Important initiatives of Administration towards development of Islands in various sectors highlighted

Port Blair, Aug. 14

The Lt Governor, A&N Islands, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) greeted the people of the Islands on the auspicious occasion of 75th Independence Day and said, "I bow to all the freedom fighters, whose supreme sacrifices were instrumental in the attainment of the freedom of our country." The Lt Governor said this in his address to the Islanders on the eve of Independence Day broadcast/telecast by AIR/Doordarshan today.

The Lt Governor mentioned that we are celebrating the 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh' marking the completion of 50 years of historic victory in the Indo-Pak war of 1971 and it is a matter of pride for us that on this auspicious occasion, the 'Vijay Jyothi' is in our Islands.

In addition to facing the challenges of COVID-19, the Lt Governor also highlighted some important initiatives of the Administration for the development of these Islands in different sectors. Keeping in mind, the preparedness to tackle the challenges of COVID in future, the Lt Governor remarked that to augment our Health Institutions, oxygen supply will be made available through oxygen pipeline in 30-30 beds in Community Health Centre at Diglipur, Rangat and Car Nicobar. Apart from this, the Forest Corporation Building at Haddo will also be renovated and turned into COVID Facility Centre, he said. Phase-I work of the 50 bedded AYUSH Hospital



has been completed while the work for Phase-II will start soon. The Lt Governor stated that as part of the COVID vaccination programme, 3,14,000 eligible persons have been vaccinated which also include the 'Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups'.

Giving details about different development initiatives in these Islands, the Lt Governor said that under Islands Development Agency Project Phase-I, Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Eco-Tourism Resorts will be developed in Long, Aves, Smith & Ross Island and Shaheed Dweep at an estimated investment of Rs. 700 crores, the response of the RFQ is expected by end of this month. In addition to this, for the 11 PPP projects under Phase -II in North/Middle and South Andaman, the survey and DPR are being prepared by the Consultant appointed by NITI Aayog, the RFQ of which will be issued shortly. All these projects will be ecologically sustainable and constructed under the International Development norms such as GRIHA, LEED, Green Globe

and Star Categorization. 60 percent employment in these projects will be reserved for the youth of these Islands, the Lt Governor added.

The Lt Governor said that there is a proposal for two 'New Greenfield Airports' in A&N Islands, of which, the Aerial LiDAR Survey of one Airport has been completed while the Survey for the second Airport will also be completed this year. The development of 'Water Aerodrome' for the operation of Seaplanes for Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep and Long Island are in the final stage while the site selection process is underway for the development of 'Water Aerodrome' at Port Blair.

For the exploration of Offshore Oil and Natural Gas in Isles, the Lt Governor said Oil India Limited will be taking up Seismic Survey work in two offshore blocks in a day or two.

The Lt. Governor stated that under the 'Har Ghar Nal Scheme', 100 percent work to provide Functional Household Tap Connection (FHTC) to every household in rural areas has been completed. He said with the completion of 'Rutland Water Supply Scheme' about 6.6 MLD water will be made available. Keeping in mind the necessity of Rain Water Harvesting in Port Blair, a 'Blue Pipe' initiative has been started. Under this initiative, community level rain water harvesting structure has been created by taking rain water from the roof tops to the nearest wells of PBMC. The

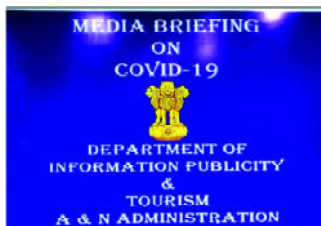

3,25,322 doses of vaccine administered to beneficiaries in Isles so far

1,17,082 eligible persons in the age group of 18 to 44 years inoculated

Port Blair, Aug.14

The safety of the citizens is the foremost priority of the Administration, especially during this pandemic time. To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries is being initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands.

Accordingly, the vaccination began with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with comorbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently



underway.

Meanwhile, the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 3, 25, 322 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 6675 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 4756 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which 4151 beneficiaries were in

the age group of 18-44 years. Similarly, 1838 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 1559 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44.81 beneficiaries were vaccinated in Nicobar District, out of which, 39 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years. A total of 1,17,082 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date, a press release from DHS said.

total storage capacity of Rain Water Harvesting at Raj Niwas including the new Unit has gone upto 15,30,000 ltrs. Informing about the construction of two bridges in NH-4, the Lt Governor said Humphrey Strait Bridge will be completed in another 3 months while the Middle Strait Bridge is expected to be completed by January, 2022.

The Lt Governor mentioned that to promote Tourism and to reduce the traffic congestion, a 1.1KM long bridge will be constructed between Minnie Bay and Mithakhari. Under the proposed 'Andaman Marine Drive Project', Port Blair and North Bay will be connected via Mithakhari Bridge. Under the 'Smart City Mission', the Lt Governor informed that 9 parks are being developed and upgraded in Port Blair. Apart from this, a 'Marine Esplanade' is being developed in the coastal stretch of Chatham to Corbyn's Cove. The phase-I construction work of this project is underway from Marina Park to Flag Point, he said. The Lt Governor said that PBMC area has achieved the ODF++ Certification while the 42 KLD 'Faecal Sludge' and 'Septage Treatment Plant', which are under construction, will be completed soon.

In the Shipping sector, the Lt Governor said, out of the two 500 pax-cum-150 ton capacity cargo vessel, 'MV Sindhu' has joined the shipping fleet on June 9, 2021 while the other Vessel 'MV Nalanda' is expected to join the fleet and provide service by October 15, 2021. On road transport, the Lt Governor said under the OPEX model 40 e-buses have been procured with the help of NTPC. Out of the 40 e-buses, 20 e-buses purchased through UT budget are providing their services while under the Smart City Project, the services of 20 e-buses will be made available soon.

To augment power supply in A&N Islands, the Lt Governor mentioned that a 0.8 MW Containerized DG Set has been installed in Baratang while a 4 MW Floating Solar Power Plant is being established by the Solar Energy Corporation of India at Kalpong, Diglipur. In addition to this, there is also a proposal to establish three 'Wind Generator' of 250 KW by the National Institute of Wind Energy in Car Nicobar. The Lt Governor said under the Smart Meter Project, 76000 Smart Meters will be installed in Isles, out of which, 53,000 Smart Meters have been installed so far. This project will be completed by October, 2021.

In the Agriculture Sector, the Lt Governor stated that A & N Islands is the first UT to get their traditional/default organic area certified as 'Organic' under Large Area Certification of PGS-India Programme. Under this, an area of 14,491 ha of land in Car Nicobar and Nancowrie group of Islands have been certified as organic.

In the Fisheries Sector, the Lt Governor said that as part of 'Seaweed Culture Project' under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana, work is under progress for the establishment of a 'Seed Bank' at Hathi Tapu. He further said for the safe berthing of Fishing Boats, apart from the existing 16 Fish Landing Centres, the construction work of a new FLC is under progress at Teressa.

Concluding his speech, the Lt Governor expressed his gratitude to the Health Care Professionals, Frontline Workers, Corona Warriors, the Member of Parliament, NGOs and all those people, through whose tireless efforts, we have been able to control the infection of Corona in the Islands. The Lt Governor expressed his gratitude to the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, all officers and employees, Andaman and Nicobar Command, Coast Guard and other organizations for their selfless service. He also congratulated the recipients of LG's Commendation Certificate and expressed the hope that in future also they will continue to set new records in their field of work.

The Lt Governor has once again appealed to the Islanders to strictly follow all the guidelines of COVID-19 and get vaccinated in time so as to ensure the safety of themselves and their family members.

can market their services and access information and other benefits. CLC will act as a 'one-stop shop' for those seeking services from the informal sector as well as for the urban poor promoting their services and products. The CLC will be positioned as a resource centre for those seeking information relating to employment and skills training opportunities etc. The centre will give the poor access to information on market demand, skill training programmes offered and placement opportunities. For those seeking skills training, wage employment or aiming to establish and sustain self-employment ventures, the Livelihood Centres



can facilitate necessary guidance, counseling and technical support.

During the CLC inauguration ceremony, about 11 women SHGs formed under DAY-NULM namely Win, Victory, Naveen, Smart, Sigaram, Sanjaya, U d h a y a m , I n d r a d h a n u s h displayed their products and expressed their

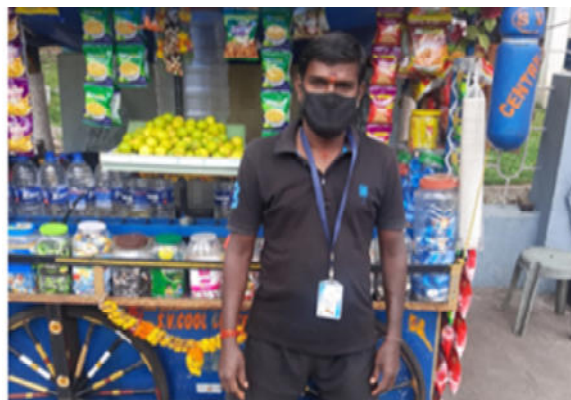

ANIIMS for YOU

"CORONASOMNIA": Covid-19 and Insomnia*-Vikhyata Gautam (MBBS Final Yr.), Dr. Sudip Deb, ANIIMS*

For the past one and half year, the corona virus pandemic has been discussed around the world, in news, on social media, among friends & family circle extensively, so much so that it has led some people into feeling anxious and worried, even hopeless about the future. This hopelessness has seeped into their regular life, making it difficult for them to function and even sleep at night! please note, it is not the virus that is causing insomnia, rather the circumstances are causing it. If you are suffering from three or more sleepless nights a week over time, you may be suffering from acute (or short-term) insomnia, which, if not addressed, can become chronic insomnia. These changes are mainly associated with elevated rates of emotional symptoms.

According to the National Institutes of Health, Insomnia is a common sleep disorder appearing with Covid 19. With insomnia, you may have trouble falling asleep, staying asleep, or getting good quality sleep. This happens even though you have the time and the right environment to sleep well. Insomnia interferes with your daily activities and may make you feel un-rested or sleepy during the day. Short-term insomnia may be caused by stress or changes in your schedule or environment. It can last for a few days or weeks. Chronic (long-term) insomnia occurs three or more nights a week, lasts more than three months, and cannot be fully explained by another health problem or a medicine.

Causes of insomnia may be:

- Worry about loss of job
- Stress about financial instability
- Fear of the virus
- Fear of getting infection
- Limited or no work-life balance
- Constant worry of improving immunity and health
- Disturbed sleep schedules
- Uncertainty about future
- Relationship crisis
- Increased addictive activities
- Increased tea, caffeine intake
- Increased time spent on electronic appliances etc

If you think that you might have either form of insomnia following COVID 19, it is important to get professional help with it. If you are just having trouble sleeping on occasional nights, and you are feeling okay during the day, you might want to try following these suggestions:

1. Don't panic

Remember that we all have sleepless nights, and that we all manage to function the following day. Worrying about sleeping and "sleep efforting" will not help - infact, they'll make it harder to sleep. If you don't already have chronic insomnia the next suggestions should help you let your body do what it does naturally, so that you can get a good night's sleep the next night, or maybe one after that.

2. Structure your days

It is important to maintain a regular, structured schedule in our lives, including not just when we have our meals, but also when we exercise, when we work, and when we go to sleep and get up. The pandemic has altered structure for most of us or taken it away altogether. Whereas you might once have had a morning routine of getting the kids up and ready for school, getting dressed, getting everyone out the door, picking up your morning coffee, and getting to work at a certain time, none of that holds true during the pandemic when we're working at home and our children are going to school from home as well. Multiply that by all of the structure and routine that is part of our normal lives - all of which is missing right now - and of course our bodies and our psyches are suffering. This is one of the problems that retirees sometimes have. The structure they have lived by for forty or fifty years (or more) is gone. We think retirement should be unstructured, but in fact, even if you are playing all day long, you need a structure to your days - and nights. Try to exercise at the same time, or close to it, every day. Try to eat regular meals - grazing all day long is not good. It's also important to put some boundaries on your work. When you are at home, it might seem that you can just keep going; but it's important to have divisions between work and relaxation, just as you would if you went into an office every day.

3. Create a "Buffer Zone" before you go to bed

According to Richard Barth, a sleep specialist in San Francisco, part of your daily structure should be a 'buffer zone' that you set up "approximately an hour before bedtime where you wind down, brush teeth, put on pj's, stop work, get off the computer and other electronics, etc." So try to create a buffer zone before going for bed, try to relax, listen some good music, brush your teeth, remind your sweet spent past times.

4. Set and maintain a regular wake up time

While we have all read plenty about going to bed at the same time and getting a set amount of sleep every night. Wake time is another single most important structure. Waking up at different times throughout the week is the equivalent of social jet lag. If one day you take a plane from the east coast to the Midwest, say New York to Chicago, and stayed over one night and flew back to New York; and stayed there for one night and flew to Los Angeles; and stayed there for one night and flew back to New York. Your sleep would be disrupted. And that's what happens when you get up at 6 am some days, and 8 am others, and 10 am or noon others. Your body reacts to being awakened at different times over the course of a week in the same way that it would be being in all of those different time zones in the same period of time.

5. Don't worry so much about how many hours you sleep

Many of us don't know how much sleep we need." We've been told that we need 7-9 hours of sleep a night, but the data is not so clear. The amount of sleep that an individual needs differs greatly.

6. Don't make up for lost sleep

There is a chemical called adenosine that builds up in our bodies during the day to make us sleep at night. If you sleep later in the morning to make up for lost night time sleep, you don't give your body a chance to build up the adenosine to sleep for the next night. It's okay to nap, for a short time (like 20 minutes) in the afternoon, when there is a natural dip in energy. But it should be short - a power nap - so that you don't rob your body of the adenosine it needs for the night to come.

If you let yourself do something you enjoy, instead of lying in bed trying to chase sleep, your body will naturally start to get sleepy. Your eyes will start to close and you can go back to bed and fall asleep. And if you don't, that's fine, you'll function the next day and the adenosine will build back up in your body so that you will sleep the next night, or maybe the night after. But if you schedule a work activity when you're supposed to be sleeping, you give your awake time a purpose. You don't want to start depending on being awake in the middle of the night to get your work done." Okay, so no 3 am classes. But doing a puzzle or an art project, watching a movie or reading a book, even if you don't fall asleep, is fine, as long as you don't try to make up the sleep later. Get up and get started at your regular time, and your body will build up the chemicals it needs to put you to sleep in the next night or two.

7. Keeping mobile phone, laptop away

There is evidence that blue light from electronics can impact your circadian rhythm, keeping you wide awake when you're supposed to be feeling tired. Stay away from mobile phones and laptops. Avoid net surfing just before bedtime.

8. No caffeine before bed

Caffeine from tea and coffee can stay in the body for up to eight hours. Many people think green tea helps, but that's not true. Alcohol does the same thing to your body.

9. Having a gap between meals and sleep time

It is good to have a gap between meals and sleep time. It allows your body to digest the food before you sleep.

10. Don't look at the clock

Set an alarm and then turn the clock and sleep. Watching the minutes go by can become an additional stressor.

Take home message!

Troubles in sleeping during the pandemic are normal and, at least evolutionarily, adaptive, since not sleeping was historically a healthy response to danger in the environment. The worries, stress, lifestyle changes, and shifts in our social and work life that have accompanied the virus all contribute to some sleepless nights for almost all of us. Following the steps above can help you override that innate response and get some better shuteye; but if they don't work for you, if you're still struggling with frequent insomnia, and if you're still trying to effort yourself to sleep, it's probably worth your while to consider getting evaluated and treated by your doctor.

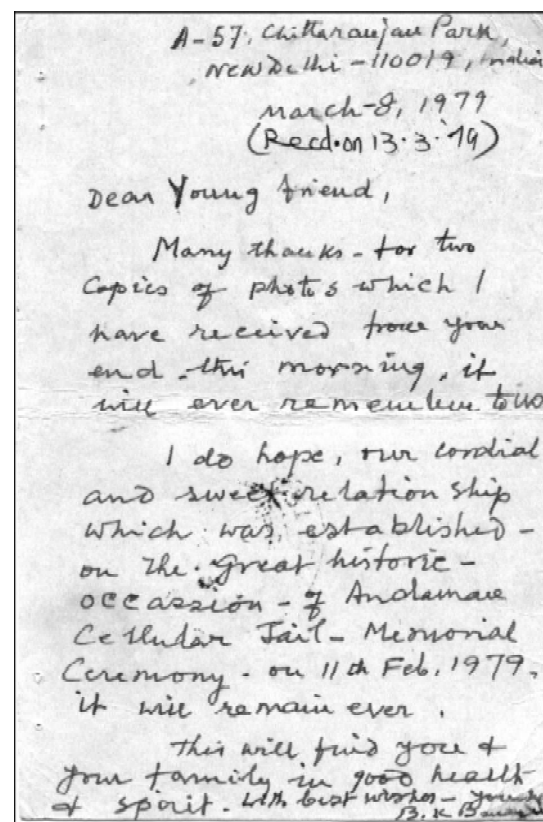
We are forever indebted to our freedom fighters for freeing us from the colonial bonds of the British. As a free nation India is today stepping into its 75th independence anniversary year with great joy and hope for brighter future. I realized the untold torture and unbearable sufferings the freedom fighters faced when I visited the notorious Cellular Jail of Andamans. And it was so hard to complete the book 'Penal Settlement in Andamans' by R.C. Majumdar that detailed the horrible life of freedom fighters since India's First War of Independence (Sepoy Mutiny) in 1857 at the penal settlement there. Hence Andamans is referred as 'Mukti Tirtha' (Holy Place of Salvation) in the annals of our freedom struggle.

So I consider myself blessed to be present at the declaration ceremony of Cellular Jail as National Memorial. This historic event took place in Port Blair on 11th February 1979. Befittingly it was declared open by the then Prime Minister, Shri Morarji Desai, a strict Gandhian and a freedom fighter himself. The occasion gave me the unforgettable opportunity to meet some freedom fighters, who all had been invited from all over the nation for the occasion, including those incarcerated elsewhere besides the Cellular Jail as well. Speechless, I watched them with respect and awe. Overwhelmed by their presence, I lingered there clicking hesitantly till sunset when the jail was illuminated. Luckily, I had bought a small camera just a month back as a new year gift to myself. I was again at the National Memorial the next morning to watch with wonder a TV Crew (Doordarshan was the one & only channel then) filming the freedom fighters.

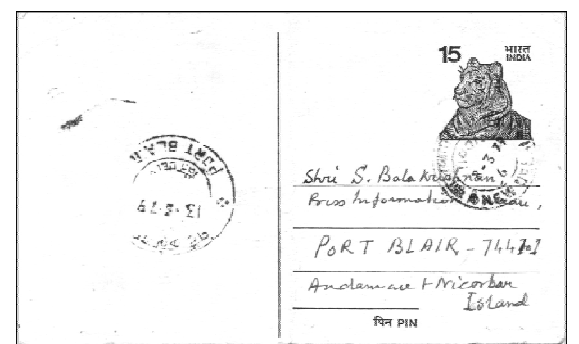
Many freedom fighters had come with their spouse and I was attracted towards an elderly couple. I later learnt that he was Shri Shatipur Sen of the famous Chittagong Armoury Raid case, and his wife; but he was not imprisoned at Cellular Jail. Chatting with them (at left in the photo) was Shri B.M. Bose, also a freedom fighter. Yet another was Dr. Bhupal Bose involved in the 'Sir Charles David, Police Commissioner, Calcutta, attempt case'; he was incarcerated in Cellular Jail. A veteran revolutionary, he was a close associate of Netaji. I clicked Baba Prithvi Singh Azad as he was signing the visitors' book. He was one of the founders of the revolutionary Ghadar Party and was sentenced for 'Lahore Conspiracy Case' and interned in Cellular Jail (1915 & 1921).

As I was deeply immersed in capturing the event and personalities, an elderly person tapped my shoulder and requested for prints of two specific shots that I had clicked. He introduced himself as freedom fighter B.K. Banerjee [Bejoy Krishna Banerjee/Chakrabarti] incarcerated in Cellular Jail. Taking this as an opportunity to serve a freedom fighter, I promptly sent him copies of those snaps, just those two snaps. How stingy of me! He duly acknowledged my letter. This letter from a freedom fighter tops my prestigious collection of correspondence. He wrote to me from his Chittaranjan Park residence in New Delhi on 8th March 1979 so promptly and very immediately after he got my letter just that morning and posted it as well on that very same day; I received his reply on 13th March after five days of travel from Delhi to Calcutta and then to Port Blair by flight -

"Dear Young friend,

Many thanks for two copies of photos which I have received from your end this morning; it will ever remember to us.

I do hope our cordial and sweet relationship which was established on the great historic occasion of Andaman Cellular Jail (National) Memorial Ceremony on 11th Feb. 1979, it will remain ever.

This will find you & your family in good health & spirit. With best wishes

B.K. Banerjee"

If I remember correctly, perhaps it was he who identified the freedom fighters I was clicking. But out of stupidity or what, I did not photograph him. How unjust of me! Should not I be deported to Kala Paani (the Andamans) and imprisoned in Cellular Jail?

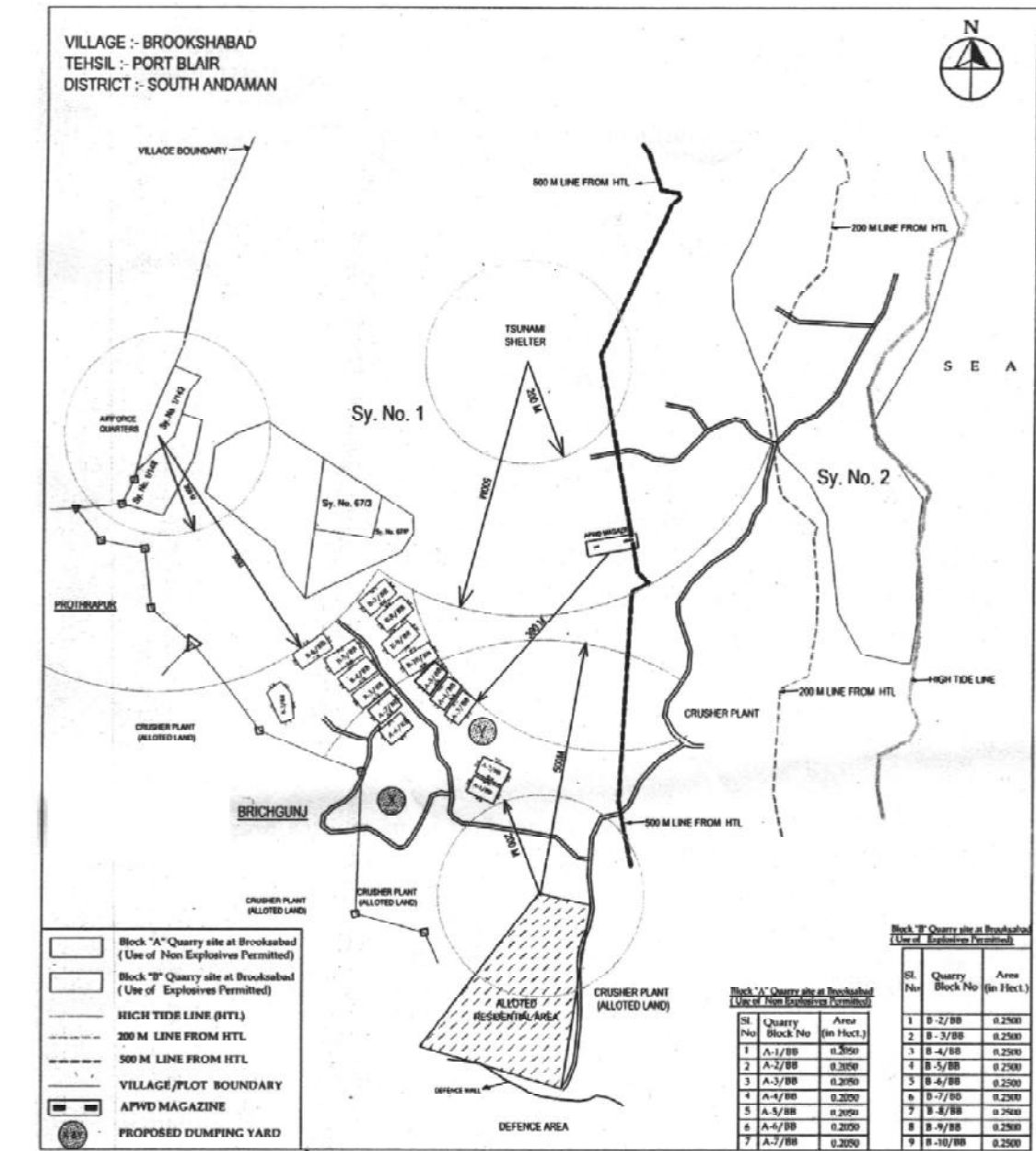

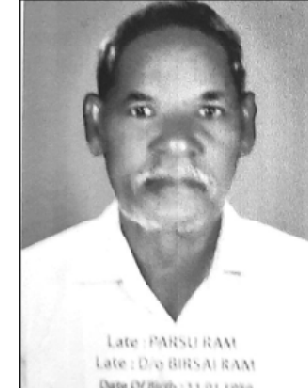
