Patients rue insufficient doctors, poor condition of PHC Kalighat

Port Blair, Oct 8: Rural population in remote villages of Kalighat suffers due to shortage of doctors at PHC Kalighat. The rural hospital is suffering from acute shortage of doctors. The situation has taken such a turn that doctors are available at patients can see doctors after gaps of weeks together. At present there is only one doctor at PHC Kalighat to look after the patients of Kalighat area who also did not attend the patients on a regular basis. The single doctor sometimes visits after the interval of 10 to 15 days and then the staff of PHC Kalighat attend the out-patients and in-patients. On a daily basis, 40 to 50 out patients hailing from far off places visit the hospital for treatment. But due to lack of doctors, the patients had to face a lot of difficulties. Patients have demanded appointment of at

least 23 doctors at PHC Kalighat on urgent basis. Another problem is providing treated water to patients of Kalighat PHC. Patients have complained that there is no arrangement of pure drinking water or RO plant to supply drinking water to the patients of PHC Kalighat. In-patients as well as out-patients had to arrange the drinking water on their own. The existing water treatment kit has gone defunct and needs to be replaced with a new one.

Another issue causing problems to the patients is the non-staying of medical staff of PHC Kalighat in the hospital. Presently the staff have to travel from Diglipur to reach Kalighat PHC which consumes considerable amount of time and patients have reported that staff delay arrival on duty is a cause of worry. Maximum staff have to

travel from Diglipur to Kalighat for their duty despite having sufficient vacant staff quarters at Kalighat.

Another issue concerning the patients is the pharmacy counter is not properly arranged for smooth communication with the out patient for their medicine prescription. The Pharmacy Counter is completely covered with glass as there is no way for communication between the pharmacist and the out-patients for their use of medicine and prescription. The poor and illiterate out patient finds it difficult to get the information relating to using their medicine given by the pharmacist. Providing street lights in front of the PHC Kalighat and supply of meals to the in-patients are some of the other issues facing PHC Kalighat.

MP demands to schedule weekly two sailing of ships/boats for Diglipur, Mayabunder & Rangat

Port Blair, Oct 8: The Member of Parliament of Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Mr. Kuldeep Rai Sharma today requested the Chief Secretary to schedule weekly two sailing of ships/boats for Diglipur, Mayabunder and Rangat region so that people can safely and comfortably travel between North and Middle Andaman and Port Blair without fearing for their safety.

In his letter addressed to the Chief Secretary the Member of Parliament today mentioned that after the recent intervention of the Chief Secretary, the work for upgradation of Andaman Trunk Road has gained speed but due to

continuous rain and various other logistic and technical shortcomings the condition of Andaman Trunk Road from Baratang to Diglipur still remains worrisome. The MP added that worst hit are the patients, old age people and children who have to travel through the slushy Andaman Trunk Road, risking their lives. Not only this, all other ATR commuters fear for the safety of their lives and vehicles every time they cross Andaman Trunk Road. Hence he requested to schedule weekly two sailing of ships/boats for Diglipur, Mayabunder and Rangat region for larger interest of public.



LG discusses with Scindia about operationalisation of water aerodromes in islands

Low pressure in North Andaman Sea

New Delhi, Oct 8: October is a cruel month for Odisha and its people are gripped with the fear of yet another possible cyclone during the period as the IMD Thursday forecast that a low pressure is likely to brew in north Andaman Sea.

The low pressure area is very likely to form around October 10, 2021 and becomes more marked and move west-north west towards south Odisha and north Andhra Pradesh during the subsequent four to five days, the IMD said in its bulletin.

Different weather models have, however, created fear among

the people as October is considered the 'cyclone month' for the state. Most of the major cyclones that hit Odisha coast took place in October. The super cyclone, the most powerful by far to hit the country, had made its landfall near Paradip and killed about 10,000 people on October 29, 1999.

Cyclones Phailin, Hudhud and Tili all took place in the same month in 2013, 2014 and 2018 respectively, an official of the Special Relief Commissioner's office said. "Cyclone Gulab made landfall in neighbouring Andhra

Asian cultural juggernaut

Twenty-six new words of Korean origin have been added this month to that venerable institution, the Oxford English Dictionary, along with revisions to 11 existing entries, and there's simply no denying it now. The whole world has been swept by Hallyu (the Korean wave). K-pop sensations BTS and Blackpink are on every playlist from Seoul to Santiago, while the Korean thriller *Squid Game*, released only two weeks ago, is about to become Netflix's most watched show ever.

Since 1987, when it took a democratic turn after decades of authoritarianism, South Korea has made culture one of its two claims to international recognition (technology is the other). For a tiny nation, scarred by war and invasions, and sandwiched between more geopolitically powerful states such as China, Russia and Japan, perhaps there was no other way. Whatever the reason, South Korea now packs a soft power punch that has few parallels, especially for a non-Western nation. Consider how efficiently the global K-pop fandom has leveraged social media for political ends, including drumming up support for the Black Lives Matter movement and disrupting a Donald Trump rally last year. South Korea's pop cultural influence has allegedly even led to official condemnation of "sissy men" (a reference to many male K-pop artists' use of makeup and jewellery) in China.

While it's been over a decade since South Korea's Asian neighbours (including parts of India) succumbed to the breezy charms of K-dramas, the hip hop-influenced energy of K-pop and the promises held out by the wildly successful K-beauty industry, the rest of the world took some time to catch on. With *Parasite* sweeping the Oscars last year, the Korean cultural invasion officially entered its global phase and it was only a matter of time before the OED bowed before the juggernaut. As K-everything fans around the world would exclaim, daebak (fantastic)!

FURTHER LIQUIDITY NORMALISATION, REVERSE REPO RATE HIKE LIKELY IN NEXT RBI MPC MEETING: EXPERTS

Gradualism—that's how Friday's monetary policy announcement by RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das can be summed up. The monetary policy committee left the repo rate unchanged for the eighth time at four per cent. Reverse repo rate was also left unchanged and the "accommodative" stance continues.

At the same time, the central bank is done with its secondary market government securities acquisition programme (G-SAP), at least for now. Also, the liquidity mop up via variable rate reverse repo (VRRR) operations are being increased, again only gradually. As Das himself put it, "our entire approach is one of gradualism. We do not want surprises."

The monetary policy is clearly suggesting that the economy is getting back on track, but we are not fully there yet; inflation is back in the targeted zone, but a surge in prices of crude oil and other commodities globally needs to be watched out too. "We don't want to rock the boat. We have to reach the shore, which is now visible and there is life, there is journey beyond the shore," says Das. So, how is the road looking ahead like. Is the interest rate cycle about to change over the next few quarters?

"Looking forward, while no rate hikes or charge instance is imminent and next few inflation prints may remain within RBI's comfort band, in calendar year 2022, there is likelihood of reverse repo rate being hiked, liquidity conditions being further normalised and short-term money market rates rising by 25-50 basis points," said Beky Kuriakose, head of fixed income at Principal Asset Management.

Madhavi Arora, lead economist at Emkay Global Financial Services says the RBI didn't "shock" the system with a reverse repo hike and the policy is well used as a lever to prepare markets for a gradual approach towards normalisation through both communication and action.

"The RBI so far has been trying to redistribute existing liquidity and increase the price of liquidity by higher VRRR quantum/cut-disfunders. It has now finally moved a step ahead—reducing further active liquidity infusion by not announcing new G-SAP calendar after sterilising earlier two installments with a simultaneous sale of bonds," said Arora.

A judicious mix of tools to manage liquidity will serve as a precursor to a reverse repo hike, possibly split between December and February MPC meetings with 15 basis points hike each, added Arora.

Looking ahead, it is not just how the inflation and growth trajectory pans out domestically that RBI will have to watch out for, but also what happens elsewhere around the globe, particularly the moves of the US Federal Reserve, which could have impact on emerging markets, including India.

Dhananjay Sinha, MD and chief strategist at JM Financial Institutional

Securities sees the US Fed beginning to taper its quantitative easing from November and eventually hike interest rates in 2022.

While a strong dollar and improvement in credit demand should further reduce excess liquidity, the central bank may also have to deal with higher core inflation.

"Thus, there is a distinct possibility of policy normalisations in 2022, lower excess liquidity and rate hikes," said Sinha.

The RBI adopted a calibrated and patient approach towards managing liquidity and monetary policy support, recognising that there are still some

downside risks to growth, felt Abheek Barua, chief economist at HDFC Bank.

The removal of G-SAP was a big surprise and in the background of high oil prices and rising US treasury yields, this could lead to a rise in long-term bond yields, said Pankaj Pattnaik, fund manager – fixed income, Quantum Mutual Fund.

Indrani Pan, chief economist at Yes Bank feels the RBI has kept the room open for a reverse repo rate hike in the next MPC meet in December. However, he doesn't see any change to the repo rate in the current financial year. Upasna Bhardwaj, senior economist at Kotak Mahindra Bank also feels the RBI would hike the reverse repo rate in the December.

"We believe that the increasing risks to inflation especially as the economic activity is picking up pace has prompted the MPC into taking liquidity normalisation measures ahead of our expectations. We expect additional liquidity normalisation measures like overnight VRRR, increased quantum of higher tenure VRRR in the months ahead where expecting a reverse repo rate hike in December" said Bhardwaj.

Pradesh and affected several districts of southern Odisha in September this year," he said.

Sarat Sahu, a former director of the office here, said while the present weather situation appears to be conducive for a cyclone, it is premature to say anything about it so early. A conclusion can be drawn only on October 13.

The present director of the Meteorological Centre, H R Biswas said that nothing can be said about the possibility of cyclone now. "One can make a forecast only after the formation of low pressure," he said. The coastal State also witnessed summer cyclones in the month of May 2016. Amphan in May, 2020 and Yaas in May, 2021.

Generally there are two

cyclone seasons in Odisha – one during pre-monsoon period (April, May and June up to onset of monsoon) and another post-monsoon (October to December). More number of cyclones occurring during the post-monsoon season, Sahu said.

He said according to the available data Odisha has hit by 98 cyclones between 1901 to 2000, followed by Andhra Pradesh which saw 79 cyclones. West Bengal was hit by 69 cyclones, Tamil Nadu by 62, Karnataka by two, Maharashtra and Goa by 18, Gujarat 28 and Kerala by three.

The Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) has written to all the district collectors asking them to closely monitor the situation and circulate the IMD forecast

among the people. It also directed the district authorities to take actions as deemed necessary in case of any eventuality.

Meanwhile, the IMD has issued "Yellow Warning" till 8.30 am of October 9 due to the cyclonic circulation related to the withdrawal of monsoon. The districts which have been asked to remain prepared till 8.30 am of Friday are Sundargarh, Bargarh, Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Deogarh, Angul, Mayurbhanj, Keonjhar and Balasore. Malkangiri, Koraput, Nawarangpur, Rayagada, Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Gajapati and Ganjam districts were asked by IMD to be prepared for heavy rains due to the same reason till October 9 morning.

SUICIDE AND ITS PREVENTION: THE URGENT NEED IN OUR EDUCATION SYSTEM

Parents and Education system has to play major role in its deterrence

Port Blair, 8th Oct, 2021: Education is perhaps society's most critical responsibility. Educational institutions impart knowledge to students, lay emphasis on their physical well-being and prepare them for social challenges. But unfortunately, many educational institutions, teachers and parents are not fully equipped to understand the mental health issues of students.

Psychological concerns in children are on the rise, especially behavioral issues and suicides. A survey reflects that 12 per cent of Indian students between the age of 4 and 16 suffer from psychiatric disorders. 20 per cent

parents – all playing an active part in ensuring mental well-being in our society, parents often go into denial mode when it comes to their child's mental health, resorting to statements like, "My child has no such problems". This attitude must go. Parents must understand how fragile their children's mental well-being is and be proactive in assessing it.

Teachers certainly need to be trained in identifying symptoms and patterns of mental

issues. For example, before scolding a child for disruptive behavior, they could use these skills to analyse the reason behind such behavior. Also, educational institutions must have psychological counselling programs in place to help students deal with their issues in confidentiality and in a comfortable environment. Every child's coping mechanism is different. Hence, the counselling programs must be flexible, to cater to the needs of each

child individually. If needed, a student must be referred to a mental healthcare professional for timely intervention. Treatment and recovery are definitely possible through counselling, therapy and medication.

To ensure the holistic – physical, emotional and mental well-being of children, society must sincerely endeavor to bridge the gap in the education sector vis-à-vis mental well-being.

TATASWIN AIR INDIA WITH 18K CR BID, MAHARAJA HEADS HOME AFTER 68 YEARS

Air India employees cannot be retrenched for one year, VRS from 2nd year onwards

Port Blair, 8th Oct, 2021: The Tata Group will take over state-owned Air India, marking a successful end to the government's bid to privatise the national carrier after having failed to sell a majority stake in it in 2018. Tata will pay Rs 18,000 crore to acquire Air India from the government — of the total money 15% would go to the government and the rest will go in clearing debt.

"Tata's Pvt Ltd won the bid to own 100% of government stake in Air India," Tuhin Kant Pandey, secretary, Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM) announced today. "Bidders have agreed to all terms and conditions. Five bidders were disqualified as they did not meet the criteria," the DIPAM Secy said. "The process was carried out in a transparent manner with due regard to confidentiality of bidders."

This follows the group of ministers known as the Air India Specific Alternative Mechanism approving the bid winner. The panel was headed by home minister Amit Shah and included finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman, commerce minister Piyush Goyal and aviation minister Jyoti Radhika Sarda. The long-awaited Air India divestment

is being heralded as one of the biggest reforms by the Narendra Modi government. The earlier attempt in 2018 didn't find any takers.

The reserve price was fixed at Rs 12,906 crore, and the winning bidder will take Rs 15,300 crore debt. It will also retain all Air India employees for one year, and can offer VRS in the 2nd year, as per the Aviation Ministry. The government had received two bids for the airline — one from the Tata Group and the other from SpiceJet chairman Ajay Singh in his personal capacity.

The deal includes a 100% stake in Air India and low-fare unit Air India Express as well as a 50% holding in ground-handling company AISATS. The government plans to hand over the airline to the buyer in another four months with the process starting 15 days after the announcement of the result. Bids for the carrier were sought through enterprise value. Under the formula, a minimum 15% was to go to the government and the rest will be used to reduce existing debt.

Air India's total debt stands at Rs 43,000 crore, an increase of about Rs 20,000 crore in the past two years due to the effects of Covid on the industry. The government plans

to absorb this portion and transfer the airline to the new owners with a debt of Rs 23,000 crore — a large part of it will be retired with the bid money. Analysts say that Air India would bring in benefits for the Tatas, if the group plays it right.

"Air India has come full circle, back into the arms of its founders, the Tatas. Bold, brave move but will be the bountiful for the new owners? If they play it right, take advantage of the vacuum presented by a post-Covid landscape, can carve a new future for the national airline," said Shukor Yusoff, founder of Endau Analytics, a Kuala Lumpur based consultant.

"India's got a lot going for aviation — a rising middle class, likely growth in travel & tourism, domestic & from abroad & it sits between the Gulf & Southeast Asia, an area of vast potential for air travel. Finally it fits nicely into (PM) Modi's privatisation plans. Of course there will be lots of challenges, including rising fuel costs, intense competition from LCCs & if Tata has the staying power to manage heavy losses during the initial takeoff period." The winning Tata Group will have to retain all employees for a period of one year, the government said after the conglomerate emerged as winner of the bid. The Air India will now return to the Tata Group after it was nationalised in 1953. The government further said that the winning bidder will have to offer VRS to those who will be terminated from second year onwards.

Air India has a total of 12,085 employees among which 8,084 are permanent and 4,001 are contractual. Air India Express has 1,434 employees. The Tatas had submitted a bid for Rs 18,000 crore which was well above the reserve price of Rs 12,906 crore. The transaction is expected to close by December. On Air India's brand and logo, the government said that the winning bidder will have to retain it for five years.

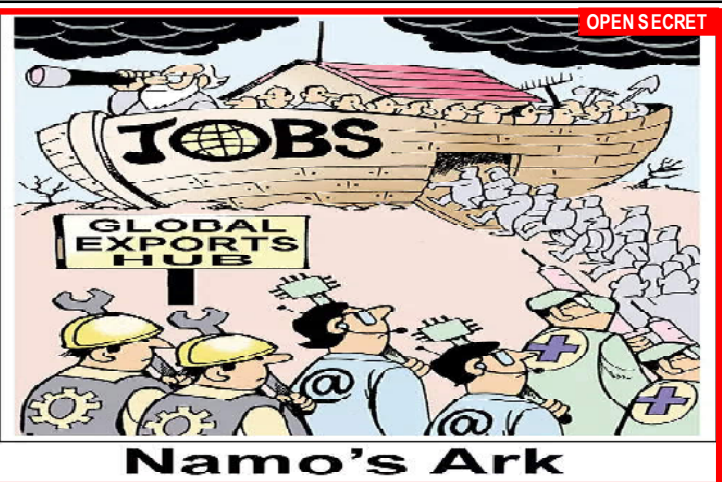
