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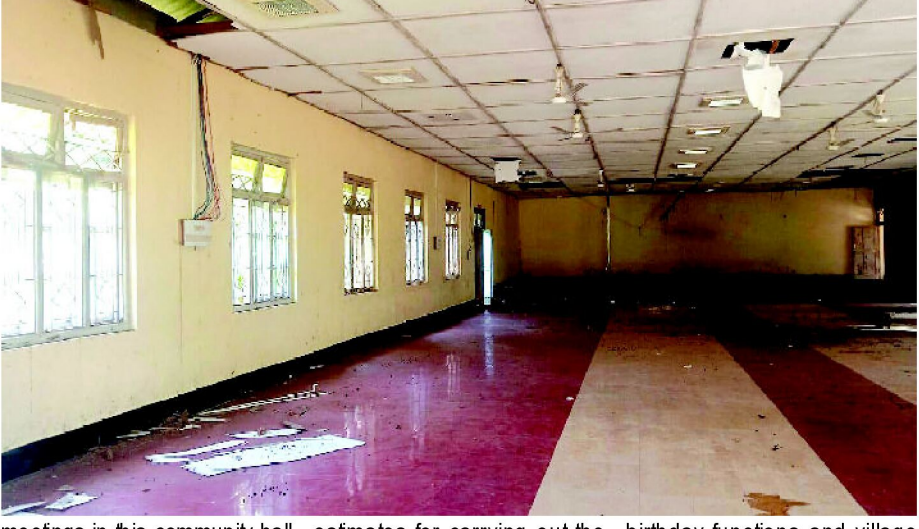

Padmanabhapuram Community Hall cries for attention

Port Blair, Dec 11: Leaking roofs, broken windows, uprooted trees, damaged doors, clogged washrooms and loose electric wiring has resulted the community hall at Padmanabhapuram under Shivapuram Gram Panchayat rendered unusable and calls for urgent renovation work. The residents of this region said that amid the space crunch, they have been suffering for years due to the appalling condition of the community hall. Absence of a community hall has been causing inconvenience to the villagers. Be it any function or social gathering, the villagers are unable to accommodate large gatherings of people. During marriage or other social ceremonies, villagers have to look for community halls located in other localities. Constructed in the year 2009, this community has been used by the villagers for marriage and family functions. PRIs members also conduct village level



meetings in this community hall on a regular basis. However, after its inauguration some 12 years ago, no repair work has been carried out. As a result of lack of repair work, the community hall at GP Shivapuram presents a picture of neglect. Sources informed that after years of delay, finally the estimates for carrying out the renovation work of the community hall have been sent to the Engineering Wing and immediately after approval, the tendering process for renovation of the community hall will be started. Villagers have complained that for organizing social events like marriages, birthday functions and village meetings, they have to depend on the neighbouring Panchayats. "If we are lucky enough, we get the booking of the community hall of our neighbouring Panchayats. However, first preference is given to the demands of their own villages", said a villager of Shivapuram.

Only seats, not cities

Municipal elections seldom attract attention outside their catchment area. However, elections to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, where AAP captured a majority displacing three-term winner BJP, was different. It embodied the fierce political competition between India's pre-eminent national party BJP and its most competitive challenger, AAP. Some regional parties do pack a punch and BJP hasn't quite got their measure. But AAP is the only other party to keep expanding its geographical footprint, often at the expense of India's original political hegemon, Congress. All these factors played out in MCD elections.

AAP secured a simple majority with 134 seats in the corporation. BJP did better than the exit polls predicted with 104 seats while Congress, expectedly, was reduced to a rump. MCD isn't the only fiercely contested urban local body polls. Two years ago, BJP pulled out all stops to capture Hyderabad's urban body, with even home minister Amit Shah campaigning extensively. It ran TRS close. Soon, we will see another high-decibel contest in Mumbai for BMC, India's richest urban body, where the two Senas have a lot at stake, as does BJP.

But do fierce contests translate into better outcomes for voters? Certainly not, as a proxy indicator like voter participation or anecdotal evidence suggests. The turnout for MCD was just above 50%, below the level recorded in 2017 and also the last Delhi assembly election. It's a reflection of the dysfunctional state of India's urban bodies. This is best captured by RBI's description that Indian cities are "emaciated financially". The core problem is that state governments are unwilling to let go of functions that the Constitution's 74th amendment recommended 30 years ago.

One of the outcomes is that urban bodies are underfunded. In India, the average municipal revenue is around 1% of GDP. The comparable figures in Brazil and South Africa are 7.4% and 6% respectively. Municipalities largely depend on property tax for revenue. Interstate comparison suggests that this electorally-sensitive tax rate is an area where corporations don't have a decisive say. For example, RBI's data shows that MCD's own tax revenue as a proportion of total revenue not only trails the national average, it's even lower than a relatively poorer urban Assam. Indian cities need more than high-decibel elections. But absolutely no political party seems interested. No wonder voters are losing interest.

NOBEL PEACE PRIZE WINNERS FROM UKRAINE, BELARUS AND RUSSIA DENOUNCE PUTIN'S UKRAINE INVASION

The winners of this year's Nobel Peace Prize from Belarus, Russia and Ukraine shared their visions of a fairer world and denounced Russian President Vladimir Putin's war in Ukraine during Saturday's award ceremony in the Norwegian capital.

Oleksandra Matviichuk of Ukraine's Center for Civil Liberties dismissed calls for a political compromise that would allow Russia to retain some of the illegally annexed Ukrainian territories, saying that fighting for peace does not mean yielding to the pressure of the aggressor, it means protecting people from its cruelty.

Peace cannot be reached by a country under attack laying down its arms, she said, her voice trembling with emotion.

This would not be peace, but occupation. Matviichuk repeated her earlier call for Putin and Belarus' authoritarian President Alexander Lukashenko, who provided his country's territory for Russian troops to invade Ukraine to face an international tribunal. We have to prove that the rule of law does work, and justice does exist, even if they are delayed, she said.

Matviichuk was named a co-winner of the 2022 peace prize in October along with Russian human rights group Memorial and Ales Bialiatski, head of the Belarusian rights group Viasna.

Under the terms of Alfred Nobel's will, the Nobel Peace Prize has been awarded by the Norwegian Nobel Committee since 1901.

Saturday's award ceremonies took place at the Oslo City Hall in the presence of King Olav V and Queen Sonja, while the other Nobel prizes were formally presented during ceremonies in the Swedish capital, Stockholm, later the same day.

Bialiatski, who is jailed in Belarus pending his trial and faces a prison sentence of up to 12 years, wasn't allowed to send his speech. He shared a few thoughts when he met in jail with his wife, Nataliia Pinchuk, who spoke on his behalf at the award ceremony.

In my homeland, the entirety of Belarus is in a prison, Bialiatski said in the remarks delivered by Pinchuk in reference to a sweeping crackdown on the opposition after massive protests against an August

2020 fraud-tainted vote that Lukashenko used to extend his rule.

This award belongs to all my human rights defender friends, all civic activists, and tens of thousands of Belarusians who have gone through beatings, torture, arrests, and prison.

Bialiatski is the fourth person in the 121-year history of the Nobel Prizes to receive the award while in prison or detention.

In the remarks delivered by his wife, he cast Lukashenko as a tool of Putin, saying the Russian leader is seeking to establish his domination across the ex-Soviet lands.

I know exactly what kind of Ukraine would suit Russia and Putin a dependent dictatorship, he said.

The same as today's Belarus, where the voice of the oppressed people is ignored and disregarded.

The triple peace prize award was seen as a strong rebuke to

Putin, not only for his action in Ukraine but for the Kremlin's crackdown on domestic opposition and its support for Lukashenko's brutal repression of dissenters.

Russia's Supreme Court shut down Memorial, one of Russia's oldest and most prominent human rights organizations that was widely acclaimed for its studies of political repression in the Soviet Union, in December 2021.

Prior to that, the Russian government had declared the organisation a foreign agent a label that implies additional government scrutiny and carries strong pejorative connotations that can discredit the targeted organisation.

Jan Rachinsky of Memorial said in his speech that today's sad state of civil society in Russia is a direct consequence of its unresolved past.

One of the first victims of this madness was the historical memory of Russia itself, Rachinsky said.

"Now, the Russian mass media refer to the unprovoked armed invasion of a neighbouring country, the annexation of territories, terror against civilians in the occupied areas, and war crimes as justified by the need to fight fascism."

While all the winners spoke in unison to condemn the war in Ukraine, there also were some marked differences.

Matviichuk specifically declared that the Russian people will

be responsible for this disgraceful page of their history and their desire to forcefully restore the former empire.

Rachinsky described the Russian aggression against its neighbors as a monstrous burden, but strongly rejected the notion of national guilt.

It is not worth talking about national or any other collective guilt at all the notion of collective guilt is abhorrent to fundamental human rights principles, he said.

The joint work of the participants of our movement is based on a completely different ideological basis on the understanding of civic responsibility for the past and for the present.

After a two-year COVID-19 pandemic break, award ceremonies took place at Stockholm's Concert Hall with nearly 1,500 invited guests.

Organisers said there were a record number of prize winners present in Stockholm this year as the Nobel Foundation had invited also those laureates who received the prize in 2020 and 2021 but missed the festivities due to the pandemic.

A brief introduction of each prize subject was followed by a ceremony where King Carl XVI Gustaf of Sweden handed the 2022 Nobel winners their awards complete with fanfare and music by the Royal Stockholm Philharmonic Orchestra. - Source : The week

PAN to become inoperative after March, 23 if not linked to Aadhaar

Port Blair, Dec, 11, 2022: The Income Tax Department on Wednesday said non-linking of PAN with Aadhaar by March 31 would attract penalty of up to Rs 1,000, but such PAN will remain functional for one more year till March 2023, for filing ITR, claiming refunds and other IT procedures. The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT), which is the apex decision making body on direct taxes, has extended the deadline for linking Permanent Account Number (PAN) with Aadhaar many times and the last date now is March 31, 2022. As per a circular issued by CBDT on Wednesday, PAN, not linked to Aadhaar, would become "inoperative" after March 31, 2023. Those taxpayers who link their PAN with biometric Aadhaar by June 30, 2022, would be required to pay late fees of Rs 500. Beyond that, the penalty would rise to Rs 1,000. In order to mitigate the inconvenience to taxpayers, as per notification dated March 29, 2022, a window of opportunity has

been provided to taxpayers up to March 31, 2023 to intimate their Aadhaar to the prescribed authority for Aadhaar-PAN linking without facing repercussions, the CBDT said, adding such intimation would have to be accompanied by late fees. "However, till 31st March, 2023 the PAN of the assessee who have not intimated their Aadhaar, will continue to be functional for the procedures under the Act, like furnishing of return of income, processing of refunds etc," the CBDT statement said. After March 31, 2023, the PAN of taxpayers who fail to intimate their Aadhaar, as required, shall become inoperative and all the consequences under the Act for not furnishing, intimating or quoting the PAN shall apply to such taxpayers, the CBDT added. As per data available, till January 24, 2022, more than 43.34 crore PANs have been linked with Aadhaar. Over 131 crore Aadhaar cards have been issued so far. PAN-Aadhaar linkage would help

in eliminating duplicate PAN and curbing tax evasion. AKM Global, Tax Partner, Amit Maheshwari said "It is advisable for taxpayers to check their income tax portal and ensure that Aadhaar and PAN are linked. NRIs may have some concerns since in some cases they do not have Aadhaar." Nangia Andersen LLP Partner Neeraj Agarwal said, while PAN is used for various transactions like opening a bank account, purchase of immovable property or proof of identity, inactive PAN will trigger domino effect and individual who have not linked their Aadhaar may face multiple challenges. "Once your PAN becomes inactive, the person will be restricted from doing financial transactions (where quoting of PAN is mandatory like mutual funds), subjected to TDS at higher rates and penalty under section 272B," Agarwal said. For those who do not have access to income tax portal, the linking process is made available through SMS also, he added. (Source: Business Standard)

To facilitate farmers, the Govt. of India has decided to undertake e-KYC verification of all the eligible registered farmer-beneficiaries of PM-KISAN Scheme for smooth transfer of benefits. The e-KYC authentication of the beneficiaries can be done by both e-KYC OTP mode as well as e-KYC biometric mode. The e-KYC authentication of the beneficiaries through OTP mode can be done on PM-KISAN portal, free of cost by the beneficiaries or State functionaries. For e-KYC biometric authentication facility, the beneficiary may visit the nearest CSC. The CSC will charge for bio-metric authentication from each beneficiary. For any query/doubt related to e-KYC, the beneficiaries can also contact

the concerned Zonal Agriculture Office/ Field functionaries of Agriculture Department. Farmers have been advised to use only the official website of PM-KISAN portal and not to download any other App for e-KYC authentication. As per the guidelines of the scheme, the following categories of beneficiaries of higher economic status are not eligible for benefit under the scheme: (a) All Institutional Land holders (b) Farmer families in which one or more of its members belong to following categories: Former and present holders of constitutional posts Former and present Ministers/ State Ministers and former/present Members of Lok Sabha/ Rajya Sabha/ State Legislative Assemblies/ State Legislative Councils, former and present Mayors of Municipal Corporations, former and present

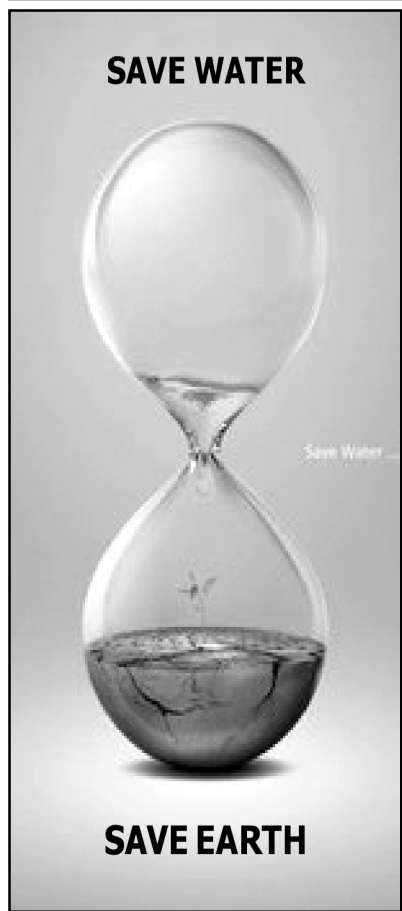

INDIA CLASSIFICATION OF TERRORISTS AS 'BAD', 'GOOD' ON BASIS OF POLITICAL CONVENIENCE MUST END

The era of classifying terrorists as "bad" or "good" on the basis of "political convenience" must end immediately, a concept note circulated by India in the UN Security Council here has said, underlining that categorising terror acts by intent as religious or ideologically motivated will dilute the shared global commitment to fighting terrorism.

India, the current president of the 15-nation UN Security Council, will hold two signature events on reformed multilateralism and counter-terrorism to be chaired by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar on December 14 and 15.

India proposes to organise a briefing of the Security Council on December 15 on Global counter-terrorism approach principles and the way forward under the Threats to international peace and security caused by terrorist acts.

Ahead of the meeting, India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations Ambassador Ruchira Kamboj, in a letter to Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, asked that a concept note intended to guide the discussions on the topic be circulated as a document of the Security Council.

The terrorist attacks in New York on September 11, 2001 were a turning point in the global approach to counter-terrorism. Since then, London, Mumbai, Paris, many parts of West Asia and Africa have also experienced terrorist attacks, the concept note last week said. It added that these attacks highlight that the threat of terrorism is grave and universal and that terrorism in one part of the world seriously impacts peace and security in other parts of the globe. The threat of terrorism is transnational. Terrorist actors and their supporters, facilitators and financiers collaborate while remaining in different jurisdictions to organise acts anywhere in the world. A transnational threat can be defeated only by the collective efforts of all States Members of the United Nations, it said. Stressing that the menace of

terrorism cannot be associated with any religion, nationality, civilisation or ethnic group, the note said that all acts of terrorism are criminal.

Terrorism in all its forms and manifestations must be condemned. There cannot be an exception or justification for any act of terrorism, regardless of its motivation and wherever, whenever and by whomsoever committed. The era of classifying terrorists as bad, not so bad or good on the basis of political convenience must end immediately.

It said that existing and emerging threats call for a renewed collective

prospects remain high.

Further, Africa's home-grown terrorist groups have found ideological support from global terrorist groups such as Al-Qaida and ISIL.

The terrorist threat was further complicated by pirates and organised criminal networks facilitating trafficking in arms, drugs, humans and finance for these terrorist groups. The threat continues to grow towards the coastal region of Western Africa.

The concept note said that proliferation of digitalisation, new and emerging communications and financing technologies has also increased the risk of these technologies being used by terrorist groups.

The risk of radicalisation through the Internet and social media, and terror financing using cryptocurrencies and crowdfunding platforms, was heightened, particularly during the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic.

Member states have, in recent times, also witnessed the use of unmanned aerial systems for the surveillance of targets, trafficking in drugs and arms and the launching of terrorist attacks on critical infrastructure and public places, it said.

The proposed high-level briefing also aims to provide an opportunity for Council members to build on the recent deliberations of the Counter-Terrorism Committee meeting in Mumbai and Delhi held in late October under the chairmanship of India, to further share their views on the current state of affairs and to aim to arrive at key principles of the global community's collective fight against terrorism going forward. Among the guiding questions for the meeting is what are the trends that the global collective needs to be wary of in the fight against terrorism and how the sanctity of sanctions regimes against terrorists and terror entities can be safeguarded and made effective in combating terrorism.

Looking at the motivations behind terrorist acts and categorising such acts by intent as political or religious and by ideological motivation will dilute our shared commitment to fighting terrorism, it said. The concept note voices concern that in recent times, there has been a resurgence of terrorist activities in both range and diversity, as well as in geographical space. The threat posed by the Islamic State in Iraq and the Levant-Khorasan, Al-Qaida, Al-Qaida in the Indian Subcontinent and terrorist groups sheltering in Afghanistan has increased following the takeover of Kabul by the Taliban in August 2021, the note said. It added that the collective expectation of the Security Council, expressed in its resolution 2593 (2021) that was adopted under India's August 2021 presidency of the Council, was that Afghan soil would not be used for terrorism, to threaten or attack any country, to shelter or train terrorists or to plan or finance terrorist acts.

It however noted that the threat
