High time to develop night sports facilities at Netaji Stadium

Port Blair, Dec 18: Sports enthusiasts were pinning hope with the BJP led Council that once they come into power in the Municipal Council they will take up development of night sports facilities in the Netaji Stadium as promised by the BJP during the municipal election. But as somebody has rightly said, never ever believe promises made by the political parties as their promises and manifestos are only meant to win elections. True to this saying, despite completing over 10 months, the BJP run Council has yet to take measures to develop Netaji Stadium into a night sporting complex. Sports enthusiasts as well as citizens are eager that night sporting events need to be organized in the Netaji stadium so that more and more youngsters can participate in sports events, if not can witness sports and games in the evening hours. This is necessary as it has been observed that more and more youth are addicted towards drugs. The drug culture in the islands is killing the future of the youth. Since there is no other way of entertainment facilities where youth can spend their evening hours, more and more youth are either spending their time in liquor bars or running behind drugs. It is exactly for these reasons, steps need to be taken for the development of sports infrastructure facilities in the islands, particularly night sports to turn the youth towards sports and games. What better than organizing night sports like cricket and football at Netaji Stadium. To begin with, the Council can restart the project of installation of High Mast Lights in Netaji Stadium, a brainchild project of Mr. K Ganeshan, the former PBMC Chairperson. In the year 2015-16, Mr. K Ganeshan has proposed a project for installation of High Mast Lights in Netaji Stadium for the promotion of night sports activities with the objectives to encourage the youth to engage themselves with sports activities and stay away from addiction. He was even able to conduct a field visit of former Lt Governor, Lt Gen A.K. Singh (Retd) to Netaji Stadium where the Lt Governor passed standing instructions to APWD for preparation of the project and its fast execution. An amount of Rs 62 lakhs was also sanctioned for the project. However, even after many years, the project has not seen the light of the day and left abandoned. Various political leaders have also raised the issue on a time to time basis, but APWD chose to ignore so far. Speaking to the Andaman Express, Mr. K. Ganeshan said "while it has been noticed that youth of rural villages remained engaged in sports activities like kabaddi, volleyball, football and cricket, a good number of youth in the city are found spending their leisure times during the evening hours in Bars and attracted towards drugs. Starting night sports activities will not only keep these youth away from addiction but will help the sports department produce talented sports persons who can participate in national level sports borney". Palni, 19) and Mrinal Sen (21) said they had been practicing sports every day during the evening hours to keep themselves busy and fit. Both of them agreed that sports activities are held during evening/night hours in Netaji Stadium, it will not only be beneficial to the youngsters to keep them fit, but will also discourage them from falling prey to drugs and alcohol.

Only seats, not cities

Municipal elections seldom attract attention outside their catchment area. However, elections to the Municipal Corporation of Delhi, where AAP captured a majority displacing three-term winner BJP, was different. It embodied the fierce political competition between India's pre-eminent national party BJP and its most competitive challenger, AAP. Some regional parties do pack a punch and BJP hasn't quite got their measure. But AAP is the only other party to keep expanding its geographical footprint, often at the expense of India's original political hegemon, Congress. All these factors played out in MCD elections.

AAP secured a simple majority with 134 seats in the corporation. BJP did better than the exit polls predicted with 104 seats while Congress, expectedly, was reduced to a rump. MCD isn't the only fiercely contested urban local body polls. Two years ago, BJP pulled out all stops to capture Hyderabad's urban body, with even home minister Amit Shah campaigning extensively. It ran TRS close. Soon, we will see another high-decibel contest in Mumbai for BMC, India's richest urban body, where the two Senas have a lot at stake, as does BJP.

But do fierce contests translate into better outcomes for voters? Certainly not, as a proxy indicator like voter participation or anecdotal evidence suggests. The turnout for MCD was just above 50%, below the level recorded in 2017 and also the last Delhi assembly election. It's a reflection of the dysfunctional state of India's urban bodies. This is best captured by RBI's description that Indian cities are "emaciated financially". The core problem is that state governments are unwilling to let go of functions that the Constitution's 74th amendment recommended 30 years ago.

One of the outcomes is that urban bodies are underfunded. In India, the average municipal revenue is around 1% of GDP. The comparable figures in Brazil and South Africa are 7.4% and 6% respectively. Municipalities largely depend on property tax for revenue. Interstate comparison suggests that this electorally-sensitive tax rate is an area where corporations don't have a decisive say. For example, RBI's data shows that MCD's own tax revenue as a proportion of total revenue not only trails the national average, it's even lower than a relatively poorer urban Assam. Indian cities need more than high-decibel elections. But absolutely no political party seems interested. No wonder voters are losing interest.

GIVING SMARTPHONES TO YOUNG KIDS TO CALM THEM DOWN MAY BACKFIRE

It's a scene many parents have experienced -- just as they're trying to cook dinner, take a phone call or run an errand, their child has a meltdown.

And sometimes, handing a fussy preschooler a digital device seems to offer a quick fix. But this calming strategy could be linked to worse behavior challenges down the road, new findings suggest.

Frequent use of devices like smartphones and tablets to calm upset children ages 3-5 was associated with increased emotional dysregulation in kids, particularly in boys, according to a Michigan Medicine study in JAMA Pediatrics.

"Using mobile devices to settle down a young child may seem like a harmless, temporary tool to reduce stress in the household, but there may be long term consequences if it's a regular go-to soothing strategy," said lead author Jenny Radesky, M.D., a developmental behavioral pediatrician at University of Michigan Health C.S. Mott Children's Hospital.

"Particularly in early childhood,

devices may displace opportunities for development of independent and alternative methods to self-regulate."

The study included 422 parents and 422 children ages 3-5 who participated between August 2018 and January 2020, before the COVID-19 pandemic started. Researchers analyzed parent and caregiver responses to how often they used devices as a calming tool and associations to symptoms of emotional reactivity or dysregulation over a six-month period.

Signs of increased dysregulation could include rapid shifts between sadness and excitement, a sudden change in mood or feelings and heightened impulsivity.

Findings suggest that the association between device-calming and emotional consequences was particularly high among young boys and children who may already experience hyperactivity, impulsiveness and a strong temperament that makes them more likely to react intensely to feelings like

anger, frustration and sadness

"Our findings suggest that using devices as a way to appease agitated children may especially be problematic to those who already struggle with emotional coping skills," Radesky said.

She notes that the preschool-to-kindergarten period is a developmental stage when children may be more likely to exhibit difficult behaviors, such as tantrums, defiance and intense emotions. This may make it even more tempting to use devices as a parenting strategy.

"Caregivers may experience immediate relief from using devices if they quickly and effectively reduce children's negative and challenging behaviors," Radesky says. "This feels rewarding to both parents and children and can motivate them both to maintain this cycle."

"The habit of using devices to manage difficult behavior strengthens over time as children's media demands strengthen as well. The more often devices are used, the less practice children -- and their parents -- get to use other coping strategies."

Alternative soothing methods can help build emotion regulation skills

Radesky, who is a mother of two herself, acknowledges that there are times when parents may strategically use devices to distract children such as during travel or multitasking with work. While occasional use of media to occupy children is expected and realistic, it is important for it not to become a primary or regular soothing tool.

Pediatric health professional should also initiate conversations with parents and caregivers about using devices with young children and

encourage alternative methods for emotional regulation, she says.

Among solutions Radesky recommends when parents are tempted to turn to a device.

Sensory techniques: Young kids have their own unique profiles of what types of sensory input calms them down. This could include swinging, hugging or pressure, jumping on a trampoline, squishing putty in their hands, listening to music or looking at a book or sparkle jar. If you see your child getting antsy, channel that energy into body movement or sensory approaches.

Name the emotion and what to do about it: When parents label what they think their child is feeling, they both help the child connect language to feeling states, but they also show the child that they are understood. The more parents can stay calm, they can show kids that emotions are "mentionable and manageable," as Mister Rogers used to say.

Use color zones: When children are young, they have a hard time thinking about abstract and complicated concepts like emotions. Color zones (blue for bored, green for calm, yellow for anxious/agitated, red for explosive) are easier for kids to understand and can be made into a visual guide kept on the fridge, and help young children paint a mental picture of how their brain and body is feeling. Parents can use these color zones in challenging moments ("you are getting wiggly and in the yellow zone -- what can you do to get back to green?") Offer replacement behaviors: Kids can show some pretty negative behaviors when they are upset, and it's a normal instinct to want it to just

stop. But those behaviors are communicating emotions -- so kids might need to be taught a safer or more problem-solving replacement behavior to do instead. This might include teaching a sensory strategy ("hitting hurts people; you can hit this pillow instead") or clearer communication ("if you want my attention, just tap my arm and say 'excuse me, mom.'")

Parents can also prevent tech-related tantrums by setting timers, giving kids clear expectations of when and where devices can be used, and use apps or video services that have clear stopping points and don't just auto-play or let the child keep scrolling.

When children are calm, caregivers also have opportunities to teach them emotional coping skills, Radesky says. For example, they can talk to them about how their favorite stuffed animal might be feeling and how they handle their big emotions and calm down. This type of playful discussion uses kids' language and resonates with them.

"All of these solutions help children understand themselves better, and feel more competent at managing their feelings," Radesky said. "It takes repetition by a caregiver who also needs to try to stay calm and not overreact to the child's emotions, but it helps build emotion regulation skills that last a lifetime."

"In contrast, using a distractor like a mobile device doesn't teach a skill -- it just distracts the child away from how they are feeling. Kids who don't build these skills in early childhood are more likely to struggle when stressed out in school or with peers as they get older."

CPI(M) demands additional flights between Port Blair and mainland sectors

Port Blair, Dec 18: The CPI (M) has demanded additional flights between Port Blair and mainland sectors considering the exorbitant flight fare and non-availability of tickets. In a letter sent to the Chief Secretary, A & N Administration, Shri D. Ayyappan, CPI (M) State Secretary drew the attention of the Chief Secretary to the non-availability of fair tickets for the people of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and exorbitant air fare in the Port Blair -- mainland sector flights being operated by Air India and other private airlines. He stated in the letter that with the beginning of Christmas vacation,

a large number of students studying in various educational institutions on the mainland propose to visit their homes in A & N Islands. He further also informed the Chief Secretary that a number of people who want to avail specialized medical treatment at mainland hospitals are also unable to proceed to mainland due to surging airfare on daily basis. CPI (M) informed the Administration that at present as per the website of Airlines, a single ticket from Port Blair to Chennai costs more than Rs. 20,000/- while no tickets in any flight are available from Chennai to Port Blair. Shri Ayyappan told

the Chief Secretary that Islanders, particularly those belonging to lower strata of the society are unable to travel by air. He said that CPI (M) has been getting frantic calls from people stranded at Chennai about the non-availability of tickets in any flights. Hence, the CPI (M) urged the Chief Secretary to intervene in the matter and direct all the Airlines operating between Port Blair-mainland sectors to schedule additional flights to cater to the needs of the passengers especially for the islanders during the months of December, 2022 and January, 2023. WILL THE SUMMONS BY CHILD RIGHTS COMMISSION DENT BYJU'S BRAND IMAGE?

The edtech sector has been rocked ever since BYJU'S CEO, Byju Raveendran, has been summoned to appear in person before the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights over alleged malpractice of hard selling and mis-selling of its courses for students. The commission has observed that BYJU'S is indulging in malpractices to lure parents and children to enter into loan-based agreements and hence it is exploiting them.

Experts with whom THE WEEK spoke feel that a brand like BYJU'S should have acted in a responsible manner and it may dent its brand image in the long run, especially among new subscribers and existing parents.

"Typically these issues do affect the brand image as far as the company is concerned. Issues such as these will also affect the decisions of parents when it comes to decision-making on buys," remarked Harish Bijoor, Business and Brand-strategy expert and Founder, Harish Bijoor Consults Inc. Experts do feel that such kind of instances is a reminder call for companies to evaluate the impact of their decisions on the society and the stakeholders of their business.

"It is not enough to take care of the

interest of the shareholders and customers. They need to act in a responsible manner. Though MCA (Ministry of Corporate Affairs) and SEBI mandate several provisions for the companies, they must introspect if they are standing strong on moral and ethical grounds," said Aditya Mishra, MD and CEO at CIEL HR.

Technology experts such as Sudin Baraokar, the global IT and Innovation Advisor feel that edtech startups must focus on the innovation and transformation agenda and must have ethical practices in terms of GTM and monetisation. "Such startups must work with the authorities to ensure that the students enrolled in their course are getting the value addition from these courses. At the same time, parents must make their own due diligence on edtech offerings and must not be confused by the hype factor of their offerings," Baraokar told.

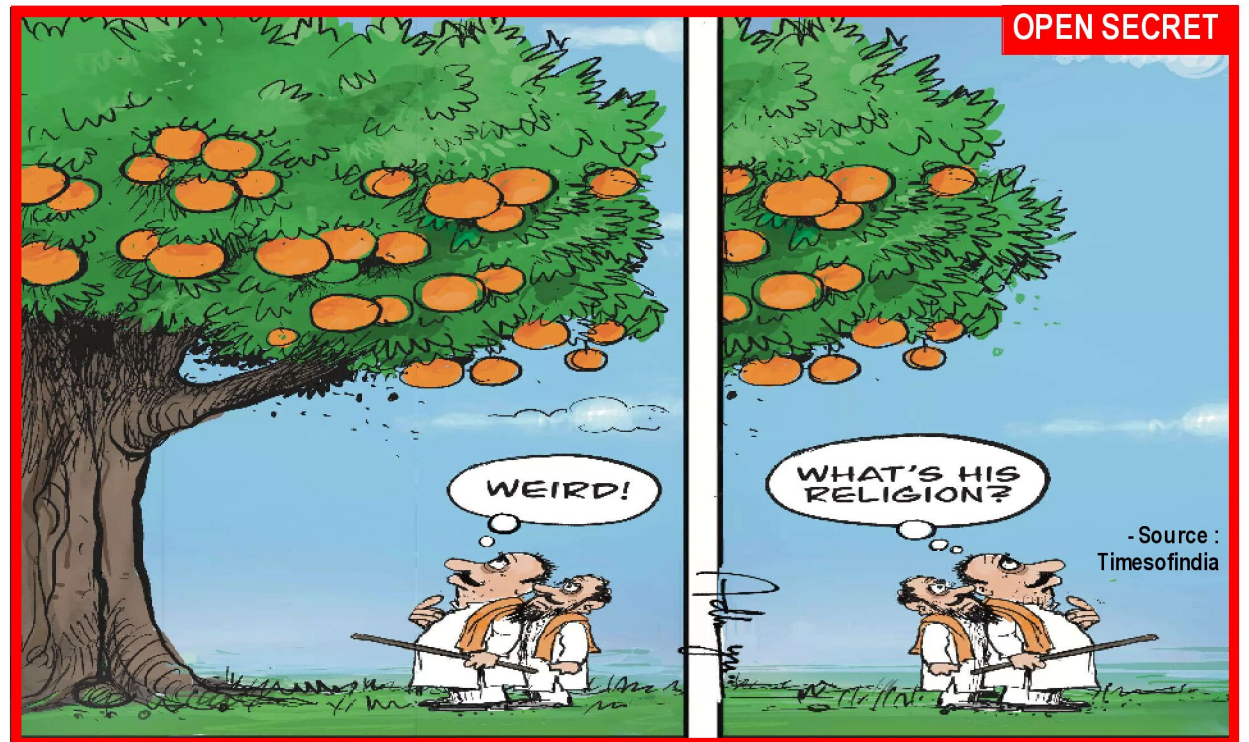
He further points out that probably there needs to be more active regulations in the edtech space, especially with a spotlight on how much the student is getting benefited. "More metrics and benchmarks need to be highlighted by the edtech companies and how are they complying with existing rules of the education

ecosystem," added Baraokar.

Just before the world cup football, BYJU'S had announced that football star and global sports icon Lionel Messi will be their first global brand ambassador of their social impact arm, 'Education For All.' Many had questioned BYJU'S for hiring Messi, as the announcement came just days after it had announced retrenchments, while some opined the appointment might help lift the brand image of BYJU'S as Messi is liked by scores of children and the FIFA world cup was around the corner.

Experts also point out that though marketing hypes are important, it is equally important for edtech companies to focus on the value, innovation and transformation of their product and service offerings. The recent summons indicate that the brand need to strongly focus on being more responsible and ethical in its approach when it comes to dealing with the students and their parents.

A spokesperson from BYJU'S said, "We have received the summons yesterday. We are compiling a transparent response based on facts to address the unsubstantiated complaints. We will clarify our position before the commission if required." - Source: Theweek

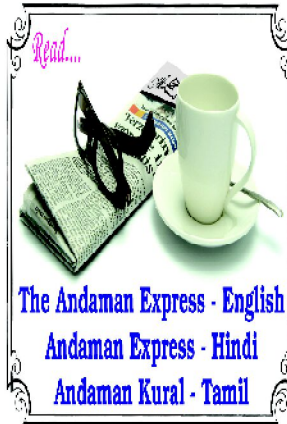
