Earthquake of 4.3-magnitude hits Port Blair in A&N Islands

Port Blair, Nov 8: An earthquake of magnitude 4.3 on the Richter scale hit southeast Port Blair in Andaman and Nicobar Islands on early Monday morning. According to National Center for Seismology (NCS), the earthquake occurred 218 km southeast of Port Blair at 5.28 am. The tremors of the earthquake had a depth of 16 km. "Earthquake of magnitude: 4.3, occurred on 08-11-2021, 05:28:29 IST, Lat. 9.98 & Long. 93.82, depth: 16 Km, location: 218km SE of Port Blair, Andaman and Nicobar Island," the NCS said in a tweet. On October 27, an earthquake of magnitude 4.0 on the Richter scale hit Diglipur area of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

'Woe' time for Cancer patients at GBPH; basic treatment facilities missing

Port Blair, Nov 8: While the UT Administration boasts of improved health services in GB Pant Hospital, shortage of medicines and basic facilities remains a major concern for patients at the lone referral hospital of these islands.

While the reason often handed out by authorities concerned about the conditions at the hospital is unprecedented rush of patients, which is indisputable, the fact that even basic facilities are not being put in place speak volumes about the total neglect. For Cancer patients in these islands, it is total chaos at the referral hospital dealing with apathy.

One Cancer patient from Farragunj Tehsil has been regularly visiting the hospital for medicines for the past five months. But every time, she is told that indent for expensive medicines has been submitted and the medicines will be issued soon. For the time being, she is being asked by the hospital staff to purchase the medicines from private pharmaceutical stores.

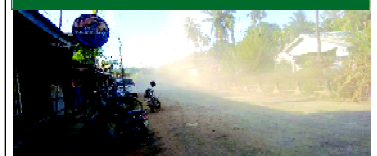

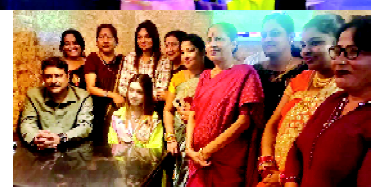

Widespread use of Covaxin

India's Covid inoculation project has received a shot in the arm with the WHO granting emergency-use licence (EUL) to Bharat Biotech's Covaxin, ending months of speculation over the fate of the indigenously manufactured vaccine. It's a notable achievement for science research in the country. The jab uses a disabled virus to trigger an immune response. While this is considered a safe approach and provides dependable defence against the virus — the inactivated pathogen cannot replicate in the human cells but triggers a broad-scale immune response involving both antibodies and T cells — the vaccine has been dogged by avoidable controversies ever since it received the Indian regulator's emergency-use approval (EUA) in January when results of phase-3 of its clinical trials were not out. The WHO's EUL should put all doubts to rest and pave the way for its widespread distribution as well as remove uncertainty regarding travel abroad by Covaxin recipients — immediately after the WHO's approval, the US announced that travellers who have taken both shots of the vaccine will be allowed into the country from November 8. The EUL also brightens the prospect for the Hyderabad-based company's vaccine for children, although that will be subject to different regulatory procedures.

Covaxin's contribution to the country's inoculation has been below expectation. Barely 12 per cent of those vaccinated against the virus have received Covaxin shots. While the country is past the phase of grievous vaccine shortages, Bharat Biotech has failed to ramp up production to the extent it was envisaged. There does not seem to be any clarity over the company's production capacity with the Centre and the vaccine manufacturer citing widely disparate figures. The WHO's vote of confidence should put the ball in the court of the Hyderabad-based firm. Covaxin, the vaccine alliance that supplies vaccines to poor nations, procures only the vaccines that have gone through the global health agency's approval procedures. The alliance is reportedly facing an acute shortage of supplies. Nearly 100 countries have vaccinated less than 10 per cent of their population, rendering almost impossible the WHO's target of inoculating at least 40 per cent of the population in all nations. The EUL to India's homegrown jab could enable the world to step up its fight against the virus if Bharat Biotech is able to improve its production capacity. Last month, a government expert committee recommended EUA for Covaxin in the age group of 2-18 years. This means that the Drug Controller General of India is a step away from clearing the use of the vaccine for children. Owing to this, Bharat Biotech's North American partner, has also reportedly submitted an application to the US Food and Drug Administration for the use of the shot for paediatric use in the country. The world is at a crucial — by all accounts, decisive — phase in its fight against the virus. The Hyderabad-based company has an opportunity, and responsibility, to position Indian scientific research at the core of this endeavour.

RAFALE DEAL: CBI WAS AWARE OF KICKBACKS, ALLEGES FRENCH JOURNAL

French investigative news outlet Mediapart has published new documents which it claims are "bogus invoices" used by aircraft maker Dassault Aviation to pay up to ₹7.5 million in secret commissions to a firm owned by a middleman, in order to facilitate the sale of the Rafale fighter jet to India.

The deal has been in the spotlight after the July appointment of a French judge to lead a "highly sensitive" judicial investigation into it following allegations of "corruption and favouritism" in the sale of 36 Rafales to India in 2016 for an estimated ₹7.8 billion (Rs. 59,000 crore).

The report claims alleged a firm controlled by alleged middleman Susheh Gupta, Interstellar Technologies, received at least ₹7.5 million from Dassault between 2007-2012, "thanks to IT contracts that were clearly overbilled, and from which most of the money was discreetly sent to Mauritius using a system of alleged false invoices".

The story by Mediapart's Yann Philippin, who has covered the deal in the past, says Indian investigative agencies like the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) and Enforcement Directorate (ED) were aware of the invoices since at least 2018 but took

no action on it. "It involves offshore companies, dubious contracts and false invoices. Mediapart can reveal that detectives from India's federal police force, the Central Bureau of Investigations (CBI), and colleagues from the Enforcement

(ED), which had accused him of being a middleman in the AgustaWestland VVIP chopper scandal, stating that he held classified documents, draft letters and sensitive information about the Defence Ministry, Indian Air Force and Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd. He was

The Mediapart report notes that "Dassault is incorrectly spelt 'Dassul' in one of the invoices, dated May 19,

Both Dassault and the Indian defence ministry have in the past trashed allegations that there was any corruption in the contractor 36 Rafales. In 2019 the Supreme Court of India also dismissed petitions seeking a probe into the deal saying there was no ground for it.

BJP IT Cell head Amit Malviya tweeted Mediapart's story, alleging that it was the UPA government that colluded kickbacks.

"Dassault paid ₹14.6 Mn to intermediary Susheh Gupta over the period 2004-2013 to sell Rafale. So UPA was collecting kickbacks but couldn't close the deal? NDA later scrapped it and got into a contract with the French Govt, which upset Rahul Gandhi no end," he tweeted.

On November 7, India reportedly lifted its ban on dealings with Italian firm Leonardo (formerly known as Finmeccanica), which had been banned for its role in the VVIP helicopter scam, the ban was imposed in 2014 following allegations of corruption in the Rs 3,600 crore contract to supply helicopters to carry the prime minister, vice president and president. However, investigations into the case against the company by the CBI and ED are still ongoing.



Directorate (ED), which fights money laundering, have had proof since October 2018 that French aviation firm Dassault paid at least 7.5 million euros (equivalent to just under Rs 650 million) in secret commissions to middleman Susheh Gupta. Mediapart claimed in the report.

Gupta had been a person of interest to the Enforcement Directorate

arrested by the ED in 2018.

As part of this case, Mauritians authorities sent documents related to the company to the CBI and ED. While the documents were sent to the CBI on October 11, 2018, a week after the CBI received a formal complaint alleging corruption in the Rafale deal, it did not open an investigation "even though just seven days after that

2009. Philippin tweeted saying an employee of Susheh Gupta's lawyer told the CBI that the invoices were "fake".

Earlier this year, Mediapart reported that a company controlled by Gupta had been commissioned to make 50 large replica models of the Rafale following the signing of the Indo-French contract in 2016.

Industrial Entrepreneur Memorandum (IEM) – DPITT G2B Portal

Port Blair, Nov 08: As part of the efforts to enhance the transparency and to ease of doing business, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPITT) has launched an enhanced DPITT G2B Portal. The DPITT vide its notification has informed that the entrepreneur can now file an application for Industrial Entrepreneur Memorandum (IEM) Part 'A' for the establishment of business and Part 'B' upon commencement of commercial

production online through the DPITT's enhanced portal. Presently, the procedure to obtain Industrial Entrepreneur Memorandum is through DPITT G2B Portal.

Industrial Entrepreneurs Memorandum is an application for acknowledgment of the industrial unit. According to the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, all exempted industrial from the requirements of industrial licensing and having an investment of Rs 10 Crore or

above in the manufacturing sector and Rs 5 crore or above in services sector are required to file IEM. According to the MSME definition modified last year, entities with the investment in plant and machinery or equipment between Rs 11 crore and Rs 50 crore are defined as medium enterprises.

Industrial Entrepreneurs Memorandum is required for the industrial promoter under the categories such as to set up a new industrial undertaking, to effect substantial expansion of the

industrial undertaking, to manufacture a new article, to carry on business of existing MSME units after graduating into large-scale industry. All the industrial promoter who falls under the purview of the above definition may visit for registration through <https://services.dpitt.gov.in/lms>. For more, one may visit District Industries Centre, Udyog Parisar, Middle Point or call over phone no 03192-232601, a press release from District Industries Centre said.

Favourable wind speed brings Delhi's air pollution level down marginally

Strong surface winds lowered pollution levels in the national capital marginally on Monday, and its 24-hour average air quality index (AQI) at 4pm was in the 'very poor' category at 390, according to agencies.

Delhi recorded 'severe' air quality for three days on the trot till Sunday due to accumulation of emissions from firecrackers on Diwali and crop residue burning amid unfavourable meteorological conditions—low temperature, wind speed and mixing height. Though 5,450 farm fires, the highest this season, were

recorded in neighboring states on Sunday, their share in Delhi's air pollution reduced from 48 per cent a day, the highest in three years, to 30 per cent on Monday due to a drop in transport-level wind speed, according to air quality forecast agency SAFAR. The India Meteorological Department said the wind speed varied from eight kmph to 14 kmph. An AQI between zero and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301 and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'. SAFAR predicted a

marginal improvement in the air quality but said it will remain in the 'very poor' category.

Lastly, the share of crop residue burning in Delhi's pollution had peaked at 42 per cent on November 5. In 2019, crop residue burning accounted for 44 per cent of Delhi's PM2.5 pollution on November 1.

Environment Minister Gopal Rai had, on Sunday, written to the Centre, demanding that an emergency meeting of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan be called to discuss the issue of crop residue burning.

Five years of demonetisation: Cash still king, but record highs for digital transactions

November 8, 2016, would have been like any other normal day. But Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in a surprise televised address at 8 pm, announced that Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 currency notes would no longer be legal tender from that midnight. The Rs 500 and Rs 1,000 notes had accounted for close to 86 per cent in currency in circulation (in value) at the time and so the move shocked the nation.

What followed that night was a huge rush to banks to buy anything people could with the notes in hand, which would soon become worthless. Many supermarkets and jewelers remained open till late hours in the wake of the rush. For weeks that followed, people had to queue outside banks for hours to get their notes exchanged. There were long queues outside ATMs, too, for withdrawal of cash.

Currency in circulation, which stood at Rs 17.97 lakh crore as of November 4, 2016, just before demonetisation, had dropped to Rs 9.41 lakh crore by December 23, 2016, according to Reserve Bank of India data. Supporters of

demonetisation saw it as a big step towards making India a less-cash and more transparent society.

However, five years on, cash is back and how. As of October 29, 2021, currency in circulation stood at Rs 29.44 lakh crore. That is a staggering 64 per cent jump since November 2016. It is almost 14.5 per cent of 2020-21 GDP now, according to some estimates.

While this data may indicate that cash is once again the king, what's interesting is that digital transactions, too, have surged and hit new records in the same period. For instance, according to National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), a record 4.21 billion transactions were recorded on the unified payments interface (UPI) in October. The total transaction value stood at Rs 7.71 lakh crore, also a record. Interestingly, UPI was also launched in 2016. While it was slow to take off, it crossed a billion transactions only in 2019, and it has picked up pace rapidly since. The next billion transactions milestone came in just a year and the next one billion in less than a year. The

increasing penetration of smartphones and the internet has fuelled the growth in digital transactions. Digital transactions have also become a convenient way to pay during the pandemic.

Today, even the neighbourhood grocery store or vegetable seller has a QR code, which one can scan and make UPI payments in a snap. Now one can even apply for IPOs (initial public offers) of companies via UPI. "UPI enabled customers across a variety of use cases, from subscribing for an IPO to making recurring payments. UPI is making digital payments unopposed and accessible to all, whether person-to-person or person-to-merchant, and to a large degree, has been effective in propelling India towards less-cash economy," said Mandeep Agashe, founder, vice-chairman of Sarva Technologies, a banking technology provider. Other digital transactions, including credit and debit cards, too, have risen over the last few years.

According to Statista, there were 43.71 billion digital transactions in the year ended March 2021, a three-fold jump compared with 14.59 billion

transactions in 2017-18. So, if digital transactions have grown rapidly, why is cash still as important as ever?

"People like to hold on to cash for two reasons. One is for transactions and the second is as a precautionary motive. Today, lots of people are holding on to cash for a precautionary motive. There is still a lot of uncertainty (due to COVID-19). People are spending a lot on healthcare. In this kind of situation, people would like to hold on to cash," explains Madan Sabnis, chief economist at CARE Ratings.

As COVID-19 led to lockdowns and social distancing became important, digital transactions, be it for online bill payments or shopping on e-commerce platforms to even person-to-person money transfers, got a big boost. However, for big-ticket purchases, especially in areas like real estate and jewellery, cash still seems to be king.

"In the lockdowns, when we had to order a lot of things online, automatically we used digital modes of payment. But when you see real

these islands. the other passengers of Helicopter service are confirmed few minutes ahead of schedule," said a resident of Digpur.

"The wheelchair facility is available in Ambulance services of administration only. If any passenger with disabilities or patient need to without refer from CHC Digpur then need to arrange standby at Helipad. This is same with who travels from other islands to Digpur. Long distance between gate and Helicopter adds their woes as Autorickshaw or other four wheeler are not allowed inside the Helipad premises. To improve access for people with disabilities and patients administration needs to position permanent wheelchair and stretcher at every Helipad in Islands," said some others.

ensure that the health of the nearby residents are not affected due to dust pollution. 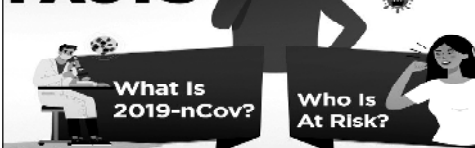

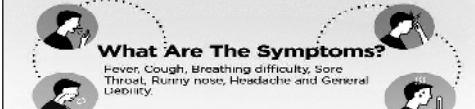

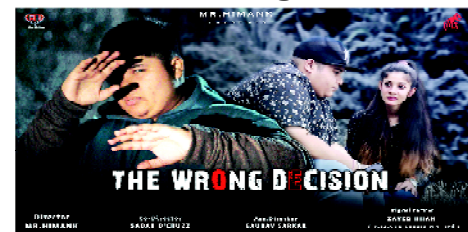
