One convicted in POCSO Case

Port Blair, Oct 14: The Hon'ble Special Judge Shri Raja Chatterjee on 13th October, 2022 convicted one accused persons namely MithunSikder, resident of Durgapur Village, Diglipur in a sexual assault case committed by him against a minor girl then aged 11 years. It is averred that on 01.11.2016 the victim girl had been to the tuition centre and the tuition teacher i.e. the accused herein was alone in the centre and no one else except the victim was present. The accused thereafter made the victim sit on his lap and started touching her body inappropriately and also

touched her private part with bad intention.

The victim out of fear came out of the centre and called her father. Then the matter was brought to notice of PS Diglipur who registered a case against the accused person under Section 354 of Indian Penal Code (IPC) read with Section 9(m) & 10 of POCSO Act.

The prosecution examined 09 witnesses and the Hon'ble Court after conducting trial found the accused person guilty of the offence and sentenced him to suffer 5 (five) years rigorous imprisonment under Section 10 of (See page 6)

Administering Medicines/ Health Assessments should be carried out by the staff of the health department: ANTA

Port Blair, Oct 14: Highlighting a crucial issue, Mr. Y Sajeevan, President, A & N Teachers' Association wrote a letter to the Secretary (Education), Andaman & Nicobar Administration today in connection to the recent incident of mass health related issue which cropped up among students of Govt. Model Senior Secondary School, Aberdeen, Port Blair.

Reportedly, about 24 students from classes 6 to 9 were hospitalized after purportedly consuming albendazole tablets for treating worm infestation among children, as mentioned in the letter.

This medication is being supplied by the Department of Health to each school to be administered by the teachers and the teachers cannot be held accountable for genuineness of the medicine or its method of administration to the children, Mr. Y Sajeevan argued.

Besides on several occasions, the responsibility of health assessment of school children and other such activities are shifted on to the shoulders of the teachers who are already overburdened in record maintenance in addition to their own academic activities, the President of A & N Teachers' Association alleged.

Urging the Secretary

(Education) to kindly ensure that the implementation of health related schemes like deworming, health assessments etc- should be carried out by the staff of the health department in their physical presence as they have the professional expertise for such activities which the teachers lack, after obtaining prior permission from the parents (if required) so that the same can be safely and effectively implemented, Mr. Y Sajeevan suggested. He further implored the Secretary that the matter may kindly be taken up with the appropriate authority to avert any such untoward incident in future.

falling sick due to Mid-Day meal as of now.

Mr. Venketewar Rao, Pradhan, Gram Panchayat Shivapuram said that he got a call from the parent of a child from PHC Billiground that a few children of Schools of Middle School Padmanabapuram and Middle school of Pinaki Nagar have fallen sick and having health issues like diarrhea and vomiting.

Acting swiftly, the Pradhan Mr. Venketewar Rao paid a surprise visit to Padmanabapuram School where he found the rice supplied by the Civil Supplies Department was of inferior quality. Talking to Andaman Sheekha, the Pradhan said that during his visit he found the workers of mid-day meal were segregating the rice. On a careful watch, he also found that some unwanted

stuff like pieces of plastic/rubber was reportedly found mixed in a bag of rice.

On asking with the mid-day meal workers about the rice, they disclosed to the Pradhan that they have been segregating these unwanted substances in the rice for the last more than 10 days and this type of rice is being supplied by the Civil Supplies Department.

Later, the Pradhan himself ate the Mid-Day meal along with the children to check if the food was worth eating and found the rice was very tough to chew and was reportedly indigestible, he claimed. Later he went to Panchawati School where he found the same issue with the rice.

Meanwhile, the residents of the area told the Pradhan that the Civil Supplies Department is careless in supplying the rice meant for the

ing to organic farming. Mrs. S. C. Progressive farmers. Mr. Balram Mistry and Mr. Chandrakanth Mistry shared their concern related to difficulty in adopting IPM practices in this era of intensive agriculture in spite of the benefits of IPM technologies.

to organize regular IPM programmes so that our farmers will get maximum benefits on Organic farming. IPM Kits were distributed to all the farmers in presence of Assistant Director and Panchayat Secretary. Mr. Azmat Qadir, SCFA, Rangat Sub Depot, explained the use of various kinds of traps such as Pheromone traps, Sticky traps, light traps and seed treatment for prevention of disease incidence in vegetable and other crops. school children. Talking to the members of the school committees, the Pradhan assured that he will seriously look into the matter so as to redress the problem. The Pradhan has also apprised the Deputy Commissioner, North Andaman of the matter with photographs.

Further talking to Andaman Sheekha, the Director in charge of the Civil Supplies department said that the Department has not received any information in this matter so far. However, the Director immediately directed the concerned civil supply official to investigate the mat-

ter and submit the report as soon as possible. The matter will be taken up seriously, the Director of Civil Supplies assured.

The million dollar question here is that after the incident of Model School Port Blair the officials of Billiground region must have send samples of rice supplied for Mid-Day meal to Food Safety unit for thorough investigation immediately after this incident but in this case, this has not been done yet. Without any such tests this will be unfair to blame School authorities or Civil Supplies for any mismanage-

ment.

Further investigating, Andaman Sheekha Daily when contacted health officials of Billiground PHC it was informed that three school students of the region who had mid-day meal and a few other children from nearby region who had not consumed any mid-day meal had also shown similar symptoms today when they were brought to hospital, hence there is a need to find whether some other factors are responsible for health issues like diarrhea and vomiting among children of the region.
