Success is not an activity but a process ...

Slow Lane Driving

At the onset of 2022-23, the Indian economy was expected to grow anywhere between 7.2%, as per Reserve Bank of India projections, and 8.2%, as per the International Monetary Fund forecast, with major rating agencies and financial institutions pegging their projections in the middle. Having bounced back 8.7% last year from a COVIDtriggered nadir, the moderation in economic growth was not a big deal even as the ripple effects of the war in Europe had begun and inflation had been high since January. By early September, the range of most forecasts shifted to 6.7%-7.7%. The RBI, Asian Development Bank, and Fitch Ratings have lowered their estimate to 7%. S&P Global Ratings retained its forecast at 7.3% and Moody's Investors Service pared it to 7.6%, but both believe the emerging global slowdown will not derail the post-COVID recovery. The outlook is not so benign any more, the World Bank has suggested, based on inputs as recent as the last week of September. From its initial expectation of 8% growth this year, which it cut to 7.5% in June, the Bank has laid out a gloomier outlook with growth of just 6.5%, citing the worsening external environment.

After the 13.5% expansion in the April-June quarter, high-frequency economic indicators point to a healthy uptick through August. But growth appears to have stumbled a bit in September with goods exports contracting for the first time since February 2021 and imports growth also slowing sharply, signalling lower domestic demand. The Bank's latest forecast suggests a relative slowdown starting in the October-December quarter, with tighter global liquidity, higher inflation (oil prices are surging again after the OPEC meet) and rising interest rates denting domestic demand. At the same time, the demand for exports will shrink further and private investment will likely prefer to sit out this period of heightened uncertainty. Private consumption, in particular, will be affected this year and next, the Bank has reckoned, especially as the pandemic's scars on income and employment levels persist for rural and low-income households. As many as 56 million Indians may have slipped below the poverty line in 2020, it estimated. The government has been gung-ho about "entering an era of robust growth", but its decision to extend the pandemic-driven free foodgrains programme suggests it realises that not all actors of the economy have managed to get out of the woods yet. This realism should be reflected in other policy choices it makes too, tempering optimism with caution.

Movie Review | Godfather, Dasara Release from Chiranjeevi

October 9: Godfather, the new Dasara release from Chiranieevi, could mark the turning point in the career of the Tollywood megastar. As he dons a role that reflects his age and away from the comfort zone of dance and romance, Chiranjeevi appears to have decided to redefine his second innings with this movie. The talent of the megastar was never in question though his two recent movies proved to be duds at the boxoffice. The issue was — just like as in the case of his peers in the Tollywood — his failure to come to terms with advancing age and adapting oneself to the new reality.

The movie is based Malayalam superstar Mohanlal's Lucifer and has nothing to do with Mario Puzo's classic Godfather. It focuses on the unholy nexus between money bags and politicians. While in other films this connection between money bags and politicians is merely suggestive, this movie unequivocally accepts the role of money in politics. In fact, the film's hero, who makes politically-correct statements, declares the need and inevitability of the nexus. Welcome to a new chapter of our mainstream cinema, where we accept yet another negative aspect of society as a way of life.

The film starts with the death of the Chief Minister, who leaves behind a stubborn daughter Priyam (Nayantara), herambitious husband Jaydev (Satyadev Kancharna), and a crafty and ambitious minister



Narayan Varma (Murli Sharma). Though the minister considers himself to bethe logical heir to the office of the chief minister, he finds a fierce competitor in Jaydev — the late leader's son-intop post but also schemes to keep others out of the race.

While the Chief Minister's daughter does not want Brahma to attend the funeral of his father, nobody could stop him as he enters the scene midst of a lot of adoration and catcalls, making it clear that he is the one who call the shots.

Brahma and Sathya Priya are half siblings. She does not approve of his presence in her life as she considers him to be an illegitimates on ofher late father. She blames him for the death of his mother who left behind her with an infant sibling who grows to be drug addict and a prey to the prowl of her brother-inlaw. NRI Maitreyee Wairagkar Nominated for Nature's 'Inspiring Women in Science' Award

October HYDERABAD: Maitreyee Wairagkar, a neuroscientist and neuroengineer who is currently postdoctoral scholar at



the University of California, Davis, has been nominated for the prestigious 'Inspiring Women in Science' award by the leading scientific journal 'Nature' in partnership with Estée Lauder.

She is the only Indian on the list of early career women scientists whose works include developing vaccines for Coronavirus and co-leading the blackhole imaging project.

Maitreyee, an Indian by birth, is among the six early career women researchers from over the world nominated for the prestigious award to be announced next week.

She has earned the nomination for her work in neurotechnology so far. "There is a severe need for research in the field of neurotechnology so that we can help people with neurological disorders become independent," Maitreyee told Deccan Chronicle.

Crediting her mentors and erstwhile educational institutes which include the University of Reading and Imperial College London and her current institution, UC Davis for the nomination, an elated Maitreyee said, "The main area of my work includes developing advanced neurotechnology using artificial intelligence. I work on brain-computer interfaces to enable people with severe motor and speech impairments to communicate directly via their brain

"The nomination itself is a very big honour for me as the other nominees have stupendous work to their credit," she said.

Other nominees are Kizzmekia Corbett, an assistant professor of immunology and infectious diseases at Harvard's T.H. Chan School of Public Health.

Lia Medeiros, a co-lead of the EHT Gravitational Physics Working Group, a member of the EHT's Junior Scientist Council, and an NSF Astronomy and Astrophysics Postdoctoral Fellow, working at the Institute for Advanced Study.

Chiara Mingarelli, a gravitational-wave astrophysicist, looking to understand how supermassive black holes in the centers of massive

Taylor Nye, a postdoctoral research scholar in the Hultgren Laboratory at Washington University in St. Louis, working to combat antimicrobial-resistant

Maheshi Ramasamy, a doctor, and scientist working in Oxford, UK. Maheshi studies infectious diseases and how the body defends itself from them.

Environment & Forests Department Releases Wild Pigs inside Jarawa Reserve as Part of 68th Wildlife Week

Port Blair, Oct. 8: As part of the ongoing 68th Wildlife Week celebrations, the Department of Environment and Forests in association with the Tribal Welfare Department released 8 (3 males 5 females) of Andaman Wild pigs (Sus scrofa andamensis) into the Reserve Forest inside Jarawa Tribal Reserve Area today. Andaman Wild pig is an endangered endemic species found in Andaman Islands. The initiative is a part of the conservation efforts of Forest Department by naturally breeding the endangered endemic swine found in the Andaman Islands and releasing them into their natural habitat. Further, the aim of this re-stocking programme is to enhance natural food resources for the



Jarawa tribe and restoring depleting food base in the reserve areas.



'If we Remove Babar and Rizwan from the Team, our Batting Isn't Performing': Inzamam-ul-Haq

October 9: Pakistan made it two wins in two games in the tri-series with Bangladesh and New Zealand with their six wicket win over the Blackcaps. A major reason behind both the wins have been the highest run scorers in the two games. Mohammad Rizwan and Babar Azam.

While Rizwan's 78* was pivotal to Pakistan to a 21 run win against Bangladesh, it was skipper Babar Azam who scored an unbeaten 79 against the hosts a day later to chase 148

The duo have led the run scoring chart for Pakistan in the T20ls this year. While Rizwan has scored 702 runs in 15 innings, Babarhas accumulated 520 runs in 16 innings. The concern for Pakistan however has been the middle order. Or as former Pakistan captain Inzamam-ul-Haq quoted, "Agar team se Babar aur Rizwan ko nikal diya jaye toh hamari

Inzamam took to his YouTube channel to share his thoughts on the team's batting.

"This is something we have to improve on. The boys that have gone to New Zealand need to forget the England series, the Asia Cup...all that is in the past now. Now you are entering in a new

tournament, so you need to forget these recent memories. The good as well as the bad ones."

In another video, Inzamam also said, "Those in the middle order need to score at a strike rate of 150. Even if they are getting 25 runs, they need to do so at 150 strike rate."

Pakistan will play another round of matches against Bangladesh and New Zealand before the top two teams meet in the tri-series final on Friday, October 14 in Christchurch.

Pankaj Advani Pockets World Title Number 25 in Kuala Lumpur

October 9: India's leading cueist Pankaj Advani on Saturday claimed his 25th world title after outclassing compatriot Sourav Kothari 4-0 in the 150 up billiards final at the World Championships.

Advani manoeuvred his cue like a magician's wand as he entertained the spectators who showed up in large numbers. In the first frame, Advani made his intentions clear that this title was his from word go. He opened the proceedings without any delay to secure the first framewith a 149 break while his opponent, who is still seeking his maiden IBSF World title, had yet to score a point in the 150-up format.

The best-of-seven summit clash saw Advani compete fiercely to ensure he completed a billiards National-Asian-World golden trifecta in the same calendar year for a record fifth time.

The second frame went Advani's way after Kothari failed to capitalize with the limited chances given to him by his worthy opponent. With the help of a 77 break, Advani was halfway home with a 2-0 lead. There on, Advani turned on

Advani turned on the heat, mesmerizing the Malaysian crowd with some fine billiards.


Advani's craftsmanship saw him make the tournament's highest break of 153 in the third bringing himself one frame away from familiar glory In the fourth frame, Advani proved yet again why he is the man to beat in the 3-ball sport as he put together exquisite breaks of 86 and 60 unfinished to put the last nail in the coffin and seal the deal. Kothari's forgettable final, witnessed a total of 72 points scored by him while Advani



amassed over 600 points to defend his title for a fifth year in a row. Due to the pandemic, the event last took place in 2019 and got revived after a three-year gap.

An elated Advani said, "It's a dream to defend a world title for five times in a row. Truly pleased with how I've played and won every billiards event I participated in this year. Feel honored to bring to my country yet another gold medal at a world level." Advani's last world title came over 12 months ago in Qatar where he won the IBSF 6-Red Snooker World Cup
