From the surface to a few feet below, the ocean is a sunlit world. that changes from day to night. Below this, the ocean becomes cold, dim, and unchanging. And thousands of meters below the surface, the ocean is a region of nearfreezing temperatures, crushing pressure, and complete darkness.

Most marine plants and animals are adapted to living in one of three regions- the sunlight, twilight, or midnight zone. These zones are defined by the presence (or absence) of light. They differ from one another in temperature amount of pressure, and nutrient supply. We will mainly focus here on the sunlight zone where most of the familiar animals and plants are present.

Senior Secondary School Sitanagar has been approved by the competent authority, and the work may begin soon after the official formality.

Unhappy New Year

Six civilians, including two children, were killed in brutal acts of terrorism in Dangri in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri in the first week of the new year. The police and authorities in Srinagar and New Delhi remain tight-lipped about the incidents. It is evident that the perpetrators intended to spread maximum terror among the Hindus in the area. They barged into houses on January 1 and fired indiscriminately, killing four civilians and injuring 10 others. Just within 15 hours, an improvised explosive device went off outside the house of one of the victims, leaving two minors dead and five others injured. The Jammu region has been relatively insulated from the conflict in recent years, but the recent incidents portend the return of a grim past. Rajouri had turned peaceful, and the last major targeting of Hindus was 16 years ago. It has a long penetrable Line of Control with Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and remained an active route for militants to cross over to the Kashmir Valley. In 2022, there were clear signs that the district was becoming a new theatre of violence, with at least four grenade attacks, and multiple encounters between security forces and militants. There were also indications of local involvement.

J&K parties in one voice condemned the attack on minorities and targeted the Lieutenant Governor (LG)'s administration for its failure to secure civilians. LG Manoj Sinha has promised strict action to curb terrorism and address the security needs of the region. There is fresh demand to revive Village Defence Committees, which were constituted in 1995 in 10 districts of the Jammu region to fight militants in remote places where security presence is thin. These were disbanded following allegations of high-handedness by armed volunteers. While the Centre is eager to portray its strong-arm policy in Kashmir that has shunned political dialogue as a success, new trends in terrorism, including frequent targeting of migrant workers in the Union Territory, act as grim reminders of the volatility. At least 29 civilians were killed in J&K in 2022, most of them migrant workers or local Hindus. While new experiments may yield different results in J&K, the old approach to allow multiple processes of engagement to address issues in a democratic way might still work. In the absence of an elected government in J&K since 2018, even the mainstream of the region is drifting away from New Delhi. A continuing political process is not a sufficient guarantee against Pakistan-backed terrorism, but it is a necessary condition in any resolution of the Kashmir conflict.

WhatsApp Down **Across Cities in** India, Meta Says Working to Restore **Services Soon**



January 9: New Delhi: WhatsApp, the Meta-owned instant messaging platform was down for several users in India on Tuesday with people unable to send or receive messages on their devices.

Many users in India have reported that they are unable to access WhatsApp messenger on Android or iOS and even Whats App web to send messages to their contacts or groups. Several other countries have also reported the issue with WhatsApp, according to trackers

According to DownDetector, a website that reports on outages and other problems, many users reported issues in using WhatsApp since 3:17 AM EDT (12:30 pm IST)as per the DownDetector tracker

Affected regions based on Downdetector's heat-map include major cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Chennai, Hyderabad as well as Nagpur and Lucknow among others.

"We're aware that some people are currently having trouble sending messages and we're working to restore @WhatsApp for everyone as quickly as possible." - a Meta Company Spokesperson said.

According to the heat map displayed on the Downdetector website, user-submitted problem reports are concentrated over the past 24 hours.

Mewnwhile, People headed to I witter to complain and check if others were facing similar issues.

Some of the reactions were hilarious.

According to Downdetector, 70 per cent WhatsApp users reported issues in sending messages, while 24 per cent had issues in server connection and 7 per cent said they were facing app issues.

Ministers on Edge as PM Likely to Revamp Union Cabinet Soon

January 9: NEW DELHI: With Prime Minister Narendra Modi likely to go in for a Cabinet rejig on the basis of "performance", some key Union ministers are reportedly on edge. The reshuffle could take place between January 15 and 25.

Sources said while speaking to top party leaders, the Prime Minister had hinted that it was time to "make changes". A senior party leader revealed that after the results of the recent polls in Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, the Prime Minister had indicated that despite the historic victory in Gujarat, he was not too pleased with outcome. observation has apparently been quite "disturbing" for some of his key ministers and party office-bearers.

Though the BJP decimated the Opposition during the Gujarat Assembly elections, the results in both the Delhi MCD polls and the Himachal Assembly elections were a body blow to the party. Some of the MPs from Himachal Pradesh and Delhi, who apparently



indulged in factionalism during the polls, were moving around "somewhat worried", a senior party leader said.

While it remains to be seen which leaders might face the axe, the proposed reshuffle would be carried out with an eye on forthcoming elections in nine states this year and the 2024 general election. The ninestates that will go to the polls this year are . Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Tripura, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Mizoram, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan. It was learnt that the MPs from the poll-bound states may be accommodated in the revamped Cabinet.

While there is a buzz the PM may drop "nonperforming" ministers, some MPs who have been "star campaigners" in various states also expect to be inducted into the Modi Cabinet.

Since this might possibly be the last ministerial reshuffle before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, hectic parleys have begun to get into the Modi Cabinet. At least two MPs from Gujarat are likely to be rewarded for party's stellar performance in the recent Assembly elections. Sources also said that the Prime Minister was considering inducting more women into the Union Cabinet.

A Samuhika Bhogi Pallu programme will be held on Jan 14 to mark Makar Sankranthi.

The architecture must be based on common vision, be inclusive, and stimulate innovative solutions to health

The summit also discussed many important issues related to Andhra Pradesh. Taking forward the call of Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan oncologists to periodically Mohan Reddy, AAPI decided to provide mental healthcare for school students to prevent suicides. For the purpose, a pilot project is being launched to train 10,000 teachers as counsellors.

Mishra on Sunday held a high-level review meeting on the situation in Joshimath, where cracks have developed in the buildings and the entire area seems to sinking. evacuations have started from Joshimath, the gateway to some renowned pilgrimage sites like Badrinath and Hemkund

Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke to Uttarakhand chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami to take stock of the situation and assured him of all possible help from the Centre to save Joshimath. Mr Dhami said that the PM is personally monitoring the situation in Joshimath and asked about the steps being taken to rehabilitate the affected families due to land subsidence.

During the PMO meeting on Joshimath, Mr Mishra was apprised that the Central agencies and experts are assisting the state government to prepare short, medium and long-term plans. One team of the National Disaster Relief Force and four teams of the state disaster relief force have already reached Joshi math.

secretary, senior officials of

the Central government, and members of the National Disaster Management Authority. District officials of Joshi math and senior officers of Uttarakhand also attended the meeting through video conference. The chief secretary of Uttarakhand briefed the top PMO officials from Joshimath.

It was decided that the

secretary border of management and members of the National Disaster Management Authority will visit (NDMA) Uttarakhand on Monday to assess the Joshi math situation. A team of experts from the NDMA, National Institute of Management, Disaster Geological Survey of India, IIT Roorkee, Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, National Institute of Hydrology and Central Building Research Institute will also study the situations and give recommendations. National Remote Sensing Centre, Hyderabad and the Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, Dehradun, have been asked to conduct a study of Joshimath through satellite imagery and submit a detailed report with photographs.

The Uttarakhand CM had visited Joshimath on Saturday to assess the situation on the ground, a day after he directed the immediate evacuation of around 600 affected families.

Joshimath has been declared The PMO meeting was a landslide-subsidence zone attended by the Cabinet and over 60 families living in damagedhouses in the sinking

temporary relief centres, a senior official in Uttarakhand said on Sunday.

Considering the extent of the damage, at least 90 more families will have to be evacuated as soon as possible and the local administration has set up relief centres at five locations in the Himalayan town, Garhwal commissioner Sushil Kumar said.

Meanwhile, Chamoli district magistrate Himanshu Khurana went from door to door in the affected area to assess the extent of damage and appealed to people living in houses that have developed cracks to move to the relief

"There are a total of 4,500 buildings in Joshimath and 610 of them have developed huge cracks, making them unfit for habitation," said Mr Kumar.

A survey is underway and the number of affected buildings could go up, he added. Mr Kumar further said the affected area, including houses that developed cracks earlier and the ones damaged recently, forms a big arch that could be spread over 1.5 km.

Temporary relief centres have been set up at five safe places within Joshimath. Some more buildings, including a few hotels, a gurdwara and two inter-colleges, have been acquired to serve as makeshift shelters that can accommodate around 1,500 people, he said.

T20 League Over Country: Trent Boult Likely to Miss Series Against England

January 9: New Zealand seamer Trent Boult has been all-but ruled out of the England Test series next month due to his T20 franchise league commitments. The 33-year-old Boult will only return to New Zealandon theeve of the tests from playing in the UAE T20 league.

When asked if Boult might face England, New Zealand's coach Gary Stead said: "No, I wouldn't have thought so. Trent and I have had discussions, his return from the UAE is only a day or so immediately prior to that. From a workload perspective that's out of the picture."

World class fast bowler Trent Boult was released from his central contract with New Zealand Cricket (NZC) at his own request last August so he can spend less time travelling and more time at home with his family.



The 33-year-old, who has played 70 tests and 137 limited overs internationals since 2011, will continue to play for his country but have a "significantly reduced role", NZC said. "This has been a really tough decision for me ... playing cricket for my country was a childhood dream and I'm so proud of everything

I'vebeen able to achieve," Boultsaid in an NZC statement.

"Ultimately this decision is about my wife Gert and our three young boys. Family has always been the biggest motivator for me and I feel comfortable with putting it first and preparing ourselves for life after cricket."

Babar Azam Says he Does not Regret not Having Sarfaraz Ahmed in the Team in the Last Four Years

January 9: With former Pakistan captain Sarfaraz Ahmed winning the player of the series in the recently concluded Pakistan New Zealand Test series with three fifties and a hundred, the 25-year-oldwicketkeeper batsman has come back from the wilderness. While Ahmed is currently not in the Pakistan ODI team, Pakistan skipper Babar Azam parised Ahmed's perseverance but also said he does not regret Ahmed's time away from the Pakistan team.

Asked by a journalist about him having any regrets of not having Ahmed in the team since the last four years, Azam replied about Ahmed's comingback to form for Pakistan. "I have said this in earlier press conferences too that the way Sarfaraz Ahmed has waited, did not lose his courage, did his training, wicketkeeping, batting with full dedication, he waited and executed his plans. The way he batted in difficult situations and got the team out of tough situations. That's the sign of a senior player and such players get you out of difficult times with different innings. It was a dream comeback for him," said Azam in reply to the



question. When pegged back again by the journalist about having any regrets of not having Ahmed in the team Azam replied, "No, I don't have any regrets," said Azam.

While Pakistan has failed towin any test this season on home soil, the Babar Azam led team will start the new year with a ODI series against New Zealand in the ODI World Cup year. With PCB naming Shan Masood as the vice-captain, Azam was also asked about media reports suggesting he was not consulted regarding the decision. "See, I believe we cannot talk about any one individual. Anybody can be part of the playing XI. I have not seen the

The Pakistan captain was also asked about him and the newly appointed PCB interim chiefselector Shahid Afridi not on the same page and Azam replied that the captain and coach always consult with the selectors. "I believe that selectors and captain have to be on the same page. important to have communication with the selectors. We have conveyed our messages to them and we are on the same page. We communicated what we needed and gave our inputs on the basis of what team was selected," said Azam. The three-match ODI series begins on Monday in Karachi.


