## Model School student dies at hospital

### K Sadhna was among 23 students who were hospitalized in GP Pant Hospital on Sept 16

Port Blair, Sept 28: The death of 12 years old K Sadhna, D/o Mr. Y Apanna and Bhu Laxmi of Sristy Nagar, Ward No-4 who died at GB Pant Hospital today at 5.00 am

On 28.09.2022. The Class 8<sup>th</sup> student of Govt. Model Sr. Sec. School in GB Pant Hospital today has raised several questions about the theory of panic attack to the 23 students of school on September 16<sup>th</sup> 2022, by the Health department. Sadhna was one among the students who was admitted to GB Pant due to stomach pain and uneasiness. Like all the other 23 students, Sadhna also undergone 24 hours observation and was discharged from the hospital after treatment. 12 days after the incident wherein about 23 students underwent treatment at GB Pant Hospital after complaint of stomach pain and uneasiness, the MS, GB Pant Hospital issued a press note citing that the incident at GMSSS could be due to panic attack. It may be recalled that on 16<sup>th</sup> of this month, several students of Model School were shifted to G. B. Pant Hospital after complaining of stomach pain and uneasiness. According to reports, around 1.30 pm, two girls students of Class-6 Section-B & Class 9<sup>th</sup> Standard complained to the teacher that they were having severe

stomach pain and feeling uneasiness. On this the teacher informed the parents and requested them to come to school to take their ward. Observing the delay in the arrival of parents, the teacher informed the Principal of the Institution and requested to call the Ambulance. By this time another girl of the same class informed the teacher about severe stomach pain. This continued and about 15 to 16 girls of the same class complained of stomach pain and uneasiness. They all were shifted to G. B. Pant Hospital. While the students of Class 6 were shifted to hospital, few students of senior classes complained of stomach pain and uneasiness. They all were shifted to Hospital. As per reports, 24 students were hospitalized at G. B. Pant Hospital. Doctors of the hospital informed that the condition of all the students is normal and they were retained in the hospital for observation. All the students were discharged from the hospital the next day. The death of K Sadhna has exposed the panic attack theory of the Health department

He is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla and Indian Military Academy, Dehradun.

In his letter he mentioned that yesterday members of Tribal Council of Car Nicobar Islands have met him and discussed several problems of the Islands with him. Following issues were taken up by the Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands with the Chief Secretary. 1) New Islanders' Card/Smart Card Issue: The

Member of Parliament pointed out that since a long time new Islanders' Card has not been issued for the people of Car Nicobar Island. In this issue he requested the Chief Secretary to send a team of officials to Car Nicobar for the issuance of New Islanders' Cards /Smart Cards. 2) Aadhaar Update: The Member of Parliament added that a large number of people of Car Nicobar Island are waiting to update several information about their Aadhaar Card for which it is often not possible for all people to come to Port Blair, which is a time consuming and expensive matter. In this matter

he requested to send a team of officials to Car Nicobar Islands for at least two weeks for necessary Aadhaar update works for the Islanders of Car Nicobar Island. 3) Demand for Electricity Site office at Sawai and Big Lapathy areas of Car Nicobar Island: The Member of Parliament mentioned that due to absence of a electricity site office in Sawai and Big Lapathy areas, during any electricity line fault, the residents of the region fail to lodge complaint on time and hence they have to suffer power cut for long hours. ## Rigorous imprisonment for life for gruesome murder of wife

Jimut Bhan Biswas, Additional Sessions Judge, North & Middle Andaman District, Mayabunder has convicted one accused namely Nil Ratan Mridha, R/o Jaipur under PS Billground on 27<sup>th</sup> Sept 2022, for committing gruesome murder of his wife in a daylight and Hon'ble Judge has sent him to judicial custody for

reflection of mind for hearing of quantum of sentence. On 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 2022, after hearing the convict as well as defense and prosecution side on length, Hon'ble Judge has sentenced to undergo rigorous imprisonment for life, which shall mean imprisonment for the reminder of that person's natural life, for the offence punishable under section

302 of Indian Penal Code. On that fateful day on 06/03/2021, at about 10:30 am, in his house accused has committed murder by intentionally causing the death of his wife Late Suchita Mridha by stabbing by means of a sharp cutting weapon (dawa). 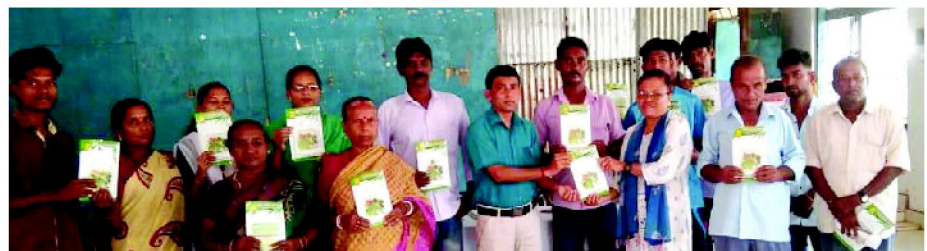

### PFI has been banned

In a late night notification, Union ministry of home affairs has banned the Popular Front of India and a number of affiliates under the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act. MHA has laid out damning charges including encouragement of terror activities, attempts to propagate anti-national sentiments and radicalise a section of society.

In the notification, MHA alluded to PFI links to banned organisations like SIMI, ISI and JMB and pointed out its hand in several targeted killings of political activists, and the chopping of Prof T.J. Joseph's hand in 2010. Interestingly, PFI's political wing SDPI has escaped the ban. It was at a PFI rally in Kerala's Alappuzha in May that violent slogans were raised by a child against two other communities, shocking the southern state into recognising the extent of radicalisation that is happening in the Muslim community.

The bottom line is that religious fundamentalism has not served the cause of any religion. The Sachar committee report makes it clear how the Muslim community is underrepresented in various social and professional spheres in proportion to its population. Working on a constructive socioeconomic agenda that can help the backward section of the community join the mainstream is the need of the hour. Now that the ban has been imposed, police forces across the country have the onerous responsibility to ensure that PFI doesn't morph into another organisation and shifts its activities further underground as happened in the past with other outfits. More importantly, mainstream politics and media must help in improving social cohesion.

### Lt General Anil Chauhan...

He was the Eastern Army Command chief before retiring in May 2021. The coveted post of CDS had been lying vacant since the death of General Bipin Rawat in a helicopter crash in December 2021. The CDS is also the single point of contact for the government for giving military advice and is the senior-most bureaucrat in the defence ministry. General Rawat took charge as India's first CDS on January 1, 2020 with a mandate to bring convergence in the functioning of the Army, the Navy and the Air Force and bolster the

country's overall military prowess. Another key mandate of the CDS was to facilitate the restructuring of the military commands for optimal utilisation of resources by bringing about jointness in operations, including through the establishment of theatre commands.

A high-level committee set up to examine the gaps in the country's security system in the wake of the Kargil war in 1999 had recommended the appointment of the CDS as a single-point military adviser to the defence minister. - Source : Times of India

# TATA MOTORS LOOKS TO ACCELERATE ELECTRIC VEHICLE SALES WITH LAUNCH OF TIAGO EV

Electric vehicle (EV) sales have been gaining traction in India, but the base remains low and still accounts for a small chunk of the overall automobile industry. In the year ending March 2022, for instance, 4.29 lakh EVs were sold in the country—a three-fold increase from 1.35 lakh units sold in the previous year. However, passenger vehicles accounted for just 17,802 units, and were a fraction of the 27.26 lakh PVs that were sold in the same period.

High upfront costs and limited charging infrastructure have been among the two key reasons behind the lower adoption of EVs. While some companies are in a wait and watch mode, a few others have taken the hybrid route to green mobility. Only a few companies currently sell electric cars in the country.

Homegrown Tata Motors is one company that has taken the lead in the passenger EV market. After launching the Nexon EV and the Tigor EV, it is now launching its Tiago hatchback in electric form. Not only will this be the first mainstream electric hatchback in the country, it will also be the most affordable EV in the market.

The Tiago EV has been priced aggressively; it starts at Rs 8.49 lakh ex-showroom, going up to Rs 11.79

lakh. Despite being competitively priced, it is equipped with a lot of features, including connected car tech, hill start and descent, cruise control, push-button start and stop rain sensing wipers and multi-mode regeneration. Considering it is based on the Tiago hatchback, which has a 4-star global NCAP rating, the Tiago EV should also be safe.

The Tiago EV will come with two battery options – a 24 kWh battery pack, which delivers a MIDC (modified Indian driving cycle) range of 315 km and a 19.2 kWh battery pack, with an estimated range of 250 km.

Tata Motors has provided multiple options to charge the Tiago EV. You could either plug in to a 15A plug point, a standard 3.3 kW AC

charger, a 7.2 kW AC home fast charger or DC fast charging.

Charging via a DC fast charger will top up the battery from 10 per cent to 80 per cent in 57 minutes, while you charge the battery fully from 10 per cent to 100 per cent in 3.36 hours via the 7.2 kW AC home fast charger.

While bookings for the Tiago EV begin from October 10, deliveries are scheduled from January 2023.

Tata Motors is already a market leader in India's passenger EV market, with sales of over 45,000 units thus far. Year-to-date its market share is close to 89 per cent. The Tiago EV should give electric car market a further momentum.

"With an aim to make our EVs more accessible, with this launch, we

are entering 80 new cities, expanding our network to more than 165 cities.

We are confident that this move will help more and more customers embrace EVs as their preferred mode for personal mobility," said Shailesh Chandra, managing director, Tata Motors Passenger Vehicles and Tata Passenger Electric Mobility.

By 2026, the company will have a portfolio of 10 EVs.

Tata Motors is also expanding the charging infra. There are already 3,000 plus public charging points. The company has also installed over 200 society chargers in three cities and is looking to expand this to more cities soon and set up more chargers in societies, considering that most people charge their vehicles at their home.

Electric car options in the market are increasing. Recently, Mahindra and Mahindra had unveiled the XUV 400 EV in the country.

Increasing options should help increase customer interest towards EVs. However, consulting firm Arthur D. Little has

flagged import dependence for Li-ion cells for EV batteries as a key challenge for the electric mobility industry in India.

"India's EV dream faces a multitude of challenges, and high import dependence for Li-ion cells is the most significant one. With very limited domestic production of Li-ion cells, Indian OEMs and ultimately customers must pay higher prices, as battery constitutes 40 per cent of the total EV cost. This makes the entire EV industry highly vulnerable to global supply chain disruptions," it said on Wednesday.

Arthur D. Little estimates that by 2030, India will need an estimated \$10 billion plus investment in cell manufacturing, just to serve the local battery demand.

It says a collaborative approach between the government and industry is the way forward for building a local supply chain for batteries and making India an export hub.

"Comprehensive policies from the government that encompass the complete battery value chain – from acquisition of natural resources to recycling of batteries – will go a long way in providing a necessary push to the industry," the consulting firm said. - Source : The Week

He requested the Chief Secretary to initiate the work for the protection of land in Mus Village from erosion. 7) Deplorable Road Conditions: Most of the road stretches of Car Nicobar Island are in bad shape hence the Member of Parliament requested the CS to order repair works of all roads of Car Nicobar Islands for the convenience of the public. 8) Helipad at Kakana Village: There is long pending demand for construction of a Helipad at Kakana Village for the Car Nicobar Island, hence he requested to complete the project for the benefit of the islanders of Car Nicobar Island. 9) Posting sufficient School teachers: Most of the

schools of Car Nicobar lack sufficient numbers of teachers and hence the Member of Parliament requested to post sufficient numbers of school teachers in Car Nicobar Island. 10) Huge shortage of desks and benches in all schools: He pointed out that most of the schools of Car Nicobar do not have sufficient desks and benches and hence he requested the Chief Secretary to supply a sufficient number of desks and benches for all the schools of Car Nicobar Island. 11) Repair of Nursing Home of BJR Hospital: There is a growing demand for repair of the Nursing Home of BJR Hospital of Car Nicobar, hence he requested to intervene in this matter and repair the nursing home. 12) Setting up Blood Bank and starting dialysis at BJR Hospital: He added that the members of Tribal Council of Car Nicobar have demanded for setting up a blood bank at BJR hospital of Car Nicobar similarly they also demanded to start dialysis at Car Nicobar. The Member of Parliament requested to look into these crucial issues. 13) Fight connectivity for Car Nicobar Island: Earlier on two different occasions islanders have seen flights connecting Car Nicobar Island with Port Blair. Hence he requested the CS to restart the flight connectivity between Port Blair and Car Nicobar at least once in a week. 14) Providing Kerosene for outboard engines of fishing boats: Fisheries department has provided outboard engines for fishing boats of Nicobar District, which runs only in Kerosene. As there is a curb in supply of kerosene, fishermen of Car

Nicobar are finding it difficult to get kerosene for their fishing dinghies. Hence he requested the CS to make kerosene available at Car Nicobar through the open market. 15) Sailing of an all-port ship for all major islands of Nicobar District via Hut Bay once every 10 days: The Member of Parliament mentioned that Shipping Services is the lifeline of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, especially for the people of the Southern Group of Islands. Thousands of Nicobari brothers and sisters are living scattered in different islands of Nicobar District, who have a strong link with other but presently due to unavailability of connecting ships, they are forced to come to Port Blair and wait for several weeks to get a ship for any other island of Nicobar District and they have to undergo similar hardship in their return journey. For this journey from one island of Nicobar District including Little Andaman Island of South Andaman District to another island of Nicobar District and vice versa via Port Blair they have to incur heavy expenditure and go through tremendous mental agony. Notably this, such a journey via Port Blair is also very time consuming. He added that all port ships are also required to supply fresh vegetables, fish and meat from Little Andaman to Car Nicobar and other islands of Nicobar District, where a large number of tribal population and government servants and their families reside. The Member of Parliament requested to provide one sailing of an all-port ship for all major islands of Nicobar District via Hut Bay once, in every 10 days.

# YELLEN WARNS INACTION ON CLIMATE COULD CAUSE ECONOMIC CRISIS

Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen warned Tuesday of economic calamity if climate change is not addressed with immediate government intervention.

Joined by local business owners and prominent Democrats in North Carolina, Yellen said the increasing frequency and severity of natural disasters could create devastating short-term supply reductions of everyday goods that could cause prices to skyrocket.

Supply chain disruptions like those experienced on a global scale during the COVID-19 pandemic could soon become commonplace, she said during a visit to Cypress Creek Renewables' solar farm in Chapel Hill.

Here in North Carolina, you remember well the devastating toll of Hurricane Florence. That disaster killed 22 Americans. It led to \$24 billion in damage and left a million North Carolinians without power," Yellen said.

As North Carolina is gearing up for several tight races in November, Yellen pitched the benefits of Democrats' new climate, health and tax law, the so-called Inflation Reduction Act, that will spend \$375 billion over the next decade on climate-related investments.

Combined with last year's bipartisan infrastructure law, the investments total more than \$430 billion. The money will be spent on everything from providing tax credits to purchasers of qualifying electric vehicles to constructing clean-manufacturing facilities.

Yellen said spending will be particularly impactful in non-coastal communities that have suffered from disinvestment.

Some North Carolinians who lost their homes in Florence in 2018 and Hurricane

Matthew in 2016 are still waiting on repairs or permanent housing accommodations, due in large part to supply and labor shortages brought on by the pandemic, according to the state's disaster recovery agency.



Other policies championed by President Joe Biden including the CHIPS Act, which invests \$52 billion in the domestic semiconductor industry have focused on shoring up essential resources to reduce dependency on global manufacturers.

Yellen is the third Cabinet member to visit North Carolina in September alone, following visits from Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Michael Regan in Warren last weekend and Vice President Kamala Harris in Durham on Sept. 1. Yellen's visit is part of a monthlong national tour highlighting new legislation. The Republican National Committee called Yellen's trip to North Carolina ironic,

accusing her of touting so-called solutions to economic problems that she and the Biden administration created, said spokeswoman Taylor Mazock.

Yellen, for her part, said the persistent frequent shocks caused by climate change will put greater strains on the national budget if unaddressed. State and local governments may increasingly be forced to devote scarce resources to disaster mitigation, potentially at the expense of investments in areas like education and worker training," she said.

Six weeks out from the midterm elections, Biden has been showering attention on the Southern swing state, where a tight U.S. Senate race could shift the power balance in the narrowly divided chamber.

The White House hosted more than 50 North Carolina leaders for a forum last week on how Biden's policies could benefit working class communities in the Tar Heel state.

And with abortion access in the spotlight, Democrats are funneling resources into North Carolina's state legislative campaigns to prevent Republicans from gaining the few seats they need to nullify the Democratic governor's veto on more stringent restrictions.

Republican U.S. Sen. Thom Tillis criticized the Biden administration Tuesday for its reckless spending policies that he said have been a disaster for North Carolina families and the economy.

President Biden's answer to all of our problems has been to spend more money we don't have on far-left priorities like green energy welfare, which will only make inflation even worse for North Carolinians, Tillis said. - Source : Theweek



## Inter Milan post 140 million-euro loss in 2021-22 accounts

MILAN: Inter Milan announced on Wednesday that they had posted a loss of 140 million euros (\$133.9 million) for the 2021-22 season, a significant reduction in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The loss, which Inter say in a statement was due to virus restrictions still being in place for the first half of last campaign, was around 105 million euros less than the previous season's

record losses.

Revenue was also up 75 million euros on the previous season to 439.6 million euros.

Inter said if the end of the 2019-20 season (which ran into the following financial year after the pandemic ravaged Europe) is not taken into account the revenue increase stands at 140 million euros. Owner Suning "has already formally expressed his commitment to backing the

group" by covering the losses, Inter said.

"The club's two primary objectives remain steadfast: maintaining the team's competitiveness at the highest level in every competition and strengthening its financial position," said Inter.

On Friday Inter's Serie A rivals Juventus posted record losses of 254.3 million euros, the fifth straight year their accounts



have been in the red. - Source : Timesofindia

## National Games: CWG gold medallist Nayanmoni Saikia stars in Lawn Bowls

AHMEDABAD: Commonwealth Games gold medalist Nayanmoni Saikia of Assam grabbed the spotlight on the opening day of the Lawn Bowls competition in the National Games, comfortably winning two singles matches and one team game on Wednesday.

Saikia started the day with an emphatic 23-0 victory over Gujarat's Vaishali Makvana in a Group A contest and ended it with a 21-10 win over Beena Shah of

West Bengal.

She also joined her Assam teammates to post a 33-3 verdict against Manipur in the Fours competition at the Kenville Golf and Country Club near here.

A member of the Indian Fours team which made history in Birmingham CWG last month, Saikia is delighted that her sport is drawing a lot of attention. "The gold medal provided the impetus for Lawn Bowls. But we have to make sure that our win wasn't a

fluke. We have to keep performing to sustain its popularity," said Nayanmoni, a Deputy Superintendent of Police in Assam, after a highly successful day.

"The National Games are getting bigger and better. Naturally, there will be pressure on

every athlete. But it is up to the senior players to leave a mark and show the way," said the 34-year-old from Golaghat.

Meanwhile, in Bhavnagar, Gujarat men's Netball team made it to the semifinals with a 57-33 victory over Punjab in their last group A contest. Needing a win to avoid a three-way tie with Punjab and Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat stuck to their task and kept themselves well ahead in the match.

Gujarat will meet the winners of Group B while Group A toppers Haryana will play the other semifinal. Telangana and Delhi took the two Group B places in the last-four stage. Telangana and Delhi both finished with two wins and a draw from their three matches each.

At the EKA Transstadia Stadium in Ahmedabad, Delhi and West Bengal became the first men's teams to claim Rugby 7s semi-final berths, both beating Punjab and Odisha in their group

B matches.

Delhi recorded a 26-0 win against Punjab and beat Odisha 14-10 while Bengal posted a 24-7 victory over Odisha and backed it up with a 22-12 win over Punjab.

In other matches, Haryana beat Gujarat 28-0 and Services held Maharashtra 14-14 in men's Group A. Bihar had teasy against the hosts 44-0 while Maharashtra defeated Delhi 19-10 in a tough battle in women's Group A.

West Bengal and Odisha started Group B with victories over Chandigarh 29-5 and Kerala 64-0 in women's Group B.

Shooting competition will begin on Thursday at the Rifle Club with the 25m rapid fire pistol stage 1 event. That is expected to offer a riveting contest among the shooters, as Anish Bhanwala (Haryana), Vijayveer Sidhu (Punjab), 2012 Olympic Games silver medalist Vijay Kumar (Himachal Pradesh) and Gurpreet Singh (Services) are in the fray. - Source : Timesofindia



## Centre bans PFI, affiliates for 5 years, declares them 'unlawful association'

The Centre has declared the Popular Front of India (PFI) and its associates or affiliates and fronts as an 'unlawful association' under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA). A ban has also been imposed on these outfits for five years.

According to a government notification issued Tuesday evening, PFI and its associates or affiliates and fronts have been indulging in unlawful activities that are prejudicial to the integrity, sovereignty and security of the country. It further added that these organisations have the potential to disturb public peace and communal harmony of the country and support militancy, reported ANI News.

This comes as the central agencies undertook the second round of raids on PFI offices across eight states on Tuesday, which saw the arrest of over 240 leaders across the country. The notification added that though the

PFI had been operating openly as a socio-economic, educational and political organisation, it has been pursuing a secret agenda to radicalise a particular section of society, thereby undermining the constitution. Adding that the PFI has links to proscribed organisations like the Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh, the centre's notification said some of PFI's founding members were the leaders of the banned organisation Students Islamic Movement Of India (SIMI). The order said there have been instances where the PFI members were found to have links with terrorist groups. Some of its members have even joined ISIS and participated in terror activities in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan. "The Central Government, having regard to the above circumstances, is of the firm opinion that it is necessary to declare the PFI and its associates or affiliates or fronts as an



unlawful association with immediate effect and accordingly, in the exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to sub-section (3) of section 3 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby directs that this notification shall, subject to any order that may be made under section 4 of the said Act, have effect for a period of five years from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette," the order read. The affiliate organisations of the PFI

include Rehab India Foundation (RIF), Campus Front of India (CFI), All India Imams Council (AIC), National Confederation of Human Rights Organization (NCHRO), National Women's Front, Junior Front, Empower India Foundation and Rehab Foundation. The PFI had earlier alleged in a Facebook post that arrests were a 'witch hunt' and carried out without any incriminating evidence.
