## Abandoned vehicles along roadsides, citizens demand land for establishment of Scrap Yard in city

Port Blair, Nov 15: While the Union Government recently launched the vehicle scrapping policy to phase out unfit and polluting vehicles in an environment-friendly manner, vehicles left abandoned in different parts of the city has prompted demand for earmarking a land to establish a Scrap Yard for such vehicles in the city. Abandoned vehicles found in several parking lots in the city and near residential areas has become an eyesore for residents. Several areas found to be blotted with old and obsolete government vehicles, discarded along the main roads by the concerned authorities taking no steps to scrap the vehicles. With the announcement of the India's 'scrapage policy', the urban population has amplified demand for setting up a scrap yard in the city to get rid of such obsolete vehicles.

"Vehicles left abandoned in the paid parking lots in the city stands testimony to gross misuse of public property by private parties. In the absence of proper monitoring

by authorities concerned, such vehicle owners conveniently utilise the spaces as personal parking space. Shortage of space in parking lots forces genuine motorists to park their vehicles along roadsides giving cops a tough time to manage traffic in the city particularly during rush hours. It has now become the need of the hour to get rid of abandoned vehicles because it will free up space that is generally occupied by dilapidated cars on roads. For years now, the authorities did not care about the problem that such abandoned vehicles causes inconvenience to people," a resident of the Junglighat.

"Many private and government vehicles can be seen abandoned in different parts of the city. Lack of proper maintenance has left the vehicles redundant and the parties prefer to discard the vehicles along the roads. Now that the government has announced the scrapage policy, the UT Administration should identify a suitable land in the city to establish a Scrap Yard to get rid of such vehicles. The

land once identified and allotted, tenders should be floated to select a suitable scrap dealer. Vehicle scrapping its operational period should be put to scrap, which will in turn generate some revenue for the government," said another.

A scrapage policy is a government-funded programme to promote the replacement of old vehicles with modern ones. The policy dictates that all automobiles over a certain age should be off the roads in the interest of better pollution control and safety, which new vehicles ensure. Commercial vehicles over 15 years old and personal vehicles over 20 years old are marked for scrapping — it doesn't matter if they run diesel or petrol — if they fail an automated fitness test. These will be deregistered, the owner can choose to scrap them, but cannot use them on the road. The government has recently come out with rules and specifications on what kind of Automated Fitness Centres should come up and who can set them up. It has also come up with how the scrapping yards should be.

### Repoll Cancelled

The Chief Election Commissioner S L Shakhder ordered the cancellation of the repoll in the Garhwal parliamentary constituency, scheduled for November 22. The order came in the wake of the Uttar Pradesh government's plea that it would not be in a position to hold and peaceful re-poll because of the strike by jail employees and other threatened agitations. While Shakhder said he was satisfied by the arguments put forward by the state government, the Opposition candidate H N Bahuguna said that the CEC had been led up the garden path. The Election Commission had failed its constitutional duty and succumbed to the pressure of the ruling party, he alleged. Leaders of the Opposition parties will meet President N Sanjiva Reddy to protest against the order.

**Resignation In Kerala**  
M Gopala Menon, adviser to the Kerala governor has resigned. Menon, former Kerala chief secretary, had assumed charge as one of the three advisers to the Governor on November 5. But he never attended the secretariat. The resignation came after a wrangle over questions of seniority and allocation of portfolios to the three advisers. Menon wanted to be ranked senior to the other two advisers. He was also not happy with the departments allotted to him.

**Tarapur Impasse**  
With three shipments offuel from Tarapur overdue and no progress in the talks with Washington, India's Atomic Chief H N Sethna and the External Affairs Secretary Eric Gonsalves told reporters, "We do not propose to divulge what we are going to report back to the government at this stage". But Sethna said that India was ready to do with a mixed oxide of plutonium and natural uranium. Sethna said that Tarapur was operating at 80 per cent capacity. This would not be affected if there was a gradual switch to mixed oxide.

# SITHARAMAN TO MEET CMS, STATE FMS; DISCUSS REFORM-FOCUSED BUSINESS CLIMATE

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will on Monday meet all chief ministers and state finance

ministers to discuss ways to create a reform-focused business climate and further facilitate investments to help

boost growth.

In a tweet, the finance ministry said the virtual meeting on November 15 would be attended by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary and Bhagwat Karad, besides secretaries of Government of India line ministries, chief secretaries and finance secretaries of states.

"Discussion to be centred on creating an enabling ecosystem for increased pro-active facilitation for investments besides topics of energizing growth, reforms, augmenting investments and creating a reform-focused business climate," the ministry tweeted. The meeting comes in the backdrop of strong economic recovery post the two COVID waves, and push

by the central government to increase capital expenditure. The Centre believes that there is scope to capitalise on the positive sentiment of the private sector, with increasing demand, amid lower non-performing assets and banks willing to lend more.

Union Finance Secretary T.V. Somanathan had last week said that the focus of this interaction will be on state-level issues, opportunities and challenges, which will enable us to go to a higher trajectory of investment and growth.

"There is capital expenditure from the government side, and there is a positive sentiment from the private sector side, though perhaps not fully translated into actual investment in big

scale. Capital market activity indicates that a lot of investment is probably on the cards," Somanathan had said.

After a slowdown in economic growth due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the first quarter of the current fiscal has seen a pickup in economic activity. Indian economy contracted 7.3 per cent in the last financial year after a 4 per cent growth in 2019-20.

In the April-June quarter of the current fiscal, the economy grew 20.1 per cent. Besides, the first four months of FY2021-22 have witnessed Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) of \$64 billion.

The IMF and World Bank peg India's GDP growth at about 9.5 per cent and 8.3 per cent, respectively, projecting India as one of the fastest-growing economies.

### Food Safety Officials..

During frying, oil under goes degradation due to their exposure to elevated temperatures which results in changes in the physico-chemical & nutritional properties of the oil and TPCs are formed in the oil. The toxicity of these compounds are associated with several diseases such as hypertension, Alzheimer disease and liver diseases. FSSAI has fixed the maximum permissible limit of TPC at 25%, beyond that the oil shall not be used. Therefore, it is essential to monitor the quality of

vegetable oil during frying. During the tests no vendors were found using oil beyond the permissible limit. The team also sensitized vendors regarding ill effects of repeated use of oil and safe disposal of used cooking oil. Further, in coordination with FSSAI Regional Office, Kolkata a training programme on Food Safety Compliance System (FSSCoS) was conducted at Port Blair for the benefit of Food Safety Officials and food business operators. The participants were briefed about

## Delhi govt informs SC it is ready for lockdown to curb pollution

The Arvind Kejriwal government on Monday informed the Supreme Court that it was ready to impose a complete lockdown to curb air pollution in Delhi.

Justices D.Y. Chandrachud and Surya Kant had expressed concern over the air pollution in Delhi on Saturday.

The court suggested a two-day lockdown on Saturday and had expressed concern about reopening of schools. The Delhi government informed the Supreme Court "no physical classes would be held in schools this week and government officials would work from home. Private offices have also been advised to work from home. Construction sites will be shut for three days," NDTV reported.

During the hearing on Monday, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta informed the court that the contribution to Delhi's pollution from stubble burning by farmers in adjoining states was 10 per cent. Reacting to him, Justice Surya Kant asked "so that hue & cry [against stubble burning] has no scientific or legal basis?", Live Law reported.

Mehta suggested three "drastic" steps to control air pollution that had not been taken yet. These were introduction of the odd-even scheme to lower traffic, ban on entry of trucks and lockdown. Other steps listed by Mehta were "Ensure closing of stone crushers in Delhi NCR... Stop use of coal or firewoods... Live Law reported. The bench noted that 75 per cent of pollution in Delhi was attributed to transport, industries and dust.

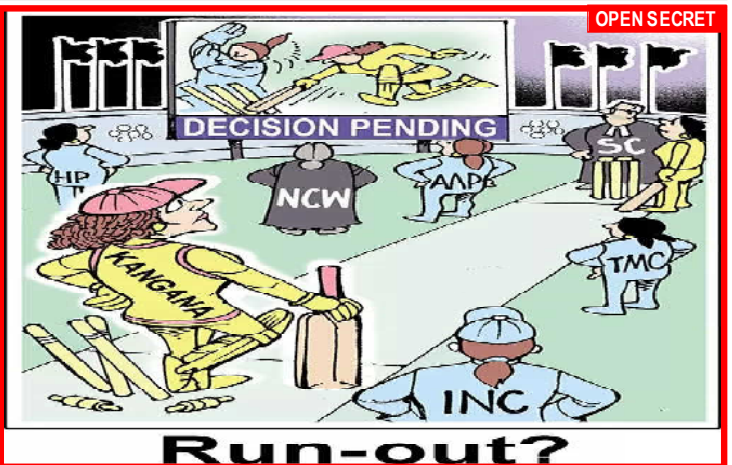
## India launches 41st Scientific Expedition to Antarctica

India has successfully launched the 41st Scientific Expedition to Antarctica with the arrival of the first batch of its contingent at the southern white continent. The first batch comprising of 23 scientists and support staff reached the Indian Antarctic Station Maitri last week.

The 41st expedition has two major programmes. The first programme encompasses geological exploration of the Amery ice-shelf at Bharati Station. The second programme involves reconnaissance surveys and preparatory work for drilling of 500 metres of ice core near Maitri. It

will help in understanding the Antarctic climate.

The Indian Antarctic programme, which began in 1981, has completed 40 Scientific Expeditions so far. India has built three Permanent Research Base Stations in Antarctica, named Dakshin Gangotri, Maitri and Bharati.

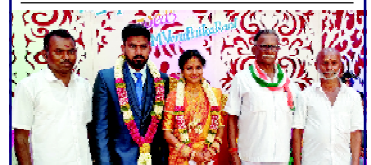

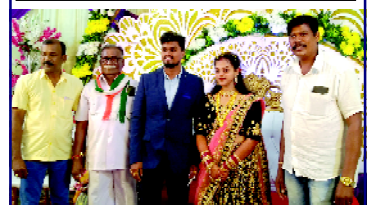
