As per reports, islanders are facing countless problems to obtain services of the Transport Department Services, Electricity, etc. owing to poor connectivity at the Offices. While slow data services deprives consumers from availing the online payment facility, lack of connectivity at the Offices compels them to travel to the Site Office only to return

dejected. "We have been having a tough time dealing with extremely slow data connectivity in the past few days. People need to pay taxes, obtain RC certificate for their vehicles or face disconnection. However owing to poor data services, we're unable to get the services. Telecom service providers particularly the BSNL has failed to live upto the expectations of the scores of users in this region," lamented some residents of Buniyadabad. "I have been



Glare on tattered road from Junglighat to Dairy farm, even patients upset

Port Blair, Nov 28: For Sanya, a Class IV student of Junglighat Govt. Secondary School, walking on the road from her house at Dairy farm takes at least 20 minutes. She has to jump over the potholes and keep off the muck splashed by passing vehicles. The incessant downpour in the recent days has resulted in massive craters over the road

stretch and continuous drizzle have made it worse. Monsoon rains this year has again exposed the poor road construction expertise of the authorities concerned. What has taken her to surprise was that the stretch leading from Dairy farm towards Junglighat through Maricar Hospital, Vijay Baugh was well taken care of during the recent accomplished work of the culvert at Dairy farm Junction. Despite tall claims to ensure trouble-free commute for residents in the city, the fact remains there isn't much change on the ground level. Potholed roads and the consequent traffic snarls continued during this monsoon with massive craters surfacing in almost all arterial roads in the city. In the road stretch from Dairy farm to Junglighat that served as a shortcut for months for the culvert-construction work, every thing was being maintained. But soon after the project was completed, the stretch

has been left abandoned, said a resident of Dairy farm. "Substandard repair work is seems to be another reason for potholes appearing on the road stretch. When a road is not repaired properly, the chances of potholes reappearing and spreading rapidly is high. Corrupt officials are often hand-in-glove with greedy contractors and allow the latter to pass off substandard works as high-quality repairs. This practice is visible with massive craters appearing and reappearing in almost all roads of the city - be it Junglighat, Prem Nagar Gola Ghar, Delanipur etc. Some potholes on the stretch seem innocuous at first, but many of them are deep enough to cause a mishap. It becomes a nightmare travelling along the battered stretch in the city. There has also been a spurt in reports of mishaps which occurred because of the potholes recently," said another.

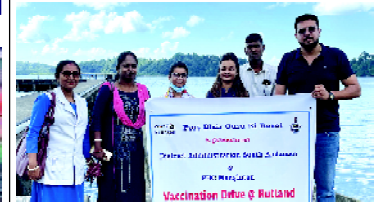

Obesity is a social problem

The path to a nanny state is paved with good intentions. According to local reports, the council in the most obese area in Lancashire is planning to place restrictions on takeaway food to control the health menace. While this isn't a standalone measure — there is also talk of encouraging exercise and addressing mental health issues — it is of a piece with the notion that health and well-being stem primarily from the decisions individuals take — smokers get cancer, obese people diabetes and heart disease. Even sitting down — in sedentary jobs, people don't have a choice — is seen as a culprit. Hence, every so often, people must be subject to anodyne phrases like "sitting is the new smoking" and before that, "sugar is the new smoking".

Restricting fast-food perhaps isn't a bad idea, particularly for young people amongst whom research indicates it is both a consequence of and cause for mental issues. But what do you replace it with? Kids having KFC and McDonald's for multiple meals in the West are statistically more likely to belong to lower-income groups. In the West, it is more expensive and difficult to procure healthy produce than to walk down to the takeaway or order in.

Like most addictive substances, fast food targets the poor and vulnerable and the solution to it cannot just be restricting individual choice. Like most short-cuts in life, prohibition tends to backfire in the long run. What is more important is to ensure food habits and economies that do not make eating healthy a function of wealth, or something that requires intervention from the state. Obesity, like most public health issues, is a social problem. Tackling it requires expanding choice — especially the ability to make healthy ones — rather than restricting them.

WHAT IS NOROVIRUS AND WHAT SHOULD YOU DO TO AVOID CATCHING IT?

With 34 norovirus infections reported at a veterinary college in Wayanad, Kerala's health minister Veena George has urged people to be vigilant.

"With proper prevention and treatment, the disease can be cured quickly. Therefore, everyone should be aware of

the disease and its means of prevention," George said.

Symptoms of norovirus include diarrhoea, vomiting, nausea and stomach pain. The symptoms may result in severe dehydration.

Treatment includes taking rest, consuming oral rehydration salts (ORS) and

possible further medical care if needed.

With Kerala recently reporting a case of Nipah (in September), Zika (over 70 cases in July) and a continuing ebb of COVID-19 cases (over 6,600 cases as of Friday), the addition of a new virus to worry about may be concerning. However, norovirus, while contagious, is seldom fatal in adults.

"A systematic review of 39 studies in adults aged > 65 years worldwide reported the hospitalization rate for norovirus gastroenteritis as 1-19 per 10,000 persons and the mortality rate as 0.4-3.2 per 100,000 persons," stated a 2019 review published in BMC Infectious Diseases.

Usually transmitted via contaminated food or water, or by touching contaminated surfaces and then touching one's mouth with unwashed hands, or via direct contact with an infected person, norovirus is the leading cause of acute gastroenteritis,

annually causing an estimated 685 million cases, according to the US Centres for Disease Control (CDC). "About 200 million cases are seen among children under 5 years old, leading to an estimated 50,000 child deaths every year, mostly in developing countries," the CDC says.

"It only takes a very small amount of norovirus particles (fewer than 100) to make you sick. People with norovirus illness shed billions of virus particles in their stool and vomit and can easily infect others," the CDC says, noting that the virus can spread quickly in enclosed places like daycare centers, nursing homes, schools, and cruise ships. Norovirus can also stay on objects and surfaces and still infect people for days or weeks. It can also survive some disinfectants, making it hard to get rid of.

With all the cases reported coming from a single college, the Kerala health ministry has stepped in to sanitise the water supply with super chlorination

of water, according to the health minister.

"Drinking water sources need to be ensured to be hygienic," she said.

The national guidelines for prevention of gastrointestinal infections in hospital wards recommend hand hygiene, use of personal protective equipment, following aseptic techniques, cleaning and decontaminating soiled instruments followed by sterilisation or high-level disinfection, appropriate disposal of biomedical waste (BMW), appropriate cleaning and disinfection of the environment, improving safety in operating rooms and other high-risk areas and maintaining a safe working environment and safe work practice.

The CDC recommends practicing proper hand hygiene, washing fruits and vegetables and cooking seafood thoroughly, avoiding preparing food or caring for others when you are sick, cleaning and disinfecting contaminated surfaces and washing laundry thoroughly.

Bihar: Dead man wins Panchayat poll after villagers vote to 'honour his last wish'

Patna, 28th Nov, 2021: A dead man has won a Panchayat poll held on Wednesday riding on a "sympathy wave" generated by his own death. The real-life tag comedy was detected in this impoverished district, situated about 20 kms from the state capital, when officials were handing over certificates to candidates who won the polls held on November 24.

Sohan Murmu, who won ward no. 2 of Deepakhar village, falling under Khairi block, was now here to be found. "On enquiry, we learnt that Murmu had died on November 6, more than a fortnight before voting took place", Khairi BDO Raghavendra Tripathi said

with a sense of bewilderment. Deepakhar happens to be a remote hamlet situated along the state's border with Jharkhand, which perhaps explains the demography of the village which has a predominantly tribal population. Old residents also recall that it was this village which was first hit by Naxal activity, in the 1990s, in the district that later became one of the worst infested by ultra-Left insurgency, according to anti-subversive by the Union Home Ministry a few years ago. Nonetheless, Tripathi's account of what has happened suggests that the village and its residents retain an amazing simplicity, bordering on downright sentimentality. "Family

members of Murmu, who defeated his rival by 28 votes, said it was the last wish of the deceased, who had been ailing, to win the election. So they kept quiet. No resident of the village informed us either. It appears that they all voted in his favour out of their last wish", said the BDO.

The naïveté of the bereaved family members and fellow villagers, nonetheless, has brought more work for the officials. "The winner's certificate cannot be issued to anybody. We are going to write to the state election with the request that election for the ward concerned be nullified and fresh polls held", said Tripathi in a matter of fact way.

'Judges-appointing-judges' system needs reform: President Kovind

New Delhi, 28th Nov, 2021: Six years after the Supreme Court mixed Parliament's NJAC Act that had replaced the "judges-selecting-judges" collegium system, President Ram Nath Kovind on Saturday gave a fresh momentum to calls for reforming the selection method and suggested nurturing of grass root-level judges, chosen through an all-India exam, for promotion to higher judiciary.

Kovind said reforms in the judge selection process is a "perennial issue", which should be attempted without diluting the independence of judiciary. "I am of the firm view that independence of judiciary is non-negotiable. Without diluting it to the slightest degree, can a better way be found to select judges for the higher judiciary," the President asked during his speech at the valedictory function of the "Constitution Day" celebrations at Vigyan Bhavan.

Listening to him were Chief Justice of India N V Ramana, SC judges and Chief Justices of the high courts. The President said, "There can be an all-India Judicial Service which can select, nurture and promote the right talent from the

lowest to the higher levels. This idea is not new and has been around for more than half a century without being tested."

"I am sure there could also be better suggestions to reform the (judge-selecting) system. Ultimately, the aim should be to strengthen the justice delivery mechanism," Kovind said. On October 15, 2016, after a judge bench had by 4:1 majority struck down the National Judicial Appointments Commission (NJAC) and revived the SC-scripted quarter-century-old collegium system.

It had set the stage for a confrontation with the executive, which played out for some time in accepting collegium recommendations for appointment of judges. The main ground for striking down NJAC was the presence of the law minister and two eminent jurists in the six-member body. The SC had feared that the minister and jurists could join hands to reject proposals of the judiciary — the Chief Justice of India and two senior-most judges of SC. Under the quashed NJAC, any two members could veto a proposal.

On Friday, SC Bar Association (SCBA) President Vikas Singh told the collegium system for selection of judges needs to be streamlined, preferably through legislative process. He said the SC judgment mandates a Memorandum of Procedure to ensure that best names are considered by the collegium transparently. "A suitable legislation in the form of a bill to replace the collegium system can be brought within the said timeline to facilitate appointment of judges to the HCs and SC," he said.

President Kovind also flagged the monstrous pendency, probably taking a cue from Attorney General K K Venugopal's flagging of cases taking 30 years to reach finality and complaining that this is not giving justice but violating the litigant's fundamental right to speedy justice. Kovind said pendency of cases poses enormous challenges to all stakeholders in the judiciary. Though many debates and suggestions have come in the past to tackle pendency, "the debate continues and pendency keeps increasing. Ultimately, the citizens and organisations, which have grievances, bear the brunt," he said.

No need to panic over new Covid-19 variant: ICMR

New Delhi, 28th Nov, 2021: Amid mounting concern over cases of the new variant of concern Omicron detected in some countries, the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) on Saturday said there is no need to panic and instead urged people to not delay their second dose of Covid vaccine besides ensuring preventive measures.

"The structural changes detected in the virus may not necessarily give rise to a functional change of concern. It may not necessarily be lethal or result in severe form of disease. There is no such data, as of now. Of course, we have to wait and see," said S Samiran Panda, Head of Epidemiology & Communicable Diseases, at ICMR.

According to Panda, the structural changes or mutations found in SARS-CoV-2 through genome sequencing in the lab are indicative but do not necessarily mean the new variant is highly transmissible. However, active vigilance and preventive measures are important,

he said. "There is no need to panic. We need to ramp up vaccination immediately. If larger proportion of people will be covered with two doses of vaccine, that will be a great public health move. Besides, there is need to strengthen genome sequencing among international travellers," Panda said.

Underlining that even if the mutation is serious, the mode of transmission remains same and therefore, vaccination and other public health measures such as proper use of mask, avoiding mass gatherings and hand sanitisation are crucial to combat the situation. The WHO's Technical Advisory Group on SARS-CoV-2 Virus Evolution on Friday assessed the new variant B.1.1.529, which was first reported to the UN health agency from South Africa on November 24. "This variant has a large number of mutations, some of which are concerning. Preliminary evidence suggests an increased risk of reinfection with this variant as compared to other VOCs. The

number of cases of this variant appears to be increasing in almost all provinces in South Africa," WHO said while designating Omicron as "VOC". Apart from South Africa, Hong Kong, Botswana, Israel and Belgium have reported Covid-19 cases due to Omicron. Panda said the alarm has been raised because cases have been found in multiple countries though total numbers have reported many cases. "International travellers need to be under surveillance because the cases have entered other countries due to movement of people globally. In many countries the number of cases due to this mutation are few. Then, how can I say it is more transmissible. We are deliberating on it and time will only tell," he said. While India has not reported any case of Covid-19 due to the new mutant variant, this might be an opportunity to ramp up vaccination coverage and implement stringent public health measures to avoid any surge in cases.

Centre alerts states over omicron variant, asks to continue monitoring hotspots

New Delhi, 28th Nov, 2021: In the wake of the new Covid-19 variant, omicron, triggering apprehension across the world, the Centre has alerted states and Union territories and asked to step up testing, vigilance, containment and vaccine coverage. In a letter written to the chief secretaries of all states and Union territories, Union health secretary Rajesh Bhushan said states need to continue monitoring the Covid hotspots. In a proactive stance, the countries from where the variant of concern has been found as already been identified by the Centre as "at-risk" countries for additional follow up measures of international travellers coming

to India, the health ministry said. The new variant believed to be more

transmissible and immune-evasive, has prompted countries to impose travel restrictions. Apart from Botswana, Hong Kong, South Africa, the new variant has now been detected in the UK, Australia, Czech Republic, Italy, Germany, Israel, the Netherlands etc.

"It is essential that the disease surveillance network in the country is geared up for rigorous follow up of all international travellers from all countries especially countries designated as 'At Risk'. There is already a reporting mechanism

for obtaining past travel details of passengers coming through international flights this should be reviewed at your level and the protocol provided by this Ministry should be strictly ensured including testing on disembarkation of international travellers coming from 'At Risk' Countries and sending all positive samples for genome sequencing to INSACOG Labs in a prompt manner," the health secretary wrote in his letter.

Emphasising the need to strengthen testing infrastructure, the health ministry observed that the overall testing, as well as the proportion of RT-PCR tests, have declined in some states. "In the absence

of sufficient testing, it is extremely difficult to determine the true level of infection spread. States must strengthen the testing infrastructure and strictly implement the testing guidelines," Rajesh Bhushan wrote.

States should continue monitoring Covid hotspots, areas where recent cluster of positive cases have emerged. "In all such 'hotspots', saturation testing and sending of positive samples quickly for genome sequencing to designated INSACOG Labs must be ensured," the ministry wrote. States should also aim at achieving a positivity rate of below 5%, the ministry stressed.

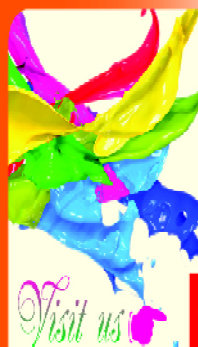

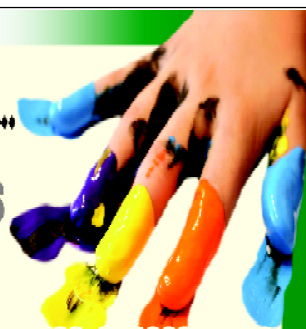

OMICRON: STATES TOLD TO STEP UP SURVEILLANCE; KEJRIWAL SEEKS FLIGHT BAN

Union health secretary Rajesh Bhushan has written to state governments asking them to step up containment and surveillance measures for COVID after the emergence of the Omicron variant, first detected in South Africa.

The health ministry was quoted by NDTV as saying "It is imperative that intensive containment, active surveillance, increased coverage of vaccination and COVID-appropriate behaviour be enforced in a very proactive measure to effectively manage this variant of concern. Ample testing infrastructure need to be operationalised to tackle any surge due to this mutated virus. It has been observed that the overall testing as well as the proportion of RT-PCR tests have declined in some states. In the absence of sufficient testing, it is extremely difficult to determine the true level of infection spread."

The health ministry noted that countries where Omicron had been detected had been labelled as 'high risk', warranting follow-up surveillance of international travellers.

"It is essential that the disease surveillance network in the country is geared up for rigorous follow-up of all international travellers from all countries especially countries designated as 'at risk', " Hindustan Times quoted the health



ministry as saying.

The Times of India reported on Sunday that COVID testing measures had been tightened at Delhi Airport. Arrivals from three Omicron hotspots—South Africa, Zimbabwe and Hong Kong—will be required to wait at the airport for their test report and only those found negative will be allowed to leave, say sources.

Those testing positive will be sent to designated COVID centres. Arrivals from other at-risk countries will be allowed to leave after their sample and the result will be

conveyed to them electronically.... Meanwhile, Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal has urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to restrict flights.

In a letter to Modi, Kejriwal noted "We should do everything possible to prevent the new variant of concern, recently recognised by the WHO, from entering India... I urge you to stop flights from these regions with immediate effect. Any delay in this regard may prove harmful, if any affected person enters India."



Tata Steel to boost iron ore production to 45 million tonnes per annum in 5 yrs

Tata Steel will focus on augmenting iron ore production from 30 million tonnes per annum to 45 MTPA in the next five years, a company official said on Saturday. The total iron ore production from the steelmaker's captive mines in Noamundi in Jharkhand and in Kalamati, Joda and Khondabond blocks in Odisha, is about 30 MTPA, he said.

"In the next five years, we will focus on increasing iron ore production capacity to 45 MTPA in line with the expansion in the steelmaking facilities in the country," company's ore, mines and quarries (OMQ) division general manager Atul Kumar Bhatnagar said. He,



however, claimed that the present capacity is sufficient to meet the iron ore requirement in Tata Steel's manufacturing facilities in Jharkhand's Jamshedpur and Odisha's Kalinganagar. The steelmaker had started its iron ore mining operation at Noamundi in 1925 and the mine will turn 100 in 2025, he said.

During the fifth National Conclave on Mines & Minerals in New Delhi on November 23, Noamundi iron ore mine was accorded the 'five-star' rating for three consecutive years from 2017-18 for sustainable development. Asked about the use of drones in the mining sector, Bhatnagar said it is being deployed for surveying and monitoring purposes.

As part of the sustainable development of the block, a solar power plant spread over 19.2 acres of mined-out land was installed in 2017 in Noamundi, he said, adding that the green cover has also been increased in the area.
