## PM to inaugurate New Integrated Terminal Building of Veer Savarkar International Airport today

Inspired from nature, the architectural design resembles a shell shaped structure depicting sea and Islands

Presence of multiple sustainability features to ensure minimal negative impact on the Islands' environment

New Integrated Terminal Building capable of handling about 50 lakh passengers annually & will help boost tourism and economy of the region



New Delhi, July 17 (PIB)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi will inaugurate the New Integrated Terminal Building of Veer Savarkar International Airport, Port Blair tomorrow (July 18) at 10.30 AM via video conferencing. Prime Minister will inaugurate the Terminal in the presence of Union Minister of Civil Aviation and Steel, GoI, Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Union Minister of State for Road Transport and Highways and Civil Aviation, General VK Singh, Lt Governor, A&N Islands and Vice-Chairman, Islands

Development Agency, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) and the Member of Parliament, Shri Kuldeep Rai Sharma at Veer Savarkar International Airport, Port Blair. Enhancing connectivity infrastructure has been a major focus of the Government. The inauguration of the New Integrated Terminal Building, built at a cost of around Rs 710 crore, will play a key role in boosting connectivity of the Island UT. With a total built up area of around 40,800 sqm., the new Terminal Building will be capable of handling about 50 lakh

passengers annually. An Apron suitable for two Boeing-767-400 and two Airbus-321 types of aircraft has also been constructed at Port Blair Airport at a cost of Rs.80 Crore, making the airport now suitable for parking of ten aircrafts at a time.

Inspired from nature, the architectural design of the Airport Terminal resembles a shell shaped structure depicting sea and Islands. The new Airport Terminal Building has a number of sustainability features like Double Insulated Roofing System to reduce heat gain, skylights to provide maximum inlet of

abundant natural sunlight during day time to reduce artificial light usage inside the building, LED lighting, low heat gain glazing. Rainwater catchment in an underground water tank, on-site Sewage Treatment Plant with 100% of treated waste water reused for landscaping and a 500 KW capacity Solar Power Plant are some other features of the Terminal Building ensuring minimal negative impact on the Islands' environment.

As a gateway to the pristine Islands of the Andaman and Nicobar, Port Blair is a popular destination for tourists.

The spacious New Integrated Terminal Building will boost air traffic and help enhance tourism in the region. It will also help create enhanced employment opportunities for the local community and give fillip to the economy of the region.

## Lt. Governor approves enhancement of monthly honorarium of Anganwadi Workers and Helpers engaged in Saksham Anganwadi Services (ICDS)

Port Blair, July 17

In a historic move, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Andaman and Nicobar Islands has approved enhancement of monthly honorarium of Anganwadi Workers (AWWs) from Rs.9000/- to Rs.12000/- per month and from Rs.6000/- to Rs.8000/- per month for Anganwadi Helpers (AWHs) with effect from 01.07.2023. The total enhanced honorarium

will be implemented with an additional outlay of Rs. 11.45 Crore from UT budget.

The Department of Social Welfare, Andaman and Nicobar Administration, is implementing Saksham Anganwadi and POSHAN 2.0 services in the Union Territory. The important services delivered through this scheme are supplementary Nutrition, Pre-School

Education, Immunization, Nutrition & Health Education, Health Check-up and Referral Services along with new components like 'Poshan Bhi Padhai Bhi', 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao', 'Poshan Abhiyaan' and 'Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY)' etc. At present, there are 720 Anganwadi Centres with 11796 children in

the age group of 0-6 years and 2552 pregnant and lactating women availing various Anganwadi services.

The above services are delivered to the beneficiaries by the Anganwadi Workers and Anganwadi Helpers appointed in each Anganwadi Centre. Ministry of Women and Child Development releases monthly honorarium of

Anganwadi Workers and Helpers at Rs.4500/- and Rs.2250/- respectively. However, the UT of ANI has been providing an additional sum of Rs.4500/- per month and Rs.3750/- per month to AWWs and AWHs respectively. Thus, a total of Rs.9000/- was paid as monthly honorarium to AWW and Rs.6000/- to AWH, till date.

Considering the demanding nature of duties of AWWs/AWHs and their prominent role in reducing the malnutrition among children and women, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration recommended for enhancement of UT component of honorarium of Anganwadi Worker and Helpers by Rs. 3000/- and Rs. 2000/- per month respectively. The Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Islands accorded approval for enhancement w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2023.

With this historic step, the UT of Andaman and Nicobar Islands has become one of the highest payers of honorarium to Anganwadi Workers and Helpers in the country, a press release from Director (SW) said.

**Narcotics Cell of CID seizes 3.564 Kgs of Ganja and arrests three persons***Staff Correspondent*

Port Blair, July 17

The A&N Police is committed towards eradicating the menace of 'Drug Abuse' and make Andaman & Nicobar Islands a 'Drug-Free' zone and the Police Department is firmly working to achieve this goal, said, DIGP (Intelligence), A&N Islands, Shri Sanjay Kumar Tyagi, IPS while interacting with the scribes at the Office of the SP, CID here today.

During the press conference, the DIGP said that fight against drugs by the Andaman & Nicobar Police is continuing and one more person was arrested with 3.564 Kgs of Ganja at VSI Airport, who had arrived at Port Blair from Kolkata on 16/07/2023 by flight. Giving details of the arrest of the accused person, the DIGP said, acting on a specific intelligence input, Police Team from Narcotics Cell, CID Unit Narcotics intercepted one person namely D. Prem Kumar (25) yrs, S/o Shri. D. Bogeshwar Rao, former Cargo Staff at Go Air, R/o Brookshabad near Kamaraj Senior Secondary School at VSI Airport. He had arrived at Port Blair from Kolkata on July 16, 2023 by flight and on checking a total of 3.564 Kgs of Ganja, which was clandestinely concealed in his bag, was seized and he was arrested on the spot observing all codal formalities. The team who had shown sheer professionalism which resulted in the arrest of



the accused consisted of SI Mohd. Rahil Islam, ASI Sanjay Yadav, Constable Ratan Das, Nandita Mistry, Vishal Kumar and M. Raja Rao under the supervision of Shri Vinay Mathur, DANIPS, Dy.SP.

The DIGP further stated that a case under relevant sections of NDPS Act-1985 has been registered at PS CCS. He said, during the course of interrogation, the arrested accused person disclosed that he went to Kolkata on 14/07/2023 with one lady namely Dhanalakshmi and brought the ganja purchased by her from Kolkata with him. The lady L. Dhanalakshmi (21) yrs, D/o Shri Tata Rao, R/o Brookshabad, Port Blair, being the mastermind in the case, was also arrested. On interrogation, she confessed her crime and told that she had purchased ganja worth Rs 50,000/- from Kolkata for one Abdul Mazid, R/o Anarkali who financed her in lieu of sharing the profit. Upon her revelation, Abdul Mazid (28) yrs, S/o Shri Abdul Rasid, R/o Anarkali has also been arrested for providing financial aid in the commission of this crime.

The investigation of this case is in progress, the DIGP added.

Answering queries from the scribes, the DIGP stated that authorities at Kolkata and Chennai Airport have been requested to take up intensive checking of the flight passengers bound to Port Blair. He said that police will make all out effort to eliminate sale of narcotics/drugs from these Islands and sought the help of the general public to weed out the menace from the society. He also introduced police team from 'Narcotics Cell' to the media and appreciated their effort in arresting the accused. Shri Vinay Mathur, Dy.SP (Narcotics) and Shri Kumar Abhishek, DySP (CID) were also present during the press conference.

The general public have been requested to inform about any credible information pertaining to sale or possession of contrabands or any other illegal activity on the telephone Numbers-100/112, 232586, 9531856080, 9474290250, and 9434299028. The identity of the informer will be kept secret and he/she shall be suitably rewarded.

**Turning Garbage Vulnerable Points (GVPs) into Greenery  
PBMC converts 71 GVPs into Green Zones in different Wards**

Port Blair, July 17

The Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) is converting Garbage Vulnerable Points (GVPs) into Green Zones with its unique initiative of 'Sanitation Awareness Drive' with appeal to the residents to keep the city clean. Within a week of the launch of the drive in 24 wards, the civic body's officials and staff have already made 71 GVPs, or places where waste is generally thrown, clean spaces by planting saplings and placing benches by using the discarded items like rubber tubes, tires, tins and other plastic materials.



While PBMC has turned Port Blair city in a bin less city, but PBMC has spotted many GVPs which have turned into makeshift trash bins. Apart from household, kitchen and garden waste, construction debris, broken furniture and furnishings are being unceremoniously dumped at these spots. The awareness drive was launched on 10<sup>th</sup> July, 2023 and it would continue till July end.



There are around 76 GVPs that have been identified in 24 Wards of Port Blair City and 71 GVPs are free from waste and the remaining 05 GVPs will also be converted into green zone by this week. PBMC is not only discouraging people from throwing garbage in the open but also set the target to achieve 100% door-to-door garbage collection and ensure source separation of waste.

The PBMC's initiative is to beautify the habitual garbage dumping places and make green zones where people can hang out. In the first phase, all identified GVPs are being converted into green space. For this, waste and old things are being used under 3Rs - Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. Plantation is also being done by PBMC Sanitary & Work Division to maintain the greenery.

PBMC is also appealing to the residents of the city to cooperate in making the city clean and beautiful. Also, we are



encouraging people to segregate solid and wet waste and to download the 'Swachhta App' for registering any complaint and suggestion for improvement in cleanliness of the city, a press release from PBMC said.

Shri Jaishankar said about BIMSTEC that our common objective is to enhance growth and promote prosperity. He also added that members agreed to meet more frequently to take

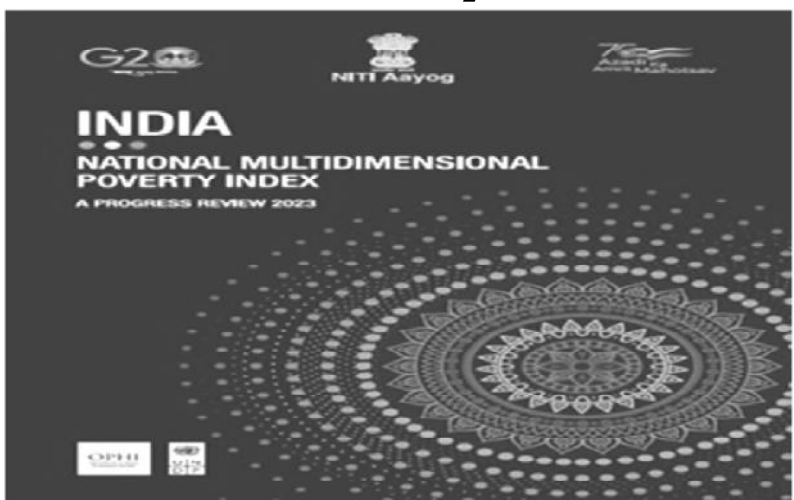

## Niti Aayog launches National Multidimensional Poverty Index

New Delhi, July 17

The number of persons living in multidimensional poverty in the country has fallen from 24.85 percent to 14.96 percent between 2015-16 and 2019-21. This was unveiled in the National Multidimensional Poverty Index released by the NITI Aayog today. Briefing media in New Delhi, NITI Aayog CEO, Shri B.V.R. Subrahmanyam said, 13.5 crores people have escaped from multidimensional poverty in five years. He said, India is on course to achieve Sustainable Development Goals target much ahead of schedule by 2030. He also said, the report shows that poverty in rural areas has declined sharply from 32.59 percent to 19.28 percent during the period.

Uttar Pradesh has registered the highest decline in the number of poor with 3.43 crore people followed by Bihar and Madhya Pradesh. Providing



multidimensional poverty estimates for the 36 States and Union Territories and 707 Administrative Districts, the report states that the fastest reduction in the proportion of multidimensional poor was observed in Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, and Rajasthan. The report says that improvement in nutrition, years of schooling, sanitation, and

cooking fuel have played a significant role in bringing down poverty. The National Multidimensional Poverty Index is a holistic measure defining poverty based on health, education, and living standards and estimates poverty at National, State, and District levels, shaping reform plans for States and UTs. ## India to witness 10 fold increase in startups and unicorns in next 4-5 years: Union Minister

Hyderabad, July 17

Union Minister of State for Electronics and IT, Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar has said that India will witness 10 fold increase in startups and unicorns in next four to five years. He hailed the country's remarkable progress in building unicorns and startups. He was speaking at the 6<sup>th</sup> Foundation Day and Investors/Startup Conclave in Hyderabad yesterday. Shri Chandrasekhar said from 108 unicorns, he is sure that India will reach 10,000 in the next 4-5 years. He said, today India has over a lakh startups and it will increase by 10 times in next few years. Shri Chandrasekhar highlighted their successful forays into emerging technology fields like AI, Web 3, and deep tech. He said, the Government's efforts to promote entrepreneurship and



innovation, coupled with the growing availability of funding and support for startups, will contribute to this exponential growth.

The Minister said, in 2014, India's tech landscape was limited to information technology and Information Technology enabled Services. However, since then, opportunities have emerged across various domains such as

deep tech, AI, data economy, semiconductor design, microelectronics, and high-performance computing.

The Minister also interacted with industry leaders and aspiring young entrepreneurs and lauded the collaborative efforts between the industry and the Government to enhance skill development. (Source: india.gov.in)

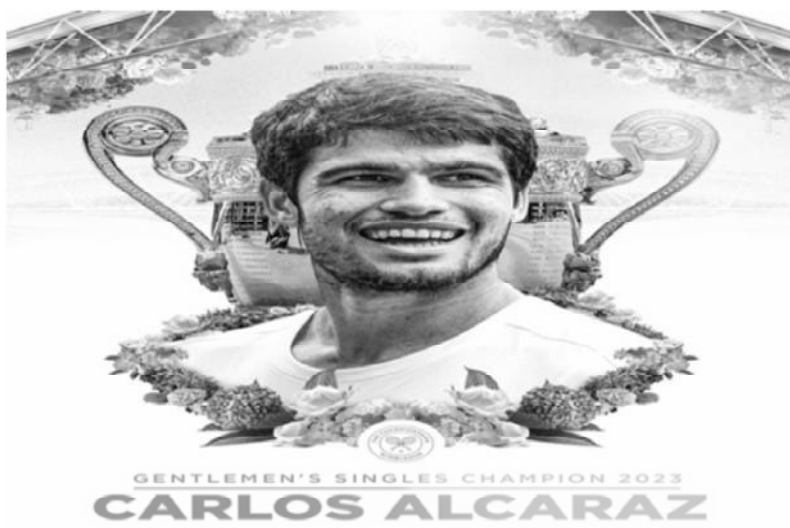
Chana is the most abundantly produced pulse in India and consumed in several forms all over the India. Chana whole is soaked and boiled to make salad and roasted chana is served as

## Carlos Alcaraz ends Novak Djokovic's long reign to win maiden Wimbledon title

London, July 17

In Wimbledon Tennis, World number one Carlos Alcaraz ended Novak Djokovic's long reign at the All England Club to win his first Wimbledon 2023 title and his second Grand Slam title with a 1-6, 7-6(6), 6-1, 3-6, 6-4 victory in the final at the Centre Court in London last night. The twenty-year-old Spaniard beat the seven-time champion to become the youngest man to lift the Challenge Cup since 18-year-old Boris Becker won the second of his three Wimbledon titles in 1986. The Spanish sensation won his second major title, having triumphed at the 2022 US Open. Djokovic lauded his opponent, Carols Alcaraz and his team, and



said that he 'lost to a better player' after missing out on his eighth Wimbledon title. While addressing his loss, Djokovic

said that he would still be 'grateful' even though he doesn't like to lose such important matches.



# India's Infrastructure Revolution

## Paving the way for Economic Growth

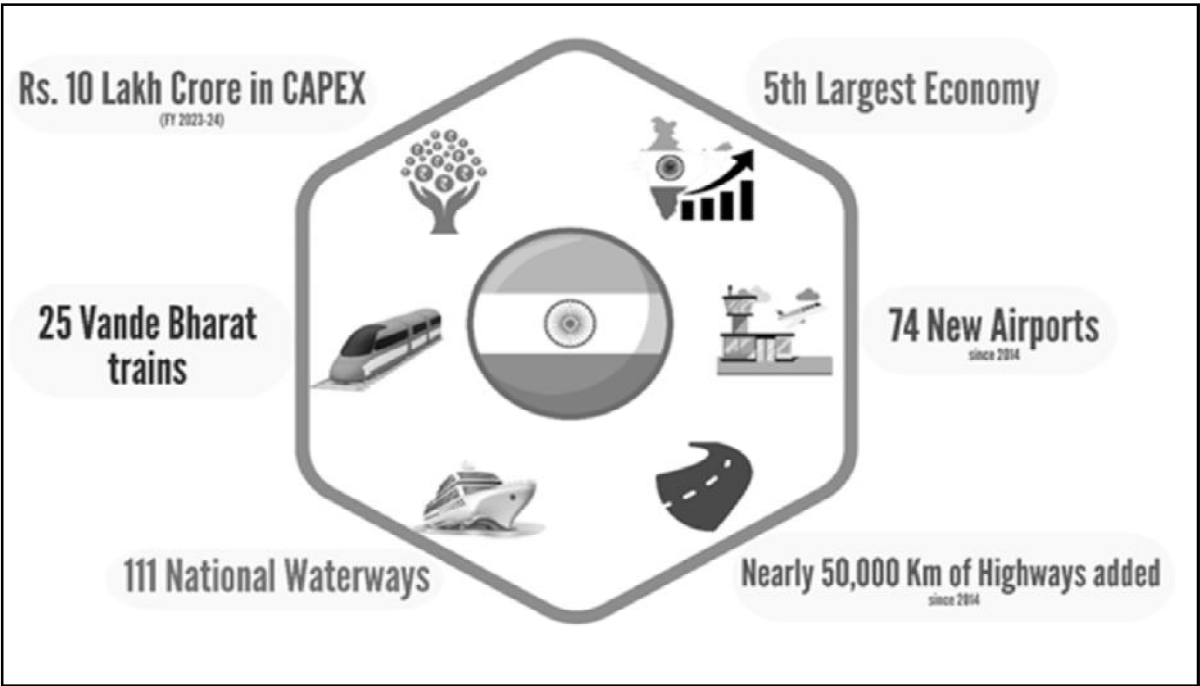
India is experiencing a blitzkrieg upgrade in its infrastructure, driven by increased Government investment and development initiatives. There are significant advancements in India's transportation networks, including roads, railways, aviation, and waterways, and their impact on the country's economic growth. These infrastructure developments aim to enhance connectivity, reduce logistics costs, and position India as a global economic powerhouse. Fuelled by the ambitious PM GatiShakti National Masterplan for multi-modal infrastructure development, the new roads and railways will help India fulfil its ambition to turn into a \$5 trillion economy-up from \$3.74 trillion currently (IMF, 2023).

### Revitalizing Road Networks

India boasts of the world's second-largest road network, with over 6.37 million kilometres. In recent years, there has been a substantial increase in the pace of construction of national highways, from an average of 12 kilometres per day in 2014-15 to around 29 kilometres per day in 2021-22. The total length of highways has expanded from 97,830 kilometres in 2014 to 145,155 kilometres today. Moreover, in the last nine years, more than 3.5 lakh kilometres of rural roads have been constructed under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana giving all-weather roads connectivity to villages of India. The Government's budget support for road infrastructure has rapidly increased, reaching approximately Rs.1.4 lakh crore in FY22-23. Completion of strategic projects like the Atal Tunnel, the Dholu-Sadiya Bridge, and the Chenab River Bridge, some of which had been pending for years, on a war footing is a testament to the Government's inclusive governance and its commitment to connectivity even in the remotest and difficult terrains of the country.

### Revolutionizing Railways

India's railways have undergone substantial modernization and expansion. Capital expenditure on railway infrastructure has steadily increased over the past four years, with a budget of Rs.2.5 lakh crore allocated in FY22-23, representing a 29% rise compared to the previous year. Electrification of railway tracks has witnessed significant progress, reaching 37,011 route kilometres in the last nine years. Further, on 4 March 2022, the successful trial of KAVACH, a state-of-the-art electronic system designed to help the Indian Railways



achieve Zero Accidents was conducted. The introduction of the indigenously designed Vande Bharat Express, which are already functional in 25 routes, and its subsequent expansion showcases India's commitment to high-speed rail travel. The ongoing construction of a high-speed line between Mumbai and Ahmedabad, with Japanese collaboration, and the development of new freight corridors will further boost connectivity, reduce travel time, and facilitate the efficient movement of goods and passengers.

### Aviation Sector's UDAN

India's aviation sector has experienced substantial growth, positioning the country as the world's third-largest market. To promote regional connectivity and revive unserved or underserved airports, the government has allocated a budget of Rs.4,500 crores under the Ude Desh ka Aam Nagarik (UDAN) scheme. The number of airports with civilian flights has doubled in the last nine years, from 74 in 2014 to 148 in 2023. Additionally, the government has also accorded 'in-principle' approval for setting up 21 greenfield airports across the country. Further, the upcoming greenfield Noida International Airport will

also be the country's largest centre for aircraft maintenance, repair and operation (MRO), bolstering the aviation sector and generating employment opportunities.

### Harnessing Waterways

India recognizes the immense potential of its waterways in establishing a sustainable logistics sector. The government's focus on inland water transport has led to the declaration of 111 National Waterways. The cargo movement on these waterways reached a record high of 108.8 million tons in FY22, reflecting a growth of 30.1% compared to the previous year. The Inland Vessels Bill 2021 further facilitates the growth of inland water transport, creating a robust multi-modal transport ecosystem and fostering ease of doing business. Additionally, the Sagarmala Project aims to develop ports, streamline compliances, and reduce vessel turnaround time.

### Economic Implications and the Future

Transport infrastructure development reduces transport costs, increases gains from trade, and drives up wages, thus boosting economic activity. The development of infrastructure has helped move

workers from agriculture to more productive jobs. Making this transition possible and feasible, also inspired improvements in educational attainment in villages.

India will be integrated into a high-quality transport network, powered by greenfield expressways, electrified railways, revamped airports, and an EV ecosystem. The transformative power of new infrastructure is a precondition for the high growth that India aspires to achieve. It is a rising tide that will lift all the sections of India.

According to a recent report by American Investment Bank Morgan Stanley, India has transformed itself in less than a decade due to key policy choices like supply-side reforms, formalization of the economy, real estate regulation, digitizing social transfers, insolvency and bankruptcy reforms, flexible inflation targeting, focus on FDI, reforms in equity markets and Government support for corporate profits among other measures.

The report suggests that in the coming decade, there is going to be a steady increase in many macroeconomic indicators of the Indian economy. India's manufacturing capacity is expected to reach USD 1500 billion by 2032 as compared to USD 447 Billion in 2022; export market share to more than double to 4.5% by 2031 as compared to 2.2% in 2021; and India's per capita income is expected to more than double from USD 2,200 currently to about USD 5,200 by 2032. The report concludes that India will emerge as a key driver of global growth with New India driving a fifth of the global growth through the end of the decade.

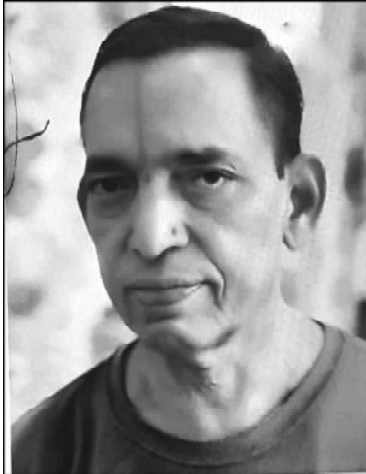

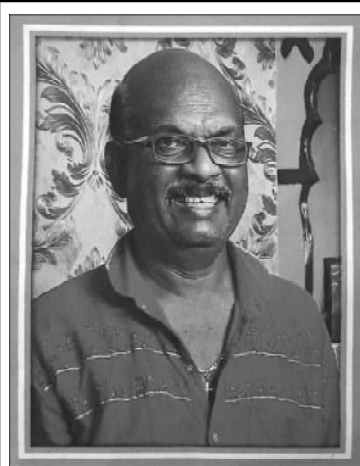

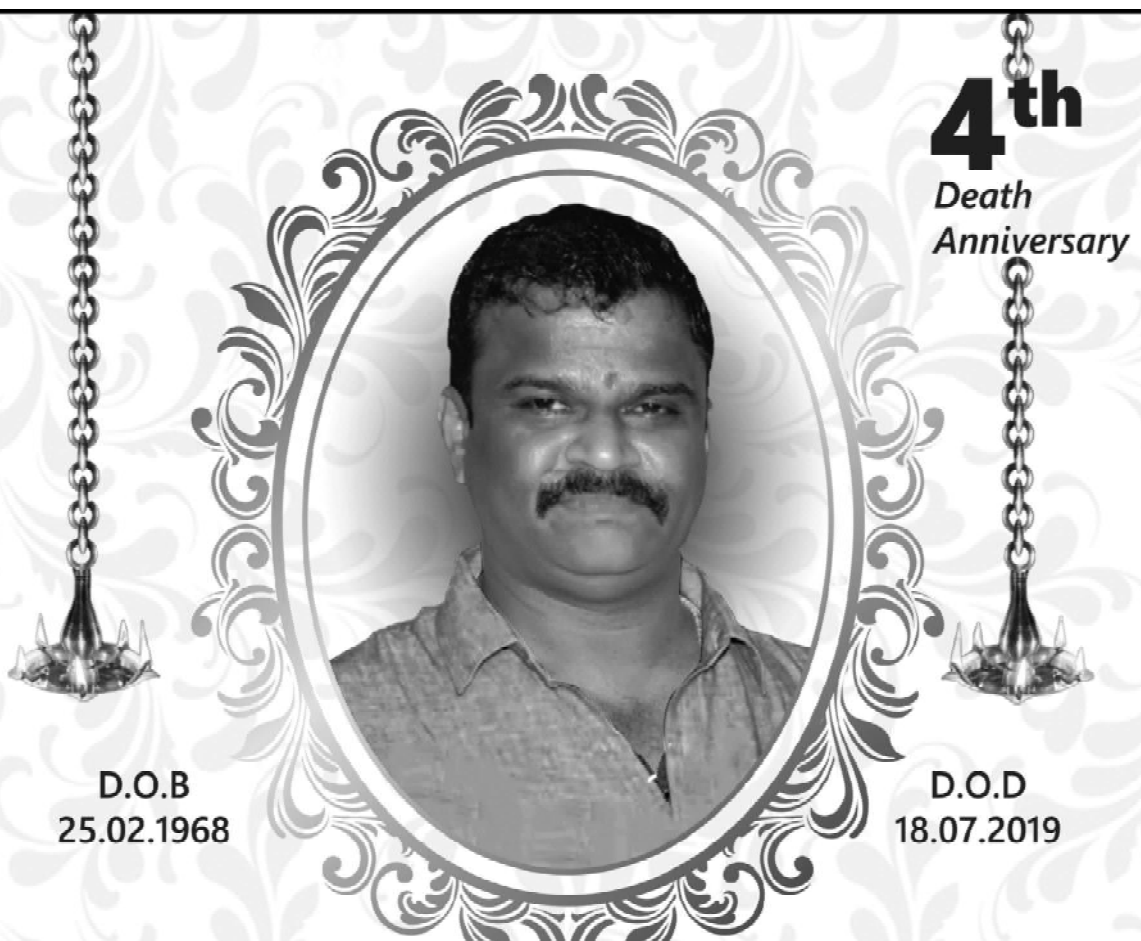
