



entitlements like Provident Fund, Employee State Insurance (ESI) etc. The scheme also create awareness and sensitization in health and life skills.

For availing the scheme, the trainee should belong to Minority community as notified under National Commission for Minorities Act 1992 (viz. Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains and Parsis), should be between 17-35 years of age. Certain particular pockets of concentration of minority population within a non-minority district or city will also be eligible for consideration. The trainees should belong to the Below Poverty Line (BPL) population both from urban and rural areas and the minimum qualification of trainee should be as per NIOS / equivalent.

30% of the beneficiary seats will be earmarked for girl/women candidates and 5% of the beneficiary seats will be earmarked for persons with disability belonging to the minority community under the scheme. To promote inter-community solidarity, 15%candidates belonging to BPL families of non-minority communities will also be considered. Programme Implementing Agencies (PIAs) will be invited to participate in the Scheme. The selection of PIA would be subject to a rigorous process of appraisal and due diligence as laid down in the Criteria for Selection of PIAs.

As per the new order, night curfew shall be enforced in the entire District of South Andaman with no movement of men and materials between 10 pm and 5 am until and unless permitted by the District Magistrate on case to case basis. Similarly, tourism activities at the National Memorial Cellular Jail and Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Island (NSCBI) shall be permitted as per the Order No.70 dt. 03.02.2022 issued by the Department of Tourism in this regard.

> Now therefore, in view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued exparte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/ Sub- Divisional Magistrate / Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.







GUIDELINES FOR VOTING THROUGH POSTAL BALLOT

Guidelines for Voting through postal ballot by Absentee Voters in the category of Senior Citizens, PWDs, Persons on Election Duty (including Police Personnel) and Covid-19 suspect or affected persons.

- 1. Following categories of Absentee Voters have been given the facility of voting through postal ballot (PB) paper:
- i. Senior citizens (above 80 years of age)
- ii. Electors holding Disability Card who are not able to stand and walk without the help of an attendant
- iii. COVID 19 suspect or affected persons
- iv. Persons on Election Duty (including police personnel)2. Process for applying for PB by absentee voters
- (2.1) An Absentee Voter wishing to vote by postal ballot has to make application to the Returning Officer (RO) of the constituency/ward concerned, in Form-27, giving all requisite particulars. Such applications seeking postal ballot facility should reach the RO within 08 days following the date of notification of the election.

(2.2) The Commission has laid down the following procedure/guidelines for facilitating voting through postal ballot by the absentee voters i.e. senior citizen category (AVSC), absentee voters belonging to PWD category (AVPD), absentee voters belonging to COVID 19 category (AVCO) and persons on Election Duty (including police personnel) (PED).

(2.3) If at the time of election, any elector is hospitalized on account of COVID-19, in a hospital within the UT or is in Home/Institutional Quarantine on account of COVID-19 and hence not in a position to cast vote personally at the polling station as per medical advice and if such elector makes a request for issue of Postal Ballot, the RO concerned, on being satisfied about the genuineness of the application in terms of guidelines issued by the Commission in this regard, shall provide the postal ballot to the elector. The RO shall make arrangement to deliver the Postal Ballot and to get the same collected back from the said elector before the date fixed for poll in the Constituency/Ward. Applications for postal ballot paper from such electors (Form 27) should be accompanied by a copy of certificate/instructions from competent health authorities clearly showing that the applicant is hospitalized in the State or is in quarantine within the State (Home or Institutional) on account of COVID 19.

3. Action by RO

(3.1) On receipt of application in Form-27, the RO will draw a list (format as annexure-1) of all Absentee Voters in the 4 categories, i.e. (a) 'AVSC', (b) 'AVPD' (c) 'AVCO' and (d) 'PED', whose applications have been received in time and are in order.

(3.2) On the last date for making nominations for the election, the electoral roll is frozen for that election and no further addition or deletion can be carried out in the roll till the completion of the election. At this stage, RO shall verify and ensure that the applicants for postal ballots are registered as electors and their electoral particulars given in Form 27 are correct with reference to the existing electoral roll. All the electors, whose particulars with reference to the electoral roll have been found to be correct, shall be issued postal ballot paper as Absentee Voters in the category of AVSC, AVPD and PED. In case of Absentee Voters belonging to the category of COVID-19 (AVCO), before issuing FORM 27, the RO shall check certificate of competent authority, duly appointed by the UT Administration to the effect that the elector is under home quarantine or institutional quarantine due to COVID-19.

(3.3) The RO shall also indicate entry 'PB' in the marked copy of the electoral roll against the names of such electors, to show that a postal ballot paper has been issued to them, without recording therein the Sl. No. of the ballot papers issued to them.

(3.4) The RO shall also ensure that elector who has been issued postal ballot is not allowed to vote at a polling station.

4. Form and design of Postal ballot paper

The postal ballot paper for Absentee Voters shall be of the same form and language as the postal ballot paper for the voters on election duty.

- 5. Visits of Polling Officials, briefing of electors and collection of marked ballot papers:-
- (5.1) Separate teams of poll officers, comprising two officials out of which at least one should be not below the rank/level of the official appointed as polling officer for Polling Station in the State, should be appointed for the purpose.
- (5.2) Number of teams of Polling Officials to be appointed would depend on the number of Absentee Voters to whom postal ballot papers have been issued. (5.3) The team of polling officials shall visit the electors at the address mentioned in their application in Form 27 for facilitating their voting by postal ballot paper.
- (5.4) The electors will be intimated, in advance, about the date and approximate time of visit of poll officials. Such intimation may be given through SMS on the mobile phone number wherever the same has been mentioned in the application in Form-27. In other cases, the intimation may be given by post or any other means.
- (5.5) If the elector is not present at the given address at

the first visit, the team shall pay a second visit after leaving intimation about the time of second visit If the elector is not present even at the second visit, no further visit or action is required in his/her case.

(5.6) The candidates shall be informed about the schedule of visit for the delivery and collection of postal ballots for this category. They may, if desired, depute their authorized representatives (including BLAs), with prior intimation to the Returning Officer, to watch the process.

(5.7) The list of AVSCs, AVPDs, AVCOs and PEDs shall be divided for distribution among the different teams of Polling Officials in such manner that each team gets a list of persons in geographically compact area.

(5.8) The visiting polling official shall ascertain the identity of the elector before issuing postal ballot paper. (5.9) Name of elector and the document produced for identification shall also be entered in a register (annexed as annexure-2) to be maintained for the purpose, and signature/thumb impression of the elector obtained therein. Further, a tick mark shall be placed against the name of the elector in the list of AVSC, AVPD, AVCO and PED to indicate that the person has voted. The counterfoil with the serial number and part number of elector duly filled up shall be got detached and kept in safe custody by the team.

(5.10) It shall be the responsibility of each team of polling officials to (a) issue postal ballot to each of the Absentee Voters assigned to it, (b) brief the elector about the procedure to be followed for voting through postal ballot, (c) make sure that the elector votes without anyone influencing his/her choice, and ensuring the secrecy of voting, all activities at the address of the elector concerned. However, if any elector is not able to cast vote by himself due to blindness or physical infirmity, he/she shall be allowed to take the assistance of any adult person for casting vote.

(5.11) While briefing the electors about the procedure of voting and formalities to be observed on their part, the polling official shall clearly explain the following points to them:-

- a) making the declaration in Form-28A and getting it attested by the poll officer himself,
- b) entering the serial number of postal ballot paper, both on Form 28A and on the smaller envelope (Form 28B)
- c) manner of marking vote, i.e by placing either cross mark or tick mark against the name of the candidate of choice
- d) folding and placing the marked ballot m the smaller envelope and closing the envelope
- e) Placing the declaration in Form -28A, duly filled up, signed and attested along with closed envelope (Form -28B) containing the marked ballot paper inside the larger envelope (Form-28C), Closing the larger envelope and handing over the same to the poll officer.
- (5.12) Poll officer is authorized to attest the declaration in Form -28A in the case of AVSC, AVPD, AVCO and PED. While attesting the declaration, the poll officer shall write his full name and also the designation 'poll officer'. In the case of a COVID affected person on treatment in Hospital, the Medical Officer attending to the person also authorized to attest the declaration.
- (5.13) After vote is cast on postal ballot and the envelope in Form 28C is ready, the Poll Officials will collect the same.

(5.14) Each team of polling officials should be provided with the list of AVSC, AVPD, AVCO and PED electors and equivalent number of postal ballot papers, envelopes, pen, ink-pad (for thumb impression wherever required), glue stick for closing the envelopes, a sufficiently big canvas bag for keeping the envelopes of polled ballots and the counterfoils safely and other essential stationeries that may be considered necessary.

(5.15) Police Security cover shall be provided to the poll officers for their visits. Arrangement for videography of the proceedings at the address of AVSCI/AVP D/AVCO/PED shall be made. For this purpose, a videographer shall accompany the poll officers. It shall be ensured that the secrecy of vote is not o violated while carrying out the videography exercise. Videography shall be preserved by the RO on the lines other election material/documents.

(5.16) Visits by teams of poll officers to the address of AVSC, AVPD, AVCO and PED electors should be planned in such a way that the same is completed a day prior to the date fixed for poll in the constituency. For instance, if poll is scheduled for 8th of Month, the postal voting for AVSC, AVPD, AVCO and PED should be completed by 7th of that Month.

(5.17) For the poll officers deputed to AVCO electors appropriate protection equipment including PPE kit shall be provided. This should be done in consultation with the Nodal Health Officer for AVCOs.

6. Deposit of envelopes containing marked ballot papers and counterfoils

At the end of each day of visit by Poll Officers to the address of AVSC/AVPD/AVCO/PED electors, the envelopes in (Form-28B, Form-28C) containing postal ballot paper etc. and the counterfoils of ballot papers containing the signature/thumb impression of electors

and other particulars, shall be collected by the ARO designated of postal voting by the absentee voters. The ARO shall make arrangements to have the same delivered at the headquarters of the RO for keeping them in safe custody. The ARO shall maintain the record indicating the number of ballots sent on each day. This should also be shared with the RO on a daily basis.

7. Contesting candidates will be duly informed about the Election Commission's above guidelines.

BROAD GUIDELINES FOR CONDUCT OF GENERAL ELECTIONS/ BYE-ELECTIONS DURING COVID-19

Elections arc conducted in different phases spread over a period of time involving a large number of people and a number of venues. The election process is conducted in accordance with the election procedure rules of the government meant for the particular institution of self government (local body).

After onset of COVID-19 pandemic in India, Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) have been issuing guidelines/ directives from time to time to be followed countrywide. Similarly, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has also

issued SOP on disinfection, sanitization, and prevention for containing COVID-19.

Friday

The endeavour of the Election Commission for UTs would be to hold the elections in such a manner that is not only free, fair and transparent but is also safe from the health point of view. Accordingly, it has become obligatory on the part of the election managers to organize the whole show in such a manner that all safety measures as advised by the government from time to time arc strictly followed so that there is no threat for the spread of corona virus amongst the stakeholders involved in the election process.

Keeping in view the above, following guidelines have been framed with respect to key activities for the conduct of elections, considering the upcoming General Elections and bye-elections to Panchayats and Municipal Councils in the UTs of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu during the period of COVID-19. The responsibility for enforcement of these guidelines and compliance by all concerned primarily lies with the respective Returning Officer; however, he may designate an independent officer to assist him in supervision and monitoring of its implementation.

Guidelines to be followed

- 1. GENERAL GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED DURING ENTIRE ELECTION PROCESSES FOR ALL PERSONS
- 1. Every person shall wear face mask during every election related activity.
- 2. At the entry of hall/ room/ premises used for election
- a. Thermal Scanning of all persons shall be carried out; b. Sanitizer, soap and water shall be made available.
- c. Social distancing shall be maintained as per the extant COVID-19 guidelines issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of H&FW, GoI and the UT Administration.
- 3. Self-monitoring of health by all and reporting of any illness at the earliest to the appropriate authority shall
- 4. As far as practicable, large halls with proper ventilation should be identified and utilized to ensure social distancing norms.
- 5. Adequate number of vehicles shall be mobilized for movement of polling personnel and security personnel to ensure compliance of COVID-19 guidelines.
- 6. Installation and use of AarogyaSetu App by election related personnel will be compulsory.

2. NODAL HEALTH OFFICER

Nodal Health Officer shall be designated for the UT to oversee COVID-19 related arrangements and preventive measures during entire electoral process.

3. EVMs/Ballot Boxes

1. First & Second randomization and preparation of EVMs shall be done in large halls.

2. Sanitizers shall be provided in sufficient quantity for use during the process.

3. Gloves shall be made available to each official handling EVM.

4. Wherever Ballot Boxes are used, care must be taken to sanitize them at each transition and before start of poll. 4. TRAINING AND CAPACITY BUILDING

1. As far as practicable, training of election officials will be organized in decentralized manner insufficiently large halls. However, the training may be organized through online mode wherever feasible.

2. Sufficient number of Polling/Counting/Poll related staffs shall also be kept in reserve by DEO/RO, for replacement in case of any polling personnel displaying COV1D-19 symptoms.

NOMINATION PROCESS

1. Installation and use of AarogyaSetu App is must while entering the offices of Returning Officers, Assistant Returning Officers, and other related offices.

2. Number of persons to accompany candidate for submission of Nomination papers is restricted to

3. Number of vehicles for the purposes of nomination is restricted to two (02).

4. Returning Officer's chamber should have sufficient space to perform the functions of nomination, scrutiny and symbol allocation following social distancing norms.

5. Returning Officer should allot staggered time in advance to prospective candidates.

6. Large space for waiting for candidate(s) should be arranged.

7. The entry of the political party representatives who are residing in any containment Zone, to any office is strictly prohibited till the containment Zone is de-notified. 6. ELECTION MATERIAL

Election Material Kit should be prepared in a spacious and properly ventilated large hall following all safety, sanitization and social distancing norms.

7. DISTRIBUTION AND COLLECTION OF ELECTION MATERIAL

- 1. Large halls/spaces should be identified for distribution/ collection of election material.
- 2. As far as practicable, it should be organized in decentralized manner.
- 3. Prior staggered time should be allocated to the polling

teams for distribution/ collection of election material. 8. POLLING STATION ARRANGEMENTS

- 1. Commission has issued detailed instructions for assured minimum facilities at each polling station. Now, in view of COV1D-19 situation, following additional facilities/steps should be taken:
- 2. Mandatory sanitization of Polling Station, preferably, a day before the poll.
- 3. Thermal Scanner at the entry point of every polling station location.
- 4. Thermal checking of voters at entry point of polling station location/ Polling station, cither by polling staffer Para Medical staff or Asha worker.
- 5. If temperature is above the norms set by the MoHFW at first reading, then it will be checked twice and if it remains so, then the elector shall be provided with token certificate and will be asked to come for voting at the last hour of poll. At the last hour of poll, such electors shall be facilitated voting, strictly following COVID-19 related preventive measures.
- 6. Help Desks should be set up for distribution of tokens to the voters on first come first served basis so that they do not have to wait in the queue.
- 7. Marker to demonstrate social distancing for queue.
- 8. Earmarking circle for 15-20 persons of 2 yards (6 feet) distance for voters standing in the queue depending on the availability of space. There shall be three queues, one each for males, females, and PwD/ Senior citizen voters.
- 9. BLOs, volunteers, etc., may be engaged to monitor and regulate social distancing norms strictly.
- 10. Soap and Water shall be provided at the entry/exit point of every polling station.
- 11. Sanitizer should be provided at the entry/exit point
- of every polling station. 12. Sufficient number of Face Masks should be available
- for those electors who are not carrying the mask. 13. Awareness posters on COVID-19 should be displayed
- at prominent and conspicuous locations.
- 14. Sitting arrangement in polling station for the polling personnel and polling agents shall be made as per the norms of social distancing.
- 15. If polling agent or counting agent is having temperature above the prescribed limit, then their reliever shall be allowed by Presiding Officer, who will keep a record accordingly.
- 16. During the process of their identification, the voters he asked to lower the facemask, very briefly, for identification, when required.
- 17. At any given time, only I (one) voter shall be allowed to stand in front of each polling official maintaining social distance.
- 18. Hand gloves shall be provided to the voter, for signing on the voter register and pressing button of EVM for
- 19. Sanitizers shall be kept inside the booth at appropriate locations with clear direction for the use by voters.
- 20. COVID-19 patients who are quarantined will be allowed to cast their vote in the last hour of polling at their respective Polling Stations, under the supervision of health authorities, strictly following COV1D-19 related preventive measures. Sector Magistrates shall coordinate this in their allocated polling stations.
- 21. A Gazetted Officer may be designated for dealing with the election staff who may develop Covid-19 symptoms during election duty to coordinate with the Health authorities and the RO.

9. KIT FOR POLLING OFFICER

The following items shall be provided to every polling official and security personnel (Other than those where PPEs are needed) in addition to other prescribed items:

- 1. Mask
- Sanitizer 3.
- Face-Shield 4. Gloves
- 10. POSTAL BALLOT
- 1) Option of Postal Ballot facility has been extended to the electors of following categories:
- a. Electors holding Disability Card who are not able to stand and walk without the help of an attendant
- b. Electors above the age of 80 years
- c. Electors on Election Duty (including Police Personnel) 2) Electors who are COVID- 19 positive/suspect and in quarantine (home/ institutional)
- 11. CAMPAIGN BY THE POLITICAL PARTIES/ **CONTESTING CANDIDATES**
- 1. Political parties and the contesting candidates should strictly adhere to the advisory issued by MHA, MOHFW Govt. of India and UT Administration from time to time
- 2. Door-to-Door Campaign- Subject to any other restriction(s) including extant COVID-19 guidelines, a group of 5 (five) persons including the candidate, excluding security personnel, if any, is allowed to do doorto-door campaigning.
- 3. Posters/standees/AV media on preventive measures about COVID-19 to be displayed prominently at conspicuous places.
- 4. Road Shows and Election Meetings -No Road Shows and public gatherings/rallies shall be allowed till further directions from the Commission. However, campaign convoy of maximum 03 [three) vehicles (excluding

security vehicles, if any) may be allowed subject to the condition that the convoys should keep moving and no public is allowed to gather around these convoys.

- 5. District Election Officer should take following steps for this purpose:
- a. Nodal District Health Officer should be involved in the process to ensure that all COVID-19 related guidelines are adhered to by all concerned in the District. b. District Election Officer and District Superintendent of Police should ensure that the number of attendees does not exceed the limit prescribed by UT/State Disaster Management Authority for public gatherings.
- c. DEO should depute Sector Health Regulators to oversee that COVID-19 instructions/guidelines are being followed during these meetings.
- d. As far as possible virtual meetings may be arranged. e. The political parties and candidates concerned should ensure that all COVID-19 related requirement like face masks, sanitizers, thermal scanning etc. are fulfilled during each of these activities.
- f. Anybody showing Covid symptoms should be referred to the health authorities.
- g. Non-compliance of Instructions Anybody violating instructions on COVID-19 measures will be liable to proceeded against asper the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as applicable, as specified in Order No.40-3/ 2020-DM-I(A) dated 29th July, 2020 of Ministry of Home Affairs. District Election Officer should bring this to the notice of all concerned.
- 12. STRONG-ROOM ARRANGEMENT
- 1. Strong Room should be sanitized after storage of all relevant materials including EVM/Ballot Boxes.
- 2. Social Distancing and other safety norms shall be followed for each activity.
- 13. COUNTING OF VOTES
- 1. Carrying cases of CUs should be sanitized before placing over counting tables.
- 2. De-sealing of CUs and displaying Result on CU should be done by one official on each table.
- 3. The counting centers shall be disinfected before,
- during and after the counting. 4. In case of use of Ballot Boxes, all the Counting Staff should use hand gloves during the time of counting.

Based on these guidelines, detailed COVID-19 related comprehensive plan will be prepared for General Elections and Bye-Elections to Panchayats and Municipal Council at the UT Administration level, taking local conditions into account.

Any other guideline issued by the Election Commission (UTs) from time to time during the Election process shall also be followed strictly.






