Security Guards made to perform office works at GBPH

Port Blair, Dec 13: It may sound weird, but security guards engaged through an outsourcing agency are being forced to perform office works at the GB Pant Hospital here. Mandated to perform watch and ward duties at the referral hospital, the security guards are reportedly made to perform duties of making register entries of patients visiting the hospital owing to shortage of office staff at the hospital, as per reports.

In the recent years, private security guards have become the frontline in the country. However, Security Guards mostly hired from outsourcing firms are meagerly paid



despite being made to work for more than 12 hours a day. Amid such a situation, forcing them to perform office related works is drawing criticism from the health department, as per reports.

"I was looking for job after losing one at a private firm. I came across an advertisement put up by a private security agency looking to hire guards. I made a call to the number, was asked to come for an interview the next day, and was hired. Despite a contract executed,

I am lowly paid and work for 12 hour shift on a daily basis. We are even not paid incentives or bonus. In the recent few days, many of my colleagues at the GB Pant Hospital have been asked to make patient entry in the official register. This is not the nature of work that we are supposed to perform. Who will be held responsible in case of any error committed by security guard for performing such duties? The health authorities should take steps to appoint office staff for such duties and leave us for watch and ward duties," said a security guard posted at GB Pant Hospital on conditions of anonymity.

WHO must take care

Two weeks after the South African medical authorities alerted the world about the Omicron variant of SARS-CoV2, there's no clarity about the magnitude of the threat posed by the latest mutation to the pathogen. While early reports indicate that the variant causes mild infections, there are understandable fears about its transmissibility and potential to evade vaccines. Travel restrictions have not stopped Omicron from dispersing in more than 50 countries. The WHO has criticised such restrictions but at the same time, its officials have talked about the highly infectious potential of the virus. Instead of exercising a calming influence, the premier health body's messaging on Omicron seems to have added to the sense of uncertainty.

At different points in the past two weeks, WHO officials have given statements that make joining the dots difficult. For instance, they have said that Omicron could "change the course of the pandemic", and it could lead to vaccine hoarding. And, then revised their initial surmise about the transmissibility of the variant by saying that the "exact impact of Omicron is still difficult" to ascertain. Much of these discrepancies are, of course, because the science on Omicron is an evolving one and the global health body is right in underlining a safety-first approach, especially when it's about adopting the well-known Covid protocols, including masking and observing physical distance. However, the experience of the past two years shows that unequivocal messaging is amongst the key essentials of managing the social and economic fallout of the pandemic. The new variant has emerged at a time when the virus seems to be taking divergent trajectories in different parts of the world. Hospitals in large parts of the Western world are overburdened by the ravages of the Delta variant, while the pathogen seems to be at a low ebb in India, where schools and educational institutions are gradually beginning to resume physical classes. At such a juncture, it is critical that global health authorities carefully measure every statement against the prevailing science. The message of caution should be delivered while taking care to do nothing that might sound alarmist. It may not always be possible to avoid discrepancies in statements. But a careful explanation of the changed circumstances — the evolution of the state of knowledge, for instance — would do much to reassure people in a pandemic-weary world. Since the SARS outbreak in the early years of this century, it has been evident that the world requires an efficient alert system when confronted with microbes that do not respect national boundaries. The WHO is the only agency equipped to take up this challenge. It must improve its ways of messaging.

FLIPKART AIMS TO INCREASE CONSUMER TRACTION AND LOYALTY WITH INVESTMENT IN NINJACART

Flipkart is reportedly in talks to invest in fresh produce e-grocery start-up Ninjacart. Though there is no official confirmation of the funding talks between the two, media reports claim that the investment could be close to \$100 million. The funding by Flipkart is expected to push the value of Ninjacart to around \$750-800 million from the current \$500 million.

If this deal goes through, this would be Flipkart's biggest funding in any start-up. In 2019, Flipkart and Walmart had invested around \$30 million in Ninjacart.

Experts point out that e-commerce players have been showing a lot of interest in customer focus and hyper local delivery. "All the e-commerce players, including Flipkart, Reliance and Amazon, have made huge investments in getting consumer traction and loyalty. This segment, which is currently in the urban areas, will witness huge spurt in investments in semi-urban areas and is therefore a sun rise vertical. Flipkart is an established player and addition of Ninjacart to its stable would boost consumer confidence and market penetration. It rounds up the ecosystem and brings it closer to consumers," observed Subramanyam

Sreenivasiah, CEO at Ascent HR. According to experts, there are mainly two ways to look at this strategic investment by Flipkart in Ninjacart—the B2B (business to business) ecosystem that Ninjacart is in and getting a decent hold of that segment. "If one looks at the B2B ecosystem which is quite large, there are mainly two players in the fruits and

Vegetable (F&V) segment—BigBasket and Ninjacart. So, such an investment by Flipkart is a way of entry into that space which has always been a tough space to enter. The other reason probably is the support for Flipkart Quick which is in the Quick Commerce space. Here is where the competition is and every one needs to build strong supply chain delivery

capabilities. This is exactly where the vendor ecosystem of Ninjacart can come in handy. So, with this investment, Flipkart is killing two birds with one shot. Probably, I think, this could not have come at a better time for both Ninjacart and Flipkart," Sahya Pramod, CEO Kayess Square Consulting Private Limited, told THE WEEK.

Some experts say that the strategic investment by Flipkart in Ninjacart is to strengthen the supply chain network for faster and reliable delivery. "The pandemic has shifted the buying behaviors of consumers. Many people have started buying online and the e-commerce players have to win in the confidence of customers to retain them and attract new customers. Hence, players like Amazon, Flipkart and new players like Meesho are in a race to expand their customer base. They are working on multiple fronts, and faster and reliable delivery is a key aspect. Reverse logistics is another crucial component in their strategy to win the race. They are also trying to expand their scope of service by leveraging the supply chain and the customer base," remarked Aditya Narayan Mishra, director and CEO, CIEL HR Services.

Market analysts also feel that such investment will change the e-commerce ecosystem in the country. "Flipkart investment in Ninjacart is symptomatic of the fact that top e-commerce players are either investing or making acquisitions of downstream e-commerce players. The emergence of Q-commerce (quick commerce) players is a fertile ground for such possibilities to emanate," pointed out Alok Shende of Mumbai-based Ascentus Consulting.

Disposing of 162 bank recovery cases, the involved amount of Rs. 17,50,26,641.67/- have been settled at Rs. 12,11,22,000/- (Rupees Twelve Crores Eleven Lakhs Twenty Two Thousand only) thus paying a benefit of Rs. 5,39,04,641.67/- to the bank loan customers. Asum of Rs. 9,82,100/- was realized on the spot. Setting up a landmark disposal of 162 bank recovery cases, Bench No. 1 disposed of a total of 144 pre-litigation cases with a settlement amount of Rs. 11,61,16,000/- benefiting the bank borrowers as at large.

Disposing of 02 BSNL recovery cases, the involved amount of Rs. 2,56,262/- have been settled at Rs. 22,000/- thus paying a benefit of Rs. 2,34,262/- to the customers. An amount of Rs. 12,00,00/- was realized on the spot. Disposing of 1468 Criminal cases a sum of Rs. 96,650/- was realized

as fine amount. In Mayabunder, one bench was constituted and 30 pre-litigation cases were taken up out of which 26 were disposed and settled at Rs. 55,77,000/- out of which Rs. 3,07,00,00/- was paid on the spot. 71 cases pending in different courts were taken up out of which 33 criminal compoundable cases were disposed of and a fine amount of Rs. 31,000/- was realized.

IN CONVERSATION

What did India's military mobilisation after Parliament attack achieve?

A day after the attack on Parliament on December 13, 2001, the Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) met in the presence of the three service chiefs. It was decided to give a befitting reply to Pakistan. The full-scale mobilisation of armed forces was decided, which was the first since the 1971 Indo-Pak war. Named Operation Parakram, the deployment began on December 15 and was completed in the first week of January 2002.

Twenty years down the line, a section of the military believes that Operation Parakram was aimed to send a stern message to Pakistan. Like the 1999 Kargil war—when it was conveyed to Pakistan that violating the border would not succeed—Operation Parakram was India's message against terrorism or proxy war by Rawalpindi (Pakistan Army's headquarters).

In response to India's mobilisation, Pakistan also moved its men and machines, and close to 8 lakh troops near the Line of Control were deployed within months by both sides. But eventually, it panned out differently because nobody wanted a warlike situation between two nuclear-armed countries.

A year-long, massive deployment ended without a conflict. But, it gave many lessons to the Indian military.

Operation Parakram exposed the Indian military's slow pace of mobilisation compared with Pakistan, which compromised New Delhi's edge. The Indian military took much more time to mobilise than Pakistan. The Pakistan Army's commitments are nearer to the border while the country is also smaller. By the time, our strike corps or reserves could reach close to the LoC, it gave enough

time for Pakistani forces to prepare well themselves.

A senior lieutenant-general, who was commanding a corps on the western border during Operation Parakram, told THE WEEK that India's advantage of early mobilisation was neutralised by Pakistan due to the latter's proximity to the border. And, to avoid such a situation, the concept of 'Cold Start' was initiated. This was the biggest lesson for the Indian Army from Operation Parakram.



Cold Start involves selected formations creating an adequate force level to hit a soft spot and by the time a larger mobilisation takes place, India would already have an upper hand across the border.

The Cold Start doctrine of the Indian armed forces involves the swift deployment of troops on the western border within days if a situation threatening a full-blown war arises. Explaining the concept, an officer said that Cold Start aims to allow Indian forces to conduct sustained attacks while preventing nuclear retaliation from Pakistan. "The operation would be carried out by a unified battle group involving various branches of India's military," said the officer, who added that at the time of the Parliament attack, India did not have options like launching surgical strikes.

Realising its slow pace of mobilisation, since then, every winter, the Indian Army carries out a drill to check the pace of its

mobilisation. One of the winter mobilisation exercises had led to the birth of a 'coup' conspiracy a few years back.

Some experts believe that militarily, at the end of the day, nothing was achieved by Operation Parakram. Rather, India lost many lives during de-mining activities. "It didn't leave a good taste for the military leadership. Politically, India got some brownie points for not initiating a war," an officer added.

Mounting pressure from the US and European nations forced Pakistan's ruler general Pervez Musharraf to deliver a speech on national television on January 12, 2002, that Pakistan "will not permit any terrorist activity from its soil". While some observers claimed that Operation Parakram had instilled

caution in Rawalpindi's behaviour, the 26/11 attack on Mumbai in 2008 proved otherwise. By early 2003, troops withdrew to peace-line locations and it was believed that Operation Parakram had cost India over \$3 billion.

In July 2003, then defence minister George Fernandes informed the Lok Sabha that India had lost 798 soldiers, even without formally going to war. These fatalities were caused by ammunition-related accidents, mine-related incidents and in some cases, friendly fire. In contrast, the 1999 Kargil war resulted in the death of 527 Indian troops.

One senior military officer maintained there was no aim or military objective for Operation Parakram and it was rather the most punishing mistake for the Indian armed forces. Another officer said, "If you take such decision, it must terminate at the situation that is advantageous to us. But, here we could gain nothing."
