Drinking water samples being tested by field functionaries using Field Testing Kits

Port Blair, Oct. 10
Jal Jeevan Mission is being implemented in A&N Islands to extend 100% FHTC coverage in rural household to ensure safe sustainable drinking water. A&N Islands has been recently declared as First 'Swachh and Sujal' among the States/UT in the country by Ministry of Jal Shakti after achieving SBM Plus status along with 100% Har Ghar Jal certification on 17th Sept., 2022.

Water Quality Monitoring and Surveillance (WQMS) is most important aspect of Jal Jeevan Mission. Drinking water samples are being tested by field level functionaries using Field Testing Kits (FTK) directly in the field. Further, water samples from source as well as delivery points are randomly collected and send to



respective Sub Division laboratory, District Laboratory as well as State Laboratory to ensure multilevel check on drinking water quality supplied to public.

Certification from National Accreditation Board of Laboratory (NABL) is mandatory to ensure that water testing laboratory is complying with various provision of ISO/IEC17025:2017 and reliability of test result remained beyond doubt. Hence, JJM guidelines has compulsory provision of NABL accredited Laboratory for Testing

of water samples in each States and UT. Accordingly, among 11 functional Water Testing Laboratory (7 Sub-Division Laboratory, 3 District Laboratory and 1 State Laboratory) NABL Certification has been planned for 3 District Laboratories and One State Laboratory (Central water laboratory, CE's Office APWD).

Central Water Laboratory was prepared for NABL assessment by procuring various types of Certified Reference Material (CRM) Reagent as

The Social Welfare Department, A&N Administration is implementing the Govt. of India scheme of Unique ID for Persons with Disabilities in an effective manner to empower People with Disabilities. The Aadhaar-linked Unique Disability Identity (UDID) Card would ensure their ease to access various Government Schemes & benefits. The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India had launched this project in the year 2016 with a view to create a National Database for PWDs and to issue a Unique Disability Identity Card to each person with disabilities.

The Ministry has so far generated 5169 e-UDID cards for A&N Islands with a coverage rate of 112.27 percent, benefitting the divyangjans, in all the three Districts viz.

South Andaman, N&M Andaman and Nicobar. At present, A&N Islands stands act 2nd place as per the latest e-UDID card status released by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.

well as laboratory equipment based on recommendation of an expert technical consultant after internal audit of laboratory facilities and gap assessment. Various equipments were calibrated by empanelled calibration agency of NABL and retrofitted with automatic sensor to ensure standard conditions are maintained in laboratory. Laboratory staff were also trained in standard testing procedure for successful completion of proficiency testing by an NABL empanelled Proficiency Testing Agency (PTA).

Based on results of proficiency testing as well as accuracy and purity of (CRM) application for NABL certification was submitted. After due examination of various documents and compliance of various conditions, a final assessment by an independent NABL empanelled assessor was conducted on 16-17th July, 2022. External assessment included testing skill of laboratory staff and managerial awareness of Laboratory management.

After detail assessment and further compliance, NABL Certificate for Central Water Laboratory, Chief Engineer Office APWD has been issued by Accreditation body. This is the first ever Water Testing Laboratory to get NABL accreditation in the Island. Now, Laboratory can use NABL Logo on test report as proof of NABL Certification subject to compliance with various laid down conditions. General public, Government and private institutions can avail testing facilities at prescribed testing charges.

Initial certification is valid for 2 years subject to fulfillment of various conditions like regular training of staff, management review as well as compulsory use of Certified Reference Material (Equipment and Reagents). Thereafter, it has to be renewed periodically. Further, accreditation process of other 3 District Laboratories are under process. It is expected that all these laboratories shall be able to get NABL accreditation by March 2023, a press release from APWD said.

The Unique Disability ID (UDID) smart card contains details such as disability percentage, personal details, identity, employment details, education details and bank account numbers of a person with disability. With UDID card, the divyangjans are eligible for free aids and appliances as per their abnormality/deformity from ALIMCO. They will get priority in medical treatment, priority at ticket counters, priorities in hearing of their grievances, free bus passes and free ship tickets in mainland bound ships once in a year and inter islands ships and boats as and when required, scholarship for students etc.

The project has not only brought transparency, efficiency and ease of delivering Government benefits to the person with disabilities, but also ensured uniformity. It has helped in streamlining the tracking of beneficiary at all levels of hierarchy of implementation - at Village level, Block level, District level , State level and National level.

The Departments of Health and Social Welfare are coordinating to help the disabled get Disability Certificate from the notified medical authorities. A divyangjan with multiple disabilities is assessed by a Medical Board comprising of Specialists to assess the percentage of disability and issue the Disability Certificate after which it is uploaded on the national portal: www.swavlambancard.gov.in.

The smart card has eliminated the hassles of the disabled to carry their Disability Certificates for different purposes since detail about the type of disabilities that they suffer from are included in the card. Moreover, the UDID cards will be valid all over the country. As a result, the divyangjans need not to make multiple copies of documents or carry multiple documents as the UDID card will capture all the necessary details which can be decoded with the help of a reader. The UDID card is the single document of identification, verification of the disabled for availing various benefits. Divyangjans who have not yet received their e-UDID cards can register in the UDID portal by visiting their nearest CSCs/Offices of CDPOs and then approach their nearby PHC/CHC for getting their Disability Certificates & UDID cards.
