All is set to celebrate the 76th Independence Day in a befitting manner in these Islands too together with the rest of the country tomorrow (15th August, 2022). Independence Day celebrations, this year, assumes greater significance as our Country is celebrating 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav', marking the completion of 75 years of India's Independence. The 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign launched has added patriotic fervour to the Independence Day celebrations this year.

The main function for the 76th Independence Day will be held at the historic Netaji Stadium wherein the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Islands and Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, Admiral D K Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) will hoist the National Tricolour at 9:14 AM. Thereafter, the Lt. Governor will inspect the Guard of Honour and present Police Medals and Commendation Certificates. The main function at Netaji Stadium will conclude with the National Anthem.

Before arrival at the Netaji Stadium for the main function, the Lt. Governor will visit National Memorial Cellular Jail and place wreath at the 'Martyr's Column'.

Meanwhile, prominent places in the city got a face lift with the historical monuments and Government buildings white coated. The 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign has added patriotic fervor to the celebrations as National Tricolor can be seen fluttering at Govt. Departments, Institutions, schools, Panchayati Raj

Coastal Cleanliness Campaign - 'Swachh Sagar, Surakshit Sagar/Clean Coast, Safe Sea'**Coastal cleanup drive conducted near Hornbill Nest Coastal area & Corbyn's Cove**

The Ministry of Earth Sciences in collaboration with the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG) has implemented the Coastal Cleanliness Campaign 'Swachh Sagar, Surakshit Sagar/Clean Coast, Safe Sea' from 5th July, 2022 which will culminate on 17th September, 2022. Marine pollution in recent times has caught the attention of environmentalist and policy makers across the globe and the main reason for marine pollution is litter especially in the form of plastics discharged from the land based sources along the coastline which have shown their harmful impact on marine biodiversity, ecosystems, fisheries, human health and economy.

Considering the catastrophic impact of such pollution and taking forward the vision of the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and his constant emphasis on cleanliness across the nation including the coastal regions, a coastal cleanup was jointly conducted by Rotary Club of

Port Blair, NextGen & Avians Club as part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. The members of Rotary Club, Port Blair, Next Gen and Avians Club participated in this cleanup project. The trash was collected from opposite Hornbill Nest Coastal area and Corbyn's Cove area.

Shri Suneel Anchipaka, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman too joined the cleanliness drive along with members of Rotary Club near Hornbill Nest area. Around 26 garbage bags of trash was collected and handed over to the Port Blair Municipal Council for safe disposal.

In the UT of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, 10 beaches have been identified by the Ministry for the Swachh Sagar, Surakshit Sagar/Clean Coast, Safe Sea Campaign. The beaches are Kalipur Beach (Diglipur), Karmatang Beach (Mayabunder), Raman Bagicha Beach (Rangat), Corbyn's Cove Beach (Port Blair), Radhanagar Beach (Swaraj Dweep), Chattan Beach (Hutbay), Kanaka Beach (Kamorta), Gandhi Nagar Beach (Campbell Bay), Malacca Beach (Carnic) and Kalasi Beach (Teressa).

Amobile app 'Eco Mitram' has also been launched to spread awareness about the campaign and also for common people for voluntary registration for the beach cleaning activity on 17th September, 2022 which aims at mass behavioral change among the masses with the intension of raising

awareness about how untreated wastages, especially plastics discharged along the coast line is destroying the marine lives, a press release from DC (SA) said.

It is notified for the information of the General Public that the following Traffic arrangements have been made for the Independence Day celebrations main function on 15th August 2022 (Monday).

- The carcade of Hon'ble Lt. Governor and other dignitaries, holders of parking card 'P' shall be parked inside the Netaji Stadium and near the Andaman Club.
- The holders of car parking label 'P', may use any route of their choice to approach the place of function, but are requested to reach the place of function latest by 0830 hrs., failing which, their vehicles will be stopped near the Gymkhana Crossing, RK Mission and Fire Brigade (HQ) crossings.
- After the departure of the Chief Guest from the place of function, the vehicles bearing parking label "P" shall follow the route Scout Hut Junction-VikasBhawan(ANIDCO Office)-Fire Brigade-APWD Crossing to their destinations.
- The holders of 'P-' parking labels will arrive at the Netaji Stadium via Model School-Clock Tower-Gymkhana Crossing to Netaji Stadium. Thereafter, the vehicles shall proceed to the parking on the western side of main gate of Netaji Stadium and near Swimming Pool.
- After the departure of all vehicles parked inside the stadium and near Andaman Club having "P" parking label the vehicles of "P-" parking label will be released to come to the main entrance of Netaji Stadium to pick up the guests and shall leave via Scout Hut Junction-Girls School Crossing-RK Mission and RGT Road.
- All other vehicles without any parking label including two and four wheelers will be parked near Water Sports Complex and Girls School parking.
- The vehicles intending to proceed to South Point from Aberdeen Bazar shall be diverted towards Model School Crossing - Bengali Club - Goalghar- Secretariat Junction - Police Line and Nayagaon.
- No heavy vehicles, private and STS buses will be allowed to proceed towards Cellular Jail from 0700 hrs to 1100 hrs and shall be diverted to other routes from Bengali Club Junction.
- The vehicles intending to proceed to Aberdeen Bazar from South Point shall follow the route of South Point-Shadipur-Nayagaon Junction-Police Line-RBV-Secretariat Junction and Goalghar.

- Private tourist boats carrying tourists from Aberdeen Jetty to Ross Island, North Bay etc. should be shifted to Junglighat jetty on 15/08/2022.

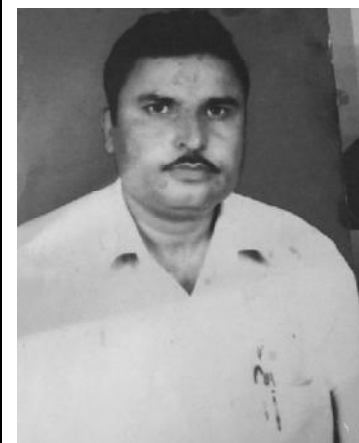
