Vice-President addresses Silver Jubilee Celebrations of Kerala Legislative Assembly building

Authorities in Constitutional positions must exemplify their conduct by high standards of propriety, dignity and decorum: VP

Thiruvananthapuram, May 22 (PIB)

The Vice-President of India, Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar today stressed that disruption and disturbance in the temples of democracy cannot be weaponised as political strategy and appealed to Legislators and Presiding Officers to urgently address this malaise. Addressing the silver jubilee celebrations of Kerala Legislative Assembly building-Niyamasabha- in Thiruvananthapuram today, the Vice-President said that authorities in constitutional positions must exemplify their conduct by high standards of propriety, dignity and decorum.

Shri Dhankhar asked the legislatures to draw inspiration from the Constituent Assembly which dealt with many complex



issues without any disruptions, and called for stamping out the "worrisome trend of intolerance towards the other productive legislature functioning is the safest guarantee to blossoming and preserving democratic values and holding accountable. He also

democracy not all issues can be evaluated via partisan prism, the Vice-President urged everyone to rise above partisan stance, giving primacy to national interest. He also raised the question as to why "the wit, humour, and sarcasm-once hallmark of exchanges between stalwarts in the Parliament and Legislatures" are disappearing from public discourse, urging legislators to revive the same.

The Vice-President noted that the Constitution provides the privilege of freedom of speech within the precincts of the House, however he cautioned that this freedom should be utilized for a healthy debate to sustain a vibrant democratic tradition, and not for disruptive purposes. Interview of Secretary (Shipping/PMB) broadcast through Akashvani Port Blair

Secretary outlines the ongoing development projects and future plans to strengthen shipping fleet & port infrastructure in Isles

Port Blair, May 22

The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Keshav Chandra, IAS has directed all Secretaries of the Departments concerned to give interviews in Akashvani Port Blair and Doordarshan (DD) and highlight the initiatives taken by the Departments involved in public delivery services to improve public delivery system, social infrastructure and social benefit schemes. As per the roster, the interview of Secretary (Shipping/PMB), Shri Kishore Kshirsagar Lakshman, IAS was broadcast today through Akashvani Port Blair and the same is being reproduced in Q&A format for the wider reach of the people of A&N Islands.

Interviewer: Kindly brief about the activities of the Port Management Board (PMB) in A&N Islands?

Secretary (Shipping): The role played by the Port Management Board (PMB) in Shipping Sector is similar to that of the Airport Authority of India for flights. PMB provides facilities such as Passenger Terminals at Ports, creation of proper passages for entry and exit of passengers besides other amenities for the convenience of passengers. Apart from this, construction of new Jetties/Wharfs, creation of breakwaters and Harbour protection works are also carried out by the PMB.

Interviewer: Shipping Services are considered as the lifeline of these Islands. What is being done to strengthen this sector?

Secretary (Shipping): Shipping is the lifeline for the people of A&N Islands and to strengthen the shipping services in A&N Islands, the shipping fleet is being augmented. As part of the augmentation plan, two vessels Sindhu & Nalanda have been inducted into the shipping fleet. The induction of these two new ships have received good response from the people of the Islands who are eager to travel in these State-of-the-Art modern ships. Apart from this, efforts are on to replace the old Harbour ferries and vehicle ferries. Steps have also been initiated to replace the Inter-Island old vessels such as MV Dering and MV Sentinel. Further, 65 percent of the work has been completed for the 1200 pax capacity vessels namely MV Ashoka and MV Atal. Further, the Administration is proceeding to charter vessels, so that the requirements of the public can be met and the process has been initiated.

Interviewer: What is the current strength of the passenger ship fleet?

Secretary (Shipping): The existing strength of Passenger Shipping Fleet in the Islands comprises of 11 Vehicle Ferries, 11 Passenger Ferries, Small Motor Launch (passenger ferry), 8 Inter-Island Vessels, and one Mainland Vessel. However, the services of vessels Sindhu and Nalanda are also being used for mainland trips on as and when required basis.

Interviewer: Apart from MV Ashoka & MV Atal, how many vessels are likely to be inducted into the fleet in the coming years?

Secretary (Shipping): Tender has been floated for two new High-Speed Response Vehicles and it is likely to be inducted into the shipping fleet of A&N Islands soon. Apart from this, 6 Harbour Ferry Vessels, 4 Vehicle Ferries, 6 Small Harbor Ferries (100 Pax

capacity), 5 small Vehicle Ferries, 3 Inter-Island Vessels (300 pax capacity ships capable of berthing in low draft areas like Car Nicobar and Diglipur) have also been planned. Ship acquisition takes time and these ships can be chartered.

Interviewer: What are the plans to make traveling to the Southern group of Islands a better experience?

Secretary (Shipping): The A & N Administration will soon promulgate a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) which guarantees that one ship in a week will sail from Port Blair via Nancowry and Campbell Bay Ports and return. Similarly, another vessel will sail for Car Nicobar in every week covering Nancowry and other small Islands, Katchal, Chowra, Terrasa (all port touch) in Southern group of Islands and return. Apart from this, two Harbour ferries are presently serving at Nancowry besides two foreshore sector vessels (speed boats) have also been made available, one each at Nancowry and Campbell Bay. These speed boats bring the passengers to Nancowry from low draft jetties/ areas so that these passengers can avail the services of the bigger vessels such as Sindhu & Nalanda by reaching Nancowry Port. Katchal Islands will also be covered every week through the vessels scheduled to call all ports. Apart from this, speed boats will also provide services, so that the people of Katchal can avail the services of speed boats to transfer goods and to visit Nancowry for any work.

Interviewer: How many Cargo Vessels are there in the A&N Shipping fleet? Is there any proposal to further strengthen this fleet?

Secretary (Shipping): MV Chuglam & MV Badam are the two Cargo Ships in the A&N Shipping fleet. Apart from this, all the passenger vessels have cargo handling capacity. Vessels Sindhu & Nalanda are also having 150-ton cargo handling capacity.

Interviewer: How many vehicle ferries are in service at Middle Strait? Is there any proposal to induct more vessels?

Secretary (Shipping): Two vehicle ferries are deployed at Middle Strait. Under the expansion plan of the shipping fleet, one more vehicle ferry will be deployed till the construction work of the bridge is completed. Due to the narrowness of the creek and some navigational issues, the services of more than 3 vehicles at Middle Strait are not feasible.

Paid customized training program can be organized by CIARI in participatory mode for the benefit of the people. Later, he delivered a special talk to mark the International Biodiversity Day on the topic 'Role of Agro eco-tourism in conserving the Island ecosystem'. During the technical session, Dr. S. Interview of Secretary (Shipping/PMB) broadcast...*(Contd. from page 1)***pertaining to old redundant vessels occupying the port?**

Secretary (Shipping): The Administration conducted a detailed survey to ascertain the ownership of the unused ships at Jetties. The Ships of the Administration is condemned and written off regularly. Many ships are of private owners and they have left the ships due to reasons such as pending charges, abandonment, technical issues, beyond repair due to water ingress, etc. To sort out this issue, the PMB has signed an MoU with a PSU named MSTC and a detailed survey was also conducted. Claims and objections have also been sought through publication in newspapers and some claims and objections were also received which are being disposed of. After that, these abandoned vessels will be auctioned through MSTC and the Administration will be able to remove the clutters from Phoenix Bay and Junglighat Jetties.

Interviewer: What is being done to improve Port facilities?

Secretary (Shipping): A&N Administration is committed towards providing modern facilities to passengers in Ports. Altogether 215 trollies have been made available at Haddo Wharf, 167 at Phoenix Bay, 69 at Swaraj Dweep, 40 at Campbell Bay, 72 at Shaheed Dweep, and 20 at Mayabunder. Due to uneven surfaces at jetties unlike tiled surfaces at Airports, there may be some issues with trollies which are replaced from time to time. Recently, Haddo Passenger Terminal has been renovated. Renovation of Passenger Jetties at Aerial Bay (with air-conditioning) & Bambooflat have also been taken up. Similarly, the Air-conditioning of Haddo Wharf and Phoenix Bay Harbour Complex have also been taken up. Apart from this, e-ticketing facilities have also started and it has provided a great relief to the commuters. The Administration is focusing more on providing all modern facilities for the passengers to minimize their hardships at Ports while traveling by ship.

Interviewer: What is being done to strengthen the foreshore sector?

Secretary (Shipping): Foreshore Sector is a very critical sector due to the increased movement of commuters when compared to the Harbour sector. In the foreshore sector, areas such as Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep, Long Island and Rangat upto Diglipur are covered through speed boats. Our main focus is to increase the availability of the vessels for which the Administration has signed an agreement named CANSRU with Cochin Shipyard Limited for 30 years. As per this agreement, the repair work of the vessels has been entrusted to CSL which is a professional shipyard having shipyard in different places and they are capable of manufacturing top-of-the-range ships. CSL is repairing our ships at present due to which the ship availability has increased and Administration will be in a position to increase the frequency of vessels. The CSL has also been asked to provide more passengers amenities in ships when they are docked at Cochin Shipyard for refitting.

Interviewer: Tell us about the status of Tug boat?

Secretary (Shipping): The Administration is having two tugs, of which, one is being used in Harbour Sector and the second is under repair. Recently, the PMB has got approval from the Administration for chartering a Tug Boat, the tendering for which will be done immediately, so that its availability will pave the way for the berthing of Ships like Sindhu & Nalanda at Car Nicobar. Due to low draft, the services of Sindhu & Nalanda are not possible for Diglipur. For this, the Administration through its ship acquisition plan will charter 300 pax capacity vessels which will also cover Car Nicobar and Diglipur.

Interviewer: Is there any proposal to provide direct sailing to Long Island regularly as NITI Ayog plans to develop Lalaji Bay beach as an upcoming tourist destination?

Secretary (Shipping): There is an immense potential for tourism activities at Long Island. The Line Services for Long Island which was withdrawn during Covid have been re-started and regular boat services have resumed, connecting Swaraj Dweep and Shaheed Dweep. Keeping in view, the tourism prospects, the Long Island Jetty has already been extended. A further extension of 150 mtrs x 20 mtrs with required Navigational Aids, the process for which has already been started by the Shipping Ministry under the Sagarmala Scheme. Direct shipping service from Port Blair to Long Island will also start, once the Shipping fleet is augmented.

Interviewer: What are the steps taken to further augment the services in Ports?

Secretary (Shipping): The focus is on providing State of the Art facilities in the existing passenger terminals. A separate approach is also being developed up to Jetty at Swaraj Dweep which will exclusively benefit the passenger movement and cargo movement will be separate. The construction of Sea Port Terminal at Swaraj Dweep is also progressing well and by next year, this project will be completed. Many Jetties are also being extended viz. Campbell Bay, Long Island and after extension, bigger vessels can be berthed enabling increased passenger and cargo movement.

Interviewer: What are the facilities available in Marine Dockyard? What is being done to improve it?

Secretary (Shipping): Small Vessels are being repaired at Marine Dockyards where slipways are available. Apart from the DSS Vessels, this dockyard is being utilized for the repairing of vessels of Forest, Police as well as privately owned. Apart from this, the Shipping Department is having two more dockyards, in which, vessels of 90 meters in length are docked for repairs in small drydock while two numbers of vessels having 90 mtrs in length are docked in the bigger drydock (180Mtrs length) for carrying out repair works. Apart from this, the Ministry has also taken up the expansion of Drydock in which 70 percent of work has been completed. This will pave the way for repairing more vessels. The Administration has signed an agreement named CANSRU agreement with Cochin Shipyard Limited under which the CSL will modernize the Dockyards of the Marine Department to make it a State-of-the-Art Dockyard in Port Blair itself.

Interviewer: What is your expectation from the commuters who are totally dependent on Shipping Sector?

Secretary (Shipping): People should understand that ship is our own property and we should also shoulder our responsibility as passengers to keep it clean and tidy and avoid spitting and follow all norms and guidelines while traveling in Ships. Although, the Department has given clear-cut instructions to carry out cleanliness and if, passengers adhere to Dos & Don'ts while traveling, it will surely help the crew members too. The passengers are also requested to cooperate with the crew during embarkation and disembarkation and while waiting for harbor ferries at the jetties.

Interviewer: What are the subsidies provided to the Islanders?

Secretary (Shipping): Since Shipping sector is a public service sector and not a source of income, the Administration provides high-level subsidies of approximately 80 percent to the Island passengers. For example, in the line boats plying under the foreshore sector to Long Island, 87 percent of the subsidy is provided for seats, 81 percent subsidy for chair car, and 79 percent subsidy for Bunk class.

Interviewer: At last, what would you like to say to the Islanders about the Directorate of Shipping Services and Port Management Board?

Secretary (Shipping): I wish to tell the general public that shipping is the lifeline for the Islanders and the A&N Administration is fully seized with the needs, demands, and requirements of the commuters. The Administration is taking all possible steps to provide better shipping services to the Islanders. In this direction, efforts are on to augment the Shipping fleet and simultaneously the landward amenities are also being augmented viz. renovation/modernizing passenger terminals and extension of jetties are also taken up to facilitate berthing of bigger vessel.

not platforms of free fall of unverified information," he highlighted.

Emphasising that in any democracy, Parliamentary sovereignty is inviolable, the Vice-President said, "essence of democracy lies in the prevalence of the ordainment of the people reflected through legitimised platform- Parliament and the Legislatures."

This is Shri Dhankhar's maiden visit to Kerala since assuming the Office of the Vice-President. The RBI Governor expected that most of 2000 bank notes will come back to the exchequer by 30th of September this year. Shri Das also clarified that RBI is withdrawing the 2000 rupees notes from circulation but they continue as legal tender. He said the RBI will be sensitive to difficulties faced by people regarding the exchange of bank notes.

The Reserve Bank of India has directed banks to maintain data on a daily basis on the amount of 2000 rupees notes exchanged and the amount that has been deposited into accounts. The Central Bank has added that banks will have to submit the information as and when called for. (Source: india.gov.in)
