Only seats, not cities

Municipal elections seldom attract attention outside their catchment area. However, elections to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, where AAP captured a majority displacing three-term winner BJP, was different. It embodied the fierce political competition between India's pre-eminent national party BJP and its most competitive challenger, AAP. Some regional parties do pack a punch and BJP hasn't quite got their measure. But AAP is the only other party to keep expanding its geographical footprint, often at the expense of India's original political hegemon, Congress. All these factors played out in MCD elections.

AAP secured a simple majority with 134 seats in the corporation. BJP did better than the exit polls predicted with 104 seats while Congress, expectedly, was reduced to a rump. MCD isn't the only fiercely contested urban local body polls. Two years ago, BJP pulled out all stops to capture Hyderabad's urban body, with even home minister Amit Shah campaigning extensively. It ran TRS dose. Soon, we will see another high-decibel contest in Mumbai for BMC, India's richest urban body, where the two Senas have a lot at stake, as does BJP.

But do fierce contests translate into better outcomes for voters? Certainly not, as a proxy indicator like voter participation or anecdotal evidence suggests. The turnout for MCD was just above 50%, below the level recorded in 2017 and also the last Delhi assembly election. It's a reflection of the dysfunctional state of India's urban bodies. This is best captured by RBI's description that Indian cities are "emaciated financially". The core problem is that state governments are unwilling to let go of functions that the Constitution's 74th amendment recommended 30 years ago.

One of the outcomes is that urban bodies are underfunded. In India, the average municipal revenue is around 1% of GDP. The comparable figures in Brazil and South Africa are 7.4% and 6% respectively. Municipalities largely depend on property tax for revenue. Interstate comparison suggests that this electorally-sensitive tax rate is an area where corporations don't have a decisive say. For example, RBI's data shows that MCD's own tax revenue as a proportion of total revenue not only trails the national average, it's even lower than a relatively poorer urban Assam. Indian cities need more than high-decibel elections. But absolutely no political party seems interested. No wonder voters are losing interest.

Google to focus on investing in women-led startups

Google will focus on investing in women-led early-stage startups through its Rs 75,000 crore India Digitisation Fund, a senior company official said on Monday.

The company had launched USD 10 billion -- about Rs 75,000 crore as per the prevailing exchange rate at the end of 2020 -- to make access to the internet affordable. Through Google IDF, the company bought a 7.73 per cent stake in Jio for USD 4.5 billion and a 1.2 per cent stake in Bharti Airtel for USD 700 million. "Moving forward, as part of our IDF investments, we will be targeting support for early-stage companies with a particular focus on women-led startups," Sanjay Gupta, Country Manager and VP, Google India said at Google for

India event. The company announced several projects powered by artificial intelligence, including speech technology, voice and video search etc. "With AI, text content can convert to video in an instant. Translations from English to virtually any language are possible at scale. AI can bring quantum leaps in online safety through advanced threat detection," Gupta said.

The company announced a collaboration with Bengaluru-based Indian Institute of Science to collect speech data from 773 districts across India to fine-tune its language translation and search technology. Google announced a grant of USD 1 million to set up India's first responsible AI centre at IIT Madras.

WHY SUNDAR PICHAI'S FIRST INDIA VISIT IN 5 YEARS IS IMPORTANT

Google CEO Sundar Pichai kicked off his first home country visit in five years by making the right noises about the government crackdown on Big Tech. But there is more to it than meets the eye.

"Technology needs responsible regulation. It is important for countries to safeguard their citizens," Pichai said at the Google for India 2022 event in Delhi, where he appeared side by side with union telecommunications, electronics and IT minister Ashwini Vaishnaw.

"Technology offers great opportunities, but also brings with it challenges," said the cabinet minister. After Vaishnaw mentioned the three new laws that the government is bringing in to regulate the country's digital ecosystem — Telecom Bill, Data Protection Bill and the upcoming Digital India Act, and how many feel that "the same template is needed in many others (countries) that are getting digitised," Pichai threw his weight behind the initiative.

"It is an important phase and we

are engaging constructively," Pichai said, adding that "it is important to make sure you're balancing... putting in safeguards for people (as well as) a framework so that companies can innovate on top of certainty in the legal framework. Through it, India can be a big export economy that benefits from an open and connected internet."

"(But) getting that balance right will be important," Pichai warned.

While the three bills do not per se harshly target Big Tech companies like Google and Meta (parent of Facebook and WhatsApp), there are worries within the search engine giant on how the implementation will play out and how stringently the clauses will work out practically. Adding to the worries have been the Competition Commission of India's (CCI) two recent tranches of penalties on the company for abusing its dominant position in the Android smartphone operating system, as well as its stranglehold on the PlayStore of apps on the Android platform.

The Rs 2,274 crore penalty

slapped on Google comes on the heels of similar adverse verdicts in countries ranging from Australia to France that have formed a pattern of governments and regulatory bodies taking on the unbridled growth and influence of Big Tech seen over the past decade.

umbrella bills Vaishnaw spoke about, there is also a social media intermediary rule that targets how the big companies run social media. There is also a case pending against sharing of news filed by Indian media entities, after action by Australian courts on a

bargaining chip. After Apple started manufacturing its phones in India, the Indian government is pretty keen to get Google also to do the same, as part of a larger narrative to project India as a manufacturing hub alternative to China.

Shut out of the Chinese market, India is the biggest digital market for the global tech industry in numbers -- more than 70 crore Indians already use the internet, while the future growth potential is unparalleled.

After pushing the union government to withdraw its original plan to insist on the local storage of data, Big Tech and multinationals would no doubt now try to ensure that the provisions of the three upcoming bills (as well as related sector-specific regulations the government is planning for the internet economy) are 'light touch' enough for their liking. The long period given for public consultations for the two bills already out (Digital India Act is expected to be out in the new year) thus augurs well for those hoping for the same. - Source : The week

Registration Certificate under the ReAL Craft, Fishing License and Biometric ID cards of Fishers/QR coded Aadhaar card. Indigenous lore and the fire knowledge we ignore

As long as fire strategy prioritises suppression, the valuable knowledge of Indigenous people will continue to be sidelined.

The hazy outline of the Sutter Buttes lingers on the horizon on the drive along Highway 32 connecting the Sierra Nevada Mountains with California's Sacramento Valley. Volcanic in geology, the Buttes are, according to the Plains Miwok creation story, the source of the fire that burnt the world over.

The small mountain range teaches a lesson from a time when people had to learn to use fire as a tool or live in fear of the destruction described in the ancient story.

Fire has played a key role in the land management practices of Indigenous peoples for millennia. This includes Aboriginal Australians and Native Americans who share many similarities in fire knowledge.

At the core of Indigenous approaches to fire is traditional law and lore. Indigenous law is coded in the lore, the stories that define culture. Both lore and law are rooted in the landscape. According to lore, the landscape will

convey its need for burning based on factors such as the accumulation of dead plant material or the decline in resource conditions. These stories may also convey the penalties for not following the laws of the land, as the Buttes do, or as depicted in Aboriginal fire paintings.

Early white settlers noted that in the autumn or at the onset of the rainy season, Indigenous people would burn to clean up landscape to remove accumulated woody fuels on the ground and facilitate the growth of luxuriant grasses and herbs. This knowledge shapes how a culture interacts with fire and more specifically how, what, where, when, and why burning occurs for cultural and environmental reasons.

Indigenous fire knowledge is fluid, changing with changing conditions, and the ability to read the landscape comes with proper training. The concept of proper training, however, arguably plays out differently today from Indigenous fire knowledge of the past due to the impact of history and politics. After millennia of Indigenous cultural burning, colonisation introduced a new kind of law.

Colonisers in both Australia and the

USA disrupted Indigenous use of fire through the removal of people from their lands and policy prohibition. Colonial attitudes to fire, forged in the forests of Europe, focused on suppression.

Indigenous use of fire, whether for resource harvesting, hunting, vegetation and soil regeneration or maintenance of communal areas, were instead seen as an environmentally degrading practice. Such fires threatened both the property and the social hierarchies of rigidly ordered colonial societies.

To this day, in many parts of Australia and the US, colonisation and 20th Century fire suppression policies are continuing to act against traditional laws.

Researchers, policymakers and practitioners still have a tendency to dismiss or ignore fire knowledge that is alive today among Indigenous elders and cultural land stewards. This is despite the growing acceptance of Indigenous knowledge of cultivation systems and wildfire protection.

The consequences of the continual dominance of Western environmental narratives over Indigenous land

management practices in many fire-prone regions are burning that is illegal under Indigenous law, and catastrophic fires resulting in ecological and economic damage to land and property.

Fire knowledge and memories are retained by Indigenous elders, cultural practitioners, and land stewards. There is far more at stake than just managing the risk of wildfire. Burning and fire knowledge can maintain culture by linking people with natural resources for food and other cultural practices.

Patterns of land use and occupancy that have been weakened by changing ecosystems, climate change, and urban expansion, can be re-established. Engaging with Indigenous knowledge through fire allows Indigenous peoples in Australia and the US to re-engage as caretakers of their native lands. For example, while burns for basket-making resources have been conducted by US fire agencies in California in coordination with weavers from different tribal areas, they are done on agency time with agency rules.

More than just burning to stimulate the right grasses, the fires have a cultural

COLUMBIA'S SHREE NAYAR AWARDED OKAWA PRIZE FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

Columbia University professor Dr Shree K. Nayar has been awarded The Okawa Prize for his ground-breaking work on computer vision and computational imaging. If your mobile phone camera is exceeding your expectations, Nayar is one of the scientists who deserve your thanks.

A Columbia University statement said: "It is estimated that more than one billion smartphone users worldwide are using his technology on a daily basis." Nayar hails from Thiruvananthapuram, but lives and teaches in New York.

Nayar was awarded The Okawa Prize for "the invention of innovative imaging techniques and their widespread use in digital photography and computer vision." The prize instituted by The Okawa Foundation for Information and Telecommunications comprises a gold medal and a citation. The awards ceremony will be held in Tokyo in March 2023.

The Okawa Prize has been awarded every year since 1992. Until 1995, it was awarded to only one Japanese scientist every year. From 1996, the prize honours two scientists—one Japanese and one international candidate. Only two Indian-origin scientists have won it before Nayar—Dr Raj Reddy (2004) and Dr J.K. Aggarwal (2007).

Nayar is currently the T. C. Chang Professor of Computer Science at the university and heads the Columbia Vision Laboratory (CAVE), which develops computational imaging and computer vision systems. According to the university website: "His research is focused on three areas—the creation of novel cameras that provide new forms of visual information, the design of physics-based models for vision and graphics, and the development of algorithms for understanding scenes from images."



Nayar graduated in electrical engineering from the Birla Institute of Technology, Mesra, and completed his postgraduation from North Carolina State University. He then took forward his research at The Robotics Institute, Carnegie Mellon University, for three years before joining Hitachi as a visiting research scientist for a year. In 1990, he was awarded a PhD by Carnegie Mellon University, following which he moved to Columbia University, where he continues to work.

Among many other awards, Nayar has received the David Marr Prize twice (1990 and 1995), the David and Lucile Packard Fellowship in 1992, the National Young Investigator Award in 1993, the NTT Distinguished Scientific Achievement Award in 1994, the Keck Foundation Award for Excellence in Teaching in 1995 and the Columbia Great Teacher Award in 2006.

He has also been elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the National Academy of Inventors and the Indian National Academy of Engineering. In February 2008, at the young age of 45, he was elected to the National Academy of Engineering—the highest honour for an engineer in the United States. - Source : Theweek

'Not going to retire from Argentina team:' LIONEL MESSI after his World Cup win

Brushing aside all speculations about his retirement, Argentina star Lionel Messi, who achieved his World Cup dream on Sunday after beating France, said he would continue to play for his country.

After receiving the Golden Ball award for the best player of the tournament, Messi said: "No, I'm not going to retire from the Argentina national team," he told TyC Sports, an Argentinean media. "I want to continue playing as a champion."

The football legend, who scored two goals in the final before his spotkick in the shoot-out that Argentina won 4-2, said he had a feeling he was going to win the tournament this time around.

"It's crazy that it happened this way. I wanted it very much," 35-year-old said. "I knew that God was going to give it to me, I had a feeling that it was going to be this way. Now to enjoy. Look at this cup, it's beautiful. We suffered a lot but we made it. We can't wait to be in Argentina and to see how crazy it's going to be," he added.

He added that the trophy was what he wanted all of his life. "This was my dream since childhood. It's anyone's childhood dream," Messi said. "I was lucky to have achieved everything in this career ... and this one that was missing is here,"



said Messi.

This is Argentina's first win since Diego Maradona led them to victory in Mexico in 1986.

Argentina head coach Lionel Scaloni too said Messi will always be welcome to play for Argentina. "First of all, we need to save him a spot for the World Cup 2026," Scaloni said. "If he wants to keep playing, he will be with us. I think he is more than entitled to decide whether

he wants to keep playing or what he wants to do with his career."

Scaloni added that it was a huge pleasure for him to coach Messi and his teammates. "Everything that he transmits to his teammates is something unparalleled, something I have never seen before -- a player, a person who gives so much to his teammates," Scaloni added.

Over 28.46 crore unorganised workers registered on e-SHRAM

The government today said more than 28.46 crore unorganised workers have been registered on e-SHRAM portal till 13th of this month. Ashokan, an emperor of throws at age 92

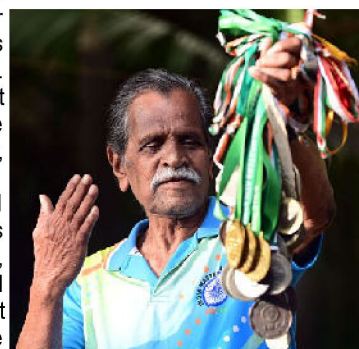
It was on a rainy day that I met the athlete, K.A. Ashokan in Thiruvananthapuram. Heavy rain in the morning had made the 92-year-old man allow a change in his daily routine. Instead of travelling 4km to the Central Stadium in the city for his daily run, he was content doing push-ups, stretches and jogging at his house in Karamana.

Not fully content, though, because he could not meet his friends: young boys and girls who train with him at the stadium every day. "I do not want to interact too much with people older than 30," he said. "People past that age have only complaints. Who wants to listen to these complaints? Interaction with young people will keep you young. I do not want to miss it for even a day." Ashokan always has a smile on his face. He has been winning medals at the National Masters Athletics Championships for four decades. The championship is for people above the age of 35.

In the last championship at Cuddalore in May, he won the gold in shotput, discus throw, javelin throw and long jump. He has stayed strong and healthy, he said, thanks to his daily practice, regular meals, and a diet rich in fruits and vegetables. He wakes up at 5am and leaves for the stadium in 30 minutes. "Either I take an auto-rickshaw or my son drops me at the stadium," he said. He stopped riding his Kinetic Honda a few years before he turned 90; his driving licence was cancelled when he was 85. After returning from the stadium, he pokes around in his garden, reads four newspapers, watches games on television and works on files sent by the Kerala and national masters athletics federations. He is one of their office bearers. Whenever he travels for championships or for the federations' work, he travels alone. Ashokan was born at Cherai on the Vypin island near the port of Kochi. "When I was a child, islands in Vypin did not even have proper roads," he said.

"Once you cross 75, you are not allowed to participate in triple jump or pole-vault," he said. "So,

as I became a super-senior, I left my favourite items and shifted to shotput, discus, javelin and long jump." No lifestyle disease has troubled him, even though he was a smoker till the age of 62. "I started smoking during my days in the Navy," he said. "I decided to kick the habit 30 years ago and I did it right away. I felt some difficulty in the first month, but I did not touch a single cigarette after I decided to stop." From cigarettes, he moved to yoga and breathing exercises, which are still going strong. He generally avoids eating meat. "I do not follow any extreme diet regime," he said. "But I prefer not to eat out. I take more fruits while travelling." Two years ago, at age 90, he was in hospital "for the first time" in his life. "There was a discolouration on my tongue, and a doctor said it might lead to cancer. So, a portion of my tongue was surgically removed. Some of my teeth were also removed. I spent five days in hospital." After the surgery, it did not take much time for him to get back to his athletic life. The shelf in his office room at home is filled with his medals and trophies, but the hunger for winning has not diminished. Though he has little competition in his age bracket, he is preparing hard for the next fight because he knows that this fight is with his own age.
