examined and investigated with blood investigation and CT Scan of abdomen and chest and found to have cancerous growth arising from the stomach. He was further evaluated with Upper GI endoscopy and Biopsy was taken from the growth which was confirmed as Adenocarcinoma arising from the pylorus of the stomach. He was planned for a major laparoscopic subtotal resection of the stomach with reconstruction. A team of Specialist Doctors headed by Dr. Saji Vargheese, HoD Department of Surgery, Dr. Anil, HoD Anaesthesia, ANIIMS / GB Pant Hospital on 25/08/2022 performed a total laparoscopic subtotal

D2 resection of the stomach containing the cancerous growth followed by reconstruction of the GI Tract namely Gastrojejunostomy. The surgery was performed through 5 key holes (ports) lasting for 4½ hours. Post operatively, patient was shifted to Surgical ICU and recovered well and started oral intake on the 4th day after surgery. The patient was discharged on 10th day post operation. Following discharge, the patient was called after 3 weeks and was started on Adjuvant Chemotherapy and completed 2 cycles and the patient is doing extremely well and is on normal diet. ### Making G20 relevant

The ongoing G20 leaders' summit in Bali is of special significance to India. Tomorrow, Indonesian President Joko Widodo will formally ask India to take over G20 presidency. From next month, India will officially assume the presidency, host next year's G20 meetings and most importantly set the agenda for the next annual leaders' summit. G20 is a unique global body. Comprising 19 countries and the EU, it represents 85% of global GDP and 66% of the world's population. In terms of composition, it's well represented.

Formed in 1999 in the wake of the Asian financial crisis, it got its left in 2008 when the G20 leaders' summit was added in the midst of the challenges posed by the global financial crisis. Designed to be a flexible body, without a permanent secretariat, decisions are based on consensus. It was most effective in 2008 and 2009, when coordination in policymaking mitigated the economic fallout of the financial crisis and also laid the platform for subsequent agreements on sharing tax data to curb tax evasion. Since then, the core goal of improving the economic policy environment has expanded to tackling climate change and terrorism, among other things. But recent results are disappointing.

India has the opportunity to get the G20 back on track. It's far too important a platform to be allowed to sink into irrelevance like some other global governance bodies with a permanent secretariat. Framing an appropriate agenda that can be realised through concrete measures will bring back the spirit of 2008-09. Given the last decade's failures with an ever-expanding agenda, it's best to stick to the founding aim of creating a more positive environment for the global economy.

The long-term implications of the strategic rivalry between US and China, and the events since 2020 have cast a shadow on global trade. Dismantling protectionism was perhaps the single most important reason that more than 1 billion people globally escaped extreme poverty in the three decades before Covid. India's G20 presidency can contribute to preserving those gains and finding a way to build on it. An agenda that revolves around preserving an enabling environment for world trade is more likely to meet with success than one with issues where solutions require painstaking negotiations over years. A unique feature of G20 is the rotating presidency. This is India's moment – and it must make something substantive of it.

# TWITTER, META AND NOW AMAZON: WHAT'S CAUSING THE LAYOFF SPREE IN TECH INDUSTRY

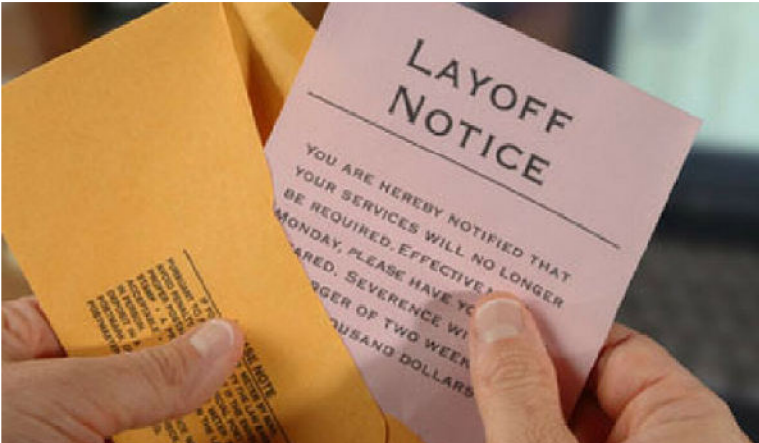
Barely days after Twitter first announced its mass layoff, which saw a half of its workforce being fired, Meta followed suit. The company's founder Mark Zuckerberg said he has to let go of 13 per cent of its workforce, which is more than 11,000 people, after realizing that his decision to increase investments did not pan out the way he expected.

Before the shock wore off, Amazon and Disney have trodden the same path. While Amazon has decided to lay off thousands of employees to cut losses, Disney has detailed its plan to review spending at all divisions, cut costs and freeze hiring after its quarterly earnings plummeted to a whopping \$1.5 billion loss.

While industry experts predict the gloom will change once the economic situation improves, fact remains that these big MNCs took the risk of growing too soon.

Who all laid off their staff?  
Not just Twitter and Meta, but many other tech giants too resorted to firing sprees. According to The Kobeissi Letter, a platform that does weekly analysis of global capital markets, this is the biggest wave of

tech layoffs since 2001. While Apple has resorted to a hiring freeze, companies like Intel (20%), Snapchat (20%), Lyft (13%) and US-based video-sharing website



Cameo (25%) too have resorted to sacking people. In India too, ed-tech giant Byju's sacked 1,100 staff earlier in the year. As per the data by Trueup Tech, a tech layoff tracker, there have been 1149 layoffs at tech companies with 183,832 people impacted so far in

2022. What caused this? Most companies attribute the layoffs to the aftermath of the Covid crisis. As Zuckerberg puts it, "At the start of Covid, the world rapidly moved online and the surge of e-commerce led to outsized revenue growth. Many people predicted this would be a permanent acceleration that would continue even after the pandemic ended. I did too, so I made the decision to significantly increase our investments. Unfortunately, this

did not play out the way I expected." His public statement added that he was extending our hiring freeze through Q1 with a small number of exceptions. Like Meta, most companies enjoyed the initial boom and hoped the trend would go on, as Zuckerberg himself confessed. None were prepared for the lull that ensued once the Covid wave subsided and people began going back to the offices. Hoping the surge would stay, most tech giants aggressively hired people, the best in the market, for huge pay packets as competition became fierce. Even Twitter founder Jack Dorsey said he grew the company too quickly, while taking responsibility for the current crisis in Twitter. Then there is the recession to blame. With recession predicted to hit hard in the backdrop of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, many tech

giants are bracing for the impact by resorting to layoffs and tightening their belts. The first step is to put the brakes on hiring, followed by cutting the workforce. The current increase in interest rates, high fuel costs and supply chain issues have only accelerated the problem. Despite expectations, the prediction is that it might take some time for the situation to improve. Experts attribute this to the macroeconomic factors created by the trend. Besides, many are still uncertain about the right balance between growth and profitability. This was evident during the last few years when the tech giants balanced the investors' cash flow by pouring it into expansion, focusing mostly on hiring and acquisitions. "The pressure is to just spend the money quick enough so you can grow fast enough to justify the kinds of investments V.C.s want to make," Eric Rachlin, an entrepreneur, told The New York Times. But the silver lining is that the tech industry will rebound as many are starting to invest in new technologies and software. - Source : The week

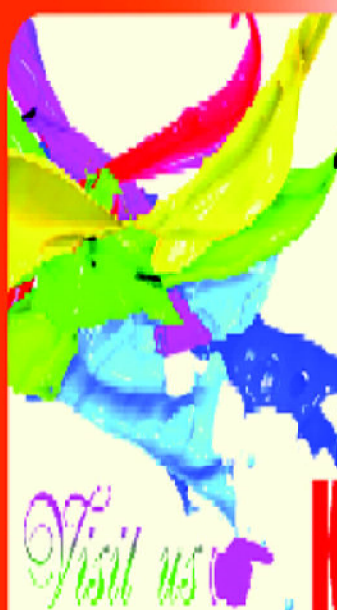

On arrival at Coimbatore on 7<sup>th</sup> Nov, 2022 grand welcome accorded to visiting team by CCMC. Thereafter a networking was held at The Residency Hotel with Coimbatore City Municipal Corporation (CCMC) officials in afternoon (3:30 P.M. - 4:30 P.M.) with a purpose to introduce the Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) delegates to the study tour and know their expectations from this visit. Day-2 of the tour visiting team had meeting with Coimbatore City



waste processing Unit, Coimbatore and understood the process for disposing and making the chicken waste useful.

The final destination of the visiting team in Coimbatore was Pollachi Municipality. There the team interacted with officials of the civic body and visited Wet & dry waste management facility at Pollachi Municipality. The team was welcomed by Smt. N. Shyamala, Chairperson, Pollachi



Municipal Corporation (CCMC) Mayor, Dy. Mayor and Dy. Commissioner at the hotel and all the officials of PBMC & CCMC shared their views during the breakfast in the Hotel. After taking breakfast, all officials went to the field for understand CCMC activities.

The first destination of visiting team was door-to-door collection system at STV Nagar, Ward No-27 North Zone where Dy. Municipal Commissioner and



his team explained the door-to-door collection system and about source segregation. Visiting team was informed that one trolley cover approx. 130 households and per capita waste generation in the city is 450 grams. Sanitary/Domestic Hazardous Waste is being collected by CCMC separately and E-waste collected once in a week. The timing of waste collection is 7.00 am to 10.0 am and waste is being transported to Transfer station through small vehicle. In narrow road, the households are being collected in Push Carts and in big roads area, through Tata Ace.

The next destination for day-2 of the tour was Transfer station at Peelamedu. There CCMC Officials informed that there are 03 transfer station in the city and daily 105 vehicles come at the station, generally they are doing 02-03 trip per day so approx. 250-300 MT waste is being transported to Vellalore plant on daily basis in wet, dry and mixed form.

The final destination of the days tour for the team was Micro composting Centre Ondipudur-cum-dry waste management facility. The team was told that Coimbatore Corporation had given permission to the Residents' Awareness Association of Coimbatore and Alagana Kovai to run the micro compost centre (MCC) in Ondipudur. MCC received 05 bns

of dry waste a day, collected from wards in the East Zone. Fifty per cent of the waste received was of the recyclable type and the rest was converted as refuse derived fuel to be sold to industries. The workers at the dry waste shed segregated the waste into 16 categories - various types of paper, plastics based on density, glass, metals, rubber, etc. They bundled the papers to be sold to paper and cardboard industries for recycling, recyclable plastics to plastic industries and non-recyclable plastics to industries to be used as fuel. The organisations had engaged another set of laborer's who shredded garden waste to sell big twigs as firewood and convert small twigs and leaves as briquette to be sold as fuel. The third shed for processing wet waste. The 100% unadulterated wet waste that the Corporation workers deliver after collection from bulk waste generators in East Zone is shredded and dried.

The dried waste, was again, converted to briquette to be sold as fuel to industries, the sources said and added that the two organisations had tied-up with industries to sell the fuel. While shredding and drying the waste they get slurry which they would use in a biogas plant to fire a blower used for drying the waste. The construction cost of the centres is 69.00 Lakhs include some machinery cost. They are

selling the biomass in Rs. 3500 per ton to boiler unit of the city. On Day-3, Team first visited Coimbatore Integrated Waste Management Company Private Ltd. (CIWMCPCL). It is managing the Municipal Solid Waste for Coimbatore City Municipal Corporation, Producing Good quality of City Compost & RDF by following the Unique Composting Technique of Windrow Composting.

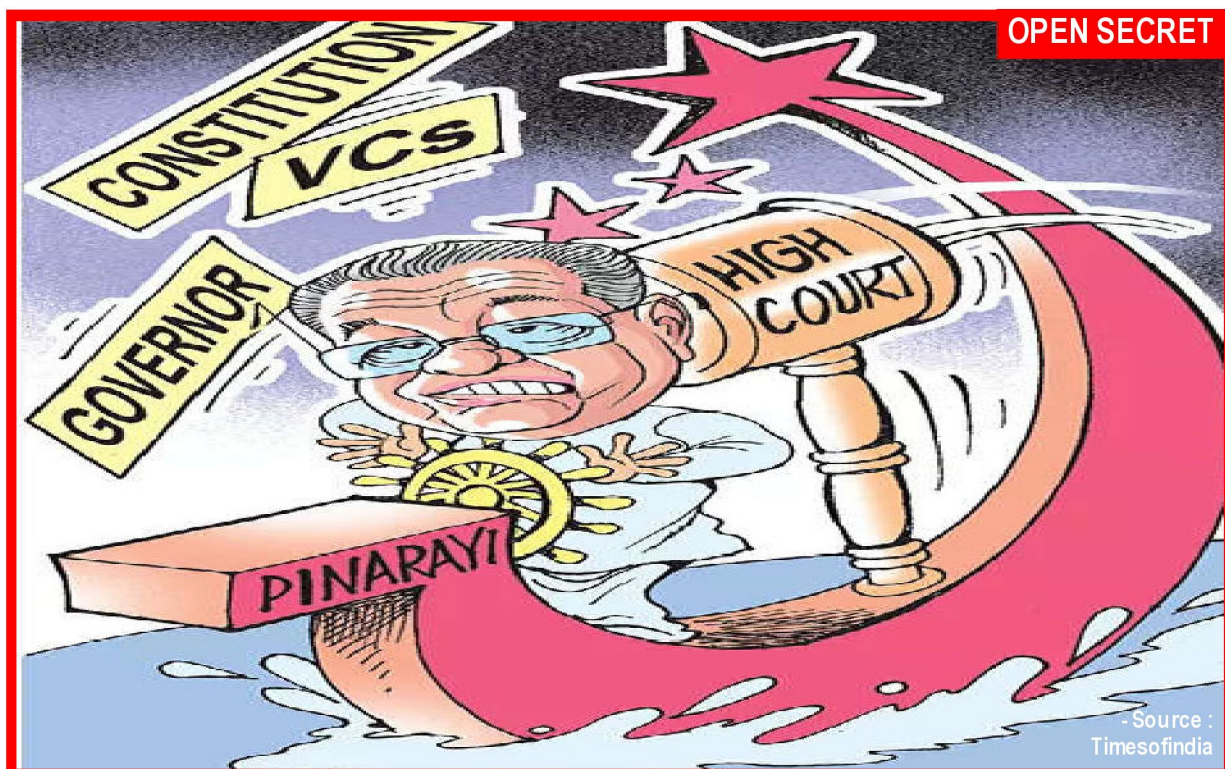
CIWMCPCL has commissioned the Vellalore compost plant presently handling the 700-850 Tones Per Day (TPD) fresh Municipal Solid Waste daily. Out of 700-850 TPD received, almost 45-50% is (approx. 300-425 MT) organic waste. The plant is having a compost plant with WINDROW Processing Technology and producing 60-70 MT of compost every day. The approximate construction cost of the plant is 16 Cr. and plant transporting the RDF to nearest Cement plant in un-shredded and shredded form. The compost is being sold to farmers at the rate of Rs. 2-3 per kg. They are also planning to increase the production capacity as per requirement.

Nest destination of the visit was Vellalore Dump yard and Biomining of dump site, Coimbatore. The project was awarded to Ahmedabad based company M/s DJG. This project involves clearing of 9.14 lakhs cubic meters of legacy waste at dump yard. CMC has cleared 50% of the legacy waste dumped at Vellalore dump yard and reclaimed around 30 of the 66-acre land. The project was taken up in 2022 and the cost of the project is Rs. 60 Cr. after segregation of plastic waste, the legacy waste is being sent to cement factories at Ariyalur to be used as Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF). The daily processing capacity of at dumping site is 2000 TPD.

## Xi-Biden meeting concludes, US warned of crossing red line over Taiwan

In sunny Bali, history was made. President Joe Biden came face to face with President Xi Jinping, for the first time since he won the presidential election, at a time when tensions between the two countries have been high. Signalling that the relations may be slightly less frosty, Biden said Beijing and Washington "shared responsibility" to share with the

world that they can "manage our differences, prevent competition from becoming conflict."

"We share responsibility, in my view, to show that China and the United States can manage our differences, prevent competition from becoming anything ever near conflict, and find ways to work together on urgent global issues that require our mutual cooperation," he said.

The two leaders spoke for three hours according to reports. In a press conference, Biden described the conversation as "open and honest." He also said that he was not looking for any conflict.

The meeting also comes at a time both the leaders have emerged stronger

domestically. Xi has proven he is the strongest leader in China after he was elected for a third term as general secretary of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP). Biden has also redefined history by retaining the Senate. And both leaders will be playing to their own audience.

The meeting may have been the most watched handshake of the G20, but apart from setting the stage—the pricklier outcomes are yet to be sorted out. Biden said that the two leaders will "lay out what each of our red lines are" over Taiwan. According to reports in the Chinese media, President Xi warned Biden of crossing the "red line" over Taiwan. The meeting of the two Presidents has certainly set the stage for perhaps a less confrontational relationship. However, it won't be easy. "It's important for heads of state to speak directly," said

Speaker Nancy Pelosi after her visit to Taiwan. "There is a lack of trust in this relationship. If Xi and Biden send the signal that it's time to resume communications, hopefully, this will trickle down to the lower levels."

While the Xi-Biden meeting can be crossed off the list, there is no clarity about whether Prime Minister Narendra Modi will meet the Chinese President. It is a hectic trip for the Prime Minister with 20 engagements planned. "The Bali summit comprises three working sessions at the leader's level where the prime minister will be participating. These include the sessions on food and energy security, a session on digital transformation, and a session on health," said Vinay Kwatra at a press briefing in the Capital. India will take on the chair of the G20 from December.
