New Delhi, Dec. 13

The nation paid homage to the martyrs who sacrificed their lives defending Parliament House in the terrorist attack on Dec.13, 2001. Vice-President, Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi and Lok Sabha Speaker, Shri Om Birla led the

nation in paying tributes to the Martyrs who laid down their lives in the terrorist attack. Several Union Ministers, Members of Parliament, former Members of Parliament, family members of the martyrs, and other dignitaries also paid floral tributes on this occasion. Both the Houses of

Parliament today paid rich tributes to the martyrs who laid down their lives in protecting the Parliament House in the 2001 terrorist attack. In the Rajya Sabha, Chairman, Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar said, on this day that the atrocious plan of terrorists to shake the foundation of

democracy and armed attack on Parliament was foiled by brave security personnel. Both the Houses also observed silence in respect of martyrs. When the Lok Sabha met this morning, Speaker, Shri Om

Birla saluted the indomitable courage displayed by the security personnel and others to protect the temple of democracy. He reiterated the nation's commitment to fight against the menace of terrorism.

Taking into account of LPG Consumer's Safety and prevention of any accidents at Marriage Halls/Restaurants/Eateries & other Commercial Establishments, all such business entities

have been advised to take adequate precautions during handling of LPG cylinders including use of standard commercial hose and stove as per ISI standard specification, which would immensely boost in

averting any untoward incidents. As per guidelines, the business entities involved in diversion of domestic LPG cylinders for commercial purpose is a punishable offence. Those indulging in such malpractice,

He has been appointed as one of the coaches for the Indian Chess Team participating in the 25th Asian Youth Chess Championship 2023 at Al-Ain in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) from Dec.12 to 22, 2023. It is his first assignment as a coach for the national team, in which 42 countries will be vying



for the honours.

A meeting was held with the fishermen of Junglighat at Fish Landing Centre in the wake of death of a youth while fishing in sea. In the meeting, the Deputy Commandant, Indian Coast Guard, Shri Shashi Dharan, Inspector, Vikas Singh, Police Marine Force, Shri Tapan Kumar Biswas, Assistant Director of Fisheries, South Andaman, Shri S U Maheshwar Rao, Governing Body Member NFDB and fishermen were present.

During the meeting, the Deputy Commandant explained various measures to be taken up before venturing into sea. He informed the gathering that they have provided all possible assistance through sea and air route to search the missing person whose body was later recovered on Dec.9,



2023 near the shore of Madhuban area. He also advised the fishermen to contact Toll Free No.1554 in case of any distress to get assistance from Indian Coast Guard.

The Inspector, Police Marine Force advised the fishermen to contact Toll Free No. 1093 in case of any distress to get assistance from Police Marine Force. The Assistant Director of Fisheries urged the Registered Fishing Vessel Owners to allow only bonafide fishermen crew members in their vessel for fishing in sea. In the

meeting, it was decided that henceforth, the details of Fishing Vessel and Crew Members including tentative area of fishing operation shall be entered in a Register at Fish Landing Centre before proceeding for any fishing voyage.

The Officials present in the meeting requested the fishermen not to allow any person without possessing a valid fishing document for fishing activity. They also paid homage to the departed soul of the deceased Fishermen, a press release from Fisheries Deptt. said.

To address this issue, some of the key points to be adapted are:

- Keeping operating systems and software applications updated and patched from trusted sources on regular basis. Ensuring latest Operating Systems/Versions/ Software installed which have the latest security features inbuilt.
- Procure and use only genuine and latest software & hardware from trusted sources, to benefit from the latest security & privacy features.
- Using reputable antivirus software and keeping it up to date. Regularly scan your system for malware and ensure that real-time protection is enabled.
- Be cautious, when opening email attachments or downloading files from un-trusted sources. Scan all attachments and downloads with antivirus software before opening them.
- Enabling the built-in firewall in the operating system. Firewalls help block unauthorized access and protect against network-based attacks.
- Be cautious while visiting websites and clicking on links. Avoid suspicious websites and only download files from trusted sources. Consider using a web browser, with built-in security features.
- Be cautious of emails, messages, or pop-ups asking for personal information or urging to click on a link. Avoid providing sensitive information unless being certain of the sender's identity and legitimacy.
- Create strong, unique passwords for your online accounts and change them periodically. Avoid using easily guessable passwords or reusing passwords across multiple accounts and configure a limit for password attempts.
- Regularly backing up important files and data to an external hard drive, cloud storage, or another secure location. In case of a malware attack, restore the system to a clean state.
- Performing regular full system scans with antivirus software to detect and remove any potential threats.
- Stay informed about the latest malware threats and security practices from trusted sources such as CERT-In.

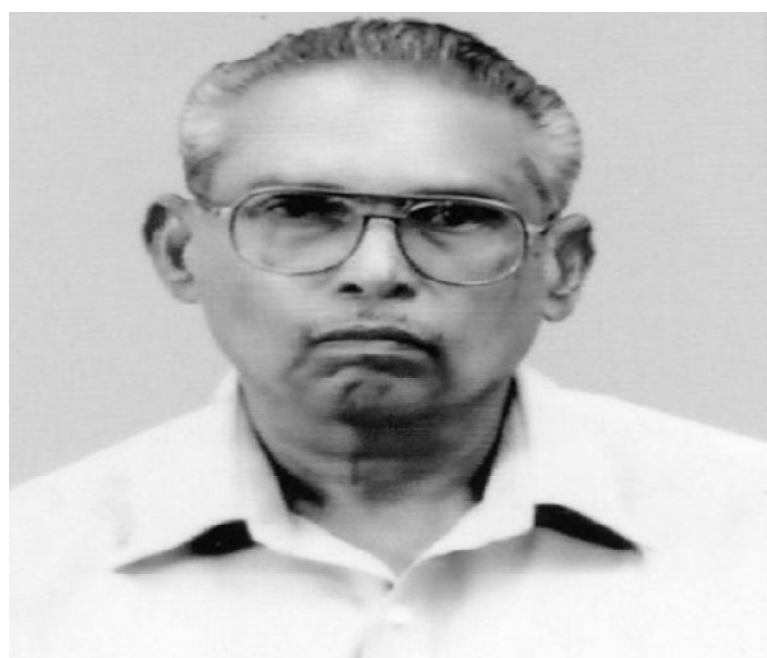
