Weather Report

Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs- ensuring availability of food grains and protecting consumer's rights

Port Blair, Nov. 11

The Civil Supplies Department is also functioning as Directorate of Consumer Affairs for expansion and strengthening of Consumer Protection Movement in the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The Department's primary responsibility is to ensure availability of food grains, monitor market prices, supervise traders' activities besides providing sufficient enforcement, and conduct consumer awareness programmes and redressal of consumer grievances. The Secretary (CS&CA) elucidates on the objectives and functions of the Department and the initiatives taken to protect consumer rights. Excerpts of the interview are as below:

Interviewer: Brief about the functions and objectives of the Department of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs.

Secretary (CS&CA): The Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs was earlier called the Supply Office and existed in this UT prior to independence. Food grains were imported from mainland to these Islands by the British Administration. Since its inception, this Department has been meeting the food requirements of the natives and covers the remotest parts of this UT. The UT of Andaman & Nicobar Islands is a minimal production of food grains. As such, to ensure food security to all the islanders, this Administration since independence in the year 1947 has introduced Universal Public Distribution System in the UT. This means that around 95% of the populace are covered under the ambit of Public Distribution System making them eligible for obtaining food grains at a highly subsidized price.

Interviewer: Considering the Islands being a disaster-prone zone, how much buffer stock are being maintained and how many storing facilities are there in the Island?

Secretary (CS&CA): The Department of Civil Supplies comprising of 12 Principal Distribution Centres (PDCs) at every nook and corner of this UT apart from godowns at South Andaman headquarter having 36 godowns with a total capacity of 13,460 MT against monthly requirement of 1922 MT considering this UT spread in an approximate area of 750 km i.e. Diglipur in North to Campbell Bay in South separated by sea prone to natural calamities and inclement weather conditions. Keeping in view of this fact, a buffer stock of 3 months requirement is maintained in every PDCs throughout the year.

Interviewer: Elaborate on the documents required for obtaining Ration Card.

Secretary (CS&CA): Ration Cards are issued to citizens of India in this UT under two categories namely NFSA & Non-NFSA. NFSA category Ration Cards include (Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) and Priority Household (PHH) whereas, Non-NFSA Ration Cards are APL households. NFSA Ration Cards are issued only to the islanders who falls under the inclusion criteria notified in the guidelines issued by the UT Administration. The major inclusion criteria are categorized as those incumbents being handicapped, transgender, old-aged, widow, destitute, ragpicker, homeless persons, households having annual income less than Rupees One Lakh etc. Income Certificate should be produced issued by the Revenue Authority not below the rank of Tehsildar of the respective areas. Non-NFSA (APL) Ration Card is issued to all Indian citizens on production of Islander Card/Local Certificate of adults, Date of Birth Certificate of Children along with the Aadhaar numbers. Inclusion of members in the existing Ration Card can be done on the basis of certificate issued by the elected representative such as Pradhan in the Rural Area and Ward Councilor in the municipal area. Aadhaar is mandatory.

Interviewer: What are the challenges before the Department in implementing PDS in this Union Territory?

Secretary (CS&CA): Although, this UT is small in terms of size and population, its peculiar location about 1200 km away from mainland, scattered from North to South for approximately 750 km, volatile climatic conditions and difficult accessibility, is most challenging in implementation of PDS in this UT. In-spite of all the challenges, the Department has been able to ensure food security to all its islanders throughout the year. Moreover, on implementation of e-PDS, Aadhaar enabled ePos devices are installed in all FPSs that are functioning in an online mode, but due to connectivity constraints in far-flung areas mainly Chowra & Teressa in Nancowrie group of Islands, the ePoS devices are functioning in partial online mode. Due to non availability of harbour for berthing the vessels in Islands such as Teressa & Chowra, the only option to transport the food grains is through pantoons from near the shore to designated godowns is also an additional challenge. In-spite of all these odd situations, till date, no case of hunger death reported/noticed in this UT even in adverse situation of Tsunami.

Interviewer: Can you elaborate on Universal Public Distribution System?

Secretary (CS&CA): The UT of Andaman & Nicobar Islands being a minimal food producing area, to ensure food security to all the islanders, this Administration since beginning has introduced Universal Public Distribution System in the UT. This means that every inhabitant in this UT is covered under the ambit of Public Distribution System making them eligible for obtaining food grains at a highly subsidized price.

Interviewer: What is National Food Security Act, 2013 and who all comes under its ambit?

Secretary (CS&CA): National Food Security Act, 2013 popularly known as NFSA was enacted by the Parliament of India on 10th September, 2013 with the view to provide food and nutritional security by ensuring access to adequate quantity of quality food. The Households/persons covered under Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY)

and Priority Household (PHH) comes under the ambit of National Food Security Act, 2013. Under this Act, food grains are distributed to the beneficiary (AAY & PHH) free of cost. Each household covered under AAY category is entitled for 35 kgs of food grains per month whereas, each PHH person registered in the respective Ration Card is entitled for 5 kgs food grains per month. The NFSA beneficiaries are also provided with 1 kg sugar per card per month. Apart from PDS, beneficiaries covered under the ICDS programme and Mid Day Meal programme (POSAN-ABHIYAN) also falls under the ambit of National Food Security Act. However, these two programmes are run by Department of Social Welfare and Department of Education respectively.

Interviewer: What is the difference between AAY card holders and PHH card holders?

Secretary (CS&CA): AAY Ration Cards are meant for socio & economically weaker section identified as per the guidelines issued by the Govt. of India. Widows/Single Women above 60 years of age with no sustainable source of income as well as tribal are provided with 35 kg foodgrains per month and the remaining socio economically vulnerable sections are covered under PHH with monthly scale of 5 kg per person per month included in respective Ration Cards. These food grains are issued absolutely free of cost. Based on the directions of the Govt. of India the States/UTs has to frame suitable guidelines as per their State/UTs scenario for identification of PHH households/persons within the coverage limit allotted to each State/UT.

Interviewer: What is the scale of distribution of food grains and sugar under NFSA in these Islands?

Secretary (CS&CA): For NFSA

Interviewer: What are the steps taken to overcome pilferage of PDS food grains?

Secretary (CS&CA): Earlier, PDS food grains were distributed through manual mode and thus had possibilities of pilferages. However, at present all the FPSs are automated in this UT with introduction of technology based Aadhaar authenticated ePos devices, the incidents of pilferages is not possible. This enables the Department to fetch real-time data of allocation & distribution.

Interviewer: What are the facilities provided to those who are unable to come to FPS due to illness, old age etc?

Secretary (CS&CA): Special dispensation under NFSA is being provided to those Ration Card holders who are unable to approach FPSs due to old age, specially abled, health challenge etc., by giving them facility of nominating any two person of card holder who is registered in the same FPS to draw their entitlement. The nomination can be done by applying to the Directorate of CS & CA and all the Supply Units with copy of Aadhaar number of both person and Ration Card number.

Interviewer: What is 'One Nation One Ration Card' and what are its benefits?

Secretary (CS&CA): 'One Nation One Ration Card' popularly known as ONORC is the initiative of the Govt. of India to ensure that no NFSA beneficiaries is deprived of getting their entitlement of food grains due to migration to other States/UTs for job or other work. Under the scheme NFSA beneficiaries (AAY & PHH) of any State/UT is free to collect their entitlement from any part of the country without transferring their Ration Card in Aadhaar based biometric authentication mode. Till date, 432 NFSA beneficiaries of other States have availed the benefits of ONORC. Apart from this, UT has extended the benefit of portability to all Ration Cards irrespective of their category to obtain food grains from any FPS of their choice in the UT. Till date, 26464 Ration Card holders of this

Promoting entrepreneurship through Stand-Up India Scheme in A&N Islands

Loan amounting to Rs. 7061.91 crores disbursed to 336 beneficiaries for setting up own ventures

The Stand up India scheme aims at promoting entrepreneurship among women and Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. The scheme is implemented by Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance, Government of India. Stand-Up India Scheme facilitates bank loans between Rs 10 lakh and Rs 1 Crore to atleast one Scheduled Caste (SC) or Scheduled Tribe (ST) borrower and at least one woman borrower per bank branch for setting up a greenfield enterprise. This enterprise may be in manufacturing, services or the trading sector. In case of non-individual enterprises, 51% of the shareholding and controlling stake should be held either by SC/ST or women entrepreneur and borrower should not be in default to any bank/ financial institution. As per the data received from Lead Bank Port Blair, in A&N Islands, altogether 336 beneficiaries have

availed loan under the Stand-Up India Scheme and an amount of Rs. 7061.91 crores (Upto Sept. 2023) have been disbursed to the applicants for setting up their own ventures since the inception of the scheme.

Composite loan (inclusive of term loan and working capital) between 10 lakh and upto 100 lakh is provided for setting up a new enterprise in manufacturing, trading or services sector by SC/ST/Women entrepreneur. The loan is repayable in 7 years with a maximum moratorium period of 18 months. The scheme, which covers all branches of Scheduled Commercial Banks is accessible either directly at the branch or through Stand-Up India portal www.standupmitra.in or through the Lead District Manager (LDM).

UT have availed the benefit of portability within the UT.

Interviewer:Kindly throw light on LPG Distribution system in these Islands. How many distributors are there across the Islands?

Secretary (CS&CA): IOCL is solely responsible to ensure uninterrupted distribution of LPG cylinders in the entire UT. The Department of CS & CA is the monitoring agency on behalf of the Administration to intervene as and when required to ensure regular and adequate supply of refilled LPG cylinders to safeguard the larger interest of the consumers. There are about 1,22,590 registered LPG connection in this UT. Presently, 08 authorized IOCL LPG distributors are functioning in this UT, out of which, 05 in South Andaman, 02 in North & Middle and 01 at Nicobar District are functional. Apart from this, in Campbell Bay, Car Nicobar, Little Andaman, Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep and Mayabunder presently Extension Counters of LPG are being operated by CCS Limited to cover all the population under LPG network.

Interviewer: What are the steps taken to ease the supply of LPG to the consumers?

Secretary (CS&CA): The Administration has asked IOCL to onboard all the LPG consumers under online booking mode of LPG cylinders. Accordingly, the LPG consumers of Municipal area can avail the booking by making a Missed call to 8454955555 from their registered mobile number. Apart from this, the LPG consumers can book the LPG through Indian Oil Portal (Indian Oil One) and also avail online booking facilities through other easily available online portal (eg. Paytm, Phonepay, Google Pay and Amazon Pay etc.). The Department has issued directions to all distributors to keep weighing machine in vehicle during sales of LPG to check the exact weight of the LPG as denoted on the body of the cylinder.

Interviewer: Elaborate on Prime Minister's Ujjwala Yojana and its benefits?

Secretary (CS&CA): PMUY is a flagship programme implemented by the Govt. of India. Under this scheme, the elderly women of those families identified under socio-economically backward community are provided subsidy to obtain new LPG connection, which is a clean, healthy and environment friendly cooking fuel. As on date, in A&N Islands, 12940 households have been benefitted.

Capacity building on agricultural practices for Nicobari farmers organized by ICAR-CIARI

Port Blair, Nov. 11

A scientific team of ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Garacharma visited Perka, Tapoiming and Chukchucha villages of Car Nicobar between Oct.30 & Nov.5,2023 and conducted capacity building programmes for Nicobari tribal farmers on 'Climate resilient Agricultural Practices for Island based Cropping System'. During the programme, Dr. I. Jaisankar, Senior Scientist (Ago Forestry) explained about the use of multipurpose tree species for efficient resource utilization, conservation of endemic plant biodiversity to mitigate the impact of climate change, scientific tuber crops cultivation, tuber crops based farming system, CIARI technologies and organic waste management. Dr. Santosh Kumar, Senior Scientist & Head, KVK, Nicobar explained about the package of practices of potential vegetable crops for a nutritious kitchen garden and its nursery management. About 191 farmers from 3 villages participated in this

programme setup Permanent Enrollment Centres at this Directorate, Rangat, Mayabunder, Diglipur, Car Nicobar, Little Andaman & Great Nicobar. Apart from this the stakeholder Department i.e. Registrar of Birth and Death for enrollment of infants, Education Department to facilitate school going children ranging in the age of 5 to 15, Social Welfare Department for enrolling at Anganwadi Centres & old age individuals. Further, this Department along with Post Office, BSNL and certain nationalized banks also provides the facility of Aadhaar services. As a gesture in accordance with 'Sarkar Aapke Dwar' these Departments organize regular Aadhaar camps to provide services at their doorsteps. For covering the left out residents for Aadhaar Enrolment & Update, as on date (from January, 2023 onwards) the Department of CS&CA has organized 602 camps throughout this UT.

Interviewer: Who are the beneficiaries of PMUY?

Secretary (CS&CA): PMUY was introduced to provide connection to households who do not have any LPG connection. The beneficiaries are issued one LPG cylinder, one hose pipe and LPG stove on loan basis with the adjustment from the subsidy provided to the LPG consumers till recovery of the exact amount of the stove. Under PM Ujjwala Yojana the current subsidy is fixed @Rs.300 per LPG refill, which is credited directly to the bank account of beneficiaries. Whereas, for normal LPG connection the subsidy rate @63.93/-. If any of the subsidy is not credited to the LPG consumers account, beneficiary may visit concerned LPG distributors showroom with Aadhaar and bank details.

Interviewer: What is fortified rice and what are its benefit?

Secretary (CS&CA): The rice is being enriched with essential micronutrients (Iron, Folic Acid and Vitamin B12) in the form of fortified granules premixed with the normal rice in the ratio of 1:100 to ensure nutritional security amongst the PDS beneficiaries, school children under MDM and especially pregnant ladies, lactating mothers, children etc. under ICDS schemes as per FSSAI norms framed by the Govt. of India.

Interviewer: Department of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs is declared as the Nodal Agency for Aadhaar related matters. Can you elaborate on your role as Nodal Agency?

Secretary (CS&CA): The Department of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs is declared as the Nodal Agency/ State Registrar for Aadhaar in this UT. This Department

ensures the availability of food grains and protecting consumer's ... against any unfair trade practices. The Act encompasses various aspects related to metrology, verification and stamping of instruments, prescribed SI units, packaged commodities, enforcement and penalties with the motto of safeguarding the consumer protection. The Act principally prescribes inspections, seizure of non-compliant instruments, and legal action against violations with punitive actions as deemed fit as per the rules and regulations framed under the Legal Metrology Act, 2009 which includes compounding and imprisonment for offenses such as using unverified/tampering of weighing & measuring instruments, selling underweight products, selling packaged commodities beyond MRP etc. The No. of offenses & Compounding fine imposed during the FY 2022-2023 is 68 & Rs. 2,95,000/- respectively and from April, 2023 to till date is 64 & Rs. 1,91,000/- respectively.

Interviewer: Do we have a Consumer Commission? If so, what is its role?

Secretary (CS&CA): In this UT of A&N Islands, 01 State Consumer District Redressal Commission is functional. As far as District Commission is concerned, 01 District Commission is functioning in South Andaman with jurisdiction of other two districts also considering the meagre complaints filed. The primary role of Consumer Commission is to hear and resolve Consumer Complaints. They provide an accessible, time bound and cost effective mechanism for consumers to seek redressal.

Interviewer: Do you have a Citizen Charter and what is being done to adhere to it?

Secretary (CS&CA): Yes, it is being adhered in true letter and spirit as per the guidelines framed thereunder.

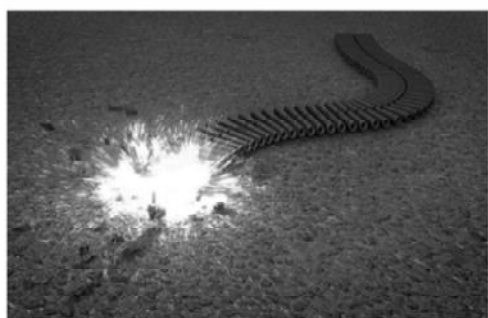

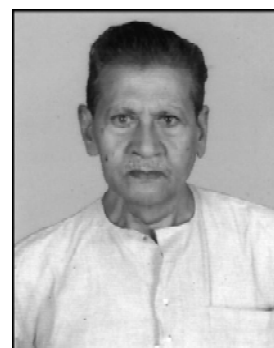

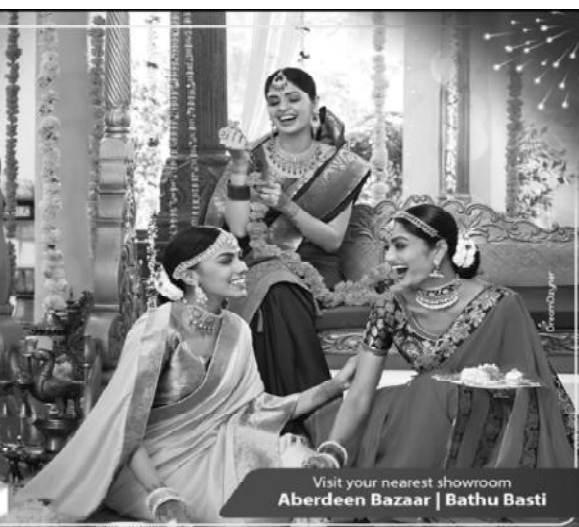
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
