India's first Virtual Science Lab for children under CSIR 'Jigyasa' prog. launched to connect students with scientists

Main aim is to provide quality research exposure and innovative pedagogy for school students: Minister

New Delhi, Nov. 22 (PIB) Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh today launched India's first Virtual Science Lab for children under CSIR Jigyasa programme, which will also connect students with scientists across the country.

Describing the Virtual Lab as a huge new beginning, Dr Jitendra Singh said this will not only take science to all

segments of students in every corner of the country, but it is also in tune with the National Education Policy (NEP), where students are allowed to choose any subject and the concept of streams has been disbanded. He said, the new facility will immensely benefit students from Kendriya Vidyalayas, Navodaya Vidyalayas and Government Schools, and will help in catching them young.

The Minister informed that Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi in a CSIR Society meeting last year appreciated the Scientist-Student Connect

programme "Jigyasa" and stressed on the importance of developing Virtual Labs. Accordingly, CSIR has partnered with IIT Bombay to develop a Virtual Lab platform under CSIR Jigyasa programme, which facilitates classroom learning with laboratory research for school students. He said, the target audience for the Virtual Lab platform is students of standard VI to XII (11-18 years) who would like to explore science using different activities, experienced researchers and faculties

will be held till Nov.30.

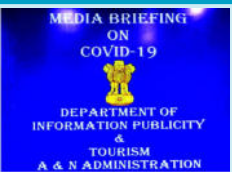
The President and Members of the Commission heard the litigants in

Media briefed on COVID-19 No positive case detected during test conducted on incoming flight & inter-Island bound passengers: Director (IP&T)

Port Blair, Nov.22

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar while giving information on COVID-19 status stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 480 passengers who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. Today, 11 flights with 1,931 passengers arrived, out of which, 1492 were vaccinated with both doses while RT-PCR test was conducted on 427



passengers and the reports are awaited. During RAT conducted on 113 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, no positive case has been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was

conducted on 82 passengers and all were found negative. At Phoenix Bay Jetty, 54 passengers were tested with RAT and were found negative. Today, 1124 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 1089 were in the age group of 18-44.

The Director, ANIMS informed that currently no COVID patients are undergoing treatment at GB Pant Hospital.

Providing weighing machines to monitor weight of filled LPG cylinder during distribution mandatory Authorized LPG distributors advised to strictly comply with the rules

Port Blair, Nov. 22

All LPG consumers and the authorized LPG distributors of this UT have been informed that as per the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011 framed under the Legal Metrology Act, 2009, it is mandatory for all the authorized LPG distributors to provide their delivery man a check weigher or non-automatic weighing instrument to measure or weigh the quantity of the LPG cylinder at the time of delivery.

The consumers have the right to demand weighing of LPG cylinders at the time of delivery so as to ensure exact quantity being delivered to them. The weight of a domestic LPG cylinder is weight of empty cylinder +14.2 kg of LPG filled in it with a maximum permissible error of 150 gm. Similarly, the weight of a 19 kg commercial LPG cylinder is weight of empty cylinder +19 kg of LPG filled in it with a maximum permissible error of 1% and that for a 5kg commercial LPG Cylinder is weight of empty cylinder +5 kg of LPG filled in it with a maximum permissible error of 1.5%. The empty weight of LPG cylinder is printed on the body of the cylinder.

The distributor shall get the weighing machine duly verified and stamped from the Legal Metrology Section functioning in the Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumers Affairs prior to using it for any



commercial transaction. All the authorized LPG distributors have been hereby informed

to strictly comply with the rules and make necessary arrangements for weighing of LPG cylinders during delivery latest by 30th November, 2021, failing which, strict action as per law shall be initiated against the distributor.

The Department of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs has been relentlessly working towards safeguarding the interest of the consumers. All the consumers have been advised that any malpractice by any person/shop/establishment may be brought to the notice of the Department over Toll Free No. 1800-345-3197 or Telephone No. 03192-230337, a press release from Directorate of CS & CA said.

Mitigation of iron deficiency anaemia (IDA) in piglets

Piglet anaemia also called iron deficiency anaemia is generally associated with young, rapidly growing piglets deprived of iron in their diet or from their environment. It has been a potential problem and a major cause of piglet mortality especially in intensive farming where the piglets have no access to soil. It is a major concern of swine industry throughout the world. In Andaman and Nicobar Islands, field level survey and analysis revealed that around 50-60% piglets are suffering from Iron Deficiency anaemia. A piglet is born with a total of 40-50 mg of iron in its body. Sow's milk is deficient in iron; a piglet cannot obtain more than 1 mg of iron daily from this source. With an iron requirement of about 7-8 mg daily to maintain blood hemoglobin level in the normally growing piglet, it is apparent that without supplemental iron, body stores will not last very long. When there is a deficiency of iron, the piglet cannot synthesize an adequate amount of hemoglobin. A piglet is born with a normal level of hemoglobin in the blood of 12-13g/100ml and this rapidly drops down to 6-7g/100 ml by 7-10 days of age. This leads to decreased oxygen-carrying capacity of blood and increased susceptibility of the piglet to different diseases. If not treated in time, the piglet may die due to respiratory problem or anoxia. Moreover, a piglet with IDA suffers from weakness and reduced growth rate. Supplementation of iron is the only effective treatment to control piglet anaemia. ICAR-Central Island Agricultural Research Institute, Port Blair has developed an effective iron supplementation regime to control IDA in piglets. It is known as 2-7-10-15 module of iron therapy in which a piglet is supplemented orally with ferrous sulphate @ 30 mg/kg body weight on 2nd, 7th, 10th and 15th day of birth.

Benefit: The technology is very much effective in mitigation of iron deficiency anaemia in piglets. This module of iron supplementation reduces piglet mortality by 10-15 % and improves weaning body weight by 5-10%.

New Delhi, Nov. 22

More than 116 crore 87 lakh COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in country so far

New Delhi, Nov. 22
More than 116 crore 87 lakh COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in the country so far under the Nationwide Vaccination Drive. Health Ministry said, over 32 lakh 99 thousand doses were administered yesterday. India reported over eight thousand new cases during the last 24 hours. India's Active caseload stands at one lakh 18 thousand 443. Active cases account for

less than one per cent of total cases and it is currently at 0.34 per cent, the lowest since March last year. The Ministry said, the recovery rate is currently at 98.31 per cent and it is highest since March last year. Over 12 thousand people recovered in the last 24 hours and total recoveries touched three crore 39 lakh 34 thousand 547. The weekly positivity rate currently stands at 0.93 per cent which is less

than two per cent for the last 59 days. Daily positivity rate is at 1.08 per cent which is less than two per cent for last 49 days. The number of deaths due to the pandemic has reached four lakh 65 thousand 911. In the last 24 hours, 249 deaths were reported. Till now, over 63 crore 25 lakh tests have been conducted. Over 7 lakh 83 thousand tests were conducted yesterday. (Source: india.gov.in)

Dr Jitendra Singh said that the main aim of the Virtual Lab is to provide quality research exposure and innovative pedagogy for school students to drive their scientific curiosity based on an online interactive medium with simulated experiments, pedagogy based content, videos, chat forums, animations, gaming, quiz, facility sharing, webinars etc. He said, the content will be available in English initially, but has been planned to be made available in Hindi and other regional languages. The CSIR Virtual lab will therefore enable curiosity driven research based concepts, encourage higher order thinking skills, promote entrepreneurship and develop passion about science, the Minister added.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said, the Virtual lab would provide a virtual tour of CSIR laboratories and expose students to research infrastructure, which otherwise would be difficult to visit physically in some laboratories considering safety standards. He said, the platform will also have the option to interact with scientists and seek their inputs or clear student's doubts. He added that the CSIR Jigyasa's Virtual lab will be an inspirational science lab where students will read, have fun and carry out those experiments and materials which are presented by the CSIR scientists and other stakeholders.
