uneven surface in the playground. It will take almost six months to clear the nails used for

construction of the pandals which will be left on the playground after dismantling the pandals. It has now become a common practice for the UT authorities to organize political and other events not

It's really basic

In April 1973, a 13-judge bench of the Supreme Court in a 7:6 majority delivered the institution's most consequential verdict. Known as the Kesavananda Bharati case, it declared that Parliament's right to amend the Constitution is not unfettered. An amendment cannot violate the Constitution's basic structure or fundamental architecture. The aftereffects still reverberate. On January 11, Vice-President Jagdeep Dhankhar in a speech questioned the basic structure doctrine. He said that the power of the Parliament to amend the Constitution and legislate is not subject to any other authority. In short, primacy of Parliament is inviolable.

The basic structure doctrine arose out of the working of the Constitution over two decades. The relevant article, 368, doesn't clearly spell out the scope of Parliament's amending power. At first, SC held that Parliament has unfettered power. Subsequent cases saw the emergence of dissenting views (Sajjan Singh vs State of Punjab) and in the Golak Nath case, the majority in an 11-judge bench held that fundamental rights cannot be abridged. Finally, in 1973 came the basic structure doctrine. It was not a bolt from the blue or usurpation of the powers of Parliament. Instead, it reflected the maturation of a democracy.

Take away the basic structure doctrine, the legislature could conceivably knock down the checks and balances that come through the separation of powers between the legislature, executive and judiciary. That would go against the tenor of the constituent assembly debates that had creation of a robust democracy as the main goal. Dhankhar identified SC's 4:1 verdict in 2015, which invoked the basic structure doctrine to strike down NJAC, as an example of incorrect usage. This paper disagreed with that verdict and shares many of politicians' critiques of the judiciary. However, that doesn't make a case against the basic structure doctrine. Instead, it points to a need for the judiciary to tighten it.

The problem is that SC often interprets the basic structure doctrine loosely. This opens the door to the judiciary to stray into domains of the legislature and executive. And that creates enormous problems. But just as an ill-conceived law does not undermine the primacy of the legislature in making them, problematic judicial verdicts do not make a case against the basic structure doctrine. Many aspects of judicial functioning need change. The basic structure doctrine is not one of them.

For conducting yearwise sports activities in the Netaji stadium, the playground should be well protected and maintained. But it is unfortunate that the UT administration has developed no

other alternate venues for organizing such an event. With technology becoming a new trend among the children of the city, and pursuing physical activity, exploring the great outdoors and playing games no longer enthrall the new generation today. Children, by and large, are more engaged with the mobile sets. At such a time when there is a need to encourage more and more children towards sports and games. Instead of developing more playgrounds for the children to play sports and games, the UT administration policy of destroying already existing playgrounds has not gone well with the sports lovers and players.

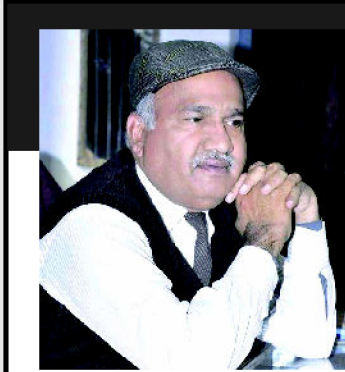

We all have read a lot about the behaviour of teachers in schools, a lot has been written on it. But we do not understand the need to think about how we behave with our own children at home and how wrong or right it is. Parental responsibility does not end with the mere birth of children, but begins with it. You have to deal with children all your life. All those aspects of life have to be learned by experiencing which we all cannot get by reading any book. Of children it is unfair to them to make them do any work against their will. Many such houses can be seen where the elders of the house have given more importance to the

decoration of the house than the wishes of the children. If we have a child in our house and our house is perfectly organized throughout the day, then the child is surely doing all that we like and what we are expecting from him. The child is not able to do what he likes at all. While it is necessary for the overall development of the child that he should be allowed to do whatever he wants to do, baby house fire. They are vandalizing, carrying water, kneading flour, spreading vegetables, playing with utensils in the kitchen, tearing paper, so they are enjoying it. What more would they do! Of course, all these acts are not seen by us, but some acts should be allowed to be done. The children and sometimes we also enjoy it. For example, the maternal grandfather of a child was sleeping soundly in the afternoon. A four-year-old girl went and sat on top of him and said, Nana, come on, get up, you have to get wet. Nana got up at once and he

had only one condition. Told her to stop, I sit in the courtyard. Then do whatever you want. The girl agreed and wet them completely with her health. Meanwhile, there was an atmosphere of laughter and games. After that both Nana and the child changed their clothes, Nana drank a cup of tea and everyone laughed and played as before. We can imagine how relieved the girl must have been during this time. This must have been one more episode in her childhood stories, which she herself will remember when she grows up and will be able to tell others as well. No matter how expensive toys we bring from the market and give to children, they enjoy playing with household items, they don't get that pleasure from any expensive toy. It is very important for us elders to understand the happiness they get by doing all this, how much it keeps them mentally healthy and strong. It is necessary to get to the bottom

of what the children are exploring while doing all this. But our attention does not go towards this and that is why we keep stopping them from doing all that all day long. Rather, they make him do all that which is boring for him. Small children can't speak why they have to grow up. Can't understand, so they cry and lift the house on their head and elders forcefully silence them, for their convenience. However, even if the children are able to speak, they are scolded or beaten and made to sit in one place. Raising children is not easy. Good parenting is not about spending a lot of money on children, but about understanding those, spending time with them, giving them the freedom to do whatever they want under your guidance, so that their minds can open up, not narrow down. They should be given a direction, so that they can see the world around them in every way. Understand everything from your own

experience and observation. Actually, children have a different world. In that world, they are not even aware of day and night. If a little effort is made to understand the children closely during their upbringing, then it will come to the fore that children enjoy doing only those things which they themselves decide to do. To understand what the children are thinking while doing any work, one has to go down to their level and understand. We the parents are their guide without imposing the pride and favor of giving birth to the children. Treat your children like companions. The things imposed on the soft mind and brain become a burden and later on the same things make the children's personality a victim of many negative tendencies. This is such an aspect related to psychology, which is rarely considered necessary to think about in our society. While this aspect deeply affects the formation of our personality.

Time to Re-Imagine Assessment Models in Indian schools

We are in the midst of one of the most crucial epochs of transformation that our education system has witnessed in decades, not least during the pandemic. The pace of reforms is aligned with the clarity with which the ecosystem is changing. The emphasis on a future-proof, modern education system that is relevant to the times has soared, and rightly so. While education systems are changing, it is all the more critical that assessment matches this pace. After all, assessment, I truly believe, sits at the core of the learning process. If our assessment models are not in sync with the evolving curriculum and the new-age pedagogies, it defeats the very idea of progress that we are seeking for our children.

ASSESSMENT FOR LEARNING: Firstly, we need to change the way we look at assessments and why we need them. Assessments have been used for upward mobility from one grade to the next, but it is also essential to see them as a means to guide a child's learning, gauge the process and integrate interventions to aid education

goals. It is time that we focused on 'assessment for learning' as much or perhaps more than we emphasise on 'assessment of learning'.

CHANGE IN LEARNING PATTERNS: We must also recognise that learning and its approaches are also undergoing a massive revamp. In addition to thematic knowledge, new-age learning is also about skills and developing character. Modern education today must lie at the intersection of all three - knowledge - of traditional subject matters like mathematics, and sciences, etc., skills - like critical thinking and creativity that help you adapt to contexts, face challenges and solve problems, and character - values like resilience, courage, leadership, that are imperative in today's day and time. Our assessment systems must therefore be able to capture and fully represent these competencies that the increasingly complex world demands.

DIFFERENCE IN FORMATIVE AND P E R F O R M A N C E ASSESSMENT: For students, formative assessments that

focus on their skills and learning curves help them understand themselves better and develop a stronger agency and autonomy. Performance assessments that take into consideration not just their thematic knowledge but critical skills, encourage a higher order of thinking, reasoning, and evaluating themselves.

TECHNOLOGY PLAYS A CRITICAL ROLE: Technology can and has been playing a critical role in generating usable assessment data which can be analysed to further adapt teaching approaches. Technology can aid in providing real-time learner feedback and provides opportunities to act on the same teachers, parents, etc. This will also hugely increase teacher-student engagement. Tech interventions for assessment can also provide essential support for a collaborative learning environment, which can include peer assessment and knowledge-sharing activities. Some educational institutes have also experimented with games-based assessment, which, although in its infancy, could be a great tool in the future.

NEP HELPS IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION

The NEP (New Education Policy) has made progress in the right direction with work towards developing a school quality assessment and accreditation framework, but we also need to develop standards for formative assessment of a student's learning throughout the school years. We must also imminently focus on training the teachers to understand, adopt and implement a new-age formative assessment model across schools.

MAJOR TAKEAWAYS: It is time for a paradigm shift in assessment in the Indian education system. We need to seek guidance from the ancient Indian education system, which focussed heavily on evaluating skills that can be practically applied to real-life situations and had strong systems of assessment. It is only when we change the way we look at assessment as a critical tool for achieving learning outcomes and understanding how best it can represent the skills of our students in entirety, can we develop brightly young minds who are learners for life.

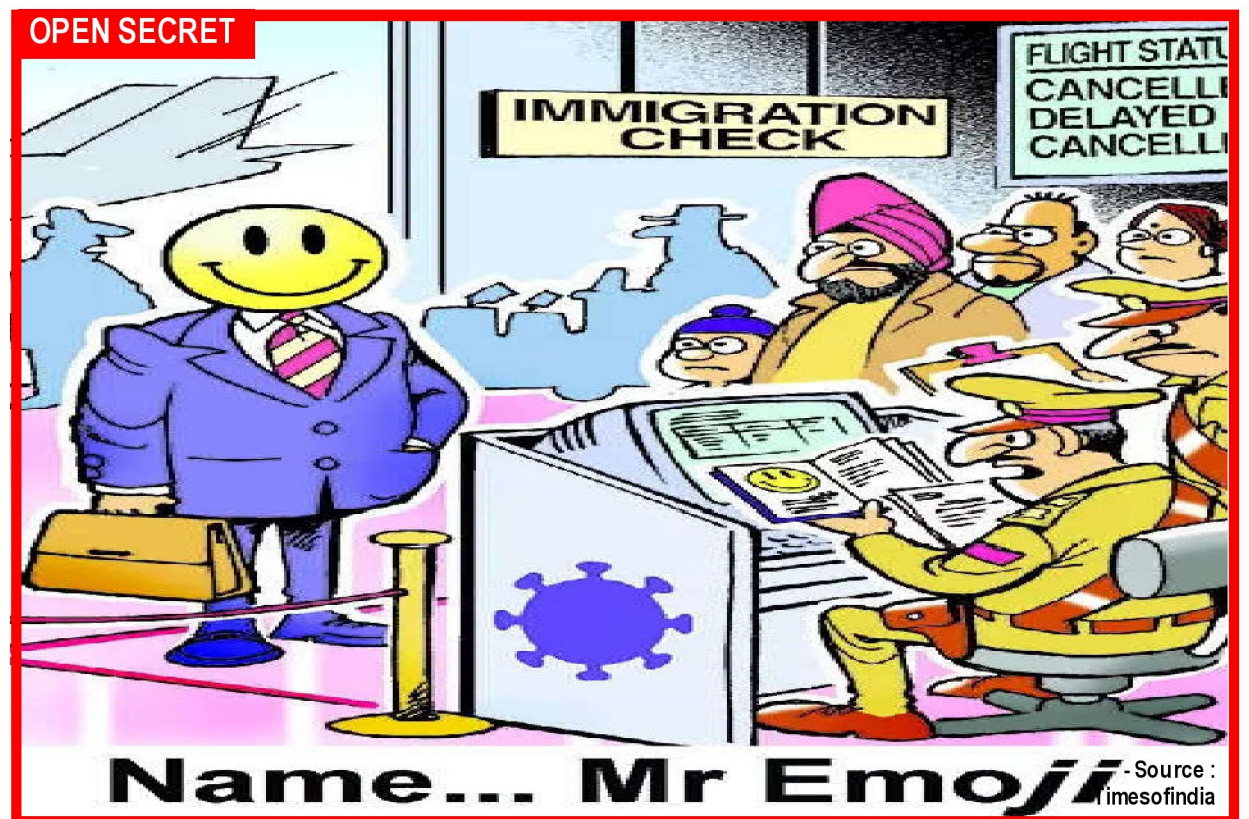
