A&N Police adopts zero tolerance towards drug menace
7.246 kgs of Ganja seized and two accused involved in the crime arrested by CCS**Staff Correspondent**

Port Blair, Dec.5

Under the 'Nasha Mukh Bharat' campaign launched by the Central Govt., the A&N Police is working tirelessly to make these Islands a Nasha Mukh place. As part of this effort, the Police from all three Districts of A&N Islands including the CID and Narcotics Cell are making all out effort to eliminate the menace of drugs from Isles. In line with this effort, the Police is continuing its raid and in one such raid conducted on Dec. 4, the team of Police Station CCS have succeeded in arresting two accused involved in the crime and seized 7.246 kgs of Ganja on the spot, informed the DIGP (Intelligence), Shri Sanjay Kumar Tyagi, IPS while interacting with the media persons here today.

Giving details of the seizure of ganja and the subsequent arrest of the accused persons, the DIGP informed that acting on a specific intelligence input received from reliable source, on Dec.4, a Police team of PS CCS conducted raid at Hotel ACC, Mohanpura and seized 7.246 Kgs of Ganja from the possession of Animesh Ezzedder, R/o Nabagram, Kalighat and Bacha Das, R/o Subhash Gram, Diglipur and they were arrested on the spot following due procedure. A special team of police personnel are being deployed to Kolkata to trace



out the source from whom the accused purchased Ganja, the DIGP said adding that Police is also on the hunt to nab the financier who helped the accused.

A case under relevant sections of NDPS Act-1985 has been registered at PS CCS and investigation is in progress. Accused Animesh Ezzedder was also previously arrested in another NDPS case of PS Kalighat for recovery of 4.174 Kgs ganja, the DIGP said adding that the Police is not confining itself in seizure of the narcotics but also moving one step further in tracing the source, backward and forward linkages of the people involved in the drug peddling including the financiers.

The raid took place under the command of Dy.SP (CID) and the overall supervision of Shri Rajeev Ranjan, IPS, SP (CID). The raiding team comprised of Inspector Vishal Ram, SHO PS Central Crime Station, SI Parvash, Head Constable Sanjit Madhu & Sanjay Kujur and Constables N. Thangaraj & K. Rajendran.

The DIGP further

disclosed that in continuation to the arrest made in 32.83 grams of Methamphetamine seized on Nov.29, 2023, one more accused person namely Kuldeep Singh, S/o Late Satpal Singh (27 yrs. R/o Goalghar has been arrested on Dec. 4, 2023 under NDPS Act 1985 after getting sufficient evidence. On interrogation, he revealed that he used to consume drugs as well as sell it at lucrative prices to the youth. The accused has been produced before the Court today (Dec.5) and his Police Custody remand has been obtained for sustained interrogation to unearth the source and further involvement of other persons.

The DIGP requested the general public to report any suspicious activities related to drug trafficking, substance abuse or any illegal activities taking place in their area to the Police immediately on telephone numbers- 112/100, 232586, 233307, 9 4 7 4 2 5 7 2 4 2 & 9531856080. The identity of the informer will be kept secret, he said.
