Manny Pacquiao

Manny Pacquiao is quick on his feet, has great instincts, formidable power both to his right and left and a knock-out one-two combo. Push the boxing metaphors far enough, and you have the makings of a political campaign. Pacquiao (42) who registered as a presidential candidate for the 2022 elections in the Philippines and announced his retirement from professional boxing earlier this week, is undoubtedly one of the greatest pound-for-pound fighters of all time. But in the political arena, it's all that much harder to go the distance. And like in the boxing ring, no one wants the decisions to go to the judges.

It's not as though Pacquiao is a complete novice to Philippines politics, or is merely trading on his fame as a sportsman. He has served as a senator and was once close to outgoing President Rodrigo Duterte. Recently, though, Pacquiao has been vocal about the alleged misappropriation of relief funds meant for the poor in the aftermath of the pandemic as well as Duterte's "cosy" relationship with China. That Duterte is contesting for the post of vice-president on a different ticket (the Philippines constitution bars him from being president for six years) makes it seem that he is trying to circumvent the rules in order to retain power. In an era of populist strongmen, a boxer — who is also a national hero and international icon — certainly has a fighting chance. Besides, Pacquiao has, literally, punched his way out of poverty, which gives his slogans some credibility.

Given that Pacquiao is oscillating between third and fourth position in opinion polls at the moment, his task is cut out for him. His real challenge, though, will be to provide the people of the Philippines with an alternative to the violent, populist government of his one-time political ally. But then, boxers — far more than politicians — know the importance of the rules of the game.

Women are at higher risk for Heart related problems than Men if not detected at early stage

Port Blair, 3rd Oct 2021: A lot of people believe that only men are subjected to heart diseases. However, it is not true. Coronary heart disease is the leading cause of mortality and not just men but women face it too. It is not detected at the early stages, women can be at a greater risk.

Signs of poor heart health do not appear as visibly in women as it does in men. What this means is that if a man has a heart issue, there are specific symptoms like angina that can be spotted easily and the right course of action be recommended. The same issue in a woman may not result in a signor symptom that can be easily spotted. So often, their symptoms go ignored or unrecognised and they do not receive timely intervention to correct the problem. The issue is so acute that today 1 in 3 deaths among women is due to coronary heart disease.

There is also a significant lack of self-awareness among women about risk factors and prevention of CVDs. Women don't only attend

to matters of the home, but they hold positions at leading companies and continue to rise to the occasion and meet impossible demands on their time. Through all of this, they take care of the emotional needs of their family members and loved ones; and still culturally are predisposed to putting the needs of others before their own. The stress they experience, among other common risk factors, often goes unnoticed by those around them. And stress has a greater influence on CVD risk in women vs men. Along with stress, other factors like diet quality and quality also have a greater influence on CVD risk in women vs men. Additionally, women are also impacted by female-specific risk factors for CVD like polycystic ovarian syndrome (PCOS), pre-eclampsia, pregnancy induced hypertension and gestational diabetes.

In such a situation where symptoms of a heart problem do not manifest visibly, it is extremely important for women to be aware of their own risk factors and adopt

proactive measures to take care of their heart health. For example, one risk factor, stress has been linked to a greater intake of energy and nutrient-dense foods, main sources of sugar and fat, and to poor diet quality. Women can take simple steps like reducing unhealthy fats and products with high content of sugar and salt to improve the quality of their diet. Choose ingredients that are good for the heart, like oatmeal, whole grains, fibre-rich vegetables, blended oils with the right balance of fatty acids, legumes, soy products, and the like. Regular and consistent exercise, adequate sleep, and other lifestyle modifications can help maintain heart health in the long term.

Furthermore, with signs of poor heart health not manifesting visibly in women, it is crucial that they get regular health check-ups to assess their risk proactively. Self-awareness and early identification of cardiovascular risk factors can lead to better prevention of CVD in women.

NTPC to list 3 subsidiaries as part of Rs 15,000-crore asset monetization

NTPC Ltd, the state-owned thermal power company, will take three subsidiaries public in order to meet the government's target of asset monetisation worth Rs 15,000 crore.

The three companies are NTPC Vidyut Vyapar Nigam Ltd (NVVN), North Eastern Electric Power Corporation Ltd (NEEPCO) and the year-old NTPC-Renewable Energy Ltd (NREL). NTPC will exit NTPC-SAIL Power Company, its joint venture with state-owned steel firm SAIL, as part of the monetisation plan. Senior NTPC executives said NREL would be listed "before October next year." NTPC incorporated wholly-owned subsidiary for its renewable energy projects in October 2020.

Gurdeep Singh, chairman and managing director of NTPC, said in June NREL would be listed soon. "We should not focus on one way of raising funds. We want to soon go public for raising funds," he said, adding that the company would add 7-8 GW renewable energy every year. NTPC is looking to invest in solar and wind power as it takes green hydrogen and green methanol, cleaner fuels that are manufactured at units powered by renewable energy. Sources said the company will start a pilot of producing green hydrogen at its Vindhyachal thermal power unit in Madhya Pradesh.

NTPC builds renewable energy projects under two heads: EPC (engineering, procurement, and construction) mode, in which it participates in tenders floated by the Centre and states and constructs on its own. It has constructed 1.2

GW of solar and wind projects. The other is developer mode, where it awards renewable projects to private companies and procures power to sell to states. Under the developer mode, 4 GW projects are operational and tenders for close to 3 GW would be finalised soon.

The other subsidiary is NVVN which was established as the power trading arm of the company. However, over the years it has morphed itself into the environment arm for NTPC with projects in fly ash trading and usage, renewable energy projects, electric and hydrogen mobility and waste to energy. NVVN is also planning projects in procuring green, agro-based fuels to blend in thermal units. Recently, NVVN has floated tender to procure 20 million tonnes of bio-pellets made from farm stubble.

Senior executives said NVVN is being redesigned to become the 'energy transition' company for NTPC and take up projects that can add to NTPC's ESG (environment, social and governance) targets. "Post-listing, NVVN would be standalone example of technology development for energy transition in the country," said an executive.

NVVN traded over 18 BUs of power in FY 2020-21 which is the highest volume since its inception, said the annual report of NTPC. NVVN has started playing 40 e-buses in Port Blair and won tender for supplying and operating 90 nos. e-buses to Bangalore Metropolitan Transport Corporation (BMTCL). It has installed 1000 EV charging stations in eight cities.

NVVN is under various stages of

implementation of ground mounted rooftop solar projects along with charging infrastructure development at various airports and public buildings, said the annual report. NVVN paid dividend of Rs 30 crore during FY 2020-21.

NTPC acquired 100 per cent stake in NEEPCO in March last year, earlier owned by the union government of India. NEEPCO operates 7 hydro, 3 thermal and 1 solar power stations with a combined installed capacity of 2,057 MW. During the fiscal, NEEPCO commissioned its largest 600 MW Hydro Project Kameng, Aunachal Pradesh.

NTPC-SAIL Power Company is a 50:50 joint venture between the two CPSEs. It owns and operates captive power plants of SAIL at Durgapur, Rourkela and Bhilai and has a total installed capacity of 814 MW.

NTI Aayog, the central government's think tank, in its recently published National Monitisation Pipeline (NMP) has identified 6 GW worth of power generation assets for monetisation over FY 2022-25. This included 3.5 GW hydro assets and about 2.5 GW is renewable (solar and wind energy). The Centre expects to fetch around Rs 39,832 crore from power generation assets.

"Together, 6 GW asset base considered for monetisation constitute about 6% of total generation capacity under central PSUs. Key entities whose assets have been considered are NHPC, NTPC & SJVN who own bulk of the hydro assets and NTPC (under Ministry of Power) and NLC (under Ministry of Coal) that own renewable assets," NTI said in NMP.

Karnataka HC Blocks First Episode of Netflix's 'Crime Stories: India Detectives'

New Delhi: In a setback to OTT platform Netflix, the Karnataka high court ordered the blocking of the first episode of a new web series, 'Crime Stories: India Detectives', on Friday, Justice B.M. Shyam Prasad, while hearing a petition moved by Sridhar Rao, a 28-year-old co-accused in the murder case of 54-year-old Nirmala Chandrasekhar, said that the pilot episode of the series, 'A Murdered Mother', should not be streamed as it could cause "harassment and prejudice to the petitioner". In consideration of these submissions, the respondents, subject to further orders, are called upon to block streaming, broadcasting, telecasting or otherwise making available the content of the Episode No. 1 of the Series 1 of the documentary 'Crime Stories: India Detective' titled "A Murdered Mother" on Netflix.

Earlier, Rao had moved the civil court to seek an interim injunction on the episode. When the civil court refused his request while also simultaneously issuing summons to the investigative agency, he moved the high court. The high court will hear the matter again on October 21, until which temporary injunction on the episode will remain in place.
