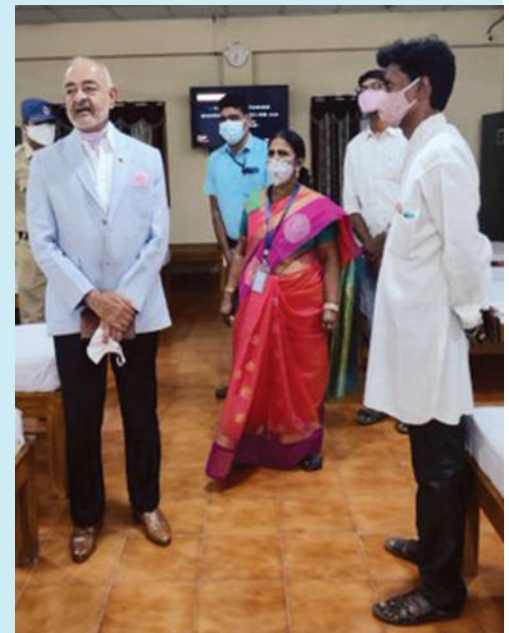
response to incidents and untiring efforts have been highly successful in this regard.

As part of the preparations for the ensuing Panchayat & Municipal Elections -2022, the Office of the Director (Panchayat and Municipal Elections) is organising series of training programmes for the personnel engaged in Election Duty. In this connection, the first round training of Ferrargunj Tehsil was organised today at the DBRAIT auditorium for the ROs, Sector Officers, Presiding Officers, First, Second, Third Polling Officials & Polling Assistants.



Addressing the trainees on the occasion, the DPME, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, reiterated that all personnel engaged in election duty irrespective of their assigned duties have to play a vital role

in the smooth conduct of polling on the day of poll. The DPME stated that Presiding Officer is the main person from the Commission point of view during the election particularly on the day of polling for

the smooth conduct of voting. As per the election manual, Presiding Officer is the key officer at their respective polling booths where he/she has to oversee the entire arrangement inside the booth.

In every election, personnel on duty especially the Presiding Officers face new challenges which, the DPME said, has to be dealt with sensitively in co-ordination with the team of Polling

COVID-19 status in A&N Islands One positive case detected during RT-PCR test conducted on incoming flight passengers

Port Blair, Feb. 21

During the RT-PCR test conducted on 312 flight passengers who arrived here yesterday, one positive case has been detected. Today, 12 flights with 1956 passengers arrived, out of which, 1699 passengers were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 236 passengers (5

foreign travellers) and the reports are awaited.

During RAT conducted on 31 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was conducted on 23 passengers, no positive case have been detected. At

Vaccination drive in A&N Islands 6,06,955 doses of vaccine administered to beneficiaries in the age group of 18 & above so far

Port Blair, Feb. 21

The vaccination drive is continuing smoothly in A&N Islands. As per data available, a total of 6,06,955 beneficiaries in the age group of 18 and above have been vaccinated so far. Similarly, 23,160 beneficiaries have been vaccinated in the age group of 15 to 18. The number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine so far stood at

8403.

A total of 356 eligible beneficiaries were vaccinated in A&N Islands today. 267 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 5 beneficiaries were in the age group of 15-18 years, 11 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 31.

21 beneficiaries were vaccinated in North & Middle Andaman District, out of which, 5 beneficiaries were in the age group of 15-18, 2 beneficiaries were in the age group of 18-44 years and the number of beneficiaries administered precautionary dose of vaccine stood at 20.

friendly nations by supplying medicines and evacuating stranded Indian citizens and foreign nationals in different parts of the world under 'Mission SAGAR' and 'Samudra Setu'. He said that the prompt and effective deployment of the Indian Navy in the times of crisis has underscored India's vision of being the 'Preferred Security Partner' and 'First Responder' in the Indian Ocean Region.

Pointing to the historical importance of Visakhapatnam, also popularly known as Vizag, the President said that it has been an important port for centuries. Its strategic importance is underlined by the fact that the headquarters of the Eastern Naval Command of the Indian Navy is located at Vizag. He said that Vizag made a glorious contribution during the 1971 war. He recalled the heroic action of the Eastern Naval Command in the naval blockade of the then East Pakistan and the sinking of Pakistan's submarine 'Ghazi'. He said that that was a decisive blow to Pakistan. The 1971 war remains one of the most emphatic victories in our history, he added.

The President was happy to note that the Indian Navy is becoming increasingly self-reliant and has been at the forefront of the 'Make in India' initiative. He noted that about 70 per cent of the contents of several warships and submarines under construction in various public and private shipyards across the country are indigenous. He said that it is a matter of great pride that India has built nuclear submarines and soon we would have our indigenously built aircraft carrier, 'Vikrant', joining the service. He added that the development of indigenous naval shipbuilding capabilities is an impressive contribution to the making of an 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'.

The President congratulated the Indian Navy for the splendid conduct of the Fleet Review, overcoming all challenges and restrictions imposed by the pandemic. He said that as the Supreme Commander of the Armed Forces, this is a moment of immense satisfaction for him. The nation is proud of our brave navy personnel.

Mumbai, Feb. 21 Union Minister for Finance & Corporate Affairs, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman today asked the industry leaders to explore ways to further strengthen their sector and help in the post-pandemic revival of economy.

Addressing a post-budget interaction with various industry leaders in Mumbai today, the Finance Minister expressed satisfaction about the resilience displayed by the financial markets even during pandemic times.

Smt. Sitharaman urged the market participants to strive for efficiency and transparency to help to channelize the resource for productive investment in the most effective manner.

During her opening remarks, the Finance Minister asserted that the Government wants a sustained recovery. She highlighted that the budget proposals on infrastructure building are an attempt to create the multiplier effect to help the economy. Stating that technology has helped the Government make payments to the affected people during the pandemic, Smt. Sitharaman said it is also looking at how digital solutions can be deployed in the education and the farming sectors. Officials attached with them. To avoid any hiccups on the poll day, the trainees have to take up the training seriously for the smooth conduct of polling at their respective booth which will be intimated accordingly.

The DPME further informed that the polling will be taken up between 7am to 5 pm on March 6 and the Presiding Officer should ensure that by 5 pm the entry gate of his/her polling booth is closed at all cost as per the guidelines of the Commission and any lapse on this count will be dealt with seriously. Those who are inside the gate in the last hour of polling (4pm to 5pm) they have to be provided token so that they can cast their votes without any hindrance as per the laid down election guidelines.

The DPME further stated that the polling should start in all the polling booths sharp at 7 AM without fail for which all the Polling Officials have to be in their respective booths early so as to complete all the formalities including mock polls for the smooth start of the voting on the day of poll. The Presiding Officers has to maintain the two hourly poll percentages of their respective Polling Booths which will be collected by the Liaison Officers engaged for this purpose, the DPME added.

The Director, Panchayat & Municipal Elections sought the cooperation and active involvement of all officials involved in the election process in conduct of a smooth, free, fair & transparent elections in the Islands.

Earlier, the Nodal Officer, Training & Vehicle, Dr. Aom Dhole welcomed the DPME and the trainees present.

Shri Som Naidu, DANICS (Retd) as the resource person briefed about the roles and responsibilities of the Presiding Officers and the other officials engaged in Election Duty pertaining to conduct of elections in the UTs.

Later, a hands on training about how to prepare the ballot boxes and its sealing on completion of the poll was also demonstrated by the master trainers on the occasion.

India becomes number one team in Men's ICC T20 International ranking

Kolkata, Feb. 21 India has become the number one team in the Men's ICC T20 International team rankings for the first time in six years after its 3-0 series win over West Indies in Kolkata yesterday. India surpassed England which had 269 rating points to take the top spot. It previously held the reigns over the Format under Mahendra Singh Dhoni's leadership from 12th February to 3rd May in 2016. In this way, Rohit Sharma has become the second Captain to take India to the number one position.

◆ Certain particular pockets of concentration of minority population within a non-minority district or city will also be eligible for consideration.

◆ The trainees should belong to the Below Poverty Line (BPL) population both from urban and rural areas.

◆ The minimum qualification of trainee should be as per NIOS / equivalent defined below:

◆ For Class VIII Bridge Program: Candidate should possess Class V pass or failed school leaving certificate or equivalent of education or provide self-certificate stating his/her capability to pursue this course. Candidate should fulfil the minimum age as prescribed by NIOS or equivalent board to pursue the course.

◆ For Class X Bridge Program: Candidate should posses Class VIII pass school leaving certificate or equivalent of education or provide self-certificate stating his/her capability to pursue this course. Candidate should fulfil the minimum age as prescribed by NIOS or equivalent board to pursue the course.

◆ 30% of the beneficiary seats will be earmarked for girl / women candidates and 5% of the beneficiary seats will be earmarked for persons with disability belonging to the minority community under the scheme. To promote inter-community solidarity, 15% candidates belonging to BPL families of non-minority communities will also be considered.

Eligibility of Programme Implementing Agencies(PIAs)

◆ PIAs will be invited to participate in the Scheme. The selection of PIA would be subject to a rigorous process of appraisal and due diligence as laid down in the Criteria for Selection of PIAs. Below is a tentative list of the types of institutions that will be selected as PIAs under the

Project:

◆ Government or Private ITIs affiliated to NCVT or SCVT

◆ Schools / Institutes approved by Central or State Boards of Secondary Education or Open Schooling (or equivalent).

◆ PIA should have turnover of at least Rs. 15 Crore in preceding 3 financial years and should have trained at least 500 trainees per year in last 3 years for empanelment.

◆ Registered Company / Firm/ Trust/ Society conducting vocational education / training / job oriented / self-employment / entrepreneurship development training courses having essentially trained 500 persons annually in the last three years under a Central Government Scheme. It should have been in existence for at least three years holding a valid Permanent Income Tax Account Number or Service Tax Registration Number. It must have audited accounts of statements for last three years and should not have been blacklisted by any Government entity in India. It should submit a letter of satisfactory performance from concerned Central Government Ministry under whose scheme it has trained more than 1000 persons.

◆ The PIAs would be empanelled by an Inter-Ministerial Selection Committee chaired by concerned Joint Secretary

The selected PIAs will be allowed to operate in one or more regions as decided at the time of selection. Outsourcing or franchising is not permitted under the scheme.

◆ The appraisal process of the PIA would include a qualitative appraisal of the following:

◆ Organization Strength: Include organization skilling experience, the

experience of promoters and management team, the robustness of internal organizational policies, quality of trainers.

◆ Training and Placement Track Record: Include applicant PIAs and/or consortium partners' performance in government and private projects, candidate feedback, employer feedback, tie-up with industry etc.

◆ Education Record: Include the Organization's or consortium partner's experience in implementing basic education projects like a number of students enrolled, examined, and passed the Board examination in the past three years.

◆ Experience in Minority Areas: Include evidence of working in minority-dominated areas like case studies, strategies adopted, collaborating with local groups, etc.

◆ Experience in the Sector: Past experience of conducting training in the proposed sector, course curriculum, and alignment with NSQF

◆ Experience in the State/Region: Past experience of conducting training in the proposed state/region. Include mobilization strategies, tie-ups with employers, understanding of micro-level demand for skills through skill gap studies.

◆ Training Infrastructure: Existing infrastructure for training like labs and machinery etc.

◆ Education Infrastructure: Tie-ups with agencies that have infrastructure as mandated in NIOS or any other open Boards.

◆ Financials: Financial documents like the balance sheet of the PIA or the lead PIA in case of consortium.
