# For an honest broker

Days after meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Delhi, Russian President Vladimir Putin held a summit via video conference with Chinese President Xi Jinping. While the two meetings may have focused on bilateral issues, the conversations appear to have overlapped in unusual ways. According to a senior Kremlin official, after discussing with Mr. Modi India's problems with Chinese aggression, which were raised publicly during the visit by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, Mr. Putin "briefed" Mr. Xi on his talks in Delhi. The official then indicated that a trilateral summit of the leaders of Russia, India and China (RIC) could be held in the near future, which would pick up on the Modi-Putin-Xi conversation during an RIC summit on the sidelines of the Osaka G-20 summit in 2019. However, much has occurred between that summit and today. China's aggression at the Line of Actual Control has dented hopes of peaceful coexistence and growth between the neighbours that had been outlined during the RIC as well as the Modi-Xi Mamallapuram summit, when the leaders last met face to face. Since April 2020, the two leaders have not spoken directly once, and while they have attended the same multilateral summits (BRICS, SCO, G-20, etc.), it would be hard to see them engaging in a face-toface format unless the situation at the LAC considerably eases. In addition, the RIC summit should not be held before promises made by Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in meetings with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar are fulfilled.

While India-Russia defence and bilateral ties have considerably strengthened, especially after the Modi government's decision to go ahead with its purchase of the S-400 missile defence systems despite the U.S. threat of sanctions, New Delhi must tread cautiously in its trilateral and multilateral cooperation with Moscow and any hint that Russia could play a facilitator of talks with China must be scrutinised closely. Russia and China have consolidated their support for each other in the face of U.S. concerns over Russian action against Ukraine and Chinese action on Taiwan. Russia is also deeply dependent on Chinese investment, particularly in the 30-year \$400 billion gas pipeline. On Afghanistan, Russia has shown that it was prepared to cut India out of negotiations held by the Troika plus group with the U.S., China and Pakistan. Any expectation that Mr. Putin could play "honest broker" between Mr. Modi and Mr. Xi must take these factors into account. While India must continue to walk the tightrope between Moscow and Washington, and its partners in Eurasia versus those in the Indo-Pacific, it needs to disentangle these threads from the very potent threat it faces directly and bilaterally from its northern neighbour, where it has little choice but to follow an independent path.

# Need a gendersensitive approach to



Vice-President Venkaiah Naidu on Thursday urged parliamentarians, MLAs and heads of local bodies to be catalysts in the campaign against tuberculosis and ensure a gender-sensitive approach to eradicate it.

"While the prevalence of TB is higher among men, it can have a disproportionately higher impact on women. Women are more susceptible because adequate priority is not given to their health and nutrition. TB is responsible for more deaths among women of reproductive age than all causes of maternal mortality combined. Facing the misery of abandonment and violence if found to have TB, it is not surprising that there are a large number of unreported and therefore untreated cases of TB amongst women," Mr. Naidu said at a national conference on "Women Winning against TB".

He said only 18 lakh of the 26 lakh estimated new TB cases in 2020 were reported to the TB programme signifying a wide gap of 8 lakh because of the stigma attached to the disease.

He also underlined that ensuring nutrition to women and children will be key in the fight against

Secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Rajesh Bhushan, said his Ministry was working with the Ministry of Women and Child Development to explore possibilities of additional nutritional support for pregnant women and lactating mothers and children to achieve the target of eradicating TB

"If our country is to achieve TB elimination goals, exhaustive and inclusive collaborations are imperative to reach more vulnerable populations and increase the depth of TB services. TB affects over 10 lakh women and girls and more than 3 lakh children every year in our country. Hence it is vital to ensure women and children not only have equitable access to healthcare but also actively seek and complete appropriate TB regimen," Mr. Bhushan said.

# Dr C Sivaperuman; A scientist who aims to aid economic development of the Islands through science research



The Andaman & Nicobar Islands is part of two Biodiversity Hotspots i.e., Andaman group is part of Indo-Burma; Nicobar group is part of the Sundaland. The Andaman & Nicobar archipelago is rich in biodiversity and hosts an about 11,000 faunal species under 24 faunal group from Marine and Terrestrial Ecosystem.

The Islands comprises only 0.25% of India's geographical area but is home to more than 10% of country's faunal species. Thus, presence of such large number of species in such small area makes A&N Islands one of the richest ecosystems and biodiversity hot spots in India.

The Andaman and Nicobar Regional Centre of Zoological Survey of India (ZSI) was established at Port Blair on 21st April 1977 under the Sixth Five Year Plan of Government of India. It is one among the 16 Regional Centres of ZSI. The jurisdiction of the centre covered entire Andaman & Nicobar Islands and its territorial waters. The faunal communities of marine and terrestrial ecosystems of these islands are being inventorized by the Centre by conducting exploratory surveys.

Since its inception the ZSI Regional Centre conducted about 90 research programmes on several faunal groups of this archipelago. The major areas of studies at this Centre are on Taxonomy, Ecology and Zoogeography of Protozoa to Mammalia from marine and terrestrial ecosystems.

ZSI. Port Blair is a nodal centre National Coral Reef Research Institute (NCRRI) for monitoring the coral reef research in Indian waters; Recognized research centre for Ph.D., M.Phil., in Ecology, Taxonomy, Zoogeography Pondicherry University Puducherry; recognized field training centre for Islands Biodiversity by Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy (IGNFA) and Tamil Nadu Forest Academy, Coimbatore (TNFA); Green Skill Development Programme (GSDP), MoEF&CC, GOI; training centre under the Accelerate vigyan programme, Science Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science & Technology, GOI; Indian Navy to study the Bird

Hazards studies & Flight safety in Naval Air Stations.

The Andaman and Nicobar Regional Centre, ZSI presently holds 1,70,000 preserved (Dry & Wet) specimens of various faunal group, of which 3500 of 22 faunal group are displayed in its museum for the viewing of researchers, students and general public. The ZSI museum is recently renovated and will be opened by officials of Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change soon. Scientists of this centre have reported more than 20 new species to science from different faunal group, which includes Narcondam Tree Shrew, besides about 900 new records to A&N Islands, India and Southeast Asia from this archipelago.

Recently, the Hon'ble Union Home Ministry had inaugurated the National Repository for Island Faunal Diversity, which hosts the voucher specimens of fauna of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and adjacent southeast Asian countries. These voucher specimens form the basis for research on evolution, speciation, distribution, taxonomy, systematics, ecology and evolutionary biology. Besides, this repository building will also be used as museum through LED display of endemic, endangered fauna of this archipelago.

Andaman & Nicobar Regional Centre, Port Blair has intensively and extensively carried out faunal exploration from Landfall Island, North Andaman to India Point, Great Nicobar Island as a result, reported more than 70 species of birds as a new distributional record to A&N Islands, India and South Asia. This led to Andaman & Nicohar Islands to receive international attention in the East-Asian Austral asian Migratory Flyway.

Dr Sivaperuman also reported many species of Ants, Earthworm, Scorpion, Spiders, Moths, Butterflies, Tree Frog, Freshwater Molluscs, Tree Shrew for the first time from this archipelago. He has successfully participated and conducted research studies in Indian Scientific Expedition to Antarctic during December 2016 - April 2017 to assess the diversity distribution of Birds and Mammals of Southern Ocean & Antarctica and only representative from Andaman & Nicobar Islands

He has provided Bird Guide Training through Directorate of Tourism & Department of Environment & Forests, as the outcome of the training few islanders have chosen as Bird Guide/Bird Watching tourism in this island. Conceptualized and bringing "National Coral Reef Research Institute" to the islands, through Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India which would give recognition to the islands not only Nationally but also Globally.

In addition, the ZSI Regional Centre also proposes to develop state-of-the-art Interpretation Centre to showcase marine biodiversity, Live Aquarium, Coral Museum, Souvenir shops/ cafeteria, and Wi-Fi hotspot in the establishment. The ministry has sanctioned budget grant for construction of the compound wall, and establishment of NCRRI will

Over 100 plus outreach activities have been conducted in the islands through Rajya Sabha TV, local print and mass media, seminars, workshops and webinars for the benefit of students, teachers and general public. The Centre also participated in the Island Tourism Festival in 2018 for the first time in the history of ZSI and had displayed endemic, endangered & threatened animals through LFD and displays disseminated information through pamphlets /

Nicobar illustrates terrestrial and marine faunal diversity of Great Nicobar Biosphere Reserve.

Dr Sivaperuman has Established Molecular Systematics Laboratory in ZSI, Port Blair which is aimed to increase our understanding of eco-evolutionary processes of long-isolated, environmentally diverse and rich biodiversity of this island ecosystem. He has also initiated to creation of ENVIS Centre (Environmental Information System) in ZSI, Port Blair through MoEF&CC, Government of India. Through ENVIS centre the following works will be disseminated, i.e. inventory of authentic information on the Biodiversity of A&N Islands, providing baseline information for the researchers, academicians etc., undertake various application oriented research biodiversity, awareness workshop, seminar to the school, college students and general public. ENVIS Centre will also be helpful to identify an area to promote eco-tourism and to enhance the revenue of government.

India, who have already sealed a semifinal berth, ended the round-robin stage of the fivenation tournament at the top of the standings with 10 points, ahead of Korea (6), Japan (5), Pakistan (2) and hosts Bangladesh

This was India's third win on the trot. Held to a draw by Korea in their lung-opener, the Manpreet Singh-led side turned things around defeating Bangladesh 9-0, while also getting the better of arch-rivals Pakistan before easily overcoming the Japanese challenge.

India's semifinal opponent was yet to be decided.

The dominant victory will be a huge boost for India as they head into the business end of the tournament full of confidence.

They completely outperformed Japan, the Asian Games gold medallists, in all departments.

India dominated the first half. They earned two back-to-back penalty corners within the first six minutes of the thefirst quarter but were unable to convert either. Soon after Japan also wasted a penalty corneras their striker fired the shot wide.

India kept on attacking and received another PC, this time



Hardik Singh injecting the ball to perfection for Harmanpreet to flick it home and give the holders a 1-0 lead.

The scoreline could have been 2-0 towards the end of the first quarter had veteran Lalit Upadhyay not missed a sitter.

Just after the five-minute mark in the second quarter, Japan were handed a PC, India referred the decision but the TV umpire found no conclusive evidence to deny

In the 23rd minute, the trio of Mandeep Singh, Shilanand Lakra and Dilpreet combined well as Dilpreet doubled India's lead.

Japan, too, attacked but the Indian defence foiled their attempts as the Olympic bronze medallists headed into the break with a two-goal lead.

Japan began the second half on the offensive but it was India who scored their third goal courtesy Jaramanpreet's clean strike.

A crucial PC coming their way in the 36th minute, Japan looked to capitalise on the chance but India keeper Suraj Karkera, who shone in the absence of regular custodian P Sreejesh, pulled off a superb save to deny them.

Japan tried to up the ante as they attacked in numbers. With India a man down, Japan looked to create an opportunity with Kenta Tanaka breaking the Indian defence with a solo run, but, once again, Karkera foiled the attack.

Japan continued to test the Indian defence but the backline stood tall.

India inflicted further pain on Japan as Sumit scored in the first minute of the final quarter. Harmanpreet then made it 5-0 by smashing the ball in the top right corner of the goalpost for his second of the match.

Two minutes later — juniors Shamsher and Shilanand — combined beautifully as the former scored India's sixth goal.

Japan tried their best to score but were unable to penetrate the Indian defence. Such was India's dominance that they defended all five penalty corners awarded to their opponents.



# BWF World Championships | Srikanth Loses to Loh Kean Yew, Bags Silver

Spain, Dec. 19: Kidambi Srikanth's fine run in the BWF World badminton Championship ended with a silver-medal finish after he lost the men's singles summit clash to Singapore's Loh Kean Yew in straight games here on Sunday.

Srikanth went down 15-21, 20-22 in 43 minutes.

Former world number one Srikanth lost the first game after leading 9-3, as his opponent from Singapore staged a fine comeback.

The Indian lost the first game in just 16 minutes.

Srikanth fought better in the second game but Yew was too good on the day, emerging the winner.

The 24-year-old Yew stunned world number one and reigning Olympic champion Viktor Axelsen in the first round of the men's singles event at the prestigious championship.

Nevertheless, Srikanth still etched his name in the history books by becoming the first Indian man to reach the finals of the championships after his come-from-behind win over compatriot Lakshya Sen on Saturday.
