is a budding talent. Rahane has taught him a lesson that will help him.

FLOUR SHORTAGE DUE TO INDIAN BAN OF WHEAT EXPORTS HITS CHEWY CHAPATI EATING PUNJABIS IN SINGAPORE

India's ban on wheat exports since May has hit Singapore eateries serving soft chewy chapati, mostly for Punjabis, as the cost has gone up by three times on imports of the similar in quality staple north Indian basic food material from other countries amidst the war in Ukraine, according to a media report on Tuesday.

Supermarket chain FairPrice said the supply of wheat flour had been low due to increased demand in the past few weeks, possibly due to the wheat and flour ban from India.

FairPrice's suppliers are sourcing wheat flour from various countries like Sri Lanka, Australia, Canada, and the United States, according to a report by The Straits Times.

"The (wheat) flour shortage will affect our business very badly. We cannot pass all the cost to our customers, we have to try and keep prices low," said Mathavan Adi Balakrishnan, managing director of Sakunthala's, one of the leading eateries in the Little India precinct

here.

The restaurant used to pay SGD 5 (USD 3.48) a kg for wheat flour from India, but the flour from Dubai now costs SGD 15 (USD 10.45) a kg.

Singapore imports between 200,000 and 250,000 tonnes of wheat and 100,000 to 120,000 tonnes of wheat flour annually, according to data from the United

Nations. In 2020, 5.8 per cent of Singapore's total wheat flour imports were from India, The Business Times reported.

The bulk of the city-state wheat flour imports come from Australia, the US, and Canada.

Wheat flour from India, albeit making up only a small proportion of total imports, is sought after by Indian eateries here as it produces soft and

chewy chapati, an Indian staple.

India, the world's second-biggest producer of wheat, stopped exporting the grain and its flour in May in an attempt to put a cap on skyrocketing domestic prices after a heatwave parched crops and affected wheat supply.

The ban came amid Ukraine's wheat exports being curtailed by the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

Ukraine used to be the fourth-biggest supplier of wheat to the world, accounting for about 9 per cent of the global wheat trade.

Some eateries have suspended menu items like chapati, poori bhaji, and tandoori as all of them require wheat flour to make.

"It will be a drastic change, especially for people like Punjabi workers who eat up to six chapatis per meal every day," said S. Mahenthiran, director of Gayatri, a popular restaurant in the Little India precinct of

Singapore. Punjabi workers make up the bulk of Mahenthiran's customers. Stores here that import wheat flour primarily from India are sourcing for alternatives.

Megastore Mustafa Centre in Serangoon Road is looking to import wheat flour from the Middle East and Britain. Its purchasing director, Mohd Saleem, said Mustafa shoppers can expect to pay more for flour due to the increase in freight costs. He did not specify how big an increase consumers can expect.

Owner of Punjabi and Bengal eatery Mustard Singapore, Radhika Abbi, 51, said many Indian eateries here will have to struggle with higher costs once their existing flour stocks from India run out.

She used to pay SGD 2 (USD 1.39) a kg for wheat flour but is now looking at paying close to SGD 8 (USD 5.57).

Abbi said the quality and texture of her eatery's chapati would be affected when it is forced to switch to another source of wheat flour.

RBI SET FOR FOURTH STRAIGHT RATE HIKE TO QUELL INFLATION, SAY EXPERTS

In its first-ever planetary defence test, a NASA spacecraft successfully slammed into an asteroid, a demonstration technique for protecting our planet from an Earth-bound asteroid or comet.

The DART mission, or the Double Asteroid Redirection Test, impacted the asteroid Dimorphos on Monday, 10 months after flying in space.

Asteroid moonlet Dimorphos is a small body just 160 meters in diameter. It orbits a larger 780-meter asteroid called Didymos.

While the asteroid Dimorphos or Didymos were not at risk of colliding with Earth, NASA's demonstration highlights our capability to protect Earth from something like a dangerous hazardous asteroid impact.

"As NASA studies the cosmos and our home planet, we're also working to protect that home, and this international collaboration turned science fiction into science fact, demonstrating one way to protect Earth," NASA Administrator Bill Nelson was quoted in the agency's official press release.

DART's one-way trip confirmed NASA can successfully navigate a spacecraft to intentionally collide with an asteroid to

deflect it, a technique known as kinetic impact, the release added.

The investigation team will now observe Dimorphos using ground-based telescopes to confirm that the DART hit has changed its orbit. The primary purpose of the full-scale test is to measure how much the asteroid was deflected, and researchers expect the impact may have shortened

University Applied Physics Laboratory's Space Exploration Sector in Laurel, Maryland.

An array of telescopes were watching the event both on Earth and in space, including the recently operational James Webb. The mission had piqued the interest of global astronomy, with more than three dozen ground telescopes participating, including optical, radio and radar. "There's a lot of them, and it's incredibly exciting to have lost count," DART mission planetary astronomer Christina Thomas told AFP.

The European Space Agency's era mission will arrive to study Dimorphos in four years. The probe will measure the physical properties of the moon and look at its orbit and the DART impact.

The momentum DART imparted on Dimorphos will depend on whether the asteroid is solid rock, or more like a "rubbish pile" of boulders bound by mutual gravity. But, that property is not yet known. Even if NASA had missed this time, it would have another shot in two years as the DART mission had enough fuel for another pass.

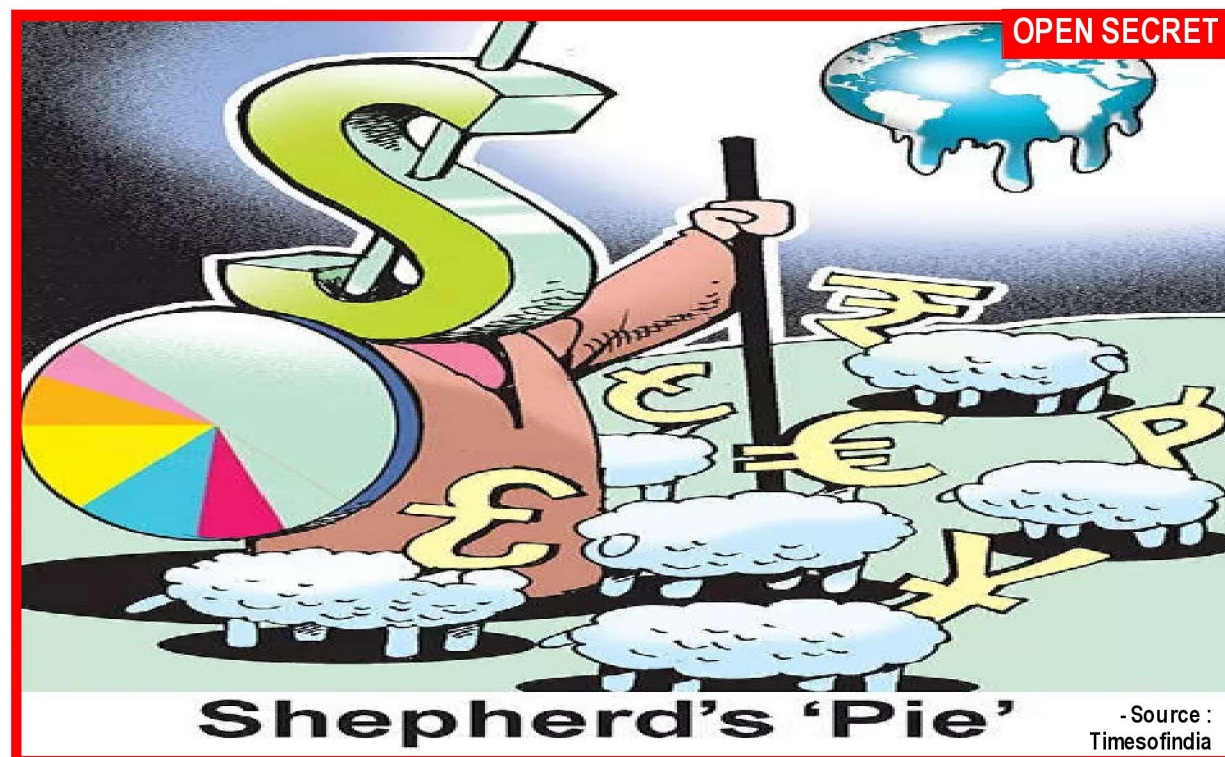

Through the mission, NASA has made a reality of what has before only been attempted in science fiction in movies like 'Armageddon' and 'Don't Look Up.'

"For the first time ever, we will measurably change the orbit of a celestial body in the universe," CNN quoted Robert Braun, head of the Johns Hopkins



Harmanpreet Kaur moves up to fifth in ICC ODI rankings

DUBAI: Riding on her stupendous show against England, India captain Harmanpreet Kaur on Tuesday jumped four spots to reach the fifth spot in the ICC Women's ODI Player Rankings.

She leads a bunch of India players who have made rapid gains in the rankings after the team's 3-0 sweep over England.

Kaur smashed a match-winning 143 not out off 111 deliveries in the second match in Canterbury.

Opener Smriti Mandhana and Deepti Sharma have also moved up in the latest update that considers performances in the last two matches of that series as well as the IWC series between the West Indies and New Zealand. Mandhana, a formerly top-ranked batter who scored 40 and 50 in the two matches, has

moved up one place to take sixth position while Sharma's unbeaten 68 not out in the third match at Lord's has lifted her eight places to 24th position.

Pooja Vastrakar (up four places to 49th) and Harleen Deol (up 46 places to 81st) are other India players to move up the batters' list while new-ball bowler Renuka Singh has galloped 35 places to take 35th position after grabbing four wickets each in the two matches. Fast bowler Jhulan Goswami, a former top-ranked bowler, retired in fifth position.

England's Danny Wyatt, who scored 65 in the second match, has gained two slots to reach 21st position among batters while Amy Jones is up four places to 30th. Charlie Dean has progressed 24 places to get to 62nd among batters and one slot to 19th among bowlers. West Indies



captain Hayley Matthews has grabbed the No. 1 position for all-rounders in the ODI format for the first time in her career after

aggregating 88 runs and grabbing five wickets in a 2-1 series win over New Zealand.

Japan bids adieu to former PM Shinzo Abe in a state funeral

The state funeral for former Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe was held on Tuesday in the presence of 700 delegates from around the world, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi and US Vice President Kamala Harris. The rare event was conducted amid huge protests from the general public who were gathered near the Nippon Budokan Arena.

The state funeral began with Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida receiving Abe's ashes, kept in a ceremonial box, from his widow Akie. The ashes were then handed over to the military officers, who placed them in the centre of the altar.

Dignitaries who flew down to Tokyo to attend the event included Singapore's PM Lee Hsien Loong, Vietnamese President Nguyen Xuan Phuc, South Korean PM Han Duck-soo, Philippines Vice President Sara Duterte-Carpio, Indonesia Vice President Ma'ruf Amin, and European Council President Charles Michel.

Amidst tight security, thousands of mourners gathered around the hall in the Japanese capital. As a tribute to the world leader, videos and pictures featuring key moments of Abe with other global leaders were played at the hall. The tribute mainly focused on his efforts to maintain a good relationship with foreign countries. Shinzo Abe has been considered one of the most important forces behind the "Quad" strategic partnership-- an alliance between India, Japan, the US, and Australia.

Up to 1000 soldiers will perform ceremonial duties and a salute will be offered with military honour guards firing 19 blank rounds from a cannon.

Tight security measures were imposed in the city as the funeral is attended by over 20 heads of the state and



governments.

Abe's is the second state funeral to be held since World War II. Japan scaled down on such events, usually reserved for members of the Imperial family. The first prime minister to get a state funeral was Shigeru Yoshida in 1967.

Japan's royal family is also expected to pay tributes to Abe at the state funeral. However, according to

the media reports, Emperor Naruhito will not be attending the funeral maintaining the line of traditions.

On July 8th, Abe was shot while he was taking part in an election rally in Japan's Nara city. Abe is Japan's longest-serving Prime Minister. He stepped down in 2020 citing health reasons. He was Prime Minister of Japan twice, from 2006-2007 and again in 2012-20.

I want to be in the Indian team, but I am scared too: Heena Sidhu

PUNE: Heena Sidhu has faced many tricky situations in her 16-year-long career, but the dilemma the pistol shooter is facing these days, is beyond complicated. The mother of a 10-month-old girl is back to competitive shooting, and it isn't easy. The World-Cup gold winning pistol shooter has made her way to the shooting team for the National Games to be held in Gujarat and is looking forward to getting back into the national team, but with a little caution.

"I think it is a good feeling to participate in the

National Games. I represented Punjab in the last edition, this time I am going to participate for Maharashtra," Heena says. Heena has been away from shooting for almost three years and got back to the range only in

January this year. "In 2019, I thought of taking a break for a couple of months, but before the break could end, Covid pandemic began and then we decided to have a baby. The break got extended to almost three years," she laughs. After coming back to train, Heena participated in the trials and managed a place in the top-16 shooters for the National Games. However, things are not the same for Heena. "I am working at a basic level right now. Physically, a lot has changed after the delivery. I lost the muscle memory, my body doesn't

listen to me anymore, so there is some frustration. But I am trying to get back to normal, slowly. I am at a stage where I know what mistakes I am making, but I am not able to rectify them," she says.

No matter how difficult physically it is for Heena, her concerns are more mental in nature. It is natural that Heena is training to be in the Indian squad, but she is apprehensive of reaching to the top. "I want to be in the team, but I am scared too. I know that once I come to the team, I will have to be there in the camps, travel without my daughter and that scares me," she says. - Source : Timesofindia
