of Dr. Suprit Kumar, Scientist E, Head, Meteorological Centre, Port Blair. The officials and employees of the Meteorological Center gave detailed information about the operation and use of these equipments to the faculty members and students of Geography Department of JNRM who were present on the occasion. The Met Office Port Blair (i/c), Shri Amrit Tirkey, Scientific Officer Grade-I elaborated on day to day functioning of the Centre and the yearlong events and activities to be conducted as part of the celebration. Retired employees of Meteorological Center of Port Blair were felicitated on the occasion. Earlier, Shri Santosh Kumar, Met Grade-A, Met Office welcomed the gathering.

The Port Blair Meteorological Centre was established in July 2023, though a Weather Observatory existed here since 1868. The



Meteorological Centre, Port Blair Office, situated at Hawa Ghar Junction in the heart of town stands as one of the oldest Central Government Offices in the region. The office is known as 'Observatory' or 'Hawa Ghar' in local language.

the country, the Prime Minister highlighted the Government's approach to distributing more than 80,000 Ayushman Cards within two months. Similarly, the Prime Minister informed that the Government has linked about 30,000 farmers of extremely backward tribal communities to the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi, and bank accounts of 40,000 such beneficiaries have been opened. He further added that more than 30,000 underprivileged people have been given Kisan Credit Cards, and about 11,000 have been given land leases under the Forest Rights Act. He pointed out that it is the progress of just a few weeks and the numbers are increasing every day. The Government is putting all its efforts into ensuring that every scheme of the Government reaches our most backward tribal communities as soon as possible. "I assure you this and this is Modi's guarantee. And you know that Modi's guarantee means the guarantee of fulfillment", he exclaimed.

Talking about providing pucca houses to Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs), the Prime Minister said that money has been transferred directly to the accounts of tribal beneficiaries. They will get 2.5 lakh rupees for a pucca house which will be a source of dignified living with electricity, gas connection, pipe water and toilet. He said that these one lakh beneficiaries are just the beginning and the Government will reach each and every deserving candidate. The Prime Minister assured and asked the beneficiaries to strictly stay away from bribing anyone for these benefits.

Recalling his long association with the tribal communities, the Prime Minister said that he relied on his personal experience in PM JANMAN Maha Abhiyan. Furthermore, he credited President, Smti. Droupadi Murmu for guidance.

"If schemes continued to run on paper, the real beneficiary would never know about the existence of any such scheme", the Prime Minister said pointing out the challenges in availing them. He emphasized that under PM-JANMAN Maha Abhiyan, the government has changed all the rules which created a hindrance and gave the example of PM Gram Sadak Yojana which made roads easily accessible to the villages of backward tribes, change in rules related to mobile medical units, handing out solar power connections to ensure that electricity reaches every tribal household, and ensuring fast internet connection by setting up hundreds of new mobile towers.

For food security, the Prime Minister mentioned free ration scheme which has been extended by 5 years. He also informed about the plan to create 1000 centers where all the facilities like vaccination, training and Anganwadi, for the vulnerable tribal groups, will be provided under one roof. He also mentioned the creation of hostels for the tribal youth. New Van Dhan Kendras are also coming up, he added.

Noting that the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra along with 'Modi Ki Guarantee' vehicles are reaching every village in the country, the Prime Minister said that the vehicle is being run only to connect people with various Government schemes. Speaking about the Aspirational District Program, he said that the members of the tribal community have been the biggest beneficiaries. He mentioned electricity connections, One Nation One Ration Card and the Ayushman Bharat scheme.

The Prime Minister also touched upon the dangers of sickle cell anemia and observed that many generations of tribal society have been affected by this disease. He stated that the Government is trying to eradicate this disease which is passed from one generation to another. "Sickle cell is also being examined during the Vikas Bharat Sankalp Yatra. More than 40 lakh people have been tested for sickle cell in the last 2 months", he informed.

Shri Modi informed that the Government has increased the budget of schemes related to Scheduled Tribes by 5 times. The total budget of the scholarship which was earlier available for the education of tribal children has now been increased by more than two and a half times. Till 10 years ago, the Prime Minister pointed out that only 90 Eklavya Model Schools were built for tribal children in the country, whereas the present Government has started work on building more than 500 new Eklavya Model Schools in the last 10 years. He expressed confidence in tribal students pursuing higher education and working for big companies. "For this, classes in tribal areas are being modernized and centers of higher education are being increased", he added.

The Prime Minister highlighted that before 2014, MSP was fixed only for about 10 forest produce, whereas the present Government has brought about 90 forest produce under the ambit of MSP. "To get higher prices for forest produce, we created Van Dhan Yojana", Shri Modi said highlighting a large number of women among lakhs of beneficiaries. "In the last 10 years, 23 lakh pattas have been issued to tribal families. We are also promoting the Haat Bazaar of the tribal community. Many campaigns are being run so that our tribal brothers can sell the same goods in other markets of the country which they sell in the market", he said.

Concluding the address, the Prime Minister said, "My tribal brothers and sisters may live in remote areas but have amazing foresight. Today the tribal society is seeing and understanding how our Government is working for the tribal culture and their respect." He mentioned the declaration by the Government to celebrate the birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda as Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas and the development of 10 big museums of tribal freedom fighters across the country. PM Modi assured the tribal community of continuously working for their respect and comfort.

Milestones of Excellence: Nicobar District Police's impactful Law Enforcement and Community Engagement in 2023

Car Nicobar, Jan. 15

In the dynamic landscape of law enforcement, the achievements of the Nicobar District Police in 2023 underscore their unwavering dedication to excellence and community well-being. A total of 165 cases, including 11 IPC cases, 24 POCSO cases, 5 IT Act cases, 2 NDPS cases (involving 2.304 KG Methamphetamine & 1.100 KG Cocaine) and 123 Excise cases were meticulously addressed, resulting in an impressive 99% workout rate. Going beyond traditional policing, the Nicobar District Police organized 879 awareness campaigns addressing critical societal issues such as POCSO Act violations, drug addiction, drunken driving, cybercrime, and adherence to traffic rules. During the year, 1055 Summons and 171 Warrants were received from various Courts of A&N Islands in entire Nicobar District. All the Summons and Warrants were successfully executed, achieving a 100% execution rate.

Every Police Station in the Nicobar District took a proactive stance against bootlegging, conducting frequent jungle searches. As a result in 123 cases, a total of 128 Ltrs. IMFL, 3 Ltrs. beer, 307 Ltrs. illicit liquor, Lehan destroyed -4500 lit and 96 Kgs Handia was seized across Nicobar District. The initiatives for traffic safety were robust, with 2130 challans issued, collecting fines amounting to Rs. 11,32,000/-. Additionally, 54 individuals driving under the influence of alcohol were apprehended, reinforcing the commitment to public safety.

A pivotal moment occurred on 14/02/2023 when a timely response from the PS Car Nicobar team saved the life of Timothy, who had jumped into the sea at Malacca jetty.

Further accolade earned when the ‘Shaedi Smarak’ was inaugurated at Car Nicobar by the Director General of Police, A&N Islands. Inauguration of the Repeater Station and Police Assistance Booth at Car Nicobar and MPOC and Transit Accommodation at Campbell Bay ensuring enhanced facilities for community welfare. These achievements collectively embody Nicobar District Police unwavering commitment to public safety and the continuous enhancement of law enforcement capabilities in the region.

During the year, ‘Children Police Dialogue’ was launched at Campbell Bay by A&N Police under the leadership of SDPO, Campbell Bay and guidance of SP Nicobar District for children to visit the Police station, fostering an understanding of Policing work and building trust between Police and younger generation. On the occasion, almost 200 Teachers including School Students, their parents, Local Administrative Officials and PRIs were present.

Another initiative "WE CARE: Bridging Generations" was launched by DGP, A&NI, Shri Devesh Chandra Srivastva, IPS, with an aim to provide support and companionship to senior citizens but also to raise awareness about the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens. This plays a crucial role in safeguarding the rights and well-being of our elderly population. A committed team of Police Officers from Campbell Bay Sub-Division, led by the Station House Officer of PS Campbell Bay embarked on a comprehensive door-to-door survey. This initiative spanned all villages under three Gram Panchayats in the Great Nicobar Islands and the team submitted their survey report. On this occasion Director General of Police,

A&N Islands, Deputy Inspector General of Police (L&O), and Superintendent of Police (Nicobar District) delivered the keynote address.

During the year, police personnel of Police Station Katchal led to the successful apprehension of 10 Myanmarese poachers in the West Bay area of Katchal Island. This significant accomplishment underscores their dedication, hard work, and unwavering commitment to duty. Their relentless pursuit of justice and protection of our natural resources reflect the highest standards of law enforcement and serve as a testament to their exemplary service.

Police team from PS Nancowry in coordination with INS Kardip rescued one person who jumped in sea from MV Nalanda ship. During rescue operation police and PMF staff have shown their extraordinary skill and devotion towards duty and saved a precious life.

During the year, 186 case properties related to various cases registered in Nicobar District were disposed across various Police Stations in Nicobar District.


In addition to commemorating 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav,' all Police Stations organized diverse awareness programs centred around the theme 'Meri Mati Mera Desh, Mati Ko Naman, Veeron Ka Vandana, Rashtriya Ekta Diwas in a befitting manner. These initiatives aimed to enlighten both the general public and students within Nicobar District to foster deeper connection to our land and paying homage to the valorous souls who shaped our nation's history."

During 2023, various vacancies has been published by Andaman and Nicobar Administration under various category and tribal candidate as well local aspirant from other district also appeared for the same. As a matter of concern and being a dedicated law enforcement agency Nicobar District Police under "Udaan Initiative" conducted coaching classes for the aspirants and a total of 80-90 aspirants including tribal youths and local residents were benefitted from the coaching classes.

Adequate arrangements were meticulously put in place to ensure the seamless conclusion of these pivotal events and visits. Additionally, the 7th Edition of the esteemed Dr. B Srikant Memorial Cricket Tournament took place in Car Nicobar. A total of 21 teams enthusiastically participated, and the coveted cup was clinched by A&N Police in a thrilling match witnessed by the Director General of Police, Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Also, Nicobar District Police organised a self defense class with the slogan "Darna Nahi Ladna Hai" for the students. Under this program students of GSSS Malacca, Car Nicobar were demonstrated UAC(Un Armed Combat) through Nukkad Natak and some techniques for self defence were also displayed by the police team.

Further, police personnel of Nicobar District were empowered with knowledge of vital CPR and First Aid training sessions, equipping participants to respond to emergencies like electric shocks, heart attacks, or drowning. Nicobar District Police also celebrated Police Flag Day, Police Commemoration Day, & Rashtriya Ekta Diwas with a dedicated plantation drive and various programs, a press release from SP (Nicobars) said.

ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair registered three animal breeds from A&N Islands

In a significant development for the animal husbandry sector of these Islands, the Andamani Goat, Andamani Pig, and Andamani Duck have been recognised as new breeds in India by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research-National Bureau of Animal Genetic Resources, Karnal, Haryana. Under the 'Mission towards Zero Non-descript Animal Genetic Resources of India', ICAR-CIARI, Port Blair, in collaboration with the Directorate of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services and the A & N Administration, have jointly taken up the initiative for characterising the native animal and poultry genetic resources. The breed characterization was conducted, and a genetic profile was completed, following which an application to register the breeds was submitted. The ICAR-Breed Registration Committee, in its meeting held on December 5, 2023, has approved the registration of Andamani Goat, Andamani Pig, and Andamani Duck as distinct breeds.

Andamani Goats are medium to short in stature, have a compact body, and are mostly black in colour. These goats are mainly distributed in the Andaman group of Islands. Ears are flat and leaf-like, medium-sized, and drooping. Both sexes have small horns, curved upward and backward. The tail is medium in length and curved upward. The body weight at 12 months of age varies from 14 to 19 kg.

Andamani Pigs are distributed on different islands in the Andaman group of Islands. They are sturdy, medium in size, and black (mostly) or brownish in colour. Neck and back portion hairs are very thick



as well as long, whereas hairs on the sides and flank regions are shorter and thinner, respectively. The most commonly observed feature is the slightly downward arch or curvature of the back (low back). They attain a body weight of 60-75 kg for males and 55-65 kg for females at 1 year of age under field conditions. Litter size at farrowing ranges from 6-13.

Andamani Duck is a dual purpose breed, mainly distributed in North and Middle Andaman. They are medium-sized ducks with features such as a comparatively longer neck, a yellowish bill with a black tip, black skin, a white band around the neck, and a shorter shank as compared to other indigenous ducks.

Genetic characterization of these breeds revealed that they are adaptable to the local microenvironment of the Andaman Islands and bear high genetic diversity, indicative of their strong ability to withstand impending climate change scenarios. Therefore, the indigenous breeds are highly recommended for climate-resilient livestock farming in the Andaman Islands, a press release from CIARI said.

Public advisory on infostealers via fake keygens and cracks

Information stealer or infostealer is a malware that is designed to gather information from a system, such as data relating to passwords, browser auto fill information, browser cookies, crypto wallets, and credit cards, which is sent to attackers system. A surge in number of cybercrimes involving infostealers has been noticed. The Infostealer malware is often distributed disguised as cracks and keygens of various unofficially downloaded programs, which are used by cybercriminals to spread malware. Infostealers usually operate as malware-as-a-service (Maas), a business model in which the developers of malicious software lease their malware to others for a fee.

Cybercriminals bundle malware with key generators and software cracks and make it available at various dubious sources, such as freeware download websites, free file hosting websites, peer-to-peer (P2P) networks, etc. In some cases, these tools are proliferated together with chosen software installation setups. Victims download these malicious software cracks and fake keygens to activate licenses for third-party software. Once the infostealer is executed by victims on



their systems, sensitive information saved on the systems is collected and sent to a C2 server controlled by attackers.

Infostealer attacks are typically financially motivated. The stolen data is analyzed, and valuable information is organized into a database, which can then be sold on the dark web or through private social media channels. The information is then used to commit various types of fraud, such as applying for bank loans or credit cards, purchasing items online, or making fraudulent health insurance claims, etc. In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard people against infostealers. Avoid downloading pirated software (and software cracks) from unverified sites and activating the software using any third-party key generators.

Do not trust sources that promise free installation of software with premium features. Download software from official sources only, check legitimacy of the website before downloading. Keep your devices secured using a reputed antivirus and/or anti-malware solutions. Regularly update your browser, operating system, and other applications. Report any such incidents on the cybercrime.gov.in portal and follow @CyberDost on Twitter, YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, Public, Koo and LinkedIn to know more about safety tips.


